A's vs. MARINERS

The A's have lost the season series as they trail 6-10 with three games remaining...are 4-6 in Oakland and 2-4 in Seattle...over the past eight seasons, the A's have won the season series in even numbered seasons (2006, 2008, 2010, 2012) and the Mariners have won in odd numbered years (2007, 2009, 2011, 2013)...the A's are 77-72 (.517) against Seattle since 2006...all-time, the A's are 310-234 (.570) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by any team against the Mariners to Boston's .581 mark (min. 20 games)...are 172-101 in Oakland, 137-132 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yoenis Céspedes is batting .321 (27 for 84) with 12 runs, six home runs, 19 RBI and 11 multiple hit games in 21 games in September...leads the American League in RBI in September and is tied for third in home runs.

Josh Donaldson is batting .370 (30 for 81) with 19 runs, eight doubles, five home runs, 15 RBI and 11 multiple hit games in 22 games in September...is tied for second in the American League in runs in September and tied for seventh in home runs.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1970 Reggie Jackson hits his 100th career home run in a 9-4 loss at California...he would go on to hit 563 home runs in his career...in 1989 Mike Moore, Rick Honeycutt and Gene Nelson combine on a four-hit shutout in a 5-0 victory over Texas to clinch the A's second consecutive AL West Championship.

ABOUT THE A's

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost the past two games, the first time the A's have lost consecutive games since August 20-23 when they lost three straight...however, have won five of the last seven, 11 of the last 15 and 14 of the last 19...now have 94 wins for the season, which matches their total from last year and is tied for 10th most in Oakland history...the last time the A's won more than 94 games was 2003 when they went 96-66...are 94-65, which is tied for the second best record in the majors (Boston, 96-63)...clinched the American League West title on Sunday and currently lead the West by six games...the only times in Oakland history the A's won the West by more than seven games were in 1971 (16), 1988 (13) and 1990 (9)...trailed the Rangers by three games entering play on August 30 but have gone 19-7 since then, which is the best record in the majors (Boston, 17-7)...have gained nine games on Texas over that stretch...for the season, have spent 78 days in sole possession of first, 11 days tied for first, 78 days in second, four days tied for second, one day in third, two days tied for fourth and one day in fifth...have won 90 games for the second consecutive season and eighth time in the last 14 years...have 17 seasons with 90 or more wins since moving to Oakland in 1968...the only Major League teams with as many 90-win seasons over that span are the Yankees (23) and Atlanta (17 including this year)...have a winning record for the second consecutive season, marking the first time the A's have put together back-to-back winning seasons since 1999-2006 when they had eight straight...are 235-185 (.560) since Bob Melvin took over as manager June 9, 2011, which is tied for the sixth best record in the majors over that span.

POSTSEASON: The A's clinched the American League West title on Sunday...will be making the 17th postseason appearance in Oakland history and 25th in Athletics history...only the Yankees (51), Dodgers (27) and Cardinals (26 including this year) have more...it is the A's 16th American League West title...only the Yankees (18) and Braves (17 including this year) have as many division titles...have won consecutive AL West titles for the fourth time in Oakland history (1971-75, 1988-90, 2002-03)...clinched the AL West on the 156th game of the season, the sixth time the A's have clinched the West in game 156 or earlier (149 in 1971, 150 in 1972, 151 in 1988, 154 in 1990, 156 in 1973)...now have a magic number of two to clinch home field advantage in the American League Division Series...trail Boston by two games for home field advantage throughout the playoffs.

SEPTEMBER: The A's are 17-7 (.708) in September, which is the second best record in the majors (Cleveland, 18-6)...the four best Septembers in Oakland history are 17-4 (.810) in 2001, 21-7 (.750) in 2000, 19-7 (.731) in 1988 and 20-8 (.714) in 1990...have clinched a winning record in every month of the season for the fifth time in Oakland history (1971, 1972, 1990, 2003)...the only other Major League team with a winning record in each of the first five months this year is Atlanta (currently 11-13 in September with three games remaining)...now have a streak of 10 consecutive months with a winning record dating back to last June, which is tied for the third longest such streak in Oakland history...it is the longest since a 10-month streak from June, 2002 to September, 2003...it is currently the longest active streak in the majors (Atlanta has nine)...the A's are batting .290 (240 for 829) and have a 3.01 ERA (71 er in 207.0 ip) in the month of September...lead the American League in batting this month and rank second in ERA.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .281 (441 for 1570) with 70 home runs over the last 46 games (since August 9)...no other team has hit more than 57 home runs over that span (Baltimore)...also **lead the majors** in runs (251), slugging percentage (.481) and extra base hits (165) over this stretch, rank third in batting, fourth in onbase percentage (.343), tied for sixth in doubles (86) and tied for seventh in triples (9)...also **lead the majors** in home runs (84) and slugging (.449) since the All-Star Break...for the season, rank third in the American League in runs (745), walks (559) and extra base hits (497) and fourth in home runs (182), doubles (290) and triples (25)...A's pinch hitters are batting .142 (19 for 134), which is second lowest in the AL...the lowest mark in Oakland history is .141 in 1994...are tied for the lead in pinch strikeouts (40), rank second in plate appearances (155), home runs (5) and walks (18) and are tied for third in RBI (15)...the five pinch hit home runs are tied for second most in Oakland history...the record is eight in 1970...hit two or more home runs in six consecutive games (15 total) from September 18-23, which tied the Oakland record (fourth time, last: July 30-Aug. 4, 1999).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed two earned runs or fewer in 14 of the last 16 games (since September 7) and are 11-1 with a 2.68 ERA (28 er in 94.0 ip) and .207 (73 for 353) opponents batting average over that span...are 70-47 with a 3.70 ERA (395 er in 961.1 ip) for the season...**lead the American League** in complete game shutouts (4), rank second in wins and ERA and are tied for second in complete games (6).

PITCHING: The A's **lead the American League** in opponents on-base percentage (.300), rank second in ERA (3.57), batting average (.243) and slugging percentage (.380) and are tied for fourth in shutouts (12)...the last time the A's finished the season with an on-base percentage under .302 was in 1972 (.284)...have issued just 419 walks, which is the fewest in the AL...the last time the A's walked fewer than 440 batters in a non-strike season was in 1976 (415)...have 1155 strikeouts, which is the second highest single season total in A's history (1160 in 2011)...have five 10-game winners, which is tied with Detroit for the most in the majors...it marks the fifth time in Oakland history the A's had five pitchers win 10 games (1968, 1971, 2004, 2005).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's rank last in the majors with 1358 assists and are on pace for 1384, which would break the Major League record for fewest assists in a non-strike season (1393, San Francisco in 2008)...have just 111 double plays, which is also the fewest in the majors...the Oakland record for fewest double plays in a non-strike season is 115 in 1980.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-2 on this regular season-ending six-game road trip to Los Angeles (1-2) and Seattle (three games)...went 5-1 on the last road trip to Minnesota (2-1) and Texas (3-0) to clinch a winning record on the road for the second consecutive season...are 42-36 (.538) on the road, which is tied for the third best road record in the American League...went 5-2 on the final homestand of the season, a seven-game stand against Los Angeles (1-2) and Minnesota (4-0)...finished with a 52-29 (.642) record at home, which is second best in the AL (Boston, 53-28)...this is the A's fourth consecutive season with a winning record at home...the 52 home wins are tied for seventh most in Oakland history.

FOR STARTERS: Is scheduled to make his 30th start of the season...the A's are 20-9 (.690) in his starting assignments this year and 34-19 (.642) over the last two years...his teams are 231-173 (.572) in his career has tossed seven or more innings in 13 of his 29 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 19 times and walked two batters or fewer 26 times.

SCORFLESS INNINGS STREAK: Has not allowed a run in his last 19 innings. which is an A's season high and the second longest active streak in the American League (Iwakuma, SEA 23.0)...his career high is 22.1 innings from July 22-August 17, 2012.

SINCE THE DISABLED LIST: Is 3-1 with a 0.90 ERA (3 er in 30.0 ip) in five starts since he was reinstated from the disabled list August 29...has allowed just one home run and walked just three batters in 30.0 innings...has allowed one earned run or fewer in each start...was placed on the 15-day DL August 18 retroactive to August 14 with a strained left groin...it was his 11th career stint on the DL.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for the American League lead in ERA (2.64), tied for second in wins (17) and third in winning percentage (.739)...the last A's pitcher to finish the season with an ERA under 2.65 is Dave Stewart in 1990 (2.56)

and the last with an ERA lower than Stewart is Steve McCatty in 1981 (2.32)...his winning percentage is currently eighth best in Oakland history (a win today would tie for fifth best, a loss would drop out of the top 10)...is tied for the AL lead in shutouts (3), is second in fewest walks per nine innings (1.37) and fewest home runs per nine innings (0.59), tied for second in complete games (3), tied for sixth in opponents grounded into double plays (21), seventh in strikeout to walk ratio (3.89) and eighth in opponents slugging percentage (.368)...is averaging the second fewest pitches per inning (14.5) and fourth fewest pitches per game (92.4)...has the third highest run support (6.30).

AS A 40-YEAR OLD: His 17 wins are second most in Athletics history by a 40-year old and are one short of the record of 18 set by Jack Quinn in 1928 (no Oakland pitcher older than 33 has won more than 15 games)...is the first Major League 40-year old with 17 wins since Time Wakefield in 2007...the last with 18 is Roger Clemens in 2004...has set an Athletics record for strikeouts (109) and an Oakland record for shutouts (3)...has tied Tom Candiotti's 1998 Oakland record for complete games (3)...ages are based on a players age as of June 30th.

CAREER BESTS: Currently has career lows in ERA (2.64), opponents slugging percentage (.368) and fewest home runs per nine innings (0.59)...his .739 winning percentage is second best to 1999 (18-5, .783)...his 17 wins are his most since 2005 when he went 21-8 for the Angels and won the Cy Young Award...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he is the first pitcher in AL history with 15 wins with four different teams (Indians, White Sox, Angels)...his 29 starts and 184.1 innings pitched are also his most since 2005 (33 starts, 222.2 ip).

SINCE MAY 20: Is 14-4 with a 1.97 ERA (45 in 153.0 ip) in 21 starts since May 20 and has allowed just five home runs in 137.0 innings...is tied for

second in the majors in wins over that span (Scherzer, DET 16)...his ERA is second lowest among pitchers with 117.0 or more innings (Fernandez, MIA 1.75) ... went 3-2 with a 4.56 ERA and seven home runs in 47.1 innings over his first eight starts.

THIS AND THAT: Is 10-2 with a 2.44 ERA (23 er in 85.0 ip) in 13 starts against American League West teams...the last time an A's pitcher won 10 division games was in 1990 (Welch 13, Stewart 10)...has a 3.61 ERA (46 er in 114.2 ip) and has yielded 11 home runs over the first four innings of a game...has a 1.03 ERA (8 er in 69.2 ip) and has surrendered just one home run from the fifth inning on...has allowed 10 of his 12 home runs to a lefthanded hitter...has yielded 49 of his 63 home runs over his last four seasons to lefties...is 8-2 following an A's loss.

LAST START: He combined with Milone and Scribner on a six-hit shutout in the A's 11-0 win over Minnesota a week ago today in Oakland...tossed six innings and allowed five of the hits...allowed only one base runner to advance past third base.

COLÓN vs. SEATTLE: Is 18-12 with a 3.90 ERA (223.2 ip, 220 h, 107 r, 97 er, 49 bb, 149 so, 19 hr) in 35 career appearances, all starts...the 18 wins are the most among active pitchers against the Mariners...is

11-1 with a 2.04 ERA (21 er in 92.2 ip) in 13 career starts at Safeco Field...the .917 winning percentage is the best by any pitcher at Safeco Field with seven or more decisions and the ERA is second best among pitchers with 60 or more innings pitched (Haren, 2.00)...is 9-0 with a 1.85 ERA (15 er in 73.0 ip) over his last 10 starts at Safeco Field...is 2-0 with a 3.00 ERA (15.0 ip, 15 h, 5 r, 5 er, 2 bb, 7 so) in two starts this year...the first win came in a 10-2 victory in Oakland July 16...allowed two runs in

the second inning on a two-run single by Chavez...also won his next start at Seattle June 21, a 6-3 A's win...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a three-run home run to Franklin in the third inning...those were the only runs he would allow in eight innings
