OAKLAND ATHLETICS (2-2) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (3-1)

ABOUT THE A'S: Won the first game of what is now a three-game series with Seattle Thursday night after losing two of three to Cleveland to start the season...have started the season 2-2 for the second consecutive season (would improve to 9-2 last year before losing their third game)...this is the A's 47th season in Oakland...have won 16 American League West titles, one AL Wild Card, six AL pennants and four World Championships in Oakland...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 3819-3502 (.522) record over the previous 46 seasons in Oakland...only five teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis, Cincinnati)...this is the Athletics franchise 114th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 8534-8974 (.487) in their previous 113 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

THIS AND THAT: A's starting pitchers have allowed two runs or fewer in each of the first four games and have a 1.13 ERA (3 er in 24.0 ip) for the season...that is the lowest mark in the American League and second lowest in the majors...have a 2.31 ERA overall, which ranks third in the AL...A's hitters drew 10 walks Thursday night and have 25 for the season, tied for the most in the Majors (Tampa Bay)...also are tied for the Major League lead with three triples and are third in the AL with four stolen bases...recorded their first walk-off win of the season Thursday night and three of the A's first four games have been decided in the last at bat...each of the A's first four games has lasted at least three hours, marking the first time in Oakland history the A's have started the season by playing four consecutive games of at least three hours...the average time of game is 3:29.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 15-13-5, which marked their third consecutive spring with a winning record (17-13-3 in 2013, 15-7-2 in 2012)...the last time A's had three straight winning springs was from 2000-04 when they had five straight...the five tie games were the most by an Oakland team since moving to Arizona for Spring Training in 1969...the previous high was three in 2010 and 2013...have 16 tie games over the last six springs...went 8-5-2 in the final spring at Phoenix Muni and 7-8-3 on the road...led the majors in walks (135), ranked second in runs (193) and on-base percentage (.358), tied for third in grounded into double plays (29), fourth in strikeouts (239) and tied for fourth in triples (11)...were fourth in most double plays turned (34) and most errors (33)...the A's pitching staff ranked fifth in the majors with 247 strikeouts...those are the most strikeouts by an A's team during the spring since statistics are available beginning in 1991...the previous high was 228 last year...allowed a Major League leading 44 home runs.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's opened the season with 12 pitchers and 13 position players for the sixth time in the last eight years...the exceptions were in 2008 and 2012 when they opened in Japan and carried just 10 pitchers...13 players returned from last years Opening Day roster (Céspedes, Crisp, Donaldson, Doolittle, Jaso, Lowrie, Milone, Moss, Norris, Reddick, Scribner, Sogard, Straily)...those are the most returning players from a previous Opening Day roster since the 2007 club had 16...five other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year (Barton, Callaspo, Chavez, Gray, Otero), four were acquired in a trade (Abad, Gregerson, Johnson, Pomeranz), two were signed as a free agent (Kazmir, Punto), and one was signed as a free agent to a minor league contract (Fuld).

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: For the first time since 2006, the A's began the season with no rookies on the Opening Day roster...four players had six or more years of service: Nick Punto (11 years, 51 days), Coco Crisp (10 years, 158 days), Scott Kazmir (7 years, 119 days) and Alberto Callaspo (6 years, 135 days).

TENURE: Of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only four played for the A's prior to 2012...Daric Barton played for the A's in 2007 and three players were with the club in 2010 (Crisp, Donaldson,

Sogard)...Barton has been in the A's organization the longest as he was acquired from St. Louis in the Mark Mulder trade, December 18, 2004.

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 28.64 years...the A's roster features one player under the age of 25, Sonny Gray at the age of 24 years, 143 days...next youngest is Derek Norris (25 years, 44 days)...there are nine players that are at least 30 years old...Nick Punto is the oldest at 36 years, 142 days...he is followed by Coco Crisp (34 years, 129 days) and Sam Fuld (32 years, 130 days)...two of the 30-year olds are in the starting rotation: Jesse Chavez (30 years, 221 days) and Scott Kazmir (30 years, 65 days)...the last time the A's had two 30-year olds in the starting rotation at the same time was in April of 2010 (Ben Sheets, Justin Duchscherer).

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have four players under contract beyond the 2014 season...Yoenis Céspedes, Scott Kazmir and Eric O'Flaherty are signed through 2015 and Coco Crisp is signed through 2016 with a vesting option for 2017...Nick Punto has a vesting option for 2015 and minor leaguer Hiroyuki Nakajima has a club option for 2015.

OPENING DAY: The A's extended their Opening Day losing streak to 10 games Monday night to establish a new **Major League record**...broke the previous mark of nine held by the New York Giants (1893-1901) and Atlanta Braves (1972-80)...were shutout for the second consecutive opener and now have a 25-inning scoreless streak on Opening Day...have scored just one run in their last 37 innings in openers and have just 13 runs during the Opening Day losing streak...are batting .167 (54 for 324) over that 10-game stretch...eight players returned from last year's Opening Day starting lineup (Céspedes, Crisp, Donaldson, Jaso, Lowrie, Moss, Reddick, Sogard)...that matched the most returning players from an Opening Day starting lineup in Oakland history (1976).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Cook, Elmore Gentry, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Rodriguez)...O'Flaherty and Parker are both on the 60-day DL...Cook (Stockton) and Rodriguez (Sacramento) have started a rehab assignment...the seven players on the DL matches the most players the A's had on the DL at once last year (May 7-14 and August 26-27)...used the DL just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's won the first meeting of 2014 Thursday night after losing the season series last year, 11-8...went 4-6 in Oakland and 4-5 in Seattle...over the previous eight seasons, the A's have won the season series in even numbered seasons (2006, 2008, 2010, 2012) and the Mariners have won in odd numbered years (2007, 2009, 2011, 2013)...Oakland is 80-73 (.523) against the Mariners since 2006...all-time, the A's are 313-235 (.572) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by any team against the Mariners to Boston's .581 mark (min. 20 games)...are 173-101 in Oakland, 139-133 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 63-69 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yoenis Céspedes has hit 10 of his 49 career home runs against Seattle, his most against any team...**Coco Crisp** hit his 50th home run as an Athletic Thursday night...25 of those have given Oakland the lead...has 143 career steals as an Athletic and needs one more to tie Reggie Jackson for fifth in Oakland history...has a 141-game errorless streak, which is fifth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...**Luke Gregerson** has pitched in 366 games since 2009, which is the most in the majors over that span...**John Jaso** has 15 pinch-walks since 2010, which are the most by an American Leaguer over that span...**Jed Lowrie** had 10 doubles against Seattle last year, matching the most in Oakland history against one team...**Dan Otero** has not allowed a home run in 53.0 career innings.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1993** Eric Fox hits the first Opening Day grand slam in Oakland history as the A's defeat the Detroit Tigers, 9-4...in **1994** Terry Steinbach hits the second Opening Day grand slam in Oakland history, but the A's lose 11-7 at Milwaukee.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Dan Straily (10-8, 3.96 ERA in 2013)

THIS SPRING: Had no decisions and a 4.37 ERA in four starts this spring...opponents hit .275...walked two or more batters in all four starts and issued 10 walks in 13.1 innings overall (6.75 walks per nine innings)...had his final start on March 29 against San Francisco rained out...pitched in a minor league game March 24 (5.2 ip, 10 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 2 hr).

STRAILY vs. SEATTLE: Is 0-1 with a 7.82 ERA (12.2 ip, 15 h, 12 r, 11 er, 11 bb, 12 so, 4 hr) in three career starts...including 0-1 with an 8.64 ERA (8.1 ip, 12 h, 8 r, 8 er, 7 bb, 9 so, 2 hr) in two starts last year...the loss came in a 6-3 decision at Seattle May 10...allowed a career-high tying six runs in 5.0 innings...allowed a RBI single to Morse and a RBI double to Smoak in the first inning...then allowed a three-run home run to Ibanez in the third and a RBI double to Morales in the fifth...then had a no decision in the A's 7-5 loss at Seattle June 22...tossed a career-low 3.1 innings...allowed two runs in the second inning on a leadoff home run by Gutierrez and a RBI single by Franklin...those were the only runs he would allow...was trailing 2-1 when he allowed a one out double to Chavez in the fourth...was relieved by Chavez after tossing 78 pitches...the A's scored twice in the fifth to get him off the hook.

2013 RECAP: Had five stints with Oakland in 2013 and was 10-8 with a 3.96 ERA in 27 starts...led American League rookies in games started, innings pitched (152.1) and strikeouts (124) and tied for the lead in wins (Perez, TEX)...is the 11th rookie in Oakland history to win 10 or more games, the fifth in the last five years (Anderson, Cahill, Milone, Parker)...had the sixth most strikeouts by an Oakland rookie...went 1-2 with a 7.27 ERA and .257 opponents batting average over his first five starts, 5-0 with a 2.83 ERA and .196 opponents average over his next nine starts from May 21 to July 9, 0-5 with a 5.20 ERA and .299 opponents over his next seven starts from July 20 to Aug. 23 and 4-1 with a 2.00 ERA and .195 opponents average over his final six starts

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .233 opponents batting average...did not have enough innings pitched to qualify for the league leaders, but his opponents average was ninth lowest among AL pitchers with 150 or more innings pitched...his .358 slugging percentage was eighth best...surrendered 16 home runs in 152.1 innings (0.95 per nine innings) after allowing 11 in 39.1 innings in 2012 (2.52 per nine innings)...11 of the 16 home runs he allowed were solo shots as are 19 of the 27 in his career...his opponents batting average included a .221 (60-for-272) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .244 (72-for-295) against left-handers...allowed a .201 batting average the first time through the lineup, which was third lowest among AL pitchers with 150 or more innings pitched...now has a .205 (56-for-273) opponents average the first time through the lineup in his career...allowed a .225 batting average to batters leading off an inning...however, issued 19 walks to start an inning, which tied for second most in the AL...opponents hit .300 with runners in scoring position and two outs...they were 4-for-7 (.571) with a grand slam with the bases loaded.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 6-2 with a 4.28 ERA and .217 opponents batting average in 14 starts before the All-Star Break...then went 4-6 with a 3.61 ERA and .250 opponents average in 13 starts after the break.

NIGHT AND DAY: Was 4-2 with a 2.14 ERA and .195 opponents batting average in nine starts during the day compared to 6-6 with a 4.98 ERA and .252 opponents average in 18 starts at night...his day ERA was the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings in day games...surrendered just one

of his 16 home runs during the day...in 2012, allowed eight of his 11 home runs in day games.

DAYS REST: Was 6-3 with a 3.25 ERA in 14 starts on five days rest or more compared to 4-5 with a 4.80 ERA in 13 starts on four days rest...is now 8-3 with a 2.90 ERA (35 er in 108.2 ip) in 18 career starts on five days rest or more compared to 4-6 with a 5.31 ERA (49 er in 83.0 ip) in 16 starts on four days rest.

RUN SUPPORT: Received two runs of support or fewer in 17 of his 27 starts and was 5-8 in those games...was 5-0 in 10 starts with three runs of support or more...is now 6-9 in 20 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 6-0 in 14 starts with support of three or more

THIS AND THAT: Was 3-1 with a 1.54 ERA and .167 opponents batting average in four interleague starts...tied for third in the majors in interleague wins, ranked fourth in opponents batting average and ninth in ERA...tied for the team-lead with seven hit batters...the A's were 16-11 (.593) in his starting assignments and are 21-13 (.618) in his career.

MORE 2013 WITH OAKLAND: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and struck out a career-high 11 batters in 6.2 innings in his first start, an 8-3 victory at Houston April 5...the 11 strikeouts matched the Oakland rookie record...was optioned to Sacramento the next day when Colón was reinstated from the suspended list...returned to Oakland April 29 to start for Brett Anderson and allowed a career-high six runs on seven hits in 4.2 innings that night against Los Angeles (AL)...had a no decision in the A's 10-8, 19-inning win and was optioned to Sacramento the next day...returned May 1 when Anderson was placed on the DL and went 3-2 with a 4.72 ERA and .232 opponents batting average in 10 starts during his third stint through June 22...had a no decision in the A's 5-4 win at New York May 5...left with a 4-1 lead in the sixth inning but Blevins allowed two inherited runners to score plus one of his own for the blown save...it was his first of four starts where he left with the lead only to have the bullpen blow the save (June 1 vs. Chicago-AL, Aug. 12 at Toronto, Sept. 19 vs. Minnesota)...combined with Doolittle and Balfour on a three-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win at Texas May 21...tossed seven innings and allowed two of the hits...did not walk a batter to become just the second visiting pitcher at Rangers Ballpark to toss seven or more innings and allow two or fewer baserunners...the win began a career-high five-game winning streak that spanned nine starts through July 9 during his fourth stint...posted a 2.83 ERA and held the opposition to a .196 batting average during the streak...surrendered just four home runs in 54.0 innings...had a career-high 12.0 inning scoreless streak from May 21-27...tossed a career-low 3.1 innings June 22 at Seattle and was optioned to Sacramento the next day...returned to Oakland July 4 and went 2-0 with a 0.68 ERA in two starts (13.1 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 6 bb, 13 so) before he was sent back to Sacramento July 10 with the All-Star Break approaching...was recalled for the final time July 20 and went 4-6 with a 3.61 ERA over his final 13 starts...went 0-5 with a 4.09 ERA and .300 opponents batting average over his first six starts following his return (July 20-Aug. 17)...the losing streak was the longest of his career...received just three runs of support in the six starts as the A's were shut out twice and held to one run three times...his one no decision during the losing streak was Aug. 12 at Toronto when he yielded one run in a career-high 7.1 innings in the A's 5-1 win...allowed a career-high tying six runs in a career-low tying 3.1 innings Aug. 23 at Baltimore...then went 4-0 with a 1.90 ERA and .181 opponents batting average over his next four starts from Aug. 28 to Sept. 13...allowed three hits or fewer while pitching five innings or more in four consecutive starts from Sept. 2 to 19...that matched the longest such streak by an A's pitcher since at least 1916...opponents went 10-for-80 (.125) during the streak...finished September with a 3-1 record, a 2.10 ERA and a .163 opponents batting average in five starts...had the lowest opponents batting average in the majors in September and ranked sixth in the AL in ERA...made one start against the Tigers in the ALDS, a no decision in the A's 8-6 loss in Game 4 at Detroit (6.0 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 8 so).

2013 WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-1 with a 1.14 ERA and .202 opponents batting average in five starts with Sacramento...allowed just one home run in 31.2 innings...struck out 33, an average of 9.38 per nine innings...his opponents batting average included a .174 (8-for-46) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .219 (16-for-73) against right-handers...yielded a .161 average to batters leading off an inning and issued just one walk...the River Cats were 4-1 in his starting assignments.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (0-0, 0.00 ERA): Had a no decision in his first start, a 2-0 A's loss to Cleveland on Opening Night last Monday (6.0 ip, 5 h, 3 bb, 7 so)...became just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...now has a 13.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to September 22, 2013, which matches his career-high (August 10-20, 2013)...is 1-0 with a 1.50 ERA in two career starts against Seattle, both last year...went 0-1 with a 3.48 ERA in six starts this spring...yielded just one home run in 20.2 innings...spent most of the 2013 season at Triple-A Sacramento where he was 10-7 with a 3.42 ERA in 20 starts...also had two stints with the A's...after making two relief appearances in his Major League debut in July, he returned to Oakland Aug. 10 and finished the season in the starting rotation...was 5-3 with a 2.67 ERA in 12 games, 10 starts, with the A's.

- A's bullpen has tied for the most losses in the AL...also tied for the fourth most innings pitched among AL bullpens.

- Issued the fewest walks in the AL (154) and second fewest in the majors (St. Louis, 148)...averaged 2.92 walks per nine innings, which was the A's lowest mark since 1990 (2.70).
- First batters faced had the lowest slugging percentage in the AL (.329) and second lowest in the majors (Pittsburgh, .297)...had the second lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.271) and the third lowest batting average (.217)
