**THE TWINS:** After finishing their recent 10-game homestand with a record of 3-7, the Twins began their final roadtrip of 2013 going 1-2 in Chicago...tonight, they begin their final road series with four against Oakland through the weekend...the Twins have gone 34-43 on the road, compared to 31-43 at home.

**DIAMOND SHINES:** The Twins beat the White Sox yesterday afternoon by a score of 4-3, finishing with a record against the Sox of 11-8 in 2013, their first winning record against the Sox since 2010 (13-5)...Scott Diamond (6-11) was the starter and winner, snapping his five-game losing streak, allowing three runs on five hits in 6.1 innings pitched...Casey Fien and Jared Burton each earned a hold while Glen Perkins saved his 36th game with a scoreless ninth...the offense recorded seven hits, scoring all four of their runs in the first two innings...they went 4-for-8 with runners in scoring position.

- Diamond did not strike out a batter yesterday and has now struck out one batter-or-less in seven straight starts (since July 7), the longest stretch for any pitcher since Baltimore's Dave Schmidt also went seven in 1989.

**WILD WILD WEST** The Twins have gone 19-10 against the AL West this season (8-5 on the road), winning nine of their last 13...they went 5-1 against the Angels, 5-1 against Houston, 4-3 against Seattle, 4-3 against Texas, and 1-2 against Oakland with four games remaining.

- The 19 wins are tied for sixth most for the Twins in a single-season, since the 1994 three division per league realignment...20 wins would tie their 2003 total for fifth most in a single-season and two wins would tie their 2007 total for fourth most...their most ever came in 1996 when they went 27-22.

**CALIFORNIA LOVE:** The Twins are 52-49 against Oakland under Manager Ron Gardenhire (since 2002), including a record of just 2-7 in their last nine (since July 13, 2012)...under Gardenhire, the Twins are 22-28 all-time in Oakland.

- Since the start of 2012, Josh Willingham has hit .405 (17-for-42) with two doubles, seven home runs and 17 RBI against the Athletics; he has hit safely in 11 of 12 games.

**THIS AND THAT ON GARDY:** Manager Ron Gardenhire won his 997th game yesterday and is just three wins away from becoming the eighth active manager to reach 1,000 victories and 60th all-time...Tom Kelly is the Twins all-time winningest manager with a record 1140-1244 from 1986-2001.

- 10 different coaches have coached under Gardenhire (since 2002).
- 223 different players have played for Gardenhire, Michael Cuddyer logging the most games played at 1,134.
- Under Gardy, there have been two MVP's (Morneau and Mauer), two Cy Young Awards (Johan Santana twice), seven Silver Slugger Awards (Mauer - 4, Morneau - 2, Willingham - 1), 10 Gold Glove Awards (Hunter - 6, Mauer - 3, Santana - 1), and three batting championships (all Mauer).
- His most wins against any MLB team is Kansas City (130-92)...his most wins in an opposing ballpark is Kauffman Stadium (65-47).
- Only the Yankees (10), Cardinals (7), Braves (6), Red Sox (6) and Angels (6) have reached the postseason as many times as the Twins (6) since Gardy took over.

**PLAYING THE FIELD:** Brian Dozier committed just his fifth error yesterday (684 total chances) and has posted a .9926 fielding percentage, the second best in baseball among second basemen, trailing only Darwin Barney's .9931 percentage...his fielding percentage is the highest for a Twins second baseman in club history (since 1961), ahead of Chuck Knoblauch's 1992 percentage of .9917.

**ROAD WARRIORS:** The Twins have gone 34-43 on the road this season, compared to 31-43 at home...since July 13, they are 18-13 on the road, the third most road wins in baseball since that date, trailing just the Dodgers (21-9) and the Angels (19-16)...in that span, they lead baseball in road home runs with 40, ahead of Oakland (39).

- A win tonight would match their 2012 road win total.

**ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY:** In 1972, Cesar Tovar became the second Twin ever to hit for the cycle (10 now) and first since Rod Carew in 1970...at home against Texas, Tovar tripled in his first at-bat, grounded out in his second at-bat, singled in his third at-bat, doubled in his fourth at-bat and hit a walk-off two-run homer in his final at-bat, in the ninth inning as the Twins won 5-3...in that game, there were 18 hits between the Twins and Rangers combined, four of which were extra-bases and Tovar had three of the four.

Had held opponents hitless in 31 straight at-bats 6/13-7/8, the second-longest hitless streak by a Twins rookie (Gerry Arrigo, 0-33, 6/22-26/1964 - ELIAS).

Earned first career win with a scoreless ninth inning June 1 vs. Seattle...Twins would walk-off in bottom of the inning with two-run triple by Doumit.
