TIGERS AT A GLANCE: The Tigers finished the regular season with an 93-69 record to capture the American League Central Division championship. It marks the 15th time in franchise history the Tigers have secured a spot in the playoffs.

LOOKING BACK AT LAST NIGHT: The Tigers defeated Oakland 3-2 last night to take a 1-0 lead in the best-of-five game series. Max Scherzer (1-0) limited the Athletics to two runs on three hits, while fanning 11 batters over seven innings of work to earn the win. Joaquin Benoit sealed off the victory with a scoreless four-out save. Alex Avila led the Tigers offense with two hits, including an RBI, while Victor Martinez and Omar Infante also collected a pair of hits in the victory.

ESTABLISHING A SINGLE-GAME STRIKEOUT RECORD: Three Tigers pitchers combined to strike out 16 batters last night versus Oakland to establish the club record for strikeouts in a postseason game. The previous record of 14 was done so twice in club history with the last taking place in 2012 when the Tigers fanned 14 batters in Game One of the 2012 American League Division Series versus Oakland on October 6, 2012.

SCHERZER POSTS DOUBLE-DIGIT STRIKEOUTS: Max Scherzer fanned 11 batters last night in a win over Oakland. It marked the second time he has posted a double-digit strikeout total in a postseason start. Scherzer is the second pitcher in Tigers history with multiple double-digit strikeout performances during postseason action (other, Verlander).

CABRERA REACHES SAFELY: Miguel Cabrera finished with a single in Game One of the American League Division Series last night at Oakland and he has now reached base safely in all 25 of his postseason games with the Tigers. His 25-game streak is the longest such streak in club history, surpassing an 18-game streak by Hank Greenberg.

A THIRD STRAIGHT AMERICAN LEAGUE CENTRAL DIVISION TITLE: The Tigers clinched the American League Central Division for the third straight season and advanced to the playoffs for the 15th time in franchise history. It marks the sixth time the Tigers have captured a division title since divisional play began during the 1969 season. Detroit has advanced to the playoffs in three consecutive seasons for the second time in club history. The only other time the Tigers have advanced to the playoffs in three consecutive seasons is from 1907-1909.

FAMILIAR TERRITORY FOR THE SKIPPER: Tigers Manager Jim Leyland has guided a club to the postseason for the eighth time in his 22 seasons as a major league manager, including the fourth time during his eight-year tenure with the Tigers. He has compiled a 40-34 record (.541) during postseason action. Leyland led the Pittsburgh Pirates to three straight National League East Division titles (1990-92), and he captured the National League Wild Card with the Florida Marlins in 1997. His 1997 Marlins defeated the Cleveland Indians to win the World Series. Leyland's 2006 Tigers club won the American League Wild Card, advancing to the World Series after defeating the Yankees in the American League Division Series and Athletics in the American League Championship Series. The 2011 Tigers captured the American League Central Division title and advanced to the American League Championship Series after defeating the Yankees in the American League Division Series. His 2012 Tigers captured the American League Central Division title and advanced to the World Series after defeating the Yankees in the American League Championship Series and defeating the Athletics in the American League Division Series.

TAKING ON OAKLAND DURING THE PLAYOFFS: The Tigers are taking on Oakland in postseason play for the fourth time in franchise history. Detroit defeated Oakland 3-2 during the American League Division Series to advance to the American League Championship Series in 2012. Detroit swept Oakland 4-0 during the American League Championship Series to advance to the World Series in 2006. The Tigers fell 3-2 to the Athletics during the 1972 American League Championship Series.

CABRERA'S THIRD STRAIGHT BATTING CROWN: Miguel Cabrera led the American League with a .348 batting average to capture his third straight batting crown. He is the first Tigers player to lead the American League in hitting in three consecutive seasons since Ty Cobb did so in three straight seasons (1917-19). Cabrera led the American League with a .330 average during 2012, and a .344 batting average during the 2011 season.

SANCHEZ CAPTURES AL ERA CROWN: Anibal Sanchez led the American League with a 2.57 ERA (182.0IP/52ER) during the season. He is the seventh pitcher in Tigers history to capture the ERA crown and the first since Justin Verlander did so with a 2.40 ERA in 2011.

SCHERZER LEADS THE MAJORS IN WINS: Max Scherzer led the Major Leagues with 21 wins on the season. He became just the 24th pitcher in franchise history to surpass 20 wins on the season, and the first since Justin Verlander posted 24 wins in 2011.

TIGERS PITCHERS ESTABLISH MAJOR LEAGUE STRIKEOUT RECORD: Tigers pitchers finished the season with 1,428 strikeouts to establish a new Major League record for most strikeouts in a season. The previous record was 1,404 strikeouts on the season, established by the 2003 Cubs. The Tigers led the league with 8.79 strikeouts during the 2013, which marked the highest rate at which Tigers pitchers have struck out batters in club history.

FIRST IN THE AL IN HITTING: The Tigers finished first in the American League with a .283 batting average, 1,625 hits, and a .446 on-base percentage, while they were second with 767 RBI. The .283 average is the highest for the Tigers since the club batted .287 in 2007.

INJURY UPDATE: RHP Octavio Dotel (right elbow inflammation, 60-day DL on April 20), RHP Luis Marte (right shoulder posterior labral debridement, 15-day DL on July 31), INF Danny Worth (left shoulder subluxation, 60-day DL on September 26th).

TONIGHT'S TIGERS STARTER - JUSTIN VERLANDER

JUSTIN'S CASE: After completing his eighth full season at the major league level, Verlander will make his 13th career postseason start, his first in 2013, this evening at Oakland.

ALL-STAR SELECTION: Verlander was selected to the American League's all-star squad for the sixth time in his career in 2013.

LOOKING AT THE LEADER BOARD: Verlander ended the 2013 season tied for first in the American League with 34 games started, while he was fourth with 217 strikeouts and 218.1 innings pitched and eighth with 8.95 strikeouts per nine innings.

HIS POSTSEASON EXPERIENCE: Verlander is making the 13th start of his postseason career this evening at Oakland. In his previous 12 starts, he is 6-4 with a 4.22 ERA (70.1IP/33ER) and 77 strikeouts. Verlander is 3-0 with a 2.11 ERA (21.1IP/5ER) and 28 strikeouts in three starts against the Athletics during his postseason career.

FRANCHISE LEADER: Verlander is tops in Tigers history with six wins, 70.1 innings pitched and 77 strikeouts during his postseason career.

ON THE ROAD: Verlander made 17 starts on the road this season. In his 17 outings on the road, he compiled a 7-5 record, with a 3.19 ERA (107.1IP/38ER) and 120 strikeouts.

200 STRIKEOUTS IN FIVE STRAIGHT: Justin Verlander fanned 217 batters this season, surpassing the 200-strikeout mark for the fifth straight season of his career. He became the first Tigers pitcher with 200-or-more strikeouts in five straight seasons since Mickey Lolich did so in six straight seasons (1969-74).

SEVEN STRAIGHT SEASONS WITH 200-OR-MORE INNINGS: Verlander tossed 218.1 innings this season, marking his seventh consecutive season surpassing the 200.0-inning mark. His streak of seven straight seasons with 200.0-or-more innings pitched is the longest by a Tigers pitcher since Jack Morris also did so in seven straight seasons (1982-88).

DOMINANT IN LAST FEW STARTS: Verlander allowed three earned runs-or-less and posted a quality start in five of his final six starts of the season. He compiled a 1-2 record, 2.27 ERA (39.2IP/10ER) and 48 strikeouts in his final six starts of the season.

RECORD AT O.co COLISEUM: Verlander has started 10 games during his career at O.co Coliseum. In his previous 10 outings, he is 5-4 with a 2.38 ERA (68.0IP/18ER).

LAST POSTSEASON START AT O.co COLISEUM: Verlander fanned 11 batters as he fired a four-hit shutout in Game Five of the American League Division Series on October 11, 2012 at Oakland. He joined Sandy Koufax as the only two pitchers in major league history to toss a shutout with 10-or-more strikeouts in a series-deciding game of a post-season series. Koufax fanned 10 batters for the Dodgers as he blanked the Twins 2-0 on three hits in Game Seven of the 1965 World Series. (Source: *Elias Sports Bureau*)

COUNTING TO 10 AGAIN AND AGAIN: Verlander fanned 10 batters in his final outing of 2013 at Miami on September 29th, marking the 28th game of his career with 10-or-more strikeouts. He is second among Tigers pitchers since at least 1916 with the 28 double-digit strikeout games, trailing only Mickey Lolich, who posted 54 games with 10-or-more strikeouts during his career.

NOTHING UNLUCKY ABOUT 13: Verlander recorded a season-high 13 strikeouts in his outing on May 27th against the Pirates. It was Verlander's fifth career game with 13-or-more strikeouts and he is tied with Jake Peavy and Yu Darvish for the second-most games with 13-or-more strikeouts since 2006. Only Tim Lincecum (7) has more during that time.

SCHERZER, VERLANDER SURPASS 200 INNINGS PITCHED AND 200 STRIKEOUTS: Justin Verlander and Max Scherzer each surpassed 200 innings pitched and 200 strikeouts during the 2013 season. They are the first pair of Tigers pitchers to toss 200-or-more innings, while striking out 200-or-more batters since Mickey Lolich and Joe Coleman did so in 1973.

SIGNING FOR THE LONG HAUL: Verlander agreed to terms on a five-year contract extension (plus a vesting option for the 2020 season) with the Tigers on March 29, 2013. The five-year contract extension will keep Verlander in a Tigers uniform through the 2019 season.

OPENING DAY NOD: Verlander made his sixth career Opening Day start on April 1 at Minnesota. He is the first Tigers pitcher to start six consecutive Opening Days since Jack Morris started 11 straight (1980-90).

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Verlander was selected by the Tigers in the first round (second overall) of the June 2004 draft. He was selected to the American League's all-star squad five times during his career (2007, 2009-12). Verlander was named the American League Rookie of the Year in 2006. He was selected the American League Most Valuable Player and unanimously named the American League Cy Young Award winner in 2011.

- Led the American League with a .348 average, a .442 on-base percentage and a .636 slugging percentage, while he was tied for first with 37 go-ahead RBI, second with 44 home runs, 137 RBI and 353 total bases, tied for second with 103 runs scored, 193 hits, third with 90 walks, and 9th with 52 multi-hit games.
- Won his third consecutive batting title in 2013, batting .348 (193x555) in 148 games on the season...became the first Tigers player to win three consecutive batting titles since Ty Cobb also did so in three straight seasons (1917-1919).
- Collected 137 RBI during the season, marking the sixth consecutive season he has posted 100-or-more RBI for the Tigers--became just the second player in Tigers history to drive in 100-or-more RBI in six straight seasons...Harry Heilmann drove in 100-or-more runs in seven consecutive seasons (1932-1936).
- Matched a career-high with 44 home runs on the season.
- Became just the third player in franchise history to connect for 30-or-more home runs and 120-or-more RBI in consecutive seasons.
