THE TWINS: The Twins have gone 1-5 through six games on their seven-game roadtrip, going 1-2 in Chicago and 0-3 in Oakland...today, they play their fourth and final game vs. Oakland, their final road game of the season...following the game, the Twins travel home to play the Tigers for three and the Indians for four...the Twins have gone 34-46 on the road, compared to 31-43 at home.

TWINS LOSE TO OAKLAND: The Twins lost to the Athletics yesterday by a score of 9-1...Pedro Hernandez (3-2) was the starter and loser as he lasted just 2.0 innings allowing six runs on eight hits (one home run)...Liam Hendriks tossed 6.0 innings of relief...he allowed three runs on eight hits (two home runs) but struck out seven...the Twins had just six hits...Josmil Pinto went 2-for-3 with a home run, the Twins only run of the game...the Twins committed two errors.

AVOID THE SWEEP: The Twins are looking to avoid being swept for the 11th time this season...the last time they were swept by the A's in a four game series was April 9-12, 1981 at Metropolitan Stadium - the Twins have never been swept in four games in Oakland (last three-game series sweep was August 30-September 1, 2002).

OAKLAND OUTSCORING THE TWINS: The A's have scored at least eight runs in five straight games vs. the Twins this season (the Twins have lost all five games)...in fact, the Twins have been outscored 57-16 by Oakland this season.

BULLPEN GETTING WORK: After tossing 6.0 innings yesterday, the Twins bullpen has tossed a Major League leading 546.0 innings this season...the 546.0 innings this season is the second highest season total in Twins history, only the 2012 bullpen logged more innings (558.2)...the bullpen has posted a 3.43 ERA (546.0 IP, 208 ER) this season.

WRAPPING UP THE ROAD: The Twins have one road games remaining, going 34-46 away from Target Field this season...below are the Twins home and road pitching and hitting numbers this season and how their road numbers previous three seasons compare:

NEED TO SCORE MORE: The Twins have scored just 587 runs this season (3.81 runs/game)...they have now scored three runs-or-less in 77 games this season...that equates to 50% of their games with three runs-or-less...the Twins are 13-64 when scoring three-or-fewer runs...the Twins have scored two-runs or less in 52 games and are 1-51 in those games...they have been held to one run-or-less in 33 games, going 0-33 in those games...by comparison, Twins pitchers have held opponents to three runs-or-less in 62 games (40% of the time)...the Twins are 48-14 in those games.

AVOID THE 15TH SHUTOUT: The Twins 11-0 loss to the Athletics on Friday marked their American League leading 14th shut out of the season (the Marlins have been held scoreless 18 times while the Braves 15 times)...with being shut out 14 times this season, the Twins have tied a club record (2007, 2006, 1990, 1972 and 1964)...the Rays blanked the Twins in back-to-back games on September 13 and 14.

RELIEF IN 2013: Has made two relief appearances for the Twins in 2013, both coming after his recall from Triple-A September 1...he allowed three runs in his outing September 11 vs. Oakland in 3.0 innings and four runs in 5.0 innings on September 16 at Chicago-AL.

- Has allowed four home runs in his 8.0 innings of relief while walking five and striking out four...opponents have hit .343 (12-for-35) against De Vries this season.

WITH TRIPLE-A ROCHESTER: Made 10 starts for the Red Wings this season, going 3-4, 7.02 ERA (50.0 IP, 39 ER) with six home runs allowed, 13 walks and 24 strikeouts.

- In his final start with Rochester, August 29 at Buffalo, tossed 7.0 shutout innings, allowing two hits and one walk while striking out five.
- Allowed three runs or less in four of his final five starts.

THREE'S COMPANY: He has allowed three-runs-or-less in each of his last four major league starts, August 21-September 8, 2012...over those four starts went 3-1, 1.54 ERA (23.1 IP, 4 ER) with four walks and 13 strikeouts.

HERE AND THERE: Combined between GCL Twins, Single-A Ft. Myers, Double-A New Britain, Triple-A Rochester and the Twins this season he is 4-6, 5.23 ERA (86.0 IP, 50 ER), 20 walks and 49 strikeouts.

SIX IS IT: De Vries is 2-1, 1.21 (44.2 ip, 6 er) when he pitches six or more innings, with 30 strikeouts and a WHIP of 0.90...he has reached the sixth inning seven times in his career...in games where he pitches less than six innings he is 2-5, 7.24 (51.0 ip, 41 er) with 32 strikeouts.

MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT NOTES: Was the loser in the Twins 11-8 defeat, May 24 at Chicago (AL), opposite Philip Humber...allowed three solo home runs to A.J. Pierzynski, Paul Konerko and Alex Rios.

- He became the second Twin to be make his Major League debut this season, the other being infielder Brian Dozier, May 7 vs. Los Angeles (AL).
- First Twins pitcher to make his ML debut since Liam Hendriks, September 6, 2011 vs. Chicago (AL).
- One of just nine Twins pitchers to toss 96-plus pitches in their debut.
- First ever Minnesota-born pitcher to start in his ML debut for the Twins.
- At 27 years and 102 days old, he became the third oldest Twin to make his professional debut as a starting pitcher, younger than only Matt Fox and Les Straker. Fox was 27 years, 273 days old on September 10, 2010 when he debuted and Straker was 27 years, 183 days when he debuted on April 11, 1987.

MINNESOTA NICE: He was the 28th Minnesota native to play for the Twins and one of four on the current roster with Joe Mauer, Glen Perkins and Caleb Thielbar being the others.

- He is a 2003 graduate of Eden Prairie High School where he also played football and was All-State in baseball and Class 3A Player of the Year in his senior season.
- Attended the University of Minnesota, where he was named Second-Team All-Big Team as a junior.
- Went 12-10, 4.52 (197.0 ip, 99 er) with 61 walks and 144 strikeouts in 42 career games (29 starts) with the Golden Gophers (from 2004-06).
- He is one of four Minnesotan's pitching in the Big Leagues this season...along with Perkins, Josh Johnson (Miami) and Steve Edlefsen (San Francisco).

EVERYTHING ELSE ON DE VRIES:

- Named Twins' Pitcher of the Week, July 11-18, 2008, while at Single-A Ft. Myers (Florida State League).
- Disabled with a back muscle straight, August 12-August 21, 2008.
- Began the 2013 season on the Opening Day roster and was placed on the 15-day disabled list with a right forearm strain on April 7...was reinstated from the DL and optioned May 18.
- Selected to the Midwest League All-Star Game in 2007...ranked sixth in the league in ERA and tied for team-lead (with Beloit) in victories.
