## A's vs. ANGELS

The A's have won the season series for the third consecutive year as they lead 10-6 with three games remaining...are 4-2 in Los Angeles and 6-4 in Oakland...have scored 88 runs in 16 games this year...the Oakland record for runs in a season against the Angels is 100 in 2003...are 31-23 against the Angels over the last three years...including 25-2 when scoring four or more runs...have been shut out in six of their last 15 losses to the Angels and have scored just one run in five of those games...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 396-319 against the Angels...that includes 205-153 in Oakland and 191-166 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 445-396 against the Angels.

## TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yoenis Céspedes is batting .338 (26 for 77) with 12 runs, six home runs, 19 RBI and 11 multiple hit games in 19 games in September...leads the American League in RBI in September and is tied for third in home runs.

Josh Donaldson has reached base safely via hit or walk in each of his last 27 games, which is the longest streak by an Athletic over the last five years...is batting .378 (37 for 98) with 24 runs, 11 doubles, six home runs, 20 RBI and 17 walks during the streak.

## THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1988 Jose Canseco steals his 40<sup>th</sup> base of the season in the A's 9-8, 14-inning win at Milwaukee...he becomes the charter member of baseball's 40/40 club, hitting 42 home runs and stealing 40 bases.

## **ABOUT THE A's**

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won four straight, 10 of the last 12 and 13 of the last 16 to improve to a season-high 30 games over .500...those are the A's most games over .500 since they finished the 2003 season with a 96-66 record...are 93-63, which is the second best record in the majors (Boston, 94-62)...clinched the American League West title yesterday and now lead the West by 8½ games...the only times in Oakland history the A's won the West by more than seven games were in 1971 (16), 1988 (13) and 1990 (9)...trailed the Rangers by three games entering play on August 30 but have gone 18-5 since then, which is the best record in the majors (Boston, 16-6)...have gained 11½ games on Texas over that stretch...for the season, have spent 74 days in sole possession of first, 11 days tied for first, 78 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth...have won 90 games for the second consecutive season and eighth time in the last 14 years...have 17 seasons with 90 or more wins since moving to Oakland in 1968...the only Major League teams with as many 90-win seasons over that span are the Yankees (23) and Atlanta (17 including this year)...have a winning record for the second consecutive season, marking the first time the A's have put together back-to-back winning seasons since 1999-2006 when they had eight straight...are 234-183 (.561) since Bob Melvin took over as manager June 9, 2011, which is tied for sixth best in the majors over that span.

**POSTSEASON:** The A's clinched the American League West title yesterday...will be making the 17<sup>th</sup> postseason appearance in Oakland history and 25<sup>th</sup> in Athletics history...only the Yankees (51), Dodgers (27) and Cardinals (26 including this year) have more...it is the A's 16<sup>th</sup> American League West title...only the Yankees (18) and Braves (17 including this year) have as many division titles...have won consecutive AL West titles for the fourth time in Oakland history (also 1971-75, 1988-90, 2002-03)...clinched the AL West on the 156<sup>th</sup> game of the season, the sixth time the A's have clinched the West in game 156 or earlier (also 149 in 1971, 150 in 1972, 151 in 1988, 154 in 1990, 156 in 1973)...now have a magic number of four to clinch home field advantage in the American League Division Series.

SEPTEMBER: The A's are 16-5 (.762) in September, which is tied with Washington for the best record in the majors...have clinched a winning record in every month of the season for the fifth time in Oakland history (1971, 1972, 1990, 2003)...the only other Major League team with a winning record in each of the first five months this year is Atlanta (currently 9-11 in September)...now have a streak of 10 consecutive months with a winning record dating back to last June, which is tied for the third longest such streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...it is currently the longest active streak in the majors (Atlanta has nine)...the A's are batting .296 (217 for 732) and have a 3.13 ERA (66 er in 190.0 ip) in the month of September...lead the American League in batting this month and rank second in ERA.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in 12 of the last 15 games (since September 7) and are 10-1 with a 2.64 ERA (26 er in 88.2 ip) and .205 (68 for 331 opponents batting average over that span...are 69-45 with a 3.71 ERA (389 er in 944.1 ip) for the season...**lead the American League** in complete game shutouts (4), rank second in wins and ERA and tied for second in complete games (6).

PITCHING: The A's lead the American League in opponents on-base percentage (.300), rank second in ERA (3.59), batting average (.244) and slugging percentage (.381) and are tied for third in shutouts (12)...the last time the A's finished the season with an on-base percentage under .302 was in 1972 (.284)...have issued just 413 walks, which is the fewest in the AL...the last time the A's walked fewer than 440 batters in a non-strike season was in 1976 (415)...have 1123 strikeouts, which is the fourth highest single season total in A's history (1160 in 2011, 1136 in 2012, 1124 in 2009)...have five 10-game winners, which is tied with Detroit for the most in the majors...it marks the fifth time in Oakland history the A's had five pitchers win 10 games (1968, 1971, 2004, 2005).

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .284 (418 for 1473) with 68 home runs over the last 43 games (since August 9)...no other team has hit more than 50 home runs over that span (Washington)...also lead the majors in runs (240), slugging percentage (.492) and extra base hits (161) over this stretch, rank fourth in batting, on-base percentage (.347) and doubles (81) and tied for seventh in triples (9)...also lead the majors in home runs (82) and slugging (.455) since the All-Star Break...for the season, are tied for second in the American League in doubles (288), rank third in runs (734), home runs (180), walks (553) and extra base hits (493) and fourth in triples (25)...A's pinch hitters are batting .142 (19 for 134), which is second lowest in the AL...the lowest mark in Oakland history is .141 in 1994...lead the AL in pinch strikeouts (40), rank second in plate appearances (155), home runs (5) and walks (18) and third in RBI (15)...the five pinch hit home runs are tied for second most in Oakland history...the record is eight in 1970.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's rank last in the majors with 1329 assists and are on pace for 1380, which would break the Major League record for fewest assists in a non-strike season (1393, San Francisco in 2008)...have just 110 double plays, which is also the fewest in the majors...the Oakland record for fewest double plays in a non-strike season is 115 in 1980.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's begin a regular season-ending six-game road trip to Los Angeles (three games) and Seattle (three games) today...went 5-1 on the last road trip to Minnesota (2-1) and Texas (3-0) to clinch a winning record on the road for the second consecutive season...are 41-34 (.541) on the road, which is the third best road record in the AL and fourth best in the majors...went 5-2 on the final homestand of the season, a seven-game stand against Los Angeles (1-2) and Minnesota (4-0)...finished with a 52-29 (.642) record at home, which is second best in the AL (Boston, 53-28)...this is the A's fourth consecutive season with a winning record at home...the 52 home wins are tied for seventh most in Oakland history.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 30-20 (.600) in one-run games...lead the American League in one run wins and have the third best record...this marks the seventh time in Oakland history the A's have won 30 one-run games...the record is 33 in 2004...started the season by going 13-3 against AL West teams compared to 5-15 against everyone else through May 9...are 28-26 against the West since May 10 while going 47-19 against the rest of baseball...have 34 players on the active roster.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his  $28^{\text{th}}$  appearance of the season, his  $26^{\text{th}}$ start...the A's are 15-10 (.600) in his starting assignments this year and 35-21 (.625) in his career...his teams are 40-21 (.656) in his 61 career starts...has tossed at least six innings in 15 of his 25 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 10 times and walked two batters or fewer 17 times.

BRIEFLY: Was on the Opening Day roster and went 9-9 with a 4.39 ERA in 22 starts before he was optioned to Sacramento August 3...had no decisions, a 1.74 ERA and .348 opponents batting average in two starts with the River Cats before returning to Oakland August 18...went 1-0 with a 2.79 ERA in two starts before he was sent to Single-A Stockton August 28...did not pitch in a game with the Ports before their season ended September 3 and returned to Oakland...is 1-0 with a 2.25 ERA (2 er in 8.0 ip) in three games, one start, since

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on two days rest today, the first A's pitcher to do that since Guillermo Moscoso on June 7, 2011 at Baltimore...it is his second start this year on three days rest or fewer (also September 15)...the last A's pitcher to make two starts on three days rest or fewer in the same season was John Halama in 2003.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .208 (27 for 130) batting average with runners in scoring position, which is sixth lowest in the American League...has yielded a .305 (46 for 151) batting average with 14 doubles, seven home runs (.536 slugging percentage) and six walks (.331 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...allowed a .319 batting average, .555 slugging percentage and .358 on-base percentage to hitters leading off an inning last year.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed 24 home runs...20 have been hit by right-handers, which is tied for fourth most in the AL...17 have been solo shots...13 have come in the first two innings of a game...has allowed 11 home runs in eight starts and 48.1 innings during the day compared to 13 home runs in 19 games and 102.2 innings at night...surrendered at least one home run in eight consecutive starts from May 24 to June 30 (12 home runs total).

RUN SUPPORT: Has received just 10 runs of support in his nine losses this year (50.1 ip, 1.79 RSA)...has received just 22 runs of support in his 19 losses in two seasons with the A's (109.0 ip, 1.82 RSA)...has received no support nine times over the last two years as a starter and one run of support eight times...the A's have been shut out nine times this year, three times in games started by Milone...is 10-1 with three runs of support or more this year and 19-3 in his career.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 5-4 with a 3.44 ERA (26 er in 68.0 ip) in 12 games at home compared to 6-5 with a 4.77 ERA (44 er in 83.0 ip) in 15 games on the road...in two seasons with the A's, he is 12-8 with a 3.02 ERA (56 er in 166.2 ip) in 27 games in Oakland compared to 12-11 with a 4.80 ERA (93 er in 174.1 ip) in 31 games on the road.

INNING BY INNING: Has a 4.68 ERA (26 er in 50.0 ip) over the first two innings of a game, a 2.61 ERA (14 er in 48.1 ip) in innings three and four and a 5.13 ERA (30 er in 52.2) from the fifth inning on

IN RELIEF: Has a 3.00 ERA (1 er in 3.0 ip) and .100 (1 for 10) opponents batting average in two relief appearances, the first of his career...began his career with 60 consecutive starts before pitching in relief September 11 at Minnesota (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 so)...entered the game in the sixth inning with the A's leading 16-2 and allowed a run...also tossed two scoreless innings against the Twins on Friday, retiring all six batters he faced in the seventh and eighth innings.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 5-1 win at Texas September 15...was a last minute replacement for Jarrod Parker, who was scratched before the game, and tossed 5.0 innings...the A's scored twice in the first and he allowed a RBI single to Pierzynski in the bottom of the first...that was the only run he would allow as he blanked the Rangers on three hits and a walk over his final four innings.

MILONE vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 4-2 with a 4.50 ERA (34.0 ip, 40 h, 17 r, 17 er, 9 bb, 28 so, 6 hr) in six career starts...is 2-2 with a 4.13 ERA (11 er in 24.0 ip) in four starts in Oakland and 2-0 with a 5.40 ERA (6 er in 10.0 ip) in two starts in Anaheim...is 2-1 with a 4.26 ERA (19.0 ip, 18 h, 9 r, 9 er, 7 bb, 21 so, 4 hr) in three starts this year...the first win came in an 11-5 A's victory at Los Angeles April 10...the A's scored a run in the first but he allowed a Hamilton sacrifice fly in the bottom of the first...the A's added three more in the third before he allowed another run in the third ... had a 5-2 lead when he allowed a two-run single to Callaspo in the fifth...then took the loss in a 5-4 decision at Oakland May 1...did not walk a batter and matched his career-high with 10 strikeouts...retired 12 of the first 13 batters he faced, with the lone exception being a two-out solo home run by Kendrick in the second...had a 2-1 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Shuck in the fifth and a pair of solo home runs to Trout and Trumbo in the sixth...won for a second time July 27 in a 3-1 win in Oakland...walked a career-high tying four batters...allowed his only run in the second inning when Hamilton homered with two outs...blanked the Angels on one hit and three walks over his final five innings

WITH SACRAMENTO: Went 0-0 with a 1.74 ERA (10.1 ip, 16 h, 5 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 15 so, 0 hr) in two starts with the River Cats...opponents hit .348 ...the first start came in a 6-4 win at Omaha August 8 (5.0 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 7 so, 99 pitches)...left with a 4-0 lead and runners on first and second with no outs in the sixth but the bullpen allowed both runs to score...his last start came in a 6-4 win at lowa on August 13 (5.1 ip, 8 h, 3 r, 0 er, 0 bb, 8 so, 101 pitches)...allowed three runs in the second inning but all were unearned following a two-out error by Andy Parrino...left after 5.1 innings with a 4-3 lead.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP A.J. Griffin (14-9, 3.78 ERA): Is scheduled to make his team-leading 32<sup>nd</sup> start of the season...is 4-0 with a 3.48 ERA and .198 opponents batting average over his last five starts...is now 9-3 with a 3.68 ERA in 16 starts since June 26...the nine wins are tied for third most in the American League over that span...is tied for seventh in the AL in wins overall (14)...ranks fifth in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.279) and sixth in opponents batting average (.225)...is 3-0 with a 2.77 ERA and .169 opponents batting average in four starts in September this year and 7-1 with a 2.95 ERA and .219 opponents average in 10 career starts in September...had a no decision in his last start, a 4-3 A's loss in 11 innings to Los Angeles last Wednesday (6.0 ip, 1 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 6 so)...is 2-1 with a 2.33 ERA four career starts against the Angels...including 1-1 with a 3.32 ERA (19.0 ip, 12 h, 7, r, 7 er 4 bb, 12 so) in three starts this year.

The A's bullpen has a 4.68 ERA (22 er in 42.1 ip) over its past 13 games (since September 10)...now has a 3.35 ERA for the season, which is third lowest in the American League...is tied for the second fewest in walks in the AL (148) and has the fourth fewest strikeouts (411)...is tied for the fourth fewest home runs allowed (41)...ranks fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.304)...first batters faced are 88 for 393 (.224) with 28 walks and two hit by pitches (4 sf, .276 on-base percentage)...has the second lowest on-base percentage in the AL against first batters and fourth lowest batting average and slugging percentage (.341)

- Was reinstated from the 60-day disabled list August 28 and has appeared in eight games in relief since then (14.0 ip, 18 h, 10 r, 10 er, 5 bb, 16 so. 2 hr. 6.43 ERA).
- Pitched on consecutive days for the first time in his career last week (Wednesday and Thursday).
- Has recorded three three-inning saves...is the second A's pitcher since 1992 with three three-inning saves in one season (Doug Jones, 1999).
