#### **OAKLAND NOTES**

- The Oakland Athletics had their five-game win streak snapped...12 runs allowed are a season high and the most the A's have allowed since September 18, 2012 at Detroit (also 12)...A's fell to 16-5 in their last 21 games and 0-1 on their seven-game homestand against Los Angeles (0-1) and Minnesota (four games)...maintained their 6.5 game lead over Texas in the AL West after the Rangers fell at Tampa Bay, 6-2.
- Jarrod Parker lost for the first time since May 22 at Texas...had his nine-game winning streak and 19-start unbeaten streak snapped...his winning streak was the third-longest in the majors this season and the longest by an A's pitcher since Dan Haren won 10 straight from April 18-July 1, 2007...the unbeaten streak was the longest in Oakland history and the longest by an A's pitcher since Lefty Grove had a 21-start unbeaten streak from April 22-August 19, 1931...the eight runs allowed by Parker tied his career high (April 14, 2013 vs. Detroit).
- Yoenis Céspedes (2 for 3) is hitting .389 (21 for 54) with nine multiple hit games in September after entering the month with a .226 average.
- Josh Donaldson (0 for 2, r, bb) had his career high hitting streak snapped at 11 games...hit .450 (18 for 40) with 12 runs, six doubles, four home runs, 11 RBI and seven walks during the streak (1 hbp, .542 on base percentage)...extended his on-base streak to 21 games with a walk, the longest streak by an Athletic over the past two years.

### LOS ANGELES NOTES

- The Los Angeles Angels are 6-2 on their current 10-day, four-city road trip to Minnesota (0-1), Toronto (3-0), Houston (2-1) and Oakland (1-0).
- C.J. Wilson moved into second place in the American League with his 17<sup>th</sup> win (Scherzer, 19)...improved to 9-0 over his past 13 starts and 13-1 over his last 18 starts...his 13 wins since June 14 are the most in the majors...during that span, has a 2.91 ERA (38 er in 117.1 ip)...his nine consecutive wins are an ongoing career high...became second Angels pitcher to beat Oakland four times in a season (Joe Saunders, 2009).
- Kole Calhoun (3 for 5, r, 3 RBI) has driven in 30 runs since his recall on July 28, the most among AL rookies since over that stretch...is batting .376 (32 for 85) over his last 25 games...has hit safely in 14 of 15 games in September (22 for 56, .393).
- Mark Trumbo (2 for 4, 2 r, 2b, hr, 3 rbi, bb) extended his ongoing career high home run total to 34...with tonight's first-inning double, he became the 13<sup>th</sup> player in Angels history to record 30 doubles and 30 home runs in a season.
