ABOUT THE A'S: The A's opened their 47th season in Oakland Monday night with a loss...have won 16 American League West titles, one AL Wild Card, six AL pennants and four World Championships in Oakland...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 3819-3502 (.522) record over the previous 46 seasons in Oakland...only five teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis, Cincinnati)...this is the Athletics franchise 114th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 8534-8974 (.487) in their previous 113 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

LET'S PLAY TWO: After the first regular season Coliseum rainout since May 5, 1998 against Detroit, the A's are scheduled to play the first "Day/Night Doubleheader" in Coliseum history today...officially, the games do not count as a doubleheader because of the split admission...the rainout last night was the 18th in the regular season in Coliseum history and the fourth against Cleveland (last: April 23, 1993)...there was also a rainout in the 1972 World Series and in the Bay Bridge Series this spring on Saturday...this will be the sixth "Day/Night Doubleheader" in Oakland history...the other five are:

OPENING DAY AND GAME TWO: The A's extended their Opening Day losing streak to 10 games Monday night to establish a new **Major League record**...broke the previous mark of nine held by the New York Giants (1893-1901) and Atlanta Braves (1972-80)...were shutout for the second consecutive opener and now have a 25-inning scoreless streak on Opening Day...have scored just one run in their last 37 innings in openers and have just 13 runs during the Opening Day losing streak...are batting .167 (54 for 324) over that 10-game stretch...however, have come back to win game two in six of the previous nine seasons...started the year 0-2 in 2007, 2011 and 2013...have a .252 (78 for 309) average and 37 runs scored in the second game of the season over the previous nine years.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 15-13-5, which marked their third consecutive spring with a winning record (17-13-3 in 2013, 15-7-2 in 2012)...the last time A's had three straight winning springs was from 2000-04 when they had five straight...the five tie games were the most by an Oakland team since moving to Arizona for Spring Training in 1969...the previous high was three in 2010 and 2013...have 16 tie games over the last six springs...went 8-5-2 in the final spring at Phoenix Muni and 7-8-3 on the road...led the majors in walks (135), ranked second in runs (193) and on-base percentage (.358), tied for third in grounded into double plays (29), fourth in strikeouts (239) and tied for fourth in triples (11)...were fourth in most double plays turned (34) and most errors (33)...the A's pitching staff ranked fifth in the majors with 247 strikeouts...those are the most strikeouts by an A's team during the spring since statistics are available beginning in 1991...the previous high was 228 last year...allowed a Major League leading 44 home runs.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's opened the season with 12 pitchers and 13 position players for the sixth time in the last eight years...the exceptions were in 2008 and 2012 when they opened in Japan and carried just 10 pitchers...13 players returned from last years Opening Day roster (Céspedes, Crisp, Donaldson, Doolittle, Jaso, Lowrie, Milone, Moss, Norris, Reddick, Scribner, Sogard, Straily)...those are

the most returning players from a previous Opening Day roster since the 2007 club had 16...five other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year (Barton, Callaspo, Chavez, Gray, Otero), four were acquired in a trade (Abad, Gregerson, Johnson, Pomeranz), two were signed as a free agent (Kazmir, Punto), and one was signed as a free agent to a minor league contract (Fuld).

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: For the first time since 2006, the A's began the season with no rookies on the Opening Day roster...four players had six or more years of service: Nick Punto (11 years, 51 days), Coco Crisp (10 years, 158 days), Scott Kazmir (7 years, 119 days) and Alberto Callaspo (6 years, 135 days).

TENURE: Of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only four played for the A's prior to 2012...Daric Barton played for the A's in 2007 and three players were with the club in 2010 (Crisp, Donaldson, Sogard)...Barton has been in the A's organization the longest as he was acquired from St. Louis in the Mark Mulder trade, December 18, 2004.

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 28.64 years...the A's roster features one player under the age of 25, Sonny Gray at the age of 24 years, 143 days...next youngest is Derek Norris (25 years, 44 days)...there are nine players that are at least 30 years old...Nick Punto is the oldest at 36 years, 142 days...he is followed by Coco Crisp (34 years, 129 days) and Sam Fuld (32 years, 130 days)...two of the 30-year olds are in the starting rotation: Jesse Chavez (30 years, 221 days) and Scott Kazmir (30 years, 65 days)...the last time the A's had two 30-year olds in the starting rotation at the same time was in April of 2010 (Ben Sheets, Justin Duchscherer).

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have four players under contract beyond the 2014 season...Yoenis Céspedes, Scott Kazmir and Eric O'Flaherty are signed through 2015 and Coco Crisp is signed through 2016 with a vesting option for 2017...Nick Punto has a vesting option for 2015 and minor leaguer Hiroyuki Nakajima has a club option for 2015.

THIS AND THAT: Eight players returned from last year's Opening Day starting lineup (Céspedes, Crisp, Donaldson, Jaso, Lowrie, Moss, Reddick, Sogard)...that matched the most returning players from an Opening Day starting lineup in Oakland history (1976).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's begin the season with six players on the disabled list (Cook, Gentry, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Rodriguez)...that matches the most players on the DL to start the season since Opening Day rosters are first available in 1992 (1992, 2010)...O'Flaherty was placed on the 60-day DL February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery and Parker was added March 20 prior to undergoing Tommy John surgery March 24...Cook (right shoulder tendinitis), Gentry (Lower back strain), Griffin (Flexor muscle strain) and Rodriguez (Tommy John surgery) were all added March 29 retroactive to March 21 and are eligible to be reinstated April 5...the A's used the DL 13 times last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. INDIANS: The A's lost the first meeting of 2014 Monday night after losing the season series last year 5-2...won two out of three in Oakland in 2013 but were swept in a four-game series in Cleveland...it was their second season series loss to the Indians over the last three years...are 12-13 against Cleveland over the last four years...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 260-228 against the Indians...that breaks down to 138-100 in Oakland and 122-128 in Cleveland...all-time, the A's are 895-1020 against the Indians.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1997** the A's play on April 2 for the first time in Oakland history and open the season with a 9-7 loss against Cleveland...Geronimo Berroa and Ernie Young homer in the loss...in **2002** Carlos Pena hits the game ending home run in the bottom of the ninth inning as the A's defeat Texas, 3-2 and start the season 2-0 for the first time since 1993.

TODAY'S DAY GAME STARTING PITCHER:

Scott Kazmir (10-9, 4.04 ERA in 2013)

THIS SPRING: Went 1-0 with a 1.62 ERA in four starts during the spring...held the opposition to a .155 (9 for 58) batting average...did not allow a home run in 16.2 innings...did not allow a run in three of his four starts...was scratched from his start March 17 against Chicago (NL) with left triceps stiffness.

KAZMIR vs. CLEVELAND: Is 1-3 with a 6.13 ERA (39.2 ip, 54 h, 31 r, 27 er, 24 bb, 39 so, 8 hr) in eight career starts...the ERA is his highest against any American League team...is 0-1 with a 9.56 ERA (17 er in 16.0 ip) in four starts in his home ballparks and 1-2 with a 3.80 ERA (10 er in 23.2 ip) in four starts at Progressive Field as a visitor...pitched for Cleveland last year and is 8-4 with a 3.84 ERA (42 er in 98.1 ip) in 18 career starts at Progressive Field...last pitched against the Indians September 14, 2010 with Los Angeles (AL) at Cleveland...was the losing pitcher in a 4-3 loss...allowed a RBI single to Duncan in the first, a solo home run to Duncan in the fourth and two-run home run to Duncan in the sixth.

2013 RECAP: Went from the independent Atlantic League in 2012 to a key member of the Cleveland Indians rotation, going 10-9 with a 4.04 ERA in 29 starts...it was his sixth 10-win season but his first since 2009...his 29 starts were his most since 2007, as were his 158.0 innings pitched...walked 47 batters for an average of 2.68 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark of his career...his previous low was 3.24 in 2006...struck out 162, and his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.45 was also a career best...was one of a club-record tying three pitchers to fan 150 or more batters (Jimenez, Masterson)...averaged 9.23 strikeouts per nine innings...did not qualify for the league leaders but had the seventh best strikeout per nine inning ratio among American League pitchers with 150 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, he had the fifth highest run support average (6.27)...was 3-4 with a 5.89 ERA and .302 opponents batting average over his first 11 starts through June 15...then went 7-5 with a 3.06 ERA and .239 opponents average over his final 18 starts

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .262 opponents batting average, including .226 (38-for-168) against left-handed hitters compared to .275 (124-for-451) against right-handers...surrendered 16 of his 19 home runs and issued 41 of his 47 walks to righties...13 of the 19 home runs were solo shots.

HOME AND AWAY: Was 7-2 with a 3.86 ERA in 14 starts at home compared to 3-7 with a 4.21 ERA in 15 starts on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Logged a 5-2 record and a 3.27 ERA in 10 starts during the day compared to 5-7 with a 4.46 ERA in 19 starts at night.

DAYS REST: Was 6-5 with a 3.55 ERA in 15 starts on four days rest, 4-4 with a 4.60 ERA in 14 starts on five days rest or more.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Compiled a mark of 5-4 and a 4.60 ERA in 16 starts before the All-Star Break...then went 5-5 with a 3.38 ERA in 13 starts after the break...his career numbers are 41-42 with a 4.75 ERA (346 er in 655.0 ip) in 116 starts before the break compared to 35-28 with a 3.41 ERA in 93 games, 92 starts, after the break.

THIS AND THAT: Was 3-1 with a 3.38 ERA in five interleague starts and is now 11-5 in 22 career interleague starts...committed three errors, which tied for second most among AL pitchers...the Indians were 15-14 (.517) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in 15 of his starts, allowed two runs or fewer 16 times and walked two batters or fewer six times.

MORE 2013: Was a non-roster invitee with the Indians during the spring but was added to the roster and placed on the 15-day disabled list April 2 with a sprained right rib cage...made one rehab start at Triple-A Columbus April 15 and was the winning pitcher in the Clippers 4-1 win over Louisville (5.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 5 so)...was reinstated from the DL April 20 and allowed a season-high six runs in 3.1 innings in his first start that day against Houston...ended up with a no decision in the Indians 19-6 win...allowed two runs in 6.0 innings May 4 against Minnesota for his first win of the season...it was his first Major League win since Sept. 19, 2010...went 3-0 with a 1.45 ERA in five starts against the Twins in 2013...struck out 10 batters in 6.0 innings May 9 against Oakland, his first of four 10-strikeout games...walked a season-high four batters May 25 at Boston...tossed a season-high 111 pitches June 4 at New York (AL)...matched his walk high June 15 against Washington while tossing a season-low 2.2 innings...had a season-high four-game winning streak from June 21 to Aug. 4...compiled a 1.93 ERA and .173 opponents batting average over that nine-start stretch...tossed a season-high 8.0 innings July 24 at Seattle, allowing one unearned run on one hit for the win...it was his longest outing since June 6, 2008...went 2-0 with a 2.75 ERA and .198 opponents batting average in six starts in July...allowed just one home run in 36.0 innings...singled Aug. 4 at Miami, his second career hit...went 1-for-4 at the plate in 2013...had a season-high three-game losing streak from Aug. 9 to 31...compiled a 7.11 ERA and .353 opponents batting average over that four-start stretch...allowed a season-high 10 hits in 5.0 innings at Oakland Aug. 18...went 3-2 with a 2.57 ERA in five starts in September...struck out 43 batters in 28 innings and walked just four...ranked fourth in the AL in strikeouts in September...had three 10-strikeout games in the month, including Sept. 6 against New York (NL) when he fanned a season-high 12 in 6.0 shutout innings...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the second pitcher in Cleveland history to have that many strikeouts in a game in which he pitched no more than six innings (Sam McDowell vs. Detroit, Sept. 18, 1966)...did not walk a batter and became the first Major League pitcher with a scoreless outing of 6.0 innings or fewer with at least 12 strikeouts and no walks since Texas' Matt Perisho Oct. 3, 1999 at Anaheim...finished the season with back-to-back 10-strikeout games, fanning 10 Sept. 21 against Houston and 11 Sept. 28 at Minnesota...won both starts to become the first Indian to win consecutive starts with 10 or more strikeouts since Chuck Finley in April, 2000.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Chavez (2-4, 3.92 ERA in 2013): Is scheduled to make the third start of his career...the other two came with Toronto in 2012...went 5-1 with a save and a 2.22 ERA in seven games, five starts, this spring...the five wins were the most in the majors and the most by an A's pitcher since spring win totals are available beginning in 1990...ranked second in the Cactus League in innings pitched (28.1), fourth in strikeouts (25) and eighth in ERA...made his final spring start last Friday against San Francisco when he picked up the win in a 4-1 victory (5.1 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 5 so)...is 0-0 with a 0.00 ERA (11.0 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 5 bb, 13 so) in eight career appearances, all in relief, against Seattle...spent most of the 2013 season with the A's and was 2-4 with a save and a career-low 3.92 ERA in 35 games over two stints.

TODAY'S NIGHT GAME STARTING PITCHER:

Josh Lindblom (1-3, 5.46 ERA in 2013)

RECALL: Will be recalled from Triple-A Sacramento following the day game to start the night game...it will be his 110th career appearance but just his sixth start...the other five came with Texas last year (see 2013 recap below).

THIS SPRING: Went 0-2 with a 4.02 ERA in six games, including one start, before he was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento March 23...allowed a .271 (16 for 59) opponents batting average...yielded at least one run in five of his six appearances...tossed at least 1.2 innings in each of his six outings.

LINDBLOM vs. CLEVELAND: Had a no decision in his only career appearance and start, a 6-3 win at Texas on June 10, 2013 (4.50 ERA)...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a three-run double to Santana in the third inning...the Rangers tied the game with two runs in the fourth and he left after six innings with the score tied at 3-3...the Indians starting pitcher that day was Scott Kazmir.

2013 RECAP: Spent most of the season at Triple-A Round Rock but also had three stints with Texas...went 1-3 with a 5.46 ERA in eight games, five starts...the starts were the first of his Major League career...was 0-3 with a 6.33 ERA and .304 opponents batting average in his five starting assignments...had a win and did not allow a run in 4.1 innings in his three relief appearances...opponents hit .071 against him as a reliever...stranded all three of his inherited runners and retired each of his three first batters faced in relief.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .278 opponents average overall, including .262 (11-for-42) against right-handed hitters compared to .286 (24-for-84) against left-handers...his career splits are .202 (53-for-262) against righties, .283 (64-for-226) against lefties...yielded a .193 batting average the first time through the lineup, .348 after that...his career numbers are .222 (93-for-418) the first time, .343 (24-

for-70) after that...opponents hit .237 with the bases empty, .340 with three of his four home runs with runners on base...however, allowed a .182 batting average with runners in scoring position, including .067 with RISP and two outs.

MORE 2013 WITH TEXAS: His first stint with the Rangers lasted just one day as he was called up May 20 to start against Oakland...took the loss (4.2 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 4 so) and was sent back to Round Rock following the game...was recalled a second time June 9 and went 0-1 with a 4.76 ERA in three starts before returning to the Express June 20...tossed a career-high 6.0 innings in back-to-back starts June 10 against Cleveland and June 15 against Toronto...struck out a career-high six in his start against the Indians...was 1-1 with a 5.59 ERA in four games, including one start, during his third stint from July 2 to 10...had career-highs in runs (6), hits (9) and walks (4) in 5.1 innings in his final start July 10 at Baltimore.

2013 RECAP: Spent most of the season with the A's and was 2-4 with a save and a career-low 3.92 ERA in 35 games over two stints...the save was the first of his career and he also struck out a career-high 55 batters...also had career lows in opponents batting average (.230), on-base percentage (.302) and slugging percentage (.318)...matched his career highs in wild pitches (5) and hit batters (3)...surrendered just three home runs in 57.1 innings, an average of 0.47 per nine innings...entered the season with 34 home runs in 177.1 career innings (1.73 per nine innings).
