OPENING DAY IN SEATTLE

The Mariners will play their home opener on Tuesday, April 8 hosting the Los Angeles Angels at Safeco Field...Seattle is 22-15 all-time in first home game of the season, including going 7-5 in home openers after starting on the road.

REHAB UPDATES

Right-hander **Stephen Pryor** has reported to AA Jackson and will begin a rehab assignment today...right-hander **Taijuan Walker** will report to A High Desert and is scheduled to start the Mavericks second game of the season Friday night vs. Inland Empire.

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue their 38th season with a road tilt at the Oakland Athletics... tonight is the first game of a four-game series against the Athletics...began 7-game road trip with three games against the Angels (3-1)...tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS** in high definition & broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle & Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...

- **Division Rivals** – Open the season with 16 consecutive games against an AL West foe: LAA - 5 G, OAK - 7 G, TEX - 4 G...28 of first 34 games of the 2014 season are against division opponents.
- **Road Warriors** – Mariners will play 23 of first 34 games of the season on the road.
- **Young & Old** – **Fernando Rodney** is oldest player on the Mariners Opening Day roster (37.014) and **Mike Zunino** (23.007) is the youngest.
- Seattle pitchers have struck out 32 batters in 27.0 innings while allowing just four walks.

STARTING THINGS RIGHT...Seattle starters have combined to go 3-0 with a 1.80 ERA (4 ER, 20.0 IP) with 26 strikeouts while allowing just three walks...opponents are hitting just .167 (12x72) against Mariners starters, 2nd best in the American League and 6th in the Majors.

ROAD WARRIORS...the Mariners scored 26 runs in their just completed 3-game sweep of the Angels, in the process, they became just the third live ball era road team to win each of their first three games by scoring at least eight runs in each game (scored, 10, 8 & 8).

HEART OF THE ORDER...the Mariners 2-3-4-5-6 hitters last night (Miller, Cano, Smoak, Hart, Romero) combined to go 10-for-22 with 2 home runs and 5 RBI, with each recording a multi-hit game.

SMOAK'IN...**Justin Smoak** has opened the season with three consecutive multi-hit games...is the 8th time in club history a player has recorded at least three consecutive games of 2+ hits to open a season (player on Opening Day roster)...**Ichiro Suzuki** opened 2005 season w/ 5 consecutive multi-hit games...Smoak is 7th player in club history to record 1+ RBI in each of first three games of a Mariners season, and first since **Jose Lopez** in 2006...7 RBI through first three team games are tied for most, joining **Gorman Thomas** (1985), **Richie Sexson** (2006), **David Segui** (1998) & **Jim Presley** (1986).

GOOD START...the Mariners current three-game stretch is only the second time in club history to record 10+ hits in the first three games of a season...opened the 1979 season with four straight games with 10+ hits...also the second time in club history to score 6+ runs in each of the first three games, one game short of a four-game streak to open the 1998 season.

ELIAS SAYS...**James Paxton** blanked the Angels for seven innings on Wednesday and after five starts for Seattle he's now 4-0 with a 1.16 ERA...Paxton is only the second pitcher in Major League history to go 4-0 or 5-0 in his first five games, all starts, with an ERA under 1.25...in 1945, **Boo Ferriss** of the Red Sox won his first five starts while having a 0.60 ERA.

LOOKING FOR FOUR...Seattle has won three straight to start the season for the third time in club history, joining the 1995 (3) & 1985 clubs (6)...Seattle's sweep of the Angels was its first in Anaheim since 2006 and it was just the second time in club history to complete a season-opening sweep, joining the 1985 club who swept the Tigers and Twins in the first two series.

STAYING HOT...dating back to August 7, 2013, **Dustin Ackley** is hitting .325 (49x151) with 18 runs, 9 doubles, 3 triples, 3 home runs, 18 RBI, a .404 OBP, .483 slugging and a .887 OPS in 44 games...his .325 batting average in that span is 8th best in A.L. (min. 100 AB) behind **Robinson Cano** (.375/75x200), **Victor Martinez** (.354/69x195), **Daniel Nava** (.343/46x134), **Salvador Perez** (.339/57x168), **Craig Gentry** (.330/36x109), **Omar Infante** (.328/56x170) & **Dustin Pedroia** (.328/66x201).

IT IS EARLY, BUT...Seattle ranks near the top of several offensive categories in the Majors including doubles (T1st/9), triples (T1st/2), HR (1st/6), RBI (T1st), average (2nd/.309) & slugging (1st/.591)...on pitching side in the AL, rank near top in strikeouts (T1st/32) & opponents average (1st/.177).

SHORTSTOP POP...**Brad Miller** hit his first & second home runs of the season Tuesday and the 9th and 10th of his career (first against a left-hander)...since July 19, 2013, his 10 home runs as a shortstop rank 3rd in the Majors behind Los Angeles' **Hanley Ramirez** (12) and Texas' **Donnie Murphy** (11)...ahead of Atlanta's **Andrelton Simmons**, Baltimore's **J.J. Hardy** and Colorado's **Troy Tulowitzki** at 9.

TWO OUTS. SO WHAT?...though only three games into the season, the Mariners have driven in 18 of their 26 runs this season with two outs, leading the Majors (PHI, 13; SF, 12)...Seattle is hitting .390 (16x41) with 5 doubles, 1 triple, 5 home runs, 18 RBI and 9 walks with two outs...**Justin Smoak** (7 RBI) leads the Majors in the 2-out RBI category while **Dustin Ackley** & **Brad Miller** (4 RBI) are tied for 2nd.

COME ON IN...Seattle is hitting .429 (12x28) with 6 2B, 1 3B, 3 HR, 22 RBI w/ runners in scoring position, tops in MLB...rank 1st in MLB w/ 1.036 slugging % & 2nd in Majors with .485 on-base %.

AS YOU KNOW...the Mariners have two rookies in the starting rotation (Paxton & Elias)...**BUT DID YOU KNOW**...that two rookies haven't made starts in the first five Mariners games to start the season since 1977?...in the Mariners inaugural season, **Enrique Romo** started (and lost) the second game and then **Gary Wheelock** started (and won) the fourth game of the season...in 1993, the Mariners had rookies **John Cummings** and **Mike Hampton** in the rotation to start the year but didn't use a 5th starter until the 12th game.

ABOUT ELIAS...

- Pronounced: Roenis (roh-EN-ees) Elias (ehl-LEE-us)
- 25-year-old left-hander is making his Major League debut tonight vs. the Athletics.
- Has spent entire career in the Mariners organization after being signed as a minor league free agent on May 3, 2011.
- Defected from Cuba to Mexico in late 2010 after playing with Guantanamo in Serie Nacional.
- Owns a career MiLB record of 22-19, 3.61 ERA (131 ER, 326.2 IP) in 59 games/56 starts over 3 seasons.
- Made his professional debut in 2011 with the Mariners in the Arizona League...also appeared in games with Pulaski and Clinton during his rookie campaign.

SPRING TRAINING RECAP...Went 3-0 with a 2.28 ERA (6 ER, 22.2 IP) in 6 games/3 starts during Spring Training...limited opponents to a .232 average (19x82), while walking 10 and striking out 13...won 3 consecutive appearances, 3/6-16, allowing only 2 earned runs in 11.0 innings (3 G/1 GS)...overall finished 3rd on the team in innings pitched (22.2) and strikeouts (13).

FIRST OPENING DAY ROSTER...Elias and James Paxton are the Mariners fourth and fifth rookie pitchers to crack the Opening Day starting rotation since 1999 (also: Brandon Maurer in 2013, Michael Pineda in 2011 and Freddy Garcia in 1999).

WHAT A JUMP...Elias is the Mariners fourth starting pitcher to jump from Double-A to a starting spot in the Major League rotation, joining Brandon Maurer in 2013, Mike Hampton and John Cummings, who both did it out of Class A back in 1993.

MAKING HIS MLB STARTING DEBUT...Elias is also only the eighth Mariners pitchers to make his Major League debut in a start since 2005, joining James Paxton (9/7/13), Taijuan Walker (8/30/13), Brandon Maurer (4/4/13), Anthony Vasquez (8/23/11), Blake Beavan (7/3/11), Michael Pineda (4/5/11) and Felix Hernandez (8/4/05).

FOREIGN-BORN PLAYERS...born 8/1/88 in Guantanamo, Cuba, **Elias** is one of 19 MLB players born in Cuba to make an Opening Day roster, including 1 of 6 pitchers (Francisco Bueno-KC, Aroldis Chapman-CIN, Jose Fernandez-MIA, Onelki Garcia-LAD, Miguel Gonzalez-PHI)...Elias is the 5th Cuban-born player in Mariners franchise history, including the 3rd pitcher (also: Tony Fossas, 1998 and Diego Segui, 1977).

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER...is 22-19 with a 3.61 ERA (131 ER, 326.2 IP) in 59 games/56 career starts over 3 seasons in the minor leagues...went 11-6 with a 3.76 ERA (62 ER, 148.1 IP) in 26 starts with High Desert in 2012...Elias was only the 4th pitcher in franchise history to start at least 25 games and have an ERA under 4.00 in a single season...joined John Patterson (2.83) and Brad Penny (2.96) in 1998 and Luis Galindez (3.87) in 1992...recorded his first career double digit strikeout game with a career-high 11 K's in 7.2 innings on July 21 at Stockton...made professional debut with the AZL Mariners on July 17, 2011 (1.0,1,0,0,0,0)...recorded first career win on July 24 at Danville w/Pulaski (4.0,3,0,0,1,HB).

- Went 6-11 with a 3.18 ERA in 22 starts with AA Jackson...limited opponents to a .232 (112x482) average, while walking 50 and striking out 121...recorded 14 quality starts.
- Received 3 or less runs of support in 15 of his 22 starts.
- Finished 7th in the Southern League in ERA, while ranking 4th amongst league starters in SO/9.0 IP (8.38).
- Named to the Southern League All-Star team.
- Struck out a season-high 10 batters July 24 at Chattanooga (5.0,6,3,3,0,10,HR,HB).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER: RHP CHRIS YOUNG (1-2, 6.81 ERA in MiLB in 2013 w/WAS)

34-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his first Major League appearance since Sept. 29, 2012 at ATL w/WAS tomorrow night vs. the Oakland Athletics...signed by Seattle as a Major League free agent on March 27, 2014 after being released from his MiLB contract with the Washington Nationals...made allowed 4 hits and struck out 2 in 4.2 scoreless inning in only Spring Training start with the Mariners on March 29 at COL...went 0-0 with 3.48 ERA (4 ER, 10.1 IP) in 4 G/2 S GS with the Nationals during Spring Training...**2013 RECAP:** Spent the entire 2013 season in the Nationals minor league system, posting a record of 1-2 with a 6.81 ERA (28 ER, 37.0 IP) with 21 strikeouts in 9 appearances, all starts with AAA Syracuse (7 GS), short-season Auburn (1 GS) and the Gulf Coast League Nationals (1 GS)...he underwent a right shoulder thoracic outlet decompression procedure on June 11 which was performed by Dr. Robert Thompson...**CAREER:** is 53-43 with 3.79 ERA (375 ER, 890.2 IP) in 159 GS with Texas (2004-05), San Diego (2005-10) and New York-NL (2011-12)...began his professional career in 2000 in the Pittsburgh Pirates organization before being traded to the Montreal Expos before the 2003 season...**vs. OAK:** Making 5th career start vs. OAK, but first since June 27, 2006 w/SD...is 2-1, 3.32 ERA (8 ER, 21.2 IP) in 4 GS vs. the A's, including going 1-0 with a 1.54 ERA (2 ER, 11.2 IP) in 2 starts at O.co Coliseum.
