ABOUT THE A'S: The A's open their 47th season in Oakland where they have won 16 American League West titles, one AL Wild Card, six AL pennants and four World Championships...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and

MLB BEST RECORDS

Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 3819-3502 (.522) record over the previous 46 seasons in Oakland...only five teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis, Cincinnati)...this is the Athletics franchise 114th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 8534-8974 (.487) in their previous 113 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 15-13-5, which marked their third consecutive spring with a winning record (17-13-3 in 2013, 15-7-2 in 2012)...the last time A's had three straight winning springs was from 2000-04 when they had five straight...the five tie games were the most by an Oakland team since moving to Arizona for Spring Training in 1969...the previous high was three in 2010 and 2013...have 16 tie games over the last six springs...went 8-5-2 in the final spring at Phoenix Muni and 7-8-3 on the road...led the majors in walks (135), ranked second in runs (193) and on-base percentage (.358), tied for third in grounded into double plays (29), fourth in strikeouts (239) and tied for fourth in triples (11)...were fourth in most double plays turned (34) and most errors (33)...the A's pitching staff ranked fifth in the majors with 247 strikeouts...those are the most strikeouts by an A's team during the spring since statistics are available beginning in 1991...the previous high was 228 last year...allowed a Major League leading 44 home runs.

FOR OPENERS: The A's have lost each of their last nine openers, which is tied for the longest Opening Day losing streak in Major League history...share the mark with the Atlanta Braves (1972-80) and New York Giants (1893-1901)...the A's are batting .167 (49 for 293) and have scored just 13 runs during their current nine-game Opening Day losing streak...have faced Felix Hernandez five times during the streak and four other pitchers once (Rodrigo Lopez, Randy Johnson, Daisuke Matsuzaka, Joe Saunders)...have not won on Opening Day since a 5-4 win over Texas April 5, 2004...have lost 16 of their last 20 openers...this marks the third time in Oakland history the A's have opened with the Indians...lost the previous two meetings, both in Oakland...dropped an 8-5 decision in 1983 and lost 9-7 in 1997...are 1-4 all-time against the Indians to start the season...the only win came on April 15, 1958, a 5-0 win by the Kansas City A's at Cleveland...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 20-26 on Opening Day, including 16-12 in Oakland, 4-11 on the road, 0-2 in Tokyo and 0-1 in Las Vegas...all-time, the Athletics are 52-61 in openers.

OPENING DAY STARTING LINEUPS: Eight players return from last year's Opening Day starting lineup (Céspedes, Crisp, Donaldson, Jaso, Lowrie, Moss, Reddick, Sogard)...that matches the most returning players from an Opening Day starting lineup in Oakland history (1976)...Crisp will be making his fourth straight Opening Day start while Céspedes, Reddick and Sogard are starting their third straight opener...Barton is making his fourth Opening Day start at first base, tying Jason Giambi for second most in Oakland history...only Mark McGwire (9) has more...Céspedes is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers in left field since Ben Grieve in 1999-2000...Gray will be the A's ninth different Opening Day starting pitcher in the last nine years...the A's have now used 19 different starting pitchers on Opening Day over the last 22 years, including 10 different from 1993-2002...the Athletics record for consecutive seasons with a different Opening Day starting pitcher is 12 from 1956-67.

MARCH SHOWERS: Since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's have never had a home opener rained out...the only Opening Day rainout in Oakland history came on April 6, 1968 at Baltimore, the first game in Oakland history...the earliest rainout in Coliseum history came on April 3, 1998 against New York in the third game of the season...the A's

played a rain shortened game in their opener on April 5, 1999 against New York...the last rainout in Coliseum history was on May 5, 1998 against Detroit.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's open the season with 12 pitchers and 13 position players for the sixth time in the last eight years...the exceptions were in 2008 and 2012 when they opened in Japan and carried just 10 pitchers...13 players return from last years Opening Day roster (Céspedes, Crisp, Donaldson, Doolittle, Jaso, Lowrie, Milone, Moss, Norris, Reddick, Scribner, Sogard, Straily)...those are the most returning players from a previous Opening Day roster since the 2007 club had 16...five other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year (Barton, Callaspo, Chavez, Gray, Otero), four were acquired in a trade (Abad, Gregerson, Johnson, Pomeranz), two were signed as a free agent (Kazmir, Punto), and one was signed as a free agent to a minor league contract (Fuld).

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: For the first time since 2006, the A's begin the season with no rookies on the Opening Day roster...four players have six or more years of service: Nick Punto (11 years, 51 days), Coco Crisp (10 years, 158 days), Scott Kazmir (7 years, 119 days) and Alberto Callaspo (6 years, 135 days.

TENURE: Of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only four played for the A's prior to 2012...Daric Barton played for the A's in 2007 and three players were with the club in 2010 (Crisp, Donaldson, Sogard)...Barton has been in the A's organization the longest as he was acquired from St. Louis in the Mark Mulder trade, December 18, 2004.

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster is 28.64 years...the A's roster features one player under the age of 25, Sonny Gray at the age of 24 years, 143 days...next youngest is Derek Norris (25 years, 44 days)...there are nine players that are at least 30 years old...Nick Punto is the oldest at 36 years, 142 days...he is followed by Coco Crisp (34 years, 129 days) and Sam Fuld (32 years, 130 days)...two of the 30-year olds are in the starting rotation: Jesse Chavez (30 years, 221 days) and Scott Kazmir (30 years, 65 days)...the last time the A's had two 30-year olds in the starting rotation at the same time was in April of 2010 (Ben Sheets, Justin Duchscherer).

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have four players under contract beyond the 2014 season...Yoenis Céspedes, Scott Kazmir and Eric O'Flaherty are signed through 2015 and Coco Crisp is signed through 2016 with a vesting option for 2017...Nick Punto has a vesting option for 2015 and minor leaguer Hiroyuki Nakajima has a club option for 2015.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's begin the season with six players on the disabled list (Cook, Gentry, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Rodriguez)...that matches the most players on the DL to start the season since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992 (1992, 2010)...O'Flaherty was placed on the 60-day DL February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery and Parker was added March 20 prior to undergoing Tommy John surgery March 24...Cook (right shoulder tendinitis), Gentry (Lower back strain), Griffin (Flexor muscle strain) and Rodriguez (Tommy John surgery) were all added March 29 retroactive to March 21 and are eligible to be reinstated April 5...the A's used the DL 13 times last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. INDIANS: The A's lost the season series last year 5-2...won two out of three in Oakland but were swept in a four-game series in Cleveland...it was their second season series loss to the Indians over the last three years...are 12-12 against Cleveland over the previous three years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 260-227 against the Indians...that breaks down to 138-99 in Oakland and 122-128 in Cleveland...all-time, the A's are 895-1020 against the Indians.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

The A's have never played a regular season game on March 31...today marks the first time the A's have played a regular season game in North America in the month of March...have played four games overall in March, all in Japan...faced the Red Sox in 2008 (March 25 and 26) and the Mariners in 2012 (March 28 and 29).

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (5-3, 2.67 ERA in 2013)

FOR OPENERS: Is scheduled to make the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...is the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history...A's starting pitchers are 0-5 with a 4.19 ERA (25 er in 53.2 ip) over the last 10 openers...the last Oakland starter to win on Opening Day was Tim Hudson on April 1, 2003 against Seattle.

THIS SPRING: Went 0-1 with a 3.48 ERA in six starts...allowed a .228 (18 for 79) opponents batting average...yielded just one home run in 20.2 innings...allowed just one earned run in 10.2 innings over his final two starts (0.84 ERA) after posting a 6.30 ERA over his first four starts...surrendered one run or fewer in four of his six starts.

2013 RECAP: Spent most of the season at Triple-A Sacramento where he was 10-7 with a 3.42 ERA in 20 starts...also had two stints with the A's...after making two relief appearances in his Major League debut in July, he returned to Oakland Aug. 10 and finished the season in the starting rotation...was 5-3 with a 2.67 ERA in 12 games, 10 starts, with the A's...also went 0-1 with a 2.08 ERA in two ALDS starts against Detroit...based upon a minimum of 60 innings pitched, he had the lowest opponents on-base percentage among American League rookies (.272), ranked second in opponents batting average (.214) and slugging percentage (.298) and third in ERA...struck out 67 batters in 64.0 innings and his average of 9.42 strikeouts per nine innings was second best (Allen, CLE 11.26)...allowed just four home runs, an average of 0.56 per nine innings...walked 20 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.35...went 4-1 with a 2.27 ERA and .230 opponents batting average over his final six starts...won each of his final three decisions beginning Sept. 11, the first time he put together consecutive wins in career...had surgery for a fractured left thumb following the season...the surgery, an internal fixation with a screw to repair the thumb fracture, was performed by Dr. Thomas Graham at the Cleveland Clinic Hospital Oct. 18.

INNING BY INNING: Yielded 20 of his 22 runs over the first three innings of a game...had a 5.10 ERA, .290 opponents batting average and four home runs allowed in innings one through three compared to a 0.53 ERA, .132 opponents average and no home runs from the fourth inning on...did not allow a run after the fifth inning (14.2 ip).

HOME AND AWAY: Was 3-1 with a 1.99 ERA in six starts in Oakland compared to 2-2 with a 3.86 ERA in six games, four starts, on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .198 (20-for-101) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .226 (31-for-137) against left-handers...issued 15 of his 20 walks to lefties...allowed a .194 opponents batting average to hitters leading off an inning...surrendered one double (.210 slugging percentage) and issued just four walks (.242 on-base percentage).

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Compiled a 5-3 record and a 2.85 ERA in his nine starts...did not allow a run in his two relief appearances (4.0 ip)...did not inherit a runner and retired both of his first batters faced in relief

NIGHT AND DAY: Was 2-1 with a 1.72 ERA in seven games at night compared to 3-2 with a 3.95 ERA in five starts during the day.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Had a 2-1 record and a 1.25 ERA in six games against AL West teams compared to 3-2 with a 4.50 ERA in six games against everyone else.

DAYS REST: Was 3-1 with a 1.57 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more, 2-2 with a 4.02 ERA in five starts on four days rest.

RUN SUPPORT: Averaged 7.50 runs of support in his 10 starts

THIS AND THAT: The A's were 6-4 (.600) in his starting assignments...tossed at least six innings in six of his 10 starts, allowed two runs or fewer six times and walked two batters or fewer seven times.

MORE 2013 WITH OAKLAND: Was selected from Sacramento July 10 and made his Major League debut that day at Pittsburgh...entered the game in the fifth inning and tossed 2.0 scoreless innings...struck out the first batter he faced, Clint Barmes...also tossed 2.0 shutout innings July 19 at Los Angeles (AL)...had allowed two hits and a walk in 4.0 scoreless innings while striking out six in two relief appearances when he was optioned to Sacramento July 19...returned to Oakland Aug. 10 and spent the remainder of the season in the starting rotation...made his first ML start Aug. 10 at Toronto and allowed four runs, two earned, in 6.0 innings for the loss in a 5-4 decision...picked up his first big league win in his second start when he combined with Dan Otero on a five-hit shutout in a 5-0 win over Houston Aug. 15...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed four hits while striking out a career-high nine on a career-high 118 pitches...is the fourth pitcher in Oakland history to toss at least 8.0 shutout innings in one of the first four games of his career...the other three all had complete game shutouts, most recently John Henry Johnson in his third game on April 23, 1978 against Seattle...allowed just two hits in 7.0 innings in a no decision against Seattle Aug. 20...it was his third consecutive start with four hits or fewer... joins A.J. Griffin (June 24-July 4, 2012) as the only Athletics pitchers since 1916 to toss six or more innings and allow four hits or fewer in each of their first three career starts...went 4-1 with a 2.27 ERA and .230 opponents batting average over his final six starts...matched his career-high by tossing 8.0 innings Sept. 5 against Houston but allowed three runs and took the loss in a 3-2 decision...won each of his final three decisions beginning Sept. 11, the first time he put together consecutive wins in his career...finished September with a 3-1 record and a 2.79 ERA in five starts...started Game 2 of the ALDS against Detroit and combined with Grant Balfour on a four-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win (8.0 ip, 4 h, 2 bb, 9 so)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the third rookie to strikeout at least nine without allowing a run in a postseason game (Dave Righetti, Game 2 of 1981 ALDS; Mike Boddicker, Game 2 of 1983 ALCS)...is the fourth pitcher with 10 or fewer career regular seasons starts that has not allowed a run in a postseason start (Duster Mails, Game 6 of 1920 World Series; Brandon Backe, Game 5 of 2004 NLCS; Matt Moore, Game 1 of 2011 ALDS)...also started Game 5 and allowed three runs on six hits and four walks in 5.0 innings for the loss in a 3-0 decision...had surgery for a fractured left thumb following the season...the surgery, an internal fixation with a screw to repair the thumb fracture, was performed by Dr. Thomas Graham at the Cleveland Clinic Hospital Oct. 18.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Won a career-high 10 games with the River Cats...also finished with a career-high 118 strikeouts...the wins tied for fifth in the Pacific Coast League and the strikeouts tied for seventh...was also fourth in ERA (3.42) and tied for fifth in complete games (1)...led the league in strikeouts per nine innings (8.97)...ranked fourth in the A's farm system in ERA, tied for fifth in wins and sixth in strikeouts...was named the A's organization Minor League Pitcher of the year and was also a Baseball America's Triple-A All-Star...surrendered just five home runs in 118.1 innings, an average of 0.38 per nine innings...four of the home runs came on the road and three were solo shots...allowed a .259 opponents batting average, including .244 (53-for-217) against left-handed hitters compared to .274 (64-for-234) against right-handers...issued 26 of his 39 walks to lefties...yielded a .223 batting average and .281 on-base percentage to batters leading off an inning...had a 4.74 ERA over the first three innings of a game, 1.54 from innings four through six and 6.23 from the seventh inning on...the River Cats were 12-8 (.600) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in 15 of his 20 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 11 times and walked two batters or fewer 15 times...was rated as having the best breaking ball and best control in the Pacific Coast League by Baseball America.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Scott Kazmir (10-9, 4.04 ERA): Went 1-0 with a 1.62 ERA in four starts during the spring...held the opposition to a .155 batting average and did not allow a home run in 16.2 innings...made his final spring start last Thursday against San Francisco when he combined with Otero, Pomeranz and Scribner on a four-hit 4-0 shutout for the win (5.1 ip, 2 h, 3 bb, 4 so)....is 1-3 with a 6.13 ERA in eight career starts against Cleveland...the ERA is his highest against any American League team...last faced the Indians September 14, 2010, a loss in a 4-3 decision with the Angels (5.2 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 3 bb, 2 so)...was signed by the A's as a free agent after going 10-9 with a 4.04 ERA in 29 starts with Cleveland in 2013.
