Single-game tickets for the 2014 season are on sale now...tickets are available without a service charge at the Safeco Field Box Office and Mariners Team Stores...good tickets are available for the Mariners home opener April 8.

#### OPENING DAY IN SEATTLE

The Mariners will play their home opener on Tuesday, April 8 hosting the Los Angeles Angels at Safeco Field...Seattle is 22-15 all-time in first home game of the season, including going 7-5 in home openers after starting on the road.

#### TODAY'S TRANSACTIONS

Right-hander **Dominic Leone** has been selected from AAA Tacoma...to make room on the 25-man roster, right-hander **Hector Noesi** has been designated for assignment...the Mariners now have 10 days to trade, release or outright Noesi.

**TONIGHT'S TILT**...the Mariners continue their 38th season with a road tilt at the Oakland Athletics... tonight is the second game of a four-game series against the Athletics (0-1)...began 7-game road trip with three games against the Angels (3-0)...tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS** in high definition & broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle & Mariners Radio Network.

#### ODDS AND ENDS...

- **Division Rivals** - Open the season with 16 consecutive games against an AL West foe: LAA - 5 G, OAK - 7 G, TEX - 4 G...28 of first 34 games of the 2014 season are against division opponents.
- **Road Warriors** - Mariners will play 23 of first 34 games of the season on the road.
- **Young & Old** - **Fernando Rodney** is oldest player on the Mariners Opening Day roster (37.015) and **Mike Zunino** (23.008) is the youngest.
- Seattle pitchers have struck out 42 batters in 38.0 innings this year.

**GRADUATING TO MAJORS**...the Mariners have two sets of players who played together in their college days...left-fielder **Dustin Ackley** and third baseman **Kyle Seager** played together at the **University of North Carolina**, and now, shortstop **Brad Miller** and reliever **Dominic Leone** are together again after playing together at **Clemson University**.

**WESTERN STREAK**...**Robinson Cano** has a current 12-game hitting streak (since July 24, 2013) against the AL West, hitting .478 (22x46) with 8 runs, 4 doubles, 6 RBI and a .547 on-base percentage... he is a career .308 (362x1175) against the AL West...over his last 18 games at O.Co Coliseum is hitting .329 (25x76) with 6 doubles, 2 triples, 5 home runs and 11 RBI.

**EASY AS 1-2-3**...the Seattle pitching staff has set a club record by allowing three runs or less in the each of the first four games to start the season...previous record was 3, done three times (1993, 1995, 2000)...the last three teams to start the season with at least 5 games were the 2013 Pirates (5), 2008 Blue Jays and the 2004 Marlins (9).

**TIRED OF WALKING**...the Mariners suffered their first walk-off loss of the season last night after enduring a club record tying 13 walk-off losses in 2013...have lost 9 straight extra-inning games (since July 11, 2013) and have suffered a Major League leading 50 walk-off losses since 2010 (STL, 38)...set a club record with 21 extra-inning games last season.

**FARQUHAR K RATE**...**Danny Farquhar** has struck out 4 of the 10 batters he has faced this season, including 3 in 1.2 innings last night...in his career, Farquhar has recorded strikeout rate of 12.53 per 9.0 innings, the 5th-highest all-time by a pitcher with a minimum of 225 batters faced...Danny has faced 249 batters, and recorded 84 strikeouts...ranks behind **Craig Kimbrel** (15.11), **Aroldis Chapman** (14.68), **Kenley Jansen** (14.06) and **Albuquerque** (12.96).

**STARTING THINGS RIGHT**...Seattle starters have combined to go 3-0 with a 1.80 ERA (5 ER, 25.0 IP) with 29 strikeouts while allowing six walks...opponents are hitting just .161 (14x87) against Mariners starters, 1st in the American League and 4th in the Majors.

**STAYING HOT**...dating back to August 7, 2013, **Dustin Ackley** is hitting .321 (50x156) with 18 runs, 9 doubles, 3 triples, 3 home runs, 18 RBI, a .398 OBP, .474 slugging and a .872 OPS in 45 games...his .321 batting average in that span is T8th best in A.L. (min. 100 AB) behind **Robinson Cano** (.371/76x205), **Victor Martinez** (.354/69x195), **Daniel Nava** (.341/47x138), **Salvador Perez** (.339/57x168), **Craig Gentry** (.330/36x109), **Omar Infante** (.328/56x170) & **Dustin Pedroia** (.325/67x206).

**IT IS EARLY, BUT**...Seattle ranks near the top of several offensive categories in the A.L. including runs (1st/28), doubles (2nd/10), triples (T2nd/2), HR (T1st/6), RBI (3rd/28), average (4th/.263) & slugging (2nd/.474)...on pitching side in the AL, rank in strikeouts (1st/42) & opponents average (1st/.174).

**SHORTSTOP POP**...**Brad Miller** hit his first & second home runs of the season Tuesday and the 9th and 10th of his career (first against a left-hander)...since July 19, 2013, his 10 home runs as a shortstop rank 3rd in the Majors behind Los Angeles' **Hanley Ramirez** (12) and Texas' **Donnie Murphy** (11)... ahead of Atlanta's **Andrelton Simmons**, Baltimore's **J.J. Hardy** and Colorado's **Troy Tulowitzki** at 9.

**TWO OUTS, SO WHAT?**...though only four games into season, the Mariners have driven in 18 of their 28 runs this season with two outs, leading the Majors (SF, 17; PHI, 13)...Seattle is hitting .308 (16x52) with 5 doubles, 1 triple, 5 home runs, 18 RBI and 11 walks with two outs...**Justin Smoak** (7 RBI) leads the Majors in the 2-out RBI category while **Dustin Ackley** & **Brad Miller** (4 RBI) are tied for 4th.

**COME ON IN**...Seattle is hitting .351 (13x37) with 6 2B, 1 3B, 3 HR, 24 RBI w/ runners in scoring position, 4th in MLB...rank 1st in MLB w/ .811 slugging % & 7th in Majors with .405 on-base %.

**ROAD WARRIORS**...the Mariners scored 26 runs in their just completed 3-game sweep of the Angels, in the process, they became just the third live ball era road team to win each of their first three games by scoring at least eight runs in each game (scored, 10, 8 & 8).

**AS YOU KNOW**...the Mariners have a diverse starting rotation...**BUT DID YOU KNOW**...that this will be just the 6th time in MLB history that five starters, all from different countries, have made the first five starts to start a season for a team?...**Felix Hernandez** (Venezuela), **Erasmo Ramirez** (Nicaragua), **James Paxton** (Canada), **Roenis Elias** (Cuba) & **Chris Young** (USA) are lined up to accomplish the feat...others to do so are 1998 Los Angeles Dodgers, 2003 Montreal Expos, 2005 Baltimore Orioles, 2006 Baltimore Orioles & 2013 Colorado Rockies.

**ABOUT YOUNG...**

- 34-year-old right hander is making his first start of the season, and first with the Mariners.
- Last pitched in the Majors with the New York Mets in 2012 (20 starts).
- Was an All-Star in 2007 with the San Diego Padres.
- Has one career postseason start, picking up the win in G#3 of the 2006 NLDS for the Padres at St. Louis.
- At 6-foot-10 is tied for the tallest player in Mariners history with LHP Randy Johnson.
- Originally selected by Pittsburg in the 3rd round of the 2000 June Draft out of Princeton University.
- Was a two-sport start in basketball and baseball at Princeton.
- Has played in the Pirates, Expos, Rangers, Padres, Mets, Nationals and now Mariners organizations.
- #53 will be the fourth jersey number he has worn in a MLB game...#49 with Texas, #32 with San Diego, #55 with New York Mets.
- Is 12-9, 3.99 ERA in 30 career starts in the month of April.

**WELCOME TO THE TEAM...** signed with the Mariners as a free agent on March 27 after being released by the Washington Nationals...was a non-roster invitee in the Nationals spring camp.

**MAKING A COMEBACK...** has battled shoulder surgeries over the last four seasons, making only 28 Major League starts since the start of the 2010 season.

**HE IS A TALL ONE...** listed at 6-foot-10, Young will tie LHP Randy Johnson as the tallest player in club history...Young is one of 6 pitchers in MLB history listed at 6-foot-10 or taller, with RHP Jon Rauch listed at 6-foot-11...here is a listing of the tallest players in Mariners history according to the SABR and STATS Inc databases:

**SPRING TRAINING RECAP...** made 5 spring appearances (3 starts) with the Nationals and Mariners...in the Grapefruit League posted a 3.48 ERA (4 ER, 10.1 IP), allowing 8 hits, 4 walks and striking out 9...made one start with the Mariners March 29 at Colorado in the final spring game...tossed 4.2 scoreless innings, allowing 4 hits and striking out a pair.

**WELCOME BACK TO THE AL...** Chris will be making his first start on an American League team since 2005 when he went 12-7 with a 4.26 ERA in 31 starts for the Texas Rangers...121 of his 159 career starts have come on National League teams...owns an all-time 17-9 record vs. American League teams (2-1 vs. Oakland).

**LAST MLB OUTING...** tonight will be Chris' first MLB start since Sept. 29, 2012 at Atlanta...in his last outing with the Mets, he allowed 2 runs on 7 hits in 6.0 innings to suffer the loss...will be a span of 552 days between MLB starts.

**2013 SEASON HIGHLIGHTS...**

- First time since 2003 to not appear in a Major League game.
- Went 1-2 with a 6.81 ERA (28 ER, 37.0 IP) in 9 starts in the Nationals minor league system.
- Was on the disabled list from May 27-Aug. 27.
- Underwent right shoulder thoracic outlet decompression procedure on June 11, performed by Dr. Robert Thompson.
- Finished the season making a pair of rehab appearances with the GCL Nationals and Auburn (NY Penn League).

**HE IS A PRINCETON MAN...** earned a B.A. in politics from Princeton...completed his studies in just four years despite playing two sports and being drafted by the Pirates...senior thesis at Princeton examined the impact of Jackie Robinson on racial stereotypes in the realm of media...majority of the thesis was written while riding the team bus for Hickory in the South Atlantic League...played both baseball and hoops (2 seasons) for Princeton...in 1999, was named Ivy League Rookie of the Year in both sports...averaged 13.6 points per game on the hardwood...blocked a Princeton single-season record 88 shots in 2nd season with the Tigers...spurned multiple overtures from various NBA teams and instead stuck with baseball.

**TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER: RHP FELIX HERNANDEZ (1-0, 3.00)**

27-year-old right-hander will be making his 2nd start of the 2014 season...celebrates his 28th birthday Tuesday (4/8)...**Opening Day:** W#1 Opening Night (3/31) vs. the Angels, allowing 3 runs (2 ER) and 4 hits in 6.0 innings...struck out 11 batters, his 2nd-most in his club-record 7 Opening Day starts (12 - 4/2/07 vs. OAK)...improved to 5-0 with a 1.52 ERA (9 ER, 53.1 IP) in his 7 Opening Day starts...became the first pitcher in modern MLB history to recorded as many as 7 Opening Day starts before turning 28 years old...**2013:** Named to the AL All-Star team for the 4th time in his career...went 13-9, 3.06 ERA and recorded his fourth consecutive season or 200.0+ innings and 200+ strikeouts...ranked 5th in the AL in strikeouts (216) and 6th in ERA (3.06)...**Career:** 110-86 with a 3.20 ERA and 1,703 strikeouts in 269 career starts...entering his 10th Major League season (debuted 8/4/05)...**vs. OAK:** Making his 30th career start vs. the A's (15-7, 2.66 ERA)...went 2-1, 1.31 ERA (3 ER, 20.2 IP) in 3 starts vs. the A's last season.
