### A's vs. TIGERS

The A's won the season series this year, 4-3...lost two of three in Oakland in April but won three of four at Detroit in late August...hit .285 with 42 runs in the seven games (6.0 per game)...however, allowed 40 runs for a 5.40 ERA...over the last eight years, the A's have won three season series, lost three season series and split two...are 35-32 over that span (since 2006), which does not include 2-7 in postseason play...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 243-235 against the Tigers...that includes 135-105 in Oakland, 106-128 in Detroit and 2-2 in Las Vegas...are 30-22 at Comerica Park...all-time, the A's are 911-988 against the Tigers.

### THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1980** Rickey Henderson steals two bases in the penultimate game of the season to become the first Athletic to swipe 100 bases in a season...he would go on to steal 100 bases two more times...in **1987**, in his final Major League at bat, Reggie Jackson singles to center field for his 2584<sup>th</sup> career hit in the A's 5-2 loss at Chicago...in **1989** Rickey Henderson is 2 for 2 with two walks and four steals in the A's 6-3 win over Toronto in Game 2 of the ALCS...in **1992** Rickey Henderson singles off Milwaukee's Cal Eldred in his final at bat of the regular season for his 2000<sup>th</sup> career hit...in **2002** Ray Durham and Scott Hatteberg start the game with back-to-back home runs as the A's defeat Minnesota 6-3 in Game 3 of the ALDS...in **2006** Mark Kotsay has an inside-the-park home run in the A's 5-2 win over Minnesota in Game 2 of the ALDS.

### ABOUT THE A's

**ABOUT THE A'S:** The A's return to postseason play for the second consecutive season...this is the A's eighth appearance in the Division Series, which is tied for fifth most all-time...have won two American League Division Series, both sweeps (1981 vs. Kansas City, 2006 vs. Minnesota)...the five losses all went the full five games (2000-01 vs. New York, 2002 vs. Minnesota, 2003 vs. Boston; 2012 vs. Detroit)...have a 16-15 (.516) record in the Division Series and the 16 wins are tied for fifth most all-time...are 8-8 at home compared to 8-7 on the road...have won six of the last nine ALDS games at home (since 2002 Game 2) but have lost five of the last seven on the road (since 2002 Game 4).

**FOR OPENERS:** This is the A's 33<sup>rd</sup> postseason series, the 25<sup>th</sup> in Oakland history...have an all-time record of 19-13 in Game 1, including 5-2 in the Division Series...the two ALDS Game 1 losses came last year against Detroit and 2002 against Minnesota...have lost three of their last four postseason series openers, with the one win coming in the 2003 ALDS against Boston in Oakland...have an 8-5 record when opening a postseason series at home, including 2-1 in the Division Series.

**POSTSEASON PLAY:** The A's are making their seventh postseason appearance in the last 14 years...have six American League West championships and one Wild Card appearance over that span...it is the 17<sup>th</sup> postseason appearance in Oakland history and the 25<sup>th</sup> in franchise history...that is fourth most all-time behind the Yankees (51), Dodgers (27) and Cardinals (26)...have an 80-72 (.526) record all-time in the postseason...the 80 wins are fourth most by any team...only the Yankees (223), Cardinals (117) and Giants (84) have more...have lost eight of their last nine postseason series, dating back to the 1990 World Series...are 15-27 (.357) over that span with the only series win coming in the 2006 ALDS against Minnesota.

**POSTSEASON EXPERIENCE:** Of the 25 players on the A's Division Series roster, 13 were on the A's ALDS roster last year (Anderson, Balfour, Blevins, Céspedes, Cook, Crisp, Donaldson, Doolittle, Moss, Norris, Parker, Reddick, Smith)...an additional five players have postseason experience with other teams (Callaspo, Colón, Lowrie, Suzuki, Young)...seven players will be making their postseason debut (Barton, Chavez, Gray, Otero, Sogard, Straily, Vogt)...Bartolo Colón has the most postseason appearances with this being his sixth (1998-99 and 2001 with Cleveland and 2004-05 with Los Angeles)...Grant Balfour is making his fifth postseason appearance, Coco Crisp and Seth Smith are playing in their fourth postseason and Jed Lowrie, Jarrod Parker and Chris Young are in their third...seven of the players have gone on to play in the LCS (Balfour, Callaspo, Colón, Crisp, Lowrie, Smith, Young) and three have played in the World Series (Balfour, Crisp, Smith).

**CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY:** The A's won their second straight American League West title in 2013, marking the fourth time in Oakland history the A's have won consecutive division championships (1971-75, 1988-90, 2002-03)...it was the A's sixth AL West Championship in the last 14 years and the 16<sup>th</sup> in Oakland history, which is third most all-time...only the Yankees (18) and Braves (17) have more division championships...the A's have also won six AL Pennants and four World Championships in 46 seasons in Oakland...have won nine World Championships overall, a total surpassed only by the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11)...the A's also have 15 AL Championships.

**A's AND TIGERS IN THE POSTSEASON:** This is the A's third consecutive postseason series against the Tigers...lost the American League Division Series last year 3-2 after being swept by Detroit in the 2006 American League Championship Series...are batting .206 (59 for 286) with 20 runs scored in the nine games (2.2 runs per game)...have lost nine of their last 12 postseason games to the Tigers, including each of the last four in Detroit...the A's and Tigers also met in the 1972 ALCS, which was the last time the A's won a postseason game in Detroit...defeated the Tigers 2-1 in Game 5 on October 12, 1972 and would go on to win to their first World Championship in Oakland...the A's are 5-9 (.357) against the Tigers in the postseason, including 4-3 in Oakland and 1-6 in Detroit...Detroit is one of four teams the A's have a losing record against in the postseason (0-4 vs. Braves, 4-9 vs. Yankees, 4-7 vs. Reds).

**2013 RECAP:** The A's compiled a 96-66 record, which was second best in the American League and tied for third best in the majors...this was the second consecutive season the A's finished with the best record in the AL...finished 5½ games ahead of second place Texas, which was the A's largest margin since 1992 when they won the West by six games...the 96-66 (.593) record was the A's best since 2003 when they also went 96-66...it tied for the 10th best record in Oakland history...won 90 games for the second consecutive season and eighth time in the last 14 years...have 17 seasons with 90 or more wins since moving to Oakland in 1968...the only Major League teams with as many 90-win seasons over that span are the Yankees (23) and Atlanta (17)...are 190-134 over the last two years, which is tied with Atlanta for the best record in the majors...it is 6½ games better than the next closest AL team (Texas, 184-141)...finished with a winning record for the second consecutive season, marking the first time the A's put together back-to-back winning seasons since 1999-2006 when they had eight straight.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's hit 74 home runs over the final 49 games beginning Aug. 9, which was 14 more than any other team (Baltimore, 60)...hit .366 with 34 runs scored in a four-game series at Detroit August 26-29 to begin a season-ending stretch where the A's batted .294 with 202 runs scored in 33 games (6.1 runs per game)...compiled a 24-9 (.727) record over that span, which was the best in the majors...the pitching staff compiled a 2.78 ERA over the final 12 games...A's starting pitchers went 21-6 with a 2.99 ERA over the final 33 games...the A's bullpen did not allow a run in eight of the final nine games for a 0.94 ERA

### 49 LHP BRETT ANDERSON

**Last Outing:** 9/28 at Seattle (ND, 1.0 ip, 0 h, 0 r, 0 er, 1 bb, 0 so)

**ALDS:** (0 g)

- Made his postseason debut with a start in Game 3 of the ALDS last year against Detroit...combined with Cook, Doolittle and Balfour on a four-hit shutout in the A's 2-0 win (6.0 ip, 2 h, 2 bb, 6 so).
- Faced the Tigers twice this year and was 0-1 with a save in two games, one start (8.2 ip, 13 h, 10 r, 10 er, 3 bb, 3 so, 3 hr, 10.38 ERA)...is 2-3 with a 6.04 ERA (17 er in 25.1 ip) in six career regular season appearances, including five starts, against Detroit.
- Pitched exclusively in relief after being reinstated from the disabled list Aug. 28 and was 0-0 with a 5.74 ERA (10 er in 15.2 ip) and .306 (19 for 62) opponents batting average in 10 games.

### 50 RHP GRANT BALFOUR

**Last Outing:** 9/29 at Seattle (ND, 1.0 ip, 1 h, 0 r, 0 er, 0 bb, 0 so)

**ALDS:** (0 g)

- Has appeared in postseason play four times with Minnesota (2004), Tampa Bay (2008, 2010) and Oakland (2012)...is 0-1 with a save and a 3.78 ERA (7 er in 16.2 ip) in 17 career appearances...including a 0.79 ERA (11.1 ip, 7 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 9 so) in 10 LDS appearances.
- Had a loss, a save and a blown save in three outings against Detroit this year (2.2 ip, 5 h, 5 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr)...had a loss and a save in two outings against the Tigers in the ALDS last year (1.2 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 1 bb, 2 so).
- Allowed at least one run in four of his final 12 regular season games (11.2 ip, 12 h, 8 r, 8 er, 9 bb, 13 so, 6.17 ERA)...had five saves and two blown saves.

### 13 LHP JERRY BLEVINS

**Last Outing:** 9/28 at Seattle (ND, 0.2 ip, 0 h, 0 r, 0 er, 0 bb, 0 so)

**ALDS:** (0 g)

- Made his postseason debut with three scoreless appearances against Detroit in the ALDS last year (3.2 ip, 1 h).
- Faced Detroit three times this year (3.1 ip, 7 h, 3 r, 3 er, 3 so, 8.10 ERA) and has a 6.30 ERA (7 er in 10.0 ip) in 11 career regular season appearances against the Tigers.
- Did not allow a run over his final nine regular season outings (7.2 ip, 4 h, 1 bb, 6 so).

### 60 RHP JESSE CHAVEZ

**Last Outing:** 9/29 at Seattle (ND, 1.0 ip, 0 h, 0 r, 0 er, 0 bb, 2 so)

**ALDS:** (0 g)

- Has no postseason experience.
- Has not faced Detroit since September 18, 2012 (1.0 ip, 4 h, 4 r, 4 er)...has a 14.00 ERA (14 er in 9.0 ip) in seven career appearances against the Tigers.
- Did not allow an earned run over his final six regular season outings beginning September 15 (6.1 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 bb, 8 so).

### 48 RHP RYAN COOK

**ALDS:** (0 g)

- Made his postseason debut in the ALDS against Detroit last year and worked in four of the five games (3.1 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 4 so, 8.10 ERA)...was charged with a blown save in Game 2 but picked up the win in Game 4.
- Has not allowed a run in three appearances against Detroit this year (2.2 ip, 3 h, 2 bb, 1 so) and five regular season outings in his career (5.1 ip).
- Was 2-2 with four blown saves and a 4.11 ERA over his final 21 regular season games (15.1 ip, 23 h, 8 r, 7 er, 11 bb, 19 so).

### 62 LHP SEAN DOOLITTLE

- Made his postseason debut against Detroit in the ALDS last year and compiled a 3.38 ERA (1 er in 2.2 ip) in three appearances...was charged with the blown save in Game 2 after allowing two unearned runs in the seventh inning.
- Faced the Tigers three times this year (3.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er)...has a 2.25 ERA (1 er in 4.0 ip) in four career regular season outings against Detroit.
- Did not allow a run in 11 of his final 12 regular season outings (14.1 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 12 so)...was credited with his only two saves of the season over that stretch.

- Made his postseason debut with Arizona in 2007 and went 0 for 2 in two pinch hitting appearances, both in the NLCS against Colorado.
- Hit safely in each of his seven games against Detroit this year (11 for 28, .393) and has a 14-game hitting streak against the Tigers (18 for 49, .367)...is a .315 (64 for 203) career hitter against Detroit with seven home runs and 27 RBI in 56 games.
- Had four home runs and 12 RBI over his final 16 regular season games and batted .271 (16 for 59) over that stretch.

- Made 10 of his final 12 regular season starts at designated hitter and was 11 for 48 (.229) with four home runs and 11 RBI in 12 games total over that span.
