#### **INSIDE THE NUMBERS**

Felix Hernandez has 15 career wins against Oakland, his most wins against any team (12 vs. Texas).

The Mariners have driven in 18 of their 28 runs this season with two outs. 2nd in the Majors (SF, 25)...Seattle is hitting .308 (16x52) with 5 doubles, 1 triple, 5 home runs. 18 RBI and 11 walks with two outs...Justin Smoak (7 RBI) leads the Majors in the 2-out RBI category while Dustin Ackley & Brad Miller (4 RBI) are tied for 7th.

#### **VS. THE ATHLETICS**

Tonight is the 3rd of 19 games between the Mariners and Athletics this season...7 of the Mariners first 12 games will be vs. the Athletics...Seattle went 11-8 vs. the Athletics last season, including a 6-4 record at O.co Coliseum.

#### **OPENING DAY IN SEATTLE**

The Mariners will play their home opener on Tuesday, April 8 hosting the Los Angeles Angels at Safeco Field...Seattle is 22-15 all-time in first home game of the season, including going 7-5 in home openers after starting on the road.

TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue their 38th season with a road tilt at the Oakland Athletics... tonight is the second game of a three-game series against the Athletics (0-1)...began the now 6-game road trip with three games against the Angels (3-0)...today's game will be televised on ROOT SPORTS in high definition & broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle & Mariners Radio Network.

- Division Rivals Open the season with 16 consecutive games against an AL West foe: LAA 5 G, OAK - 7 G, TEX - 4 G...28 of first 34 games of the 2014 season are against division opponents.
- Road Warriors Mariners will play 23 of first 34 games of the season on the road.
- Fernando Rodney is oldest player on roster (37.016) & Mike Zunino (23.009) the youngest.
- Seattle pitchers have struck out 42 batters in 38.0 innings this year.

RAIN, RAIN, GO AWAY...the Mariners and Athletics game yesterday was postponed after rain made the field conditions unplayable...it is the first time the Mariners have been rained out since May 15, 2011 at Cleveland...the last time Seattle was rained out in Oakland was on April 10, 1982.

**EXTRA! EXTRA!**...despite having yesterday's game postponed, the Mariners lead the American League and are T2nd in the Majors with 18 extra-base hits (10 2B, 2 3B, 6 HR)...18 of the 40 Mariners hits this season have gone for extra bases.

GRADUATING TO MAJORS...the Mariners have two sets of players who played together in their college days...left-fielder Dustin Ackley and third baseman Kyle Seager played together at the University of North Carolina, and now, shorstop Brad Miller and reliever Dominic Leone are together again after playing together at Clemson University.

WESTERN STREAK...Robinson Cano has a current 12-game hitting streak (since July 24, 2013) against the AL West, hitting .478 (22x46) with 8 runs, 4 doubles, 6 RBI and a .547 on-base percentage... he is a career .308 (362x1175) against the AL West...over his last 18 games at O.Co Coliseum is hitting .329 (25x76) with 6 doubles, 2 triples, 5 home runs and 11 RBI.

EASY AS 1-2-3...the Seattle pitching staff has set a club record by allowing three runs or less in the each of the first four games to start the season...previous record was 3, done three times (1993, 1995, 2000)...the last three teams to start the season with at least 5 games were the 2013 Pirates (5), 2008 Blue Jays and the 2004 Marlins (9).

TIRED OF WALKING...the Mariners suffered their first walk-off loss of the season Wednesday night after enduring a club record tying 13 walk-off losses in 2013...have lost 9 straight extra-inning games (since July 11, 2013) and have suffered a Major League leading 50 walk-off losses since 2010 (STL, 38)...set a club record with 21 extra-inning games last season.

FARQUHAR K RATE...Danny Farquhar has struck out 4 of the 10 batters he has faced this season, including 3 in 1.2 innings Thursday night...in his career, Farquhar has recorded strikeout rate of 12.53 per 9.0 innings, the 5th-highest all-time by a pitcher with a minimum of 225 batters faced...Danny has faced 249 batters, and recorded 84 strikeouts...ranks behind Craig Kimbrel (15.12), Aroldis Chapman (14.68), Kenley Jansen (14.06) and Al Alburquerque (12.96).

STARTING THINGS RIGHT... Seattle starters have combined to go 3-0 with a 1.80 ERA (5 ER, 25.0 IP) with 29 strikeouts while allowing six walks...opponents are hitting just .161 (14x87) against Mariners starters. 1st in the Majors.

STAYING HOT...dating back to August 7, 2013, Dustin Ackley is hitting .321 (50x156) with 18 runs, 9 doubles, 3 triples, 3 home runs, 18 RBI, a .398 OBP, .474 slugging and a .872 OPS in 45 games...his .321 batting average in that span is 10th best in A.L. (min. 100 AB) behind Robinson Cano (.371/76x205), Victor Martinez (.350/70x200), Salvador Perez (.339/58x171), Omar Infante (.337/59x175), Josh Hamilton (.332 (62x187), Daniel Nava (.331/47x142), Craig Gentry (.330/36x109), Miguel Cabrera (.324/57x176) & Dustin Pedroia (.324/68x210).

IT IS EARLY, BUT ... Seattle ranks near the top of several offensive categories in the A.L. including runs (1st/28), doubles (3rd/10), triples (T2nd/2), HR (T1st/6), RBI (1st/28), average (6th/.263) & slugging (3rd/.474)...on pitching side in the AL, rank in strikeouts (2nd/42) & opponents average (1st/.174).

SHORTSTOP POP...Brad Miller hit his first & second home runs of the season Tuesday and the 9th and 10th of his career (first against a left-hander)...since July 19, 2013, his 10 home runs as a shortstop rank 3rd in the Majors behind Los Angeles' Hanley Ramirez (12) and Texas' Donnie Murphy (11)... ahead of Atlanta's Andrelton Simmons, Baltimore's J.J. Hardy and Colorado's Troy Tulowitzki at 9.

COME ON IN ... Seattle is hitting .351 (13x37) with 6 2B, 1 3B, 3 HR, 24 RBI w/ runners in scoring position, 3rd in MLB...rank 1st in MLB w/ .811 slugging % & 7th in Majors with .405 on-base %.

DID YOU KNOW...that Felix Hernandez is the all-time ERA leader for pitchers from Venezuela?... his 3.1955 ERA (650 ER, 1830.2 IP) ranks ahead of fellow countrymen Johan Santana (3.203 ERA), Carlos Zambrano (3.66), Wilson Alvarez (3.96), Kelvim Escobar (4.15) and Freddy Garcia (4.15) among pitchers with a minimum of 1500.0 innings...Felix is 2nd on the all-time Venezuelan strikeout list with 1,714 K's, behind just Johan Santana (1,988)...and already ranks 4th in wins with 111 victories, behind Freddy Garcia (156), Johan Santana (139) and Carlos Zambrano (132).

ABOUT KING FELIX ... 27-year-old right-hander (turns 28 4/8) is making second start of the season today vs. the A's.

- Signed a 7-year deal through the 2019 season on Feb. 13, 2013.
- In 2010 won the **AL Cy Young**, garnering 21 of 28 first-place votes...joined Randy Johnson (1995) as only Mariners to win the Cy Young...named *Sporting News* AL Pitcher of the Year. ML debut Aug. 4, 2005 at Detroit...Safeco debut vs. MIN Aug. 9,
- 2005...youngest MLB pitcher since Jose Rijo worked as reliever in '84 (19 years, 54 days old on 7/6/84 at MIN).
- At 19 years, 118 days old at debut, was the 3rd-youngest player to debut in Mariners history & 2nd-youngest pitcher.
- Born in Valencia, VZ...signed as 16-year-old non-drafted free agent July 4, 2002.
- elected to AL squad in 2009, 2011, 2012 & 2013 ASG
- Threw the first Perfect Game in Mariners history, and 23rd in ML history, Aug. 15, 2012 in a 1-0 victory over Tampa Bay at Safeco Field (9.0,0,0,0,0,12)...7th PG in MLB history to be decided in a 1-0 game, and 1st in the AL since 1984.
- Tossed at least 6.0 IP in 218 of 270 GS (80.7%)...pitched at least 6.0 innings in 24 of 31 starts last season (77.4%), including 22 quality starts (180 career quality starts).

  Owns a 20-11, 2.58 ERA record in the opening month of the
- season (March/April) during his career...was 3-2 with a 1.90 ERA (9 ER, 42.2 IP) in 6 starts last April.

YEAR 10 ALREADY...believe it or not, this is the 10th season that Felix will be pitch in the Majors Leagues...since making his debut on Aug. 4, 2005, he has is 111-86 with a 3.20 ERA and 1,714 strikeouts.

SAY GOODBYE 27...Felix is making his last start as a 27-yearold today...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, Felix's 1,714 strikeouts are 4th-most all-time by a pitcher before their turning 28...trails only Sam McDowell (1,956), Bert Blyleven (1,910) and Walter Johnson (1,886).

LAST TIME OUT...earned W#1 in the season opener March 31 at LA Angels...allowed 3 runs (2 ER) in 6.0 innings, striking out 11 and walking only 1 batter...allowed a leadoff single followed by a 2-run Mike Trout home run in the first inning, and then settled in to allow 1 run (unearned) and 2 hits the rest of the way...improved to 5-0, 1.52 ERA in his 7 career Opening Day starts.

KING OF OPENING DAY ... Felix made his 7th career Opening Day start Monday vs. the Angels, the most in Mariners history...has started each of the Mariners last 7 Opening Days (since 2009)...with the win over the Angels, is now 5-0 with a 1.52 ERA (9 ER, 53.1 IP) all-time on Opening Day...Felix holds club Opening Day records for starts (7), consecutive starts (6), wins (5) and strikeouts (52).

ELITE COMPANY...Felix is the only pitcher in MLB history (since 1900) with 7 Opening Day starts as a pitcher before turning 28...there are 4 additional pitchers with 6 Opening Day starts before turning 28: Bert Blyleven, Dennis Eckersley, Dwight Gooden, and Fernando Valenzuela...here is a look at Felix's 7 career Opening Day starts:

SPRING TRAINING...went 2-0 with a 4.73 ERA (7 ER, 13.1 IP) in 4 Cactus League starts...recorded 13 strikeouts and walked 3 batters...also threw in a minor league game on March 20...made is final spring appearance March 25 at Kansas City (5.0,5,3,3,0,6).

OAKLAND UNDEFEATED STREAK...Felix has made 9 consecutive starts at O.co Coliseum without recording a loss...since the start of the 2009 season he is 4-0 with a 2.98 ERA (21 ER, 63.1 IP)...the streak of undefeated starts is the 2nd-longest all-time by a visiting pitcher at O.co Coliseum...trails only a 13-start streak by Mike Flanagan of the Orioles from 1977-84...Kenny Rogers had a 9-start streak as an opposing pitcher, but had several starts with the A's to break up that streak.

DOUBLE-DIGITS STRIKEOUTS...recorded 11 strikeouts in his last start at LAA, the 27th career double-digit strikeout performance of his career...recorded five 10+ strikeout starts last season, including 2 of his last 5 starts...has recorded 24 double-digits strikeout games since the start of the 2009 season, tied for 2nd-most in baseball behind only Cliff Lee (26) and tied with Justin Verlander and Tim Lincecum.

BASEBALL TONIGHT...ESPN's Baseball Tonight came out with their annual player rankings, and Felix was the No. 5 player and the top right-handed pitcher...ESPN's top 5 were Mike Trout (LAA), Miguel Cabrera (DET), Clayton Kershaw (LAD), Andrew McCutchen (PIT) and Felix...teammate Robinson Cano was No. 7 on the list and the top second baseman.

### TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER: RHP ERASMO RAMIREZ (1-0, 2.57)

23-year-old right-hander is scheduled to make his second start of the season in tomorrow's road trip finale vs. the A's...started G#2 of the seasonat LAA, earning the win by allowing 6 hits and 2 runs in 7.0 innings (Ibañez HR)...
