TIGERS AT A GLANCE: The Tigers finished the regular season with an 93-69 record to capture the American League Central Division championship. It marks the 15th time in franchise history the Tigers have secured a spot in the playoffs.

LOOKING BACK AT TUESDAY: The Tigers defeated the Athletics 8-6 on Tuesday night at Comerica Park, to even out the best-of-five game series at 2-2. Doug Fister started and allowed three runs on seven hits, while fanning one batter over 6.0 innings but did not factor in the decision. Max Scherzer (2-0) made his second career appearance in the postseason as reliever for the Tigers, tossing two innings to earn the win for Detroit. Victor Martinez led the Tigers offense with three hits, including two runs scored and a solo home run. Jhonny Peralta chipped in with two hits, including a double and a three-run homer.

THE SERIES GOES THE DISTANCE: The Tigers and Athletics will battle in the fifth and deciding game of the American League Division Series this evening at O.co Coliseum. It marks the ninth time in the club's postseason history the Tigers have had a series go to the maximum number of games. Detroit has compiled a 4-4 record in the previous eight series. The Tigers won Game Seven of both the 1945 and 1968 World Series and Game Five of both the 2011 and 2012 American League Division Series, while the team suffered the loss in Game Seven of the 1909, 1934 and 1940 World Series and Game Five of the 1972 American League Championship Series.

QUALITY WORK: Tigers starting pitchers have registered a quality start in three of the club's four games thus far during the American League Division Series. Detroit starters have compiled a 3.70 ERA (24.1IP/10ER) and 29 strikeouts during the four starts, while limiting Oakland to a .234 batting average (22x94). The Tigers led the Major Leagues with 108 quality starts during the regular season.

JHONNY DRIVING THEM IN: Jhonny Peralta drove in three runs with a three-run homer in Game Four of the American League Division Series. He has driven in five runs during the series and 10 runs over his last eight postseason games dating back to last season. The 10 RBI ties a Tigers record for most RBI over an eight-game span in the postseason, which was set by Kirk Gibson (1984-1987). (Source: *Elias Sports Bureau*)

SCHERZER EARNS THE WIN: Max Scherzer, who led the major leagues with 21 wins this season, earned the victory in Game Four of the American League Division Series. It marked the fourth time in postseason history that the Major League leader in wins earned a win in relief. It had previously been done by Smoky Joe Wood of the Red Sox in the final game of the 1912 World Series, Lefty Grove of the Athletics in Game Five of the 1930 World Series and Pedro Martinez of the Red Sox in the final game of the 1999 American League Division Series. MARVELOUS MAX: Max Scherzer survived a bases-loaded, no-outs jam in the eighth inning to preserve a one-run lead Tuesday night in Game Four of the American League Division Series. It was the first time in Major League postseason history that a team facing elimination escaped a bases-loaded, no-outs jam, in the eighth inning-or-later, to preserve either a one-run lead or a tie. CABRERA REACHES SAFELY: Miguel Cabrera finished with a single in Game Four of the American League Division Series on Tuesday evening and he has now reached base safely in all 28 of his postseason games with the Tigers. His 28-game streak established a major league postseason record.

A THIRD STRAIGHT AMERICAN LEAGUE CENTRAL DIVISION TITLE: The Tigers clinched the American League Central Division for the third straight season and advanced to the playoffs for the 15th time in franchise history. It marks the sixth time the Tigers have captured a division title since divisional play began during the 1969 season. Detroit has advanced to the playoffs in three consecutive seasons for the second time in club history. The only other time the Tigers have advanced to the playoffs in three consecutive seasons is from 1907-1909.

FAMILIAR TERRITORY FOR THE SKIPPER: Tigers Manager Jim Leyland has guided a club to the postseason for the eighth time in his 22 seasons as a major league manager, including the fourth time during his eight-year tenure with the Tigers. He has compiled a 41-36 record (.532) during postseason action. Leyland led the Pittsburgh Pirates to three straight National League East Division titles (1990-92), and he captured the National League Wild Card with the Florida Marlins in 1997. His 1997 Marlins defeated the Cleveland Indians to win the World Series. Leyland's 2006 Tigers club won the American League Wild Card, advancing to the World Series after defeating the Yankees in the American League Division Series and Athletics in the American League Championship Series. The 2011 Tigers captured the American League Central Division title and advanced to the American League Championship Series after defeating the Yankees in the American League Division Series. His 2012 Tigers captured the American League Central Division title and advanced to the World Series after defeating the Yankees in the American League Championship Series and defeating the Athletics in the American League Division Series.

TAKING ON OAKLAND DURING THE PLAYOFFS: The Tigers are taking on Oakland in postseason play for the fourth time in franchise history. Detroit defeated Oakland 3-2 during the American League Division Series to advance to the American League Championship Series in 2012. Detroit swept Oakland 4-0 during the American League Championship Series to advance to the World Series in 2006. The Tigers fell 3-2 to the Athletics during the 1972 American League Championship Series.

INJURY UPDATE: RHP Octavio Dotel (right elbow inflammation, 60-day DL on April 20), RHP Luis Marte (right shoulder posterior labral debridement, 15-day DL on July 31), INF Danny Worth (left shoulder subluxation, 60-day DL on September 26th).

JUSTIN'S CASE: After completing his eighth full season at the major league level, Verlander will make his 14th career postseason start, his second in 2013, this evening at Oakland.

ALL-STAR SELECTION: Verlander was selected to the American League's all-star squad for the sixth time in his career in 2013.

LOOKING AT THE LEADER BOARD: Verlander ended the 2013 season tied for first in the American League with 34 games started, while he was fourth with 217 strikeouts and 218.1 innings pitched and eighth with 8.95 strikeouts per nine innings.

HIS POSTSEASON EXPERIENCE: Verlander is making the 14th start of his postseason career this evening at Oakland. In his previous 13 starts, he is 6-4 with a 3.84 ERA (77.1IP/33ER) and 88 strikeouts. Verlander is 3-0 with a 1.59 ERA (28.1IP/5ER) and 39 strikeouts in four starts against the Athletics during his postseason career.

DOUBLE-DIGIT STRIKEOUTS: Verlander fanned 11 batters on Saturday night in the loss against Oakland during Game Two of the American League Division Series. It marked the fourth time he has posted a double-digit strikeout total in a postseason start. He is the only pitcher in Tigers history to record three-or-more double-digit strikeout performances during postseason action.

FRANCHISE LEADER: Verlander is tops in Tigers history with six wins, 77.1 innings pitched and 88 strikeouts during his postseason career.

200 STRIKEOUTS IN FIVE STRAIGHT: Justin Verlander fanned 217 batters this season, surpassing the 200-strikeout mark for the fifth straight season of his career. He became the first Tigers pitcher with 200-or-more strikeouts in five straight seasons since Mickey Lolich did so in six straight seasons (1969-74).

ON THE ROAD: Verlander made 17 starts on the road this season. In his 17 outings on the road, he compiled a 7-5 record, with a 3.19 ERA (107.1IP/38ER) and 120 strikeouts.

SEVEN STRAIGHT SEASONS WITH 200-OR-MORE INNINGS: Verlander tossed 218.1 innings this season, marking his seventh consecutive season surpassing the 200.0-inning mark. His streak of seven straight seasons with 200.0-or-more innings pitched is the longest by a Tigers pitcher since Jack Morris also did so in seven straight seasons (1982-88).

DOMINANT IN LAST FEW STARTS: Verlander allowed three earned runs-or-less and posted a quality start in five of his final six starts of the season. He compiled a 1-2 record, 2.27 ERA (39.2IP/10ER) and 48 strikeouts in his final six starts of the season.

RECORD AT O.co COLISEUM: Verlander has started 10 games during his career at O.co Coliseum. In his previous 10 outings, he is 5-4 with a 2.38 ERA (68.0IP/18ER).

LOOKING TO REPEAT HISTORY: Verlander fanned 11 batters as he fired a four-hit shutout in Game Five of the American League Division Series on October 11, 2012 at Oakland. He joined Sandy Koufax as the only two pitchers in major league history to toss a shutout with 10-or-more strikeouts in a series-deciding game of a postseason series. Koufax fanned 10 batters for the Dodgers as he blanked the Twins 2-0 on three hits in Game Seven of the 1965 World Series. (Source: *Elias Sports Bureau*)

COUNTING TO 10 AGAIN AND AGAIN: Verlander fanned 10 batters in his final outing of 2013 at Miami on September 29th, marking the 28th game of his career with 10-or-more strikeouts. He is second among Tigers pitchers since at least 1916 with the 28 double-digit strikeout games, trailing only Mickey Lolich, who posted 54 games with 10-or-more strikeouts during his career.

NOTHING UNLUCKY ABOUT 13: Verlander recorded a season-high 13 strikeouts in his outing on May 27th against the Pirates. It was Verlander's fifth career game with 13-or-more strikeouts and he is tied with Jake Peavy and Yu Darvish for the second-most games with 13-or-more strikeouts since 2006. Only Tim Lincecum (7) has more during that time.

SIGNING FOR THE LONG HAUL: Verlander agreed to terms on a five-year contract extension (plus a vesting option for the 2020 season) with the Tigers on March 29, 2013. The five-year contract extension will keep Verlander in a Tigers uniform through the 2019 season.

OPENING DAY NOD: Verlander made his sixth career Opening Day start on April 1 at Minnesota. He is the first Tigers pitcher to start six consecutive Opening Days since Jack Morris started 11 straight (1980-90).

MISCELLANEOUS NOTES: Verlander was selected by the Tigers in the first round (second overall) of the June 2004 draft. He was selected to the American League's all-star squad five times during his career (2007, 2009-12). Verlander was named the American League Rookie of the Year in 2006. He was selected the American League Most Valuable Player and unanimously named the American League Cy Young Award winner in 2011.

- Named the Tigers Minor League Pitcher of the Year for 2013.
- Had his contract recalled from Triple A Toledo prior to the game on 9/3 @BOS-- returned for his fifth stint with the Tigers this season after being optioned on August 28.
- Posted an 8-6 record, 2.80 ERA (128.2IP/40ER) and 115 strikeouts in 21 outings with the Mud Hens this season.
- Made his major league debut on 6/9 vs. CLE and earned his first major league win-- became the first Tigers pitcher to win his major league debut since Alfredo Figaro in 2009.

BENOIT

- **Last Game Pitched:** 10/8 vs. OAK (1.0IP/2ER), 2 H, BB, 2 SO
- Finished the season ranked ninth among all AL relievers with a 2.01 ERA (67.0IP/15ER), while he was 10th with a .197 opponents batting average, and tied for 12th with 24 saves.
- Posted a 3-1 record, 2.00 ERA (45.0IP/10ER), 22 saves and 46 strikeouts over his last 45 outings.
- Compiled a 30-16 record, 3.17 ERA (576.0IP/203ER) and 600 strikeouts in 486 relief outings during his major league career.
- Has posted a 13-7 record, 2.89 ERA (199.0IP/64ER), 28 saves and 220 strikeouts since joining the Tigers.

PORCELLO
