LHP Diamond recalled from AAA RHP Tonkin recalled from AAA C Fryer contract purchased from AAA RHP Martis contract purchased from AAA THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 1-4 through five games on their seven-game roadtrip, going 1-2 in Chicago and 0-2 in Oakland...today, they play the third of four against the Athletics... after tomorrow's game, they will complete their 2013 road season...after tomorrow's matinee, the Twins travel home to play the Tigers for three and the Indians for four...the Twins have gone 34-45 on the road, compared to 31-43 at home.

TWINS BLOWN OUT IN OAKLAND: The Twins lost to the Athletics last night by a score of 11-0...Andrew Albers was the starter and loser, allowing eight runs (3 earned) on eight hits in 4.2 innings pitched...the bullpen allowed three runs in 3.1 innings pitched...the offense recorded six hits, including two from Josh Willingham and two from Eduardo Escobar...the offense went 0-for-7 with runners in scoring position and were shutout for the 14th time this season...the Twins defense committed four errors, their most since October 1, 2009 at Detroit.

WILD WILD WEST The Twins have gone 19-12 against the AL West this season...they went 5-1 against the Angels, 5-1 against Houston, 4-3 against Seattle, 4-3 against Texas, and 1-4 against Oakland with two games remaining.

• The 19 wins are tied for sixth most for the Twins in a single-season, since the 1994 three division per league realignment...20 wins would tie their 2003 total for fifth most in a single-season and two wins would tie their 2007 total for fourth most...their most ever came in 1996 when they went 27-22.

CALIFORNIA LOVE: Since the start of 2012, Josh Willingham has hit .396 (19-for-48) with three doubles, seven home runs and 17 RBI against the Athletics, including an on-base percentage of .473, reaching base safely in 13 of 14 games in that span...only Victor Martinez has a higher batting average against the A's in that span, hitting .464 in seven games.

WRAPPING UP THE ROAD: The Twins have two road games remaining, going 34-45 away from Target Field this season...below are the Twins home and road pitching and hitting numbers this season and how their road numbers previous three seasons compare:

ON THIS DAY IN TWINS HISTORY: In 2010, the Twins clinched the AL Central with a 6-4 victory over Cleveland at Target Field...Glen Perkins was the winner, pitching 1.0 inning of scoreless relief as Matt Capps earned his 15th save, giving Ron Gardenhire his 800th career victory...it was the sixth time the Twins won the division under Gardy. In 1963, Harmon Killebrew tied an American League record with four home runs in a doubleheader, a split with the Red Sox...the Twins lost won game one 13-4 and lost game two 2-11... Killer had three homers in game one.

CONGRATS TO DICK BREMER!: Twins play-by-play man Dick Bremer will be receiving a Silver Circle Award from NATAS on Saturday September 28 at the regional Emmy Awards banquet in Minneapolis...he is being inducted into the Minnesota Broadcasters Hall of Fame the following evening.

PRIOR START: Was the starter but did not factor into the decision in the Twins 6-4 victory September 15 vs. Tampa Bay...allowed three runs on four hits with four walks and two strikeouts in 5.0 innings pitched...he threw 89 pitches, 50 strikes...all three runs given up by Hernandez were by home run (2-run HR by Myers in 4th, solo HR by Rodriguez in 5th).

PRIOR START: Did not factor into the decision in his start September 9 vs. Los Angeles-AL (make-up game) opposite Jered Weaver...allowed three runs on eight hits with one walk and three strikeouts in 4.2 innings pitched...allowed two runs to cross in the fourth inning on a Kole Calhoun RBI-double and a Grant Green ground out...he threw 89 pitches, 52 strikes.

IHREE'S COMPANY: He has allowed three-runs-or-less in each of his last six starts, however only one of those have been quality outings.

PLAYING THE ODDS: The Twins are 8-2 this season when Hernandez starts for a .750 winning percentage, the highest of any of the Twins starters...the Twins have won in six of his last seven starts.

PICK A SIDE: He has held left-handed batters to a .250 average (14-for-56) with just four extra base hits while right-handers have hit .325 (51-for-157) with 19 extra-base hits.

HERNANDEZ RECALLED: Hernandez replaced Samuel Deduno on the 25-man roster after he was placed on the 15-day disabled list (August 30)...this is his third stint with the Twins this season...in three levels of the minors this season he has posted a record of 3-3, 3.66 ERA (64.0 IP, 26 ER) with 15 walks and 45 strikeouts in 12 games (10 starts).

FIRST ONE IN THE BOOKS: Earned his first career major league win in the Twins 7-2 victory April 27 vs. Texas opposite Derek Holland...pitched 5.0 scoreless innings allowing five hits with one walk and three strikeouts...retired eight of the last nine batters faced giving up one walk... threw 80 pitches, 52 strikes.

<u>OUT OF THE 'PEN:</u> Hernandez has made two relief appearances this season going 0-0-0, 1.69 ERA (5.1 IP, 1 ER) with one strikeout and a .238 opponents' batting average.

FIRST START OF THE YEAR: Made his first start as a Twin and first start of the year, April 7 at Baltimore opposite Jason Hammel...did not factor in the decision allowing three runs on four hits with three walks and three strikeouts in 5.0 innings pitched...retired the last seven batters faced (2 strikeouts)...threw 83 pitches, 51 strikes...Twins won, 4-3.

 Recalled from Triple-A Rochester, April 7, to replace Cole De Vries who went on the 15day disabled list with a right forearm strain.

YOUNG SOUTHPAW: At 23 years, 11 months and 26 days, Hernandez was the youngest Twins left-handed pitcher to make their first start since Francisco Liriano (21 years, 10 months and 19 days) on September 14, 2005...eighth youngest lefty to start a game for the Twins since 1995.


