## DETROIT TIGERS SEASON IN REVIEW

**A THIRD STRAIGHT AMERICAN LEAGUE CENTRAL DIVISION TITLE:** The Tigers finished with a 93-69 record and clinched the American League Central Division for the third straight season on September 25 at Minnesota and advanced to the playoffs for the 15th time in franchise history. It marks the sixth time the Tigers have captured a division title since divisional play began during the 1969 season. Detroit has advanced to the playoffs in three straight seasons for the first time since the club also did so from 1907-1909.

**CABRERA'S THIRD STRAIGHT BATTING CROWN:** Miguel Cabrera led the American League with a .348 batting average to capture his third straight batting crown. He is the first Tigers player to lead the American League in hitting in three consecutive seasons since Ty Cobb did so in three straight seasons (1917-19). Cabrera led the American League with a .330 average during 2012, and a .344 batting average during the 2011 season.

**TIGERS PITCHERS ESTABLISH MAJOR LEAGUE STRIKEOUT RECORD:** Tigers pitchers finished the season with 1,428 strikeouts to establish a new Major League record for most strikeouts in a season. The previous record was 1,404 strikeouts on the season, established by the 2003 Cubs.

**FIRST IN THE AMERICAN LEAGUE IN HITTING:** The Tigers finished first in the American League with a .283 batting average, 1,625 hits, and a .446 on-base percentage, while they were second with 767 RBI. The .283 average is the highest for the Tigers since the club batted .287 in 2007.

**THIRD IN THE AMERICAN LEAGUE IN ERA:** The Tigers finished third in the American League with a 3.61 ERA during the 2013 season. The club posted a 3.75 ERA in 2012.

**SCHERZER LEADS THE MAJORS IN WINS:** Max Scherzer led the Major Leagues with 21 wins on the season. He became just the 24th pitcher in franchise history to surpass 20 wins on the season, and the first since Justin Verlander posted 24 wins in 2011.

**SCHERZER, VERLANDER, SANCHEZ SURPASS 200 STRIKEOUTS:** Max Scherzer finished second in the American League with 240 strikeouts on the season, while Justin Verlander finished fourth with 217 strikeouts, and Anibal Sanchez finished sixth with 202 strikeouts. Scherzer, Verlander and Sanchez are the first trio of Tigers pitchers to each surpass 200 strikeouts in a single season in franchise history, and are just the third trio to each surpass 200 strikeouts in Major League History, joining Larry Dierker, Tom Griffin and Don Wilson from the 1969 Astros, and Dave Boswell, Dean Chance and Jim Kaat from the 1967 Minnesota Twins in accomplishing the feat.

**SCHERZER, VERLANDER SURPASS 200 INNINGS PITCHED AND 200 STRIKEOUTS:** Justin Verlander and Max Scherzer each surpassed 200 innings pitched and 200 strikeouts during the 2013 season. They are the first pair of Tigers pitchers to toss 200-or-more innings, while striking out 200-or-more batters since Mickey Lolich and Joe Coleman did so in 1973.

**SANCHEZ CAPTURES AMERICAN LEAGUE ERA CROWN:** Anibal Sanchez led the American League with a 2.57 ERA (182.0IP/52ER) during the season. He is the seventh pitcher in Tigers history to capture the ERA crown and the first since Justin Verlander did so with a 2.40 ERA in 2011.

**50 WINS AT HOME:** The Tigers compiled a 50-31 record at Comerica Park this season. The club has won 50-or-more games in each of the last five seasons (2009-13). It marked the 22nd time in franchise history the Tigers have won 50-or-more games at home during a season.

**SIX TIGERS SELECTED TO AMERICAN LEAGUE ALL-STAR SQUAD:** Miguel Cabrera was elected by the fans as the starting third baseman for the 2013 All-Star Game at Citi Field, while Prince Fielder, Torii Hunter, Jhonny Peralta, Max Scherzer and Justin Verlander were all named to the All-Star team. It marked the eighth All-Star selection for Cabrera, fifth for Fielder, fifth for Hunter, second for Peralta, first for Scherzer, and sixth for Verlander.

**CABRERA ELECTED STARTING THIRD BASEMAN FOR AMERICAN LEAGUE:** Miguel Cabrera was elected as the American League's starting third baseman for the All-Star Game, and he became the third Tigers third baseman to start the All-Star Game and the first since Ray Boone in 1954.

**LEYLAND MANAGES AMERICAN LEAGUE TEAM IN MIDSUMMER CLASSIC:** Jim Leyland managed his third All-Star Game and lead the American League to victory to secure home-field advantage for the American League in the World Series.

**CABRERA, FIELDER FORM POWERFUL COMBO:** Miguel Cabrera belted 44 home runs and drove in 137 runs during the 2013 season, while Prince Fielder knocked 25 home runs and drove in 106 RBI. They are just the seventh pair of Tigers to hit 25-or-more home runs in a season and drive in 100-or-more RBI.

**A MODERN DAY IRON MAN:** Prince Fielder was one of only two players in the American League to play in 162 games during the 2013 season, and he has now played in 505 consecutive games dating back to September 14, 2010. Fielder's streak of 505 consecutive games played is the longest such streak among all active major league players.

**HUNTER REACHES MAJOR MILESTONES:** Torii Hunter recorded the 2000th hit of his Major League career on April 9 vs. Toronto and belted his 300th career home run on May 16 at Minnesota. He is one of only 11 active active players to surpass 300 home runs and 2,000 hits in his major league career.

**NOTES ON THE SKIPPER:** Jim Leyland is in his eighth season as the manager of the Tigers, compiling a 700-596 record (.540).

- Leyland has compiled 1,769 wins during his major league managerial career, 15th-most all-time in major league history. Leyland is tops among all active major league managers with 1,769 wins.
- Leyland has managed 3,500 games during his career, placing him in 15th place all-time in major league history.
- Leyland is one of only three managers in Tigers history to register at least 700 victories with the club. Sparky Anderson (1,331 wins) and Hughie Jennings (1,131 wins) are the two other managers in Tigers history with at least 700 wins with the club.
- The Tigers have advanced to the post-season four times during Leyland's managerial career with the club, including winning the American League Central Division in each of the last three seasons. Leyland joins Hughie Jennings as the only two managers in Tigers history to lead the club to post-season play in three-or-more seasons.
- This will be Leyland's eighth postseason appearance as a manager, having been three times with the Pittsburgh Pirates, once with the Florida Marlins and three times with the Detroit.

**TIGERS SURPASS THREE MILLION MARK:** For the second consecutive season, the Tigers surpassed the three million mark in tickets sold for the fourth time in franchise history in 2013, finishing with 3,083,397 tickets sold. Detroit also surpassed the three million mark in tickets sold in 2007, 2008 and 2012.

**TIGERS PLAYERS LAUNCH NEW PROGRAMS IN THE COMMUNITY:** Members of the 2013 Detroit Tigers got involved in the community like never before with the launch of five new programs in the greater Detroit community:

- **Cabrera's Chamitos:** Each Wednesday home game, Miguel Cabrera welcomes a group of 20 fans from Southwest Detroit to Comerica Park to enjoy a Tigers game and meet the All-Star slugger.
- **Hunter's Homies:** Torii Hunter partnered with the Detroit Tigers Foundation to welcome disadvantaged youth from the Boys and Girls Clubs of greater Detroit to watch a game at Comerica Park and meet Hunter prior to the game.
- **Sanchez' Smiles:** In partnership with the Tigers Foundation, Anibal Sanchez invited patients and their families from the craniofacial and cleft lip clinic from Children's Hospital of Michigan to Comerica Park to enjoy the game from his private suite.
- **Verlander's Wins for Warriors:** In August, Justin Verlander announced a commitment of \$1 million to support the emotional health and mental well-being of veterans in Iraq and Afghanistan.

**ALVAREZ, TRAVIS EARN MINOR LEAGUE HONORS:** Jose Alvarez and Devon Travis were named the Tigers Minor League Pitcher and Player of the Year, respectively. Alvarez posted a 2.80 ERA (128.2/40ER) and 115 strikeouts in 21 games for Toledo. Travis batted .351 (177x504) with 28 doubles, four triples, 16 home runs and 76 RBI in 132 games between West Michigan and Lakeland.

## 2013 DETROIT TIGERS PLAYERS

### AL ALBURQUERQUE #62

- Made the Tigers Opening Day roster for the first time in his career, establishing career-highs with 53 appearances, 49.0 innings pitched and 70 strikeouts.
- Ranked second among all American League relievers with 12.86 strikeouts per nine innings.
- Tossed a season-high 2.0 innings on April 17 at Seattle -- matched the high on April 21 at Los Angeles, July 27 vs. Philadelphia and September 21 vs. Chicago.
- Struck out a season-high five batters on April 21 at Los Angeles.
- Posted a 1.50 ERA (12.0IP/2ER) and 21 strikeouts in 12 appearances during April.
- Optioned to Triple A Toledo on May 16 -- posted an 0-1 record, a 3.14 ERA (14.1IP/5ER) and 27 strikeouts in 10 outings with Toledo.
- Recalled from Triple A Toledo prior to the game on June 21.
- Posted a 1-1 record and a 4.66 ERA (9.2IP/5ER) and 11 strikeouts in 12 games during August.
- Compiled a 2-0 record and a 3.60 ERA (10.0IP/4ER) and 15 strikeouts in 11 games during September.
- Limited lefties to a .228 (18x79) average...righties hit .202 (21x104) with him on the mound.
- Compiled a 2-1 record and a 2.86 ERA (28.1IP/9ER) at home...while he posted a 2-2 record a 6.97 ERA (20.2IP/16ER) on the road.

### JOSE ALVAREZ #52

- Appeared in 14 games as he spent the majority of the season with Triple A Toledo.
- Tabbed as having the best changeup and control in the International League by *Baseball America*.
- Had his contract purchased from Toledo prior to the game on June 9 vs. CLE...made his major league debut and earned his first major league win the same day -- became the first Tigers pitcher to win his debut since Alfredo Figaro in 1999.
- Became one of four Tigers pitchers since 1916 to go six-or-more innings while giving up one-run-or-less in his major league debut, joining Justin Thompson (1996), Pat Thompson (1979) and Joe Sullivan (1935).
- Recalled from Toledo by the Tigers on June 20.
- Optioned to Toledo by the Tigers on July 5.
- Recalled from Toledo by the Tigers on August 16 and started one game as the 26th man before being optioned back to Toledo the same day.
- Recalled from Toledo by the Tigers on August 21 and appeared in three games before being optioned back to Toledo on August 28.
- Recalled from Toledo by the Tigers on September 3.
- Appeared in five games out of the bullpen for the Tigers in September, posting a 2.70 ERA (6.2IP/2ER) and five strikeouts.
- Limited lefthanded hitters to a .265 batting average (13x49)...righties hit .287 (29x101) against him.
- Finished the season ranked third in the International League with a 2.80 ERA (128.2IP/40ER), while he led the Mud Hens with eight wins.
- Named the Tigers Minor League Pitcher of the Year.

### ALEX AVILA #13

- Finished his fourth season with the Tigers in 2013, seeing action in 102 games with the club.
- Sidelined June 17-July 2 with a left forearm contusion.
- Assigned to Triple A Toledo for an injury rehabilitation assignment on June 23 -- hit .242 (8x33) with three runs scored, two doubles, one home run and five RBI in eight games with Toledo.
- Belted his first career grand slam on July 30 vs. Washington off Stephen Strasburg -- drove in a season-high four runs that same game.
- Compiled a season-high six-game hitting streak July 24-31, batting .348 (8x23) with two doubles, two home runs and nine RBI during the streak.
- Hit .269 (18x67) with four doubles, three home runs and 19 RBI during July.
- Sidelined August 11-24 with delayed concussive symptoms.
- Assigned to Toledo for an injury rehabilitation assignment on August 22 -- batted .273 (3x11) with two runs scored and a double in four games with Toledo.
- Matched a career-high with four hits on September 10 at Chicago.
- Hit .343 (23x67) with four doubles, two home runs and eight RBI during September--ranked third in the American League with a .343 average and a .430 on-base percentage during that stretch.
- Hit .139 (11x79) with lefthanders on the mound...while he batted .255 (64x251) against righties.
- Recorded a .259 batting average (38x147) at home...posted a .202 (37x183) average on the road.
- Batted .177 with five doubles, six home runs and 21 RBI prior to the All-Star break...batted .296 (37x125) with eight doubles, five home runs and 24 RBI after the break.
- Threw out 12.0 percent of baserunners attempting to steal (10x83).

### JOAQUIN BENOIT #53

- Completed his third season with the Tigers, appearing in 66 games out of the bullpen.
- Finished the season ranked ninth among all AL relievers with a 2.01 ERA (67.0IP/15ER), while he was 10th with a .197 opponents batting average, and tied for 12th with 24 saves.
- Fanned a season-high four batters on April 13 at Oakland.
- Compiled a 1.54 ERA (11.2IP/2ER) and 15 strikeouts in 11 outings during May.
- Posted a 1-0 record and a 1.93 ERA (9.1IP/2ER) three saves and 12 strikeouts in nine games during June.
- Recorded a 0.00 ERA (9.2IP/0ER), five saves and 11 strikeouts in 11 games during July.
- Did not allow a run over a 16-outing stretch June 27-August 5 -- saved nine games, while striking out 16 during that stretch.
- Matched a career-high four-game winning streak May 23-August 29.
- Converted 22 straight saves from April 17-September 19 -- the 22-game stretch was the third longest such stretch in the American League.

- Compiled a 0-1 record and a 4.38 ERA (12.1IP/6ER) seven saves and 12 strikeouts during September.
- Opponents hit just .114 (8x70) with two doubles, one home run and 11 RBI with runners in scoring position -- ranked fifth among all American League relievers (min. 25.0IP) with a .114 opponents batting average with runners in scoring position.
- Limited lefthanded hitters to a .194 batting average (27x139)...righties hit .202 (20x99) with him on the mound.
- Compiled a 4-1 record and a 3.00 ERA (33.0IP/11ER), 11 saves and 32 strikeouts in 35 games at home...posted a 1.06 ERA (34.0IP/4ER), 13 saves and and 41 strikeouts in 31 games on the road.
- Posted a 2-0 record and a 1.64 ERA (38.1IP/7ER), eight saves and 50 strikeouts in 38 games prior to the All-Star Break...compiled a 2-1 record and a 2.51 ERA (28.2IP/8ER), 16 saves and 23 strikeouts in 28 games following the break.

### JEREMY BONDERMAN #38

- Began the season with the Seattle Mariners -- compiled a 1-3 record, a 4.93 ERA (38.1IP/21ER) and 16 strikeouts in seven starts.
- Designated for assignment by the Mariners on July 11 -- signed to a minor league deal by the Tigers on July 14 and assigned to Toledo.
- Posted a 0.00 ERA (9.2IP/0ER) and five strikeouts in seven outings with Toledo.
- Had his contract purchased by the Tigers prior to the game on August 5.
- Recorded the win on August 7 at Cleveland -- his first win with the Tigers since September 18, 2010 vs. Chicago.
- Compiled a 1-1 record, a 2.51 ERA (14.1IP/4ER) and 12 strikeouts in nine games with the club in August.
- Optioned to Toledo following the game on August 31 -- had his contract recalled by the Tigers on September 3.
- Appeared in two games with the Tigers in September posting a 30.86 ERA (2.1IP/8ER) and four strikeouts during that stretch.

### MIGUEL CABRERA #24

- Elected the starting third baseman for the American League in the All-Star Game -- marks his eighth All-Star Game (fourth in the American League), and first fan-elected start.
- Led the American League with a .348 average, a .442 on-base percentage and a .636 slugging percentage, while he was tied for first with 37 go-ahead RBI, second with 44 home runs, 137 RBI and 353 total bases, tied for second with 103 runs scored, 193 hits, third with 90 walks, and 9th with 52 multi-hit games.
- Won his third consecutive batting title in 2013, batting .348 (193x555) in 148 games on the season...became the first Tigers player to win three consecutive batting titles since Ty Cobb also did so in three straight seasons (1917-1919).
- Collected 137 RBI during the season, marking the sixth consecutive season he has posted 100-or-more RBI for the Tigers--became just the second player in Tigers history to drive in 100-or-more RBI in six straight seasons...Harry Heilmann drove in 100-or-more runs in seven consecutive seasons (1932-1936).
- Matched a career-high with 44 home runs on the season.
- Became just the third player in franchise history to connect for 30-or-more home runs and 120-or-more RBI in consecutive seasons (Joins Greenberg, Fielder).
- Tabbed the best hitter in the American League by *Baseball America*.
- Collected at least one RBI in each of the team's first five games this season, marking the longest streak by a Tigers player to start the season since Bobby Higginson did so in the first five games in 2004.
- Collected a season-high four hits on April 6 against New York -- matched the high with four hits on April 9 vs. Boston, May 4 at Houston, May 19 at Texas, June 21 vs. Boston, June 28 at Tampa Bay and July 7 at Cleveland.
- Drove in 28 runs during the month of April, marking the most for any Tigers player since at least 1921.
- Named the Tigers Player of the Month for April after batting .363 (37x102) with 21 runs scored, six doubles, four home runs and 28 RBI in 25 games -- tied for first in the American League with 37 hits and 28 RBI, while he was third with a .363 average during April.
- Knocked the 1,000th hit of his Tigers career on May 2 at Houston becoming the 30th player in franchise history with 1,000 hits.
- Matched a career-high with six RBI on May 4 at Houston.
- Matched a career-high with three home runs on May 19 vs. Texas.
- Collected the 400th double of his career in the first inning on May 30 vs. Pittsburgh.
- Selected the Tigers Player of the Month and the American League Player of the Month for May after batting .379 (44x116) with 23 runs scored, nine doubles, 12 home runs and 33 RBI in 28 games during the month -- first in the American League with 12 home runs, 33 RBI and a .379 average, while he was tied for first with 44 hits and a .455 on-base percentage during that stretch.
- Clubbed the 200th home run of his Tigers career on June 1 vs. Baltimore, becoming just the 10th player in franchise history to record 200 home runs.
- Established a 44-game on-base streak from May 14 - June 30, marking the second-longest streak in the majors this season (Cuddyer, 46-game streak).
- Posted a season-high 15 game hitting streak June 15-30 -- batted .458 (27x59) with 12 runs scored, five doubles, seven home runs and 13 RBI.
- Named the Tigers Player of the Month for June after batting .378 (37x98) with 20 runs scored, five doubles, nine home runs and 21 RBI in 27 games during the month...finished third in the American League with 37 hits and a .378 average, while he was tied for third with nine home runs.
- Connected for 30 home runs prior to the All-Star Break -- marks the most home runs by a Tigers player prior to the All-Star break in franchise history.
- Batted .288 (19x66) with seven home runs and 17 RBI in 20 games during July.
- Garnered American League Player of the Week honors August 5-11 after batting .429 (12x28) with four doubles, two home runs and 11 RBI in seven games during the week.

## 2013 DETROIT TIGERS PLAYERS

- Clubbed his sixth career walk-off home run on August 17 vs. Kansas City off Aaron Crow.
- Named the American League Player of the Month for August -- hit .356 (36x101) with five doubles, 11 home runs and 31 RBI in 27 games during the month...tied for first in the American League with 11 home runs and 31 RBI, finished fourth with a .356 batting average and tied for tenth with 36 hits...marks the fourth time he earned American League Player of the Month honors with Detroit (also, June of 2013, August of 2012, July of 2008). He is the only Tigers player to ever win the award more than twice.
- Hit .278 (20x72) with one double, one home run and seven RBI in 21 games during September.
- Led the American League with a .397 (62x156) average with runners in scoring position.
- Batted .368 (49x133) with lefties on the mound...hit .341 (144x422) against righthanded pitching.
- Led the American League with a .366 (97x265) average at home...finished second with a .331 (96x290) average on the road.
- Hit .365 (132x362) with 20 doubles, one triple, 30 home runs and 95 RBI before the All-Star Break...batted .316 (61x193) with 30 runs scored, six doubles, 14 home runs and 42 RBI in 55 games after the break.

### NICK CASTELLANOS #30

- Spent the majority of the season at Triple A Toledo -- led the International League with 81 runs scored, while he was tied for first with 37 doubles, second with 147 hits and fourth with 76 RBI.
- Named the best batting prospect in the International League by *Baseball America*.
- Batted .361 (39x108) with nine doubles, five home runs and 17 RBI in 28 games during June.
- Selected to the International League All-Star team.
- Had his contract purchased from Toledo prior to the game on September 1 vs. Cleveland--made his major league debut the same day.
- Collected his first career major league hit on September 7 at Kansas City, an infield single.
- Appeared in 11 games with the Tigers in September, batting .278 (5x18).
- One of 10 players named to the International League's postseason All-Star squad.

### PHIL COKE #40

- Completed his fourth season with the Tigers, appearing in 49 games out of the bullpen.
- Tossed a season-best two innings on April 21 at Los Angeles -- fanned a season-high four batters that same day.
- Sidelined April 26 - May 11 with a right groin strain.
- Assigned to Triple A Toledo for an injury rehabilitation assignment on May 6 -- posted a 1-0 record, 0.00 ERA (2.0IP/0ER) and one strikeout with Toledo.
- Made the 300th appearance of his major league career on July 9 vs. Chicago.
- Compiled a 2.50 ERA (8.0IP/2ER) and five strikeouts in 10 outings during July.
- Posted a 2.45 ERA (3.2IP/1ER) in eight appearances during August.
- Optioned to Toledo by the Tigers on August 21...appeared in four games with Toledo posting a 0.00 ERA (4.0IP/0ER) and eight strikeouts before being recalled from Toledo by the Tigers on August 31.
- Posted a 0-0 record, and an 11.57 ERA (2.1IP/3ER) in six appearances during September.
- Lefthanded batters hit .299 (23x77) against him...righties batted .282 (20x71) with him on the mound.
- Posted an 0-2 record and a 7.71 ERA (18.2IP/16ER) in 23 games at home... compiled an 0-3 record and a 3.20 ERA (19.2IP/7ER) on the road.
- Recorded an 0-5 record, and a 5.83 ERA (29.1IP/19ER) in 30 games before the All-Star Break...posted a 4.00 ERA (9.0IP/4ER) in 19 games after the break.

### ANDY DIRKS #12

- Completed his second full season at the major league level with the Tigers, appearing in a career-high 130 games.
- Established career highs with 60 runs scored, 112 hits, nine home runs, and 37 RBI on the season.
- Hit his first career grand slam on May 13 vs. Houston-- matched a career high with four RBI in the game.
- Established a career-high six-game hitting streak June 19-26, batting .444 (8x18) during that stretch.
- Batted .286 (18x63) with 13 runs scored, a home run and five RBI in 21 games during August.
- Established a career high with five hits and four runs scored on September 6 at Kansas City.
- Hit his second career pinch-hit home run on September 21 vs. Chicago.
- Hit .266 (18x69) with nine runs scored, two doubles, a triple, one home run and seven RBI in 21 games during September.
- Posted a .234 average (18x77) against lefthanded pitchers...hit .260 (94x361) with righties on the mound.
- Hit .284 (58x204) at Comerica Park...batted .231 on the road.
- Batted .243 (67x276) with six home runs and 23 RBI in 78 games prior to the All-Star Break...batted .278 (45x162) with three home runs and 14 RBI in 53 games after the break.

### OCTAVIO DOTEI #20

- Made the Tigers Opening Day Roster for the second consecutive season.
- Appeared in six games with the Tigers in April posting a 13.50 ERA (4.2IP/7ER), before being sidelined for the remainder of the season on April 20 with right elbow inflammation.

- Tossed a complete game shutout on May 24 vs. Minnesota -- allowed just one hit in 9.0 innings to record his fourth career one-hit game -- he joined Bob Feller as the only two pitchers since at least 1916 to record five complete games allowing one hit-or-fewer in the first 155 games of their major league career.

- Compiled a 2-1 record and a 2.05 ERA (30.2IP/7ER) and 39 strikeouts in five games during September.
- Limited lefthanded batters to a .246 (91x370) average...righties hit .208 (65x312) with him on the mound.
- Posted an 8-3 record, and a 2.70 ERA (93.1IP/28ER) and 110 strikeouts in 14 starts at home...compiled a 6-5 record and a 2.44 ERA (88.2IP/24ER) and 92 strikeouts in 15 games on the road.
- Compiled a 7-6 record and a 2.93 ERA (92.0IP/30ER) and 111 strikeouts in 15 games prior to the All-Star Break...posted a 7-2 record and a 2.20 ERA (90.0IP/22ER) in 14 games after the break.

- Completed his 10th season with the Tigers in 2013, seeing action at second base, third base and shortstop.
- Batted .313 (15x48) with seven runs scored, one home run and five RBI in August.
- Hit .196 (10x51) with two RBI vs. lefthanded pitchers...batted .234 (36x154) with one home run and 12 RBI vs. righthanded pitchers.
- Posted a .242 average (23x95) in 38 games at home...batted .209 (23x110) in 42 games on the road.
- Batted .160 (13x81) in 31 games prior to the All-Star Break...hit .266 (33x124) in 49 games following the break.

### MAX SCHERZER #37

- Selected to the American League All-Star team for the first time in his career as he completed his fourth season with the Tigers -- elected to start the All-Star Game in New York...marked the 11th time a Tigers pitcher was elected to start the All-Star Game.
- Led the American League with 21 wins, while he finished second with 240 strikeouts and 10.08 strikeouts per nine inning, and fifth with a 2.90 ERA and tied for fifth with 214.1 innings pitched.
- Fanned 240 batters during the season -- marked back-to-back seasons where he fanned 200-or-more batters.
- Struck out a season-high 12 batters on April 17 at Seattle -- recorded 10-or-more strikeouts in eight outings this season...his eight such outings ranked second among all AL pitchers.
- Won each of his first 13 decisions to begin the season, becoming the first pitcher in franchise history to win his first 13 decisions to begin a season as a starter.
- Established a franchise record going 19 straight starts without a loss from September 23, 2012 - July 8, 2013 (Previous record, Bobo Newsom 18 starts 4/25-7/17 1940).
- Fanned six-or-more batters in each of his first 18 outings to begin the season. The 18-game streak is the second-longest such streak in American League history, trailing only Pedro Martinez' 29-game streak to begin the 2000 season. (Source: Elias Sports Bureau)
- Posted a 3-0 record, a 4.02 ERA (31.1IP/4ER) and 46 strikeouts in five starts during April.
- Named the Tigers Pitcher of the Month for May after going 4-0 with a 3.00 ERA (45.0IP/15ER) and 45 strikeouts in six starts during the month-- tied for second in the American League with four wins, while he was third with 45 strikeouts during that stretch.
- Named the Tigers Pitcher of the Month for June after posting a 5-0 record, a 2.38 ERA (24.0IP/9ER) and 40 strikeouts in five starts during the month.
- Tossed a quality start in 10 consecutive outings from May 21 - July 8 posting an 8-0 record, a 2.34 ERA (69.1IP/18ER) and 78 strikeouts during the stretch.
- Recorded the 1,000th strikeout of his major league career on August 8 at Cleveland.
- Finished 4-0 with a 2.50 ERA (29.2IP/11ER) and 37 strikeouts in six games during August -- tied for second in the AL with four wins, while he was fifth with a 2.50 ERA and tied for sixth in strikeouts.

- Recorded his 20th win of the season on September 20 vs. Chicago...became the 24th player in Tigers history to record 20-or-more wins in a season, and the first since Justin Verlander won 24 games in 2011.
- Limited lefties to a .222 (100x450) average...righties hit .165 (52x316) against him.
- Finished 2-2 with a 2.90 ERA (31.0IP/10ER) and 39 strikeouts in five games during September.
- Posted a 12-1 record, a 3.55 ERA (104.0IP/41ER) and 111 strikeouts in 16 starts at home... led the American League in wins while he was third with 111 strikeouts at home...recorded a 9-2 record and a 2.28 ERA (110.1IP/28ER) and 129 strikeouts in 16 games on the road this season...led the American League with 129 strikeouts on the road, while he finished second with a 2.28 ERA, and tied for second with nine wins.
- Compiled a 13-1 record and a 3.19 ERA (129.2IP/46ER) and 152 strikeouts in 19 starts prior to the All-Star Break...finished 8-2 with a 2.44 ERA (84.2IP/23ER) and 88 strikeouts in 13 games after the break.

### JOSE VERAS #31

- Established a career-high with 21 saves on the season.

- Acquired from the Astros in exchange for Danry Vasquez and a player to be named later on July 29.
- Posted a 1-1 record, a 3.38 ERA (13.1IP/5ER) one save, and eight strikeouts in 14 appearances with the Tigers in August.
- Lefthanded batters hit .231 (27x117) against him...righties hit .165 (18x109) with him on the mound.
- Compiled an 0-4 record, 18 saves and a 3.20 ERA (39.1IP/14ER) and 42 strikeouts in 39 games prior to the All-Star Break...posted a 0-1 record, three saves and a 2.70 ERA (23.1IP/7ER) in 28 games after the break.

### JUSTIN VERLANDER #35

- Selected to the American League's All-Star squad for the sixth time in his career as he completed his eighth full season at the major league level with the Tigers.
- Registered 217 strikeouts during the season, marking the fifth straight season he has fanned 200-or-more batters -- his streak of five straight seasons with 200-or-more strikeouts is the longest by a Tigers pitcher since Mickey Lolich did so in six straight seasons (1969-74).
- Finished fourth in the American League in strikeouts and innings pitched.
- Surpassed 200.0 innings for Detroit for the seventh straight season, tossing 218.1 innings -- his streak with 200.0-or-more innings pitched is the longest by a Tigers pitcher since Jack Morris also did so in seven straight seasons (1982-88).
- Rated as possessing the second-best curveball in the American League by *Baseball America*.
- Earned the nod as the Tigers starter on Opening Day on April 1 at Minnesota, marking the sixth consecutive season he has served as Detroit's Opening Day starter -- first Tigers pitcher to start six consecutive Opening Days since Jack Morris started 11 straight (1980-90).
- Fanned 12 batters on April 18 at Seattle, his first of four starts on the season with a double-digit strikeout total -- struck out a season-high 13 batters on May 27 vs. Pittsburgh, 12 batters on September 23 at Minnesota and 10 batters on September 29 at Miami.
- Posted a 3-2 record, and a 1.83 ERA (39.1IP/8ER) and 41 strikeouts in six starts during April -- ranked fifth in the American League with a 1.83 ERA, while he was tied for fifth with 41 strikeouts.
- Recorded a season-high four-game winning streak May 22 - June 7 -- posted a 4.85 ERA (25.0IP/14ER) and 33 strikeouts during that stretch.
- Compiled a 1-2 record, and a 2.27 ERA (39.2IP/10ER) and 48 strikeouts in six games during September -- ranked second in the American League with 48 strikeouts, while he was seventh with a 2.27 ERA.

- Spent the majority of the season with Triple A Toledo, batting .223 in 82 games with the Mud Hens.
- Sidelined April 18 - June 10 with a left heel contusion.
- Established a season-best nine-game hitting streak July 28-August 5...batted .316 (12x38) during that stretch.
- Hit .245 (13x53) with lefties on the mound...batted .218 (55x252) with righties on the hill.
- Had his contract recalled by the Tigers from Triple A Toledo on September 1...appeared in three games with the club before landing on the 60-day disabled list with a left shoulder subluxation on September 26.
