THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 1-3 through four games on their seven-game roadtrip, going 1-2 in Chicago and losing their first in Oakland last night...tonight, they play the second of four in Oakland...the Twins have gone 34-44 on the road, compared to 31-43 at home.

TWINS FIGHT HARD, FALL SHORT: The Twins lost to the Athletics last night by a score of 8-6... Kevin Correia was the starter but did not factor into the decision, allowing two runs on six hits in 5.0 innings, tying a season-high with five walks...the bullpen combined to allow six runs on five hits — three of which were home runs...Shairon Martis was issued his first loss, allowing two runs in the bottom of the eighth...the offense recorded 10 hits...Chris Parmelee tied his season-high with three hits...Oswaldo Arcia had two hits, including his 13th home run...Josh Willingham walked twice, giving him 500 walks for his career.

WILD WILD WEST: The Twins have gone 19-11 against the AL West this season (8-6 on the road)...they went 5-1 against the Angels, 5-1 against Houston, 4-3 against Seattle, 4-3 against Texas, and 1-3 against Oakland with three games remaining.

▪ The 19 wins are tied for sixth most for the Twins in a single-season, since the 1994 three division per league realignment...20 wins would tie their 2003 total for fifth most in a single-season and two wins would tie their 2007 total for fourth most...their most ever came in 1996 when they went 27-22.

CALIFORNIA LOVE: Since the start of 2012, Josh Willingham has hit .378 (17-for-45) with two doubles, seven home runs and 17 RBI against the Athletics, including an on-base percentage of .462, reaching base safely in 12 of 13 games in that span.

OZ THE GREAT AND POWERFUL: Oswaldo Arcia hit his 13th home run last night, marking the most for a Twins rookie since Marty Cordova hit 24 in 1995...the 13 home runs are tied for 11th most in club history with Eric Soderholm (1972)...Jimmie Hall holds the Twins rookie record with 33 in 1963.

▪ Among AL rookies, he is tied for first in home runs and extra-base hits (31), fifth in RBI (37), tied for sixth in doubles (16) and seventh in hits (84).

▪ Arcia has 23 home runs this season between Triple-A Rochester and Minnesota.

THREE WINS REMAINING: Manager Ron Gardenhire won his 997th game Wednesday and is just three wins away from becoming the eighth active manager to reach 1,000 victories and 60th all-time.

A GLOVE STORY: The Twins have committed 70 errors this season, the fourth fewest in baseball, trailing Baltimore (46), Tampa Bay (55) and the Yankees (64)...they are on pace for just 74 errors, which would tie their 2002 total for fewest in Twins/Washington Senators franchise history (since 1901).

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 2004, the Twins clinched the AL Central with a 8-2 victory over Chicago-AL...it marked their third consecutive AL Central title.

CONGRATS TO DICK BREMER!: Twins play-by-play man Dick Bremer will be receiving a Silver Circle Award from NATAS on Saturday September 28 at the regional Emmy Awards banquet in Minneapolis...he is being inducted into the Minnesota Broadcasters Hall of Fame the following evening.

THIS AND THAT:

- Since July 13, the Twins are 18-14 on the road, tied for the third most road wins in baseball since that date.
- Twins rookies have hit eight of the club's 18 home runs this month...they also have 24 of the 67 RBI.
- The Twins have hit 37 home runs on the road since the All-Star break, tied for third most in baseball.
- Jasmil Pinto's .360 batting average this month is the second best among all rookies in baseball, trailing Philadelphia's Cesar Hernandez (.373).
- The bullpen's .238 opponent batting average is the 10th lowest in club history...the 'pen's 470 strikeouts are the most in club history, ranking ahead of their 2004 total of 455.
- Oswaldo Arcia gave the Twins their 43rd outfield assist last night, tied with Arizona for the most in baseball...the 43 outfield assists are tied for third most in club history with their 1985 total...the Twins record is 52, set in 1983.

LAST START: Was issued his third career loss, extending his losing streak to three games, September 14 vs. Tampa Bay opposite Matt Moore...it was just his second start to go fewer than 5.2 innings...struck out a career-low one batter...Twins had just four hits in the game, being shutout for the second straight game in the 7-0 loss.

PREVIOUS START: Did not factor into the decision in the Twins 2-0 loss September 8 vs. Toronto opposite Esmil Rogers...tossed 7.0 scoreless innings, allowing four hits and no walks while striking out a career-high five batters...the Twins bullpen allowed two runs in the eighth inning... it marked his third career scoreless start, joining his first two career starts (17.1 scoreless IP).

OH CANADA: Albers is one of 20 Canadian-born players to have played in the MLB this season, one of 11 pitchers...a win today would tie him with Milwaukee's Jim Henderson (3-5) for fifth most wins by a Canadian-born pitcher in 2013.

SECOND START, SECOND WIN: Earned his second career major league win in his second career start and appearance August 12 vs. Cleveland opposite Danny Salazar...allowed just two hits and no walks while striking out two in the complete game shutout, the first of his career...it was the first Twins complete game shutout since Scott Diamond on July 27, 2012 vs. Cleveland...he was the 19th Twins rookie to toss a complete game shutout.

- Albers became the fourth Twins rookie to throw a complete game shutout with two hits allowed-or-fewer, the others being Tom Hall April 18, 1969 against California (2 hits), Gary Serum August 19, 1978 against Toronto (2 hits) and Gerry Arrigo June 26, 1964 against Chicago-AL (1 hit).
- **ELIAS SAYS...**Albers became the first pitcher not to allow a run in either of his first two games in the major leagues, while pitching at least 8.0 innings in each game, since Baltimore's Tom Phoebus began his career with consecutive shutouts in September 1966.
- Albers is the first Twin to begin his MLB career by winning each of his first two major league starts since Eric Milton did so April 5-11, 1998...no Twin has ever began their MLB career with three straight starts resulting in three wins.

WHAT A DEBUT: Albers made his major league debut August 6 at Kansas City, earning the win after tossing 8.1 scoreless innings with four hits allowed and one walk...the 8.1 innings pitched were the most by a Twins pitcher since Liam Hendriks tossed a 9.0 inning complete game on August 27, 2012.

- **ELIAS SAYS...**Albers became the first pitcher in club history (since 1961) to throw more than seven scoreless innings in his major league debut.
- **ELIAS SAYS...**Albers became the third pitcher in Twins/Senators franchise history (since 1901) to pitch 8.0-plus scoreless innings in his debut, the previous two being Washington's George Dumont (9.0 IP) September 14, 1915 vs. Cleveland and Washington's Mike Forniello (9.0 IP) September 2, 1952 vs. Philadelphia.
- Albers became the 11th different Twins starter to win in his debut and second this season, the other being Kyle Gibson June 29 vs. KC...the last time the Twins had two pitchers win in their debuts in one season was in 1978 when Roger Erickson beat Seattle on April 6 and Darrell Jackson beat Detroit on June 16.

SCORELESS STREAK: Allowed a run in the first inning 8/17 vs. Chicago-AL, snapping his 17.1 scoreless inning streak to start his career...it was the longest scoreless inning streak to begin a career by a Twins starter.

RETURN FROM TOMMY JOHN: Albers underwent "Tommy John" surgery on his left elbow on June 17, 2009...was released by the Padres following surgery and was signed by the Quebec Capitales of the Can-Am Independent League in 2010...in 40 relief appearances for the Capitales he went 3-0, 1.40 ERA (57.2 IP, 9 ER) 17 saves, 16 walks and 59 strikeouts.

ALL HE'S GOT: Tossed three complete games this season for Triple-A Rochester, the first being a complete game shutout June 7 at Gwinnett...in that start he allowed six hits and no walks while striking out seven batters...only on opposing hitter reached second base and no one reached third base in the 9.0 innings.

- Tossed his second and third complete games in back-to-back outings, July 26 and 31... earned the win in the first complete game and allowing two runs on three hits with seven strikeouts...was issued the loss in his start before his promotion, a complete game allowing two runs on five hits and striking out four.

2013 WITH THE RED WINGS: Ranked in the top five of several International League pitching categories including strikeouts (1st, 116), wins (T-2nd, 11), innings pitched (3rd, 132.1) and ERA (5th, 2.86) at time of promotion.

- With his complete-game victory on July 26 vs. Norfolk (9.0 IP, 3 H, 2 R/ER), he became the first Wings starter to win 11 games in a season since Brian Duensing in 2007.
- Posted a 23.2-inning streak without allowing an earned run from April 30-May 23...had a 13.1-inning scoreless streak April 30-May 11 snapped on two unearned runs.
- Career-high seven-game win-streak was snapped on June 28 at Indianapolis (6.0 IP, 8 H, 4 R 3 HR)...went 7-0, 3.06 ERA (50.0 IP, 17 ER) from May 17-June 23...won five straight starts from June 2-23 going 5-0, 2.43 ERA (33.1 IP, 9 ER).

TOMORROW'S STARTER - PEDRO HERNANDEZ, LHP

Will be making his 11th start and 13th appearance this season...it will be his 10th straight start and fourth since being recalled August 30 from Double-A New Britain...was issued a no decision after he allowed three runs on four hits in 5.0 innings, Septemeber 15 vs. Tampa Bay...will be making his first career start and appearance against the A's...in three career starts and appearances against the AL West he is 1-0, 2.87 ERA (15.2 IP, 5 ER)...in his last start vs. AL West he allowed three runs in 4.2 IP September 9 vs. LAA...has a career record of 3-2, 6.62 ERA (51.2 IP, 38 ER) in 11 career starts.

 - Earned the win in his major league debut August 6, 2013 at Kansas City, tossing 8.1 scoreless innings with one walk and two strikeouts.
 - Named the Twins Minor League Player of the Week, ending June 9 after tossing a complete game shutout...did not allow a base runner to third base and only one to second the entire outing.
 - Was named to the 2013 Triple-A All-Star team after going 9-4, 3.11 ERA (110.0 IP, 38 ER) in 19 starts pre-ASG...was his second straight Triple-A All-Star Game.
