LEADING OFF: Today, the Angels play the final game (6-3) of a four-city, 10-game road trip to Minnesota (9/9; 4/17 makeup game; 0-1), Toronto (9/10-12; 3-0), Houston (9/13-15; 2-1) and Oakland (9/16-18; 1-1)...Angels have gone unbeaten in seven straight series (6-0-1), longest streak this season...Halos have won 10 of 13 and 15 of last 19 road affairs...LAA is 18-7 in last 25 overall games, tied with A's for best record in MLB in the span...Club is 11-6 this month, 29-29 since ASB and 25-20 since Aug. 1...Angels are in a stretch of 16 straight contests against A.L. West opponents (Sept. 13-29)...Club is 27-38 division...After an off-day tomorrow, the club opens its final homestand Friday vs. Seattle (Sept. 20-22) and Oakland (Sept. 23-25).

KNOW THIS: With his first inning HR last night, Mike Trout became the first player in A.L. history with 25 HR, 30 SB & 100 BB in a season...He is the 2nd youngest player (22 yrs, 40 days) in MLB history w/ 25 HR & 30 SB. The youngest? Trout in 2012.

PITCHING AND TIMELY HITTING: In the Halos' 18-7 span since Aug. 23, the club leads the A.L. in ERA (3.08; 212.1 IP – 74 ER) and ranks second in avg. with RISP (.332; 71/214)...Since Aug. 23, bullpen has a 1.83 ERA (68.2 IP – 14 ER) to lead the A.L.

10-20-30-40: Mike Trout is one double and one triple shy of being the first ever member of the 10-20-30-40 club (10 triples, 20 homers, 30 steals, 40 doubles) in MLB history...He's at 9-25-33-39 right now.

ROAD WORK: LAA has won 10 of last 13 on road and 15 of last 19 away games...In 19-game span, the club has scored 99 runs (5.2 per) and fashioned a 2.84 ERA (167.2 IP – 53 ER).

FISH FACT: Trout is the first A.L. player ever with 70 extra-base hits, 30 stolen bases and 100 walks in a season...Since the All-Star Break, Trout's on-base percentage is .502...If it remains over .500, he'd be just the fifth MLB player with a .500 OBP post-ASB all-time.

HOT KOLE: Kole Calhoun has totaled 23 RBI his last 23 games...Since his recall on July 28th, he leads all MLB rookies with 30 RBI...His seven HR in that span are the most by an A.L. rookie...His stretch of 11 straight road games with an RBI was snapped Friday night...He is hitting .400 (16/40) with 11 RBI over his last 10 games.

SEPTEMBER SURGE: During Sept, Angels have scored 5.5 runs per game (93R/17G) and are hitting .295 (175/593)...Halos lead MLB in doubles (42) and extra-base hits (65) this month.

HOT HALOS: Chris Iannetta is hitting .366 (15/41) with five HRs and eight RBI his last 12 contests...Mark Trumbo has five doubles, one triple, five home runs and 14 RBI his last 14 games...Since August 10, Ernesto Frieri is 3-0 with nine saves and a 0.54 ERA (1ER/16.2IP)...Since Aug. 15, Hank Conger is batting .333 (20/60) with a .403 OBP...Garrett Richards has fashioned a 2.90 ERA (68.1 IP – 22 ER) over his last 11 starts. C.J. Wilson extend his career-best nine-game win streak Monday (13 starts), and set a career high in victories (17)...He is the eighth Angel starter to win nine straight decisions...Wilson is 13-1 (2.91 ERA) over his last 14 decisions.

CLOSING IN: With 184 hits, 25 HRs, 33 SBs and 107 runs, Mike Trout is closing in on becoming the only player in MLB history with at least 200 hits, 25 home runs, 30 steals and 100 runs in his age-21 season or younger...He is one double shy of become just the fifth MLB player ever with 40 2B, 30 SB & 100 BB in a season (last, B. Abreu in 2006).

MINOR LEAGUE POST-SEASON: Angels' top three affiliates each reached the championship series of their respective leagues for the first time in club history...Triple-A Salt Lake played in the 2013 PCL Pacific Conference Championship, falling to Omaha in four games...Double-A Arkansas fell to San Antonio in five games of the Texas League Championship series...Single-A Inland Empire swept San Jose for the Cal League Championship...OF Andy Workman was named MVP.

WALKMAN: Trout has walked 51 times in his last 47 games, tops in the Majors in that span while his .517 OBP in that stretch is 39 points higher than any other major leaguer...His 100 walks lead the A.L...With 107 runs and 100 walks, Trout is the sixth Angel with 100 runs and 100 walks in a season, first since Chone Figgins in 2009...He is one of only six players in MLB history with 100 walks in their age-21 or younger season: John McGraw, Jimmie Foxx, Mel Ott, Ted Williams, Rickey Henderson & Mike Trout.

FAST FACTS: Chris Iannetta was named A.L. Player of the Week after hitting .429 (9/21) with two doubles and three home runs last week, first Angels catcher to win the award since Ellie Rodriguez in 1974...With Saturday's victory, Jered Weaver joined Chuck Finley and Nolan Ryan as the only Angels to record at least 10 wins in eight separate seasons...He joins Ryan as the only Angels to accomplish the feat in eight consecutive seasons...Ernesto Frieri earned his first career six-out save Sunday...He leads the Majors with seven saves of more than three outs this season...Dane De La Rosa leads A.L. rookies with 70 games pitched, setting the Angels rookie record (prev. 69, Bill Kelson, 1967)...Halos have outscored opponents 101-58 in first inning this season (leads MLB)...Halos are hitting .346 (66/191) with runners in scoring position over their last 22 games...Angels have used 25 pitchers this season, second-most in club history (also, 2000 & 2009) and four shy of club-record 29 in 1996...Josh Hamilton is batting .331 (44/133) over his last 35 games...Raised average from .217 to .245 in the stretch...Angels are 29-10 in last 39 games when Hamilton drives in a run...Mark Trumbo's 34 HRs & 98 RBI are career bests.

MIGHTY MIKE: Mike Trout is just the seventh player in MLB history with 100 runs in his age-20 and age-21 seasons: John McGraw (1893, 1894), Mel Ott (1929, 1930), Buddy Lewis (1937, 1938), Ted Williams (1939, 1940), Vada Pinson (1959, 1960) and Alex Rodriguez (1996, 1997)...Trout became the first player in MLB history with 50-plus HRs and 70-plus SBs before turning 22 (ELIAS)...Trout is just one of four players all-time with 50+ HR, 200+ R & .320 AVG in First 2 Full MLB Seasons (1st Full Season Starts in Rookie Year)...Others are Joe DiMaggio, Ted Williams and Albert Pujols.

@ OAKLAND: A's lead 2013 series 10-5...Halos have dropped four of last five games to Oakland...Two of the three longest games in Angels history have come against the A's, including April 29th in Oakland this season (19 innings)...Halos lost three straight season series vs. A's (2010-2012)...Halos are 11-9 in last 20 games in Oakland...However, LAA has dropped 12 of last 16 to A's at Angel Stadium.

UP NEXT – Vs. SEATTLE: Halos swept M's in Seattle in last meeting (8/23-25), outscoring Mariners 14-2 in series...LAA leads 2013 series 9-7...Halos haven't dropped a season series to the Mariners since 2003 (8-11)...Angels are 84-46 vs. M's since 2007...LAA is 116-71 vs. M's since '04...LAA is 29-10 in last 39 home games vs. Seattle...Since 2008, no player has picked up more RBI against the Mariners than the Josh Hamilton (58).

STROKE OF SHUCK: J.B. Shuck leads A.L. rookies in hits (120), runs (54), total bases (151), doubles (19) and multi-hit games (34).

THIS DATE IN ANGELS HISTORY

Sept. 18

(1986) Reggie Jackson became the sixth player in club history to hit three home runs in a game in an 18-3 win vs. Kansas City...At 40 years, 123 days, Jackson was the second oldest player in ML history to connect for three HR in a contest (Stan Musial did it at 41 years, 229 days in 1962).

2-0 with a 1.69 ERA across last three starts at the Coliseum

- Makes 22nd start of regular season tonight and 11th road start of the year...Second start this season vs. Oakland.
- **LAST TIME OUT:** Charged with the loss in last start Friday at Houston after allowing a season-high eight earned runs on nine hits in 4.1 innings pitched...Fewest pitches thrown in a start (70) since April 8, 2011 (63)...First Angel lefty to allow eight or more earned runs in under five innings pitched since Joe Saunders on June 30, 2009...First pitcher in Angels history to allow eight or more earned runs without issuing a walk...First Angel starter to hit two or more batters without issuing a walk since John Lackey on August 30, 2006.
- Today marks eighth start since returning from the disabled list...Missed 47 team games with a blood clot in his left armpit area...Has a 2-3 record and 5.54 ERA (37.1 IP – 23 ER) with 33 strikeouts in seven starts since return from DL.
- **VS. OAKLAND:** Owns a 5-6 record with a 3.42 ERA (94.2 IP – 36 ER) in 16 career games (14 starts) vs. the A's...Six losses are tied for his most against any opponent, while his five wins, 16 games and 14 starts are all second-most...0-2 with a 4.12 ERA (19.2 IP – 9 ER) in last three starts against Oakland (3-0 with a 1.78 ERA in previous five matchups).
- **AT O.CO COLISEUM:** In eight career games (seven starts) at the Coliseum has a 2-3 record and 3.02 ERA (47.2 IP – 16 ER)...Both wins came last season...In three starts at Oakland last year for Seattle, went 2-0 with a 1.69 ERA (21.1 IP – 4 ER).
- **PITCHER OF THE MONTH:** Earned American League Pitcher of the Month honors for May after going 5-0 with a 2.30 ERA (43 IP – 11 ER) in his six starts last month...Marked second career Pitcher of the Month Award (also July 2012), and became the first Angel to be honored with the award since Jered Weaver in April 2011.
- Became the sixth Angels pitcher to earn five wins in month of May and the first since Shawn Boskie in 1996...Frank Tanana is the only Angels pitcher with six wins in May...Jered Weaver is the last Angels pitcher to win five games in any month (six wins in July 2012).
- Team has gone 3-7 in his last 10 starts after going 6-0 in his May starts.
- Pitched a complete game shutout on May 3rd vs. Baltimore to earn first win of the season...Held the Orioles to three hits while walking two and striking out three...Marked second consecutive complete game (ninth career)...Became first Angels pitcher to throw back-to-back complete games since Ervin Santana during the 2011 season...First Angels pitcher to earn first win with the club in a complete game shutout since Ervin Santana on May 23, 2005.
- Is now in fifth full season in Majors and first season with Angels after being acquired from Seattle in exchange for Kendrys Morales on Dec. 19, 2012.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS:

- One of only eight A.L. pitchers to have thrown 200+ innings each of last two seasons...Logged four complete games and three shutouts in 2011...Has spent professional career in Florida, New York (NL), Seattle and Angels organizations.
- In July 2012, was named A.L. Pitcher of Month after going 5-0 with a 1.64 ERA to tie the Mariners club record for most wins in a month.
- Collegiate teammate of Jered Weaver at Long Beach State.

- Tossed 3.1 innings in relief in last appearance on Sep. 3...Marked his longest relief appearance since 2004...Has pitched in just two games since August 16.
- Has made eight relief appearances with Angels...First three outings were scoreless (6 IP) but has given up 16 ER in five latest appearances (10.2 IP).
- Made first 20 appearances of season as a starting pitcher...In his 20 starts, had a 2-13 record and 5.66 ERA...Led the American League in losses, hits, earned runs and home runs allowed at time of move to the bullpen.
- Has made 17 career appearances out of the bullpen in 265 career outings...His teams have an 0-17 record in those games.
- Played for A's for five seasons and had a 47-46 record and 4.25 ERA from 2004-08.
- Owns a 0-1 record and 6.75 ERA (8 IP – 6 ER) in three career games (one start) vs. Oakland...All three games were this season and all six runs allowed came in start on April 10...Has tossed three scoreless innings in two relief appearances vs. A's.
- Appearance on 7/27 @ OAK was first out of bullpen since April 7, 2012 for Phillies.
- **Last Outing:** 9/3 vs. TB (3.1 IP, 1 ER, 3 H, 4 BB, 3 SO) **Holds:** - **Saves/Opps:** -

- Has not allowed a hit in three appearances (2 IP) during current road trip, including striking out only batter faced last night (Brandon Moss).

- Right-handed batters are 1-for-14 (.071) against him this season.

#62 RYAN BRASIER (RHP) 2013: .333 vs. LH, .188 vs. RH AGE: 26

- Tossed two scoreless innings Friday night vs. Astros in latest appearance.
- Has not allowed a run in last seven innings pitched.
- Has never faced Oakland in big league career.
- Recalled from triple-A Salt Lake on September 1st for third stint with Angels this season...Did not pitch during second stint with Halos (May 16-21).
- Made Major League debut May 2nd vs. Baltimore.
- During first stretch with Angels, pitched two innings and allowed two runs on two hits with three strikeouts and one walk across two appearances.
- In 38 appearances this season with Salt Lake, posted a 5-2 record with 10 saves, a 4.13 ERA (56.2 IP – 26 ER) and 57 strikeouts.
