## A's vs. ANGELS

The A's have won the season series for the third consecutive year as they lead 11-7 with one game remaining...are 5-3 in Los Angeles and 6-4 in Oakland...have scored 98 runs in 18 games this year...the Oakland record for runs in a season against the Angels is 100 in 2003...are 32-24 against the Angels over the last three years...including 26-2 when scoring four or more runs...have been shut out in seven of their last 16 losses to the Angels and have scored just one run in five of those games...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 397-320 against the Angels...that includes 205-153 in Oakland and 192-167 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 446-397 against the Angels.

## **TODAY'S TIDBITS**

Yoenis Céspedes is batting .325 (26 for 80) with six home runs, 19 RBI and 11 multiple hit games in 20 games in September...leads the AL in RBI this month and is tied for third in home runs.

Josh Donaldson had a 28-game streak of reaching base safely via hit or walk last night. It was the longest streak by an Athletic over the last five years...is batting .364 (39 for 107) with 25 runs, 11 doubles, six home runs, 20 RBI and 17 walks during the streak.

**Brandon Moss** is hitting .333 with nine doubles, 10 HR and 27 RBI in his last 30 games.

## THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1987**, Mark McGwire's ninth inning game tying homer breaks Reggie Jackson's Oakland home run record as it is his 48<sup>th</sup> of the year...he would go on to hit an Oakland and major league rookie record 49 home runs.

## ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Jason Vargas' four-hit shutout last night snapped a five-game A's winning streak...however, Oakland has still claimed 11 of the last 14 and 14 of the last 18 games...the A's 94 wins match their total from last year and are tied for 10<sup>th</sup> most in Oakland history...the last time the A's won more than 94 games was 2003 when they went 96-66...are 94-64, which is the second best record in the majors (Boston, 95-63)...clinched the American League West title on Sunday and currently lead the West by 7½ games...the only times in Oakland history the A's won the West by more than seven games were in 1971 (16), 1988 (13) and 1990 (9)...trailed the Rangers by three games entering play on August 30 but have gone 19-6 since then, which is the best record in the majors (Boston, 16-7)...have gained 10½ games on Texas over that stretch...for the season, have spent 76 days in sole possession of first, 11 days tied for first, 78 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for foruth and one day in fifth...have won 90 games for the second consecutive season and eighth time in the last 14 years...have 17 seasons with 90 or more wins since moving to Oakland in 1968...the only Major League teams with as many 90-win seasons over that span are the Yankees (23) and Atlanta (17 including this year)...have a winning record for the second consecutive season, marking the first time the A's have put together back-to-back winning seasons since 1999-2006 when they had eight straight...are 235-184 (.561) since Bob Melvin took over as manager June 9, 2011, which is tied for fifth best in the majors over that span.

**POSTSEASON:** The A's clinched the American League West title on Sunday...will be making the 17<sup>th</sup> postseason appearance in Oakland history and 25<sup>th</sup> in Athletics history...only the Yankees (51), Dodgers (27) and Cardinals (26 including this year) have more...it is the A's 16<sup>th</sup> American League West title...only the Yankees (18) and Braves (17 including this year) have as many division titles...have won consecutive AL West titles for the fourth time in Oakland history (1971-75, 1988-90, 2002-03)...clinched the AL West on the 156<sup>th</sup> game of the season, the sixth time the A's have clinched the West in game 156 or earlier (149 in 1971, 150 in 1972, 151 in 1988, 154 in 1990, 156 in 1973)...**now have a magic number of one to clinch home field advantage in the American League Division Series...trail Boston by one game for home field advantage throughout the playoffs.** 

**SEPTEMBER:** The A's are 17-6 (.739) in September, which is the **best record in the majors** (Cleveland, 16-6)...the four best Septembers in Oakland history are 17-4 (.810) in 2001, 21-7 (.750) in 2000, 19-7 (.731) in 1988 and 20-8 (.714) in 1990...have clinched a winning record in every month of the season for the fifth time in Oakland history (1971, 1972, 1990, 2003)...the only other Major League team with a winning record in each of the first five months this year is Atlanta (currently 10-12 in September)...now have a streak of 10 consecutive months with a winning record dating back to last June, which is tied for the third longest such streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...it is currently the longest active streak in the majors (Atlanta has nine)...the A's are batting .293 (234 for 798) and have a 3.09 ERA (71 er in 207.0 ip) in the month of September...lead the American League in batting this month and rank second in ERA.

**OFFENSE:** The A's hit two home runs Monday night, their sixth straight game having homered two or more times, which ties the Oakland record (fourth time, last: July 30-Aug. 4, 1999)...have launched 15 homers in the last seven games...are now batting .283 (435 for 1539) with 70 home runs over the last 45 games (since August 9)...no other team has hit more than 52 home runs over that span (Baltimore)...also **lead the majors** in runs (250), slugging percentage (.487) and extra base hits (165) over this stretch, rank third in batting, fourth in on-base percentage (.348), fifth in doubles (86) and tied for seventh in triples (9)...also **lead the majors** in home runs (84) and slugging (.453) since the All-Star Break...for the season, rank third in the American League in runs (744), home runs (182), walks (558), doubles (290) and extra base hits (497) and fourth in triples (25)...A's pinch hitters are batting .142 (19 for 134), which is second lowest in the AL...the lowest mark in Oakland history is .141 in 1994...tied for the lead in the AL in pinch strikeouts (40), rank second in plate appearances (155), home runs (5) and walks (18) and third in RBI (15)...the five pinch hit home runs are tied for second most in Oakland history...the record is eight in 1970.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed two earned runs or fewer in 14 of the last 17 games (since September 7) and are 11-2 with a 2.82 ERA (31 er in 99.0 ip) and .209 (78 for 373) opponents batting average over that span...are 70-46 with a 3.71 ERA (394 er in 954.2 ip) for the season...**lead the AL** in complete game shutouts (4), rank second in wins and ERA and are tied for second in complete games (6).

**PITCHING:** The A's **lead the American League** in opponents on-base percentage (.299), rank second in ERA (3.58), batting average (.243) and slugging percentage (.380) and are tied for fourth in shutouts (12)...the last time the A's finished the season with an on-base percentage under .302 was in 1972 (.284)...have issued just 417 walks, which is the fewest in the AL...the last time the A's walked fewer than 440 batters in a non-strike season was in 1976 (415)...have 1148 strikeouts, which is the second highest single season total in A's history (1160 in 2011)...have five 10-game winners, which is tied with Detroit for the most in the majors...it marks the fifth time in Oakland history the A's had five pitchers win 10 games (1968, 1971, 2004, 2005).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's rank last in the majors with 1343 assists and are on pace for 1377, which would break the Major League record for fewest assists in a non-strike season (1393, San Francisco in 2008)...have just 110 double plays, which is also the fewest in the majors...the Oakland record for fewest double plays in a non-strike season is 115 in 1980.

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 1-1 on this regular season-ending six-game road trip to Los Angeles (1-1) and Seattle (three games)...went 5-1 on the last road trip to Minnesota (2-1) and Texas (3-0) to clinch a winning record on the road for the second consecutive season...are 42-35 (.545) on the road, which is tied for the second best road record in the AL and tied for third best in the majors...went 5-2 on the final homestand of the season, a seven-game stand against Los Angeles (1-2) and Minnesota (4-0)...finished with a 52-29 (.642) record at home, which is second best in the AL (Boston, 53-28)...this is the A's fourth consecutive season with a winning record at home...the 52 home wins are tied for seventh most in Oakland history.

**FOR STARTERS:** Is scheduled to make his 27<sup>th</sup> start of the season, his 13<sup>th</sup> since being recalled from Sacramento July 20 for his fifth stint with the A's this year...the A's are 16-10 (.615) in his starting assignments this year and are 21-12 (.636) in his career...has tossed six or more innings in 12 of his 26 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 15 times and walked two batters or fewer 14 times.

THREE HITS OR FEWER: Has allowed three hits or fewer while tossing at least five innings in each of his last four starts...that matches the longest such streak by an A's pitcher since at least 1916 (Mike Moore, April 13-28, 1989)...opponents are 10 for 80 (.125) during the streak.

**ROOKIE LEADERS:** Leads American League rookies in wins (10), games started (26), strikeouts (119) and innings pitched (145.2)...is the 11<sup>th</sup> rookie in Oakland history to win 10 or more games, the fifth in the last five years (Anderson, Cahill, Milone, Parker)...his 119 strikeouts are sixth most by an Oakland rookie (Hudson is 5<sup>th</sup>, 132).

FOUR-GAME WINNING STREAK: Is 4-0 with a 2.15 ERA (7 er in 29.1 ip) and .173

(18 for 104) opponents batting average over his last five starts...the winning streak is one short of his career high of five (May 21-July 9, 2013)...went 0-5 with a 5.20 ERA and .299 opponents batting average over his previous seven starts, which was the longest losing streak of his career...that losing streak came on the heels of a five-game winning streak from May 21 to July 9...posted a 2.83 ERA and .196 opponents batting average during the winning streak, which spanned nine starts.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has allowed a .230 opponents batting average, which ranks ninth in the American League among pitchers with 140 or more innings...using the same minimum, his .200 (42 for 210) opponents average the first time through the lineup is third lowest in the AL...11 of the 16 home runs he has allowed have been solo shots...10 have come on the road and eight have come in the first two innings of a game.

**DAYS REST:** Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 6-2 with a 3.42 ERA (29 er in 76.1 ip) in 13 starts on five days rest or more compared to 4-5 with a 4.80 ERA (37 er in 69.1 ip) in 13 starts on four days...his career numbers are 8-2 with a 3.00 ERA (34 er in 102.0 ip) in 17 starts on five days rest or more compared to 4-6 with a 5.31 ERA (49 er in 83.0 ip) in 16 starts on four days rest.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is 4-1 with a 2.25 ERA (12 er in 48.0 ip) and .181 (30 for 167) opponents average in eight starts during the day compared to 6-6 with a 4.98 ERA (54 er in 97.2 ip) and .252 (95 for 377) opponents batting average in 18 starts at night...has allowed 15 of his 16 home runs at night.

**THE WEST AND THE REST:** Is 5-4 with a 5.15 ERA (37 er in 64.2 ip) in 12 starts against American League West competition compared to 5-3 with a 3.22 ERA (29 er in 81.0 ip) in 14 starts against all other teams...his career numbers are 6-4 with a 5.07 ERA (49 er in 87.0 ip) in 16 starts against the West, 6-4 with a 3.12 ERA (34 er in 98.0 ip) in 17 starts against everyone else.

**BRIEFLY:** Was recalled from Triple-A Sacramento July 20 for his fifth stint with the A's this year and is 4-5 with a 3.84 ERA (28 er in 65.2 ip) in 13 starts since his return...was on the A's Opening Day roster and started the fifth game of the season April 5 at Houston...was optioned to Sacramento the next day when Bartolo Colón was reinstated from the suspended list...went 3-0 with a 0.96 ERA in three starts with the River Cats before being recalled from Sacramento April 29 to start for Brett Anderson...started that night, was optioned to Sacramento April 30 and recalled May 1 when Anderson went on the DL...went 3-2 with a 4.69 ERA in 10 starts before he was optioned to Sacramento June 23 as the A's had three days off over an eight-day stretch...returned July 4 and went 2-0 with a 0.68 ERA in two starts before he was sent back to Sacramento July 10 with the All-Star Break approaching.

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 8-6 win over Minnesota last Thursday in Oakland...allowed just one run over the first five innings when Parmelee singled to lead off the third inning, went to second on a Lowrie error, third on a Florimon ground out and scored on a Presley fielders choice...had a 2-1 lead when he put runners on first and third with two outs in the sixth...was relieved by Otero, who allowed one runner to score...Otero was relieved by Anderson who allowed the other runner to score.

**STRAILY vs. LOS ANGELES:** Is 1-2 with a 6.91 ERA (27.1 ip, 37 h, 21 r, 21 er, 5 bb, 28 so, 9 hr) in five career starts...is 0-1 with a 10.54 ERA (16 er in 13.2 ip) in three starts in Oakland and 1-1 with a 3.29 ERA (5 er in 13.2 ip) in two starts in Anaheim...is 0-2 with a 7.31 ERA (16.0 ip, 22 h, 13 r, 13 er, 3 bb, 15 so, 3 hr) in three starts this year...had a no decision in a 10-8 A's win in 19 innings on April 29 in Oakland...allowed a career-high six runs in 4.2 innings...allowed solo home runs to Pujols in the first and Trumbo in the second...also allowed four more runs in the fifth on a Pujols RBI single, a Hamilton sacrifice fly and a Trumbo two-run double...left trailing 6-1 but the A's eventually tied the game before winning in 19 innings...then took the loss in a 2-0 decision at Los Angeles July 20...allowed a sacrifice fly to Hamilton in the first inning but then blanked the Angels on five hits over the next five innings...Callaspo homered to lead off the sixth...the A's were shutout on three hits by Wilson (8.1 ip) and Frieri (0.2 ip)...also lost in an 8-3 decision in Oakland July 25...allowed a RBI single to Pujols in the third inning but the A's scored twice in the fourth to take a 2-1 lead...he then allowed four runs in the fifth inning on a Trout sacrifice fly, a Hamilton RBI single and a Trumbo two-run double...left after 4.1 innings trailing 5-2.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-1 with a 1.14 ERA (31.2 ip, 24 h, 11 r, 4 er, 9 bb, 33 so) in five starts with Sacramento...went 3-0 with a 0.96 ERA over his first three starts before being promoted to Oakland April 29...was tied for the Pacific Coast League lead in wins as of April 29 promotion...has a .202 opponents batting average, including .174 (8 for 46) by left-handed hitters compared to .219 (16 for 73) by right-handers...has allowed just one home run in 31.2 innings.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Bartolo Cólon (17-6, 2.64 ERA):** Is scheduled to make his 30<sup>th</sup> start of the season... has not allowed a run in his last 19 innings, which is an A's season high and the longest active streak in the American League...his career high is 22.1 innings from July 22-August 17, 2012... leads the American League in ERA (2.64) and is tied for second in wins (17) and tied for third in winning percentage (.739)...the last A's pitcher to finish the season with an ERA under 2.65 is Dave Stewart in 1990 (2.56)...in his last start, combined with Milone and Scribner on a six-hit shutout in the A's 11-0 win over Minnesota last Friday in Oakland...tossed six innings and allowed five of the hits...allowed only one base runner to advance past third base... Is 12-6 with a 3.16 ERA (153.2 ip, 145 h, 57 r, 54 er, 39 bb, 107 so, 15 hr) in 23 career appearances, all starts
