ABOUT THE A'S: Have split the first two games of this series after losing two of three to Cleveland to start the season...have started the season 2-3 for the second time in the last three years (were 3-2 last year en route to a 9-2 start)...this is the A's 47th season in Oakland...have won 16 American League West titles, one AL Wild Card, six AL pennants and four World Championships in Oakland...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 3819-3502 (.522) record over the previous 46 seasons in Oakland...only five teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis, Cincinnati)...this is the Athletics franchise 114th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 8534-8974 (.487) in their previous 113 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

THIS AND THAT: A's starting pitchers have allowed three runs or fewer in each of the first five games and have a 1.80 ERA (6 er in 30.0 ip) for the season...that is the second lowest mark in the American League and third lowest in the majors...the A's have a 2.44 ERA overall, which ranks second in the AL...the A's have tripled in each of the last three games, which is their longest streak since September 6-9, 2008 when they also had a streak of three straight...lead the majors with four triples for the season...rank second in the AL in walks (26)...are tied for the second fewest runs scored (14) and have the third lowest batting average (.214)...recorded their first walk-off win of the season Thursday night and three of the A's first five games have been decided in the last at bat.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 15-13-5, which marked their third consecutive spring with a winning record (17-13-3 in 2013, 15-7-2 in 2012)...the last time A's had three straight winning springs was from 2000-04 when they had five straight...the five tie games were the most by an Oakland team since moving to Arizona for Spring Training in 1969...the previous high was three in 2010 and 2013...have 16 tie games over the last six springs...went 8-5-2 in the final spring at Phoenix Muni and 7-8-3 on the road...led the majors in walks (135), ranked second in runs (193) and on-base percentage (.358), tied for third in grounded into double plays (29), fourth in strikeouts (239) and tied for fourth in triples (11)...were fourth in most double plays turned (34) and most errors (33)...the A's pitching staff ranked fifth in the majors with 247 strikeouts...those are the most strikeouts by an A's team during the spring since statistics are available beginning in 1991...the previous high was 228 last year...allowed a Major League leading 44 home runs.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's opened the season with 12 pitchers and 13 position players for the sixth time in the last eight years...the exceptions were in 2008 and 2012 when they opened in Japan and carried just 10 pitchers...13 players returned from last year's Opening Day roster (Céspedes, Crisp, Donaldson, Doolittle, Jaso, Lowrie, Milone, Moss, Norris, Reddick, Scribner, Sogard, Straily)...those are the most returning players from a previous Opening Day roster since the 2007 club had 16...five other players on the roster played for the A's at some point last year (Barton, Callaspo, Chavez, Gray, Otero), four were acquired in a trade (Abad, Gregerson, Johnson, Pomeranz), two were signed as a free agent (Kazmir, Punto), and one was signed as a free agent to a minor league contract (Fuld).

ROOKIE AND VETERANS: For the first time since 2006, the A's began the season with no rookies on the Opening Day roster...four players had six or more years of service: Nick Punto (11 years, 51 days), Coco Crisp (10 years, 158 days), Scott Kazmir (7 years, 119 days) and Alberto Callaspo (6 years, 135 days).

TENURE: Of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only four played for the A's prior to 2012...Darc Barton played for the A's in 2007 and three players were with the club in 2010 (Crisp, Donaldson, Sogard)...Barton has been in the A's organization the longest as he

was acquired from St. Louis in the Mark Mulder trade, December 18, 2004.

THE YOUNG AND THE OLD: The average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 28.64 years...the A's roster features one player under the age of 25, Sonny Gray at the age of 24 years, 143 days...next youngest is Derek Norris (25 years, 44 days)...there are nine players that are at least 30 years old...Nick Punto is the oldest at 36 years, 142 days...he is followed by Coco Crisp (34 years, 129 days) and Sam Fuld (32 years, 130 days)...two of the 30-year olds are in the starting rotation: Jesse Chavez (30 years, 221 days) and Scott Kazmir (30 years, 65 days)...the last time the A's had two 30-year olds in the starting rotation at the same time was in April of 2010 (Ben Sheets, Justin Duchscherer).

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have four players under contract beyond the 2014 season...Yoenis Céspedes, Scott Kazmir and Eric O'Flaherty are signed through 2015 and Coco Crisp is signed through 2016 with a vesting option for 2017...Nick Punto has a vesting option for 2015 and minor leaguer Hiroyuki Nakajima has a club option for 2015.

OPENING DAY: The A's extended their Opening Day losing streak to 10 games Monday night to establish a new **Major League record**...broke the previous mark of nine held by the New York Giants (1893-1901) and Atlanta Braves (1972-80)...were shutout for the second consecutive opener and now have a 25-inning scoreless streak on Opening Day...have scored just one run in their last 37 innings in openers and have just 13 runs during the Opening Day losing streak...are batting .167 (54 for 324) over that 10-game stretch...eight players returned from last year's Opening Day starting lineup (Céspedes, Crisp, Donaldson, Jaso, Lowrie, Moss, Reddick, Sogard)...that matched the most returning players from an Opening Day starting lineup in Oakland history (1976).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have seven players on the disabled list (Cook, Elmore Gentry, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Rodriguez)...O'Flaherty and Parker are both on the 60-day DL...Cook (Stockton) and Rodriguez (Sacramento) have started a rehab assignment...the seven players on the DL matches the most players the A's had on the DL at once last year (May 7-14 and August 26-27)...used the DL just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's have split the first two games of 2014 after losing the season series last year, 11-8...went 4-6 in Oakland and 4-5 in Seattle...over the previous eight seasons, the A's have won the season series in even numbered seasons (2006, 2008, 2010, 2012) and the Mariners have won in odd numbered years (2007, 2009, 2011, 2013)...Oakland is 80-74 (.519) against the Mariners since 2006...all-time, the A's are 313-236 (.570) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by any team against the Mariners to Boston's .581 mark (min. 20 games)...are 173-102 in Oakland, 139-133 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 63-69 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yoenis Céspedes has hit 10 of his 49 career home runs against Seattle, his most against any team...**Coco Crisp** hit his 50th home run as an Athletic Thursday night...25 of those have given Oakland the lead...has 143 career steals as an Athletic and needs one more to tie Reggie Jackson for fifth in Oakland history...has a 142-game errorless streak, which is fifth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...**Luke Gregerson** has pitched in 366 games since 2009, which is the most in the majors over that span...**John Jaso** has 15 pinch-walks since 2010, which are the most by an American Leaguer over that span...**Jed Lowrie** had 10 doubles against Seattle last year, matching the most in Oakland history against one team...**Dan Otero** has not allowed a home run in 53.0 career innings.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1982** an Opening Day crowd of 48,348 watches the A's defeat the California Angels 3-2 in 11 innings...the A's score the winning run when Davey Lopes walks with the bases loaded to force in Dwayne Murphy with the go-ahead run.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (0-0, 0.00 ERA)

SCORELESS STREAK: Tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his first start last Monday after tossing 5.0 scoreless innings in his final regular season start of 2013 at Seattle (September 29)...now has a 13.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to September 22, 2013, which matches his career-high (August 10-20, 2013).

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss to Cleveland on Opening Night last Monday...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...allowed five hits while walking a career-high tying three...retired the side in order just once, the third inning...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom).

GRAY vs. SEATTLE: Is 1-0 with a 1.50 ERA (12.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 5 bb, 15 so, 1 hr) in two career starts, both last year...had a no decision in a 7-4 A's loss in Oakland August 20...the A's scored four times in the first inning and he allowed a two-run home run to Franklin in the third...then retired 13 of the final 14 batters he faced and was relieved by Doolittle to start the eighth...he allowed four straight hits for the blown save as the Mariners scored five times in the eighth inning...then combined with five A's relievers on a five-hit shutout in the A's 9-0 win in the final game of the regular season September 29 at Seattle...tossed five innings and allowed three of the hits...the Mariners biggest threat came in the third inning when he loaded the bases with two outs before striking out Ibanez to end the inning.

THIS SPRING: Went 0-1 with a 3.48 ERA in six starts...allowed a .228 (18 for 79) opponents batting average...yielded just one home run in 20.2 innings...allowed just one earned run in 10.2 innings over his final two starts (0.84 ERA) after posting a 6.30 ERA over his first four starts...surrendered one run or fewer in four of his six starts.

2013 RECAP: Spent most of the season at Triple-A Sacramento where he was 10-7 with a 3.42 ERA in 20 starts...also had two stints with the A's...after making two relief appearances in his Major League debut in July, he returned to Oakland Aug. 10 and finished the season in the starting rotation...was 5-3 with a 2.67 ERA in 12 games, 10 starts, with the A's...also went 0-1 with a 2.08 ERA in two ALDS starts against Detroit...based upon a minimum of 60 innings pitched, he had the lowest opponents on-base percentage among American League rookies (.272), ranked second in opponents batting average (.214) and slugging percentage (.298) and third in ERA...struck out 67 batters in 64.0 innings and his average of 9.42 strikeouts per nine innings was second best (Allen, CLE 11.26)...allowed just four home runs, an average of 0.56 per nine innings...walked 20 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.35...went 4-1 with a 2.27 ERA and .230 opponents batting average over his final six starts...won each of his final three decisions beginning Sept. 11, the first time he put together consecutive wins in his career...had surgery for a fractured left thumb following the season...the surgery, an internal fixation with a screw to repair the thumb fracture, was performed by Dr. Thomas Graham at the Cleveland Clinic Hospital Oct. 18.

INNING BY INNING: Yielded 20 of his 22 runs over the first three innings of a game...had a 5.10 ERA, .290 opponents batting average

and four home runs allowed in innings one through three compared to a 0.53 ERA, .132 opponents average and no home runs from the fourth inning on...did not allow a run after the fifth inning (14.2 ip).

HOME AND AWAY: Was 3-1 with a 1.99 ERA in six starts in Oakland compared to 2-2 with a 3.86 ERA in six games, four starts, on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .198 (20-for-101) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .226 (31-for-137) against left-handers...issued 15 of his 20 walks to lefties...allowed a .194 opponents batting average to hitters leading off an inning...surrendered one double (.210 slugging percentage) and issued just four walks (.242 on-base percentage).

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Compiled a 5-3 record and a 2.85 ERA in his nine starts...did not allow a run in his two relief appearances (4.0 ip)...did not inherit a runner and retired both of his first batters faced in relief.

NIGHT AND DAY: Was 2-1 with a 1.72 ERA in seven games at night compared to 3-2 with a 3.95 ERA in five starts during the day.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Had a 2-1 record and a 1.25 ERA in six games against AL West teams compared to 3-2 with a 4.50 ERA in six games against everyone else.

DAYS REST: Was 3-1 with a 1.57 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more, 2-2 with a 4.02 ERA in five starts on four days rest.

RUN SUPPORT: Averaged 7.50 runs of support in his 10 starts.

THIS AND THAT: The A's were 6-4 (.600) in his starting assignments...tossed at least six innings in six of his 10 starts, allowed two runs or fewer six times and walked two batters or fewer seven times.

MORE 2013 WITH OAKLAND: Was selected from Sacramento July 10 and made his Major League debut that day at Pittsburgh...entered the game in the fifth inning and tossed 2.0 scoreless innings...struck out the first batter he faced, Clint Barmes...was optioned to Sacramento July 19 after two relief appearances...returned to Oakland Aug. 10 and spent the remainder of the season in the starting rotation...made his first ML start Aug. 10 at Toronto and allowed four runs, two earned, in 6.0 innings for the loss in a 5-4 decision...picked up his first big league win in his second start when he combined with Dan Otero on a five-hit shutout in a 5-0 win over Houston Aug. 15...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed four hits while striking out a career-high nine on a career-high 118 pitches...went 4-1 with a 2.27 ERA and .230 opponents batting average over his final six starts...won each of his final three decisions beginning Sept. 11, the first time he put together consecutive wins in his career...started Game 2 of the ALDS against Detroit and combined with Grant Balfour on a four-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win (8.0 ip, 4 h, 2 bb, 9 so)...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the third rookie to strikeout at least nine without allowing a run in a postseason game...is the fourth pitcher with 10 or fewer career regular seasons starts that has not allowed a run in a postseason start...also started Game 5 and allowed three runs on six hits and four walks in 5.0 innings for the loss in a 3-0 decision.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Won a career-high 10 games with the River Cats...also finished with a career-high 118 strikeouts...the wins tied for fifth in the Pacific Coast League and the strikeouts tied for seventh...was also fourth in ERA (3.42) and tied for fifth in complete games (1)...led the league in strikeouts per nine innings (8.97)...ranked fourth in the A's farm system in ERA, tied for fifth in wins and sixth in strikeouts...was named the A's organization Minor League Pitcher of the year and was also a *Baseball America's* Triple-A All-Star...surrendered just five home runs in 118.1 innings, an average of 0.38 per nine innings...four of the home runs came on the road and three were solo shots...allowed a .259 opponents batting average, including .244 (53-for-217) against left-handed hitters compared to .274 (64-for-234) against right-handers...issued 26 of his 39 walks to lefties...yielded a .223 batting average and .281 on-base percentage to batters leading off an inning...had a 4.74 ERA over the first three innings of a game, 1.54 from innings four through six and 6.23 from the seventh inning on...the River Cats were 12-8 (.600) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in 15 of his 20 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 11 times and walked two batters or fewer 15 times...was rated as having the best breaking ball and best control in the Pacific Coast League by *Baseball America*.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Scott Kazmir (1-0, 0.00 ERA): Tossed 7.1 shutout innings for the win in his first start last Wednesday in the day game against Cleveland, a 6-1 A's win (7.1 ip, 3 h, 5 so)...it marked the ninth time in his last 19 starts he has allowed one run or fewer...is 8-5 with a 2.85 ERA over that span, which dates back to June 21, 2013...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut...is 5-4 with a 3.00 ERA in 11 career starts against Minnesota...the ERA is his lowest against any American League team...was 3-0 with a 1.45 ERA in five starts against the Twins last year with Cleveland...went 1-0 with a 1.62 ERA in four starts during the spring...held the opposition to a .155 batting average and did not allow a home run in 16.2 innings...was signed by the A's as a free agent after going 10-9 with a 4.04 ERA in 29 starts with Cleveland in 2013.

- A's bullpen has thrown nine straight scoreless innings after allowing seven earned runs over its first nine innings this season.
- Ranked third in the American League with a 3.22 ERA in 2013...also ranked third in opponents on-base percentage (.300), fourth in slugging percentage (.357) and fifth in opponents batting average (.237).
- Issued the fewest walks in the AL (154) and second fewest in the majors (St. Louis, 148)...averaged 2.92 walks per nine innings, which was the A's lowest mark since 1990 (2.70).
- First batters faced had the lowest slugging percentage in the AL (.329) and second lowest in the majors (Pittsburgh, .297)...had the second lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.271) and the third lowest batting average (.217)

2013 RECAP: Spent most of the season with the A's and was 2-4 with a save and a career-low 3.92 ERA in 35 games over two stints...the save was the first of his career and he also struck out a career-high 55 batters...also had career lows in opponents batting average (.230), on-base percentage (.302) and slugging percentage (.318)...matched his career highs in wild pitches (5) and hit batters (3)...surrendered just three home runs in 57.1 innings, an average of 0.47 per nine innings...entered the season with 34 home runs in 177.1 career innings (1.73 per nine innings).

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Had a 2.97 ERA and .210 opponents batting average in 18 games before the All-Star Break...then compiled a 5.25 ERA and .258 opponents average in 17 games after the break.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .212 (21-for-99) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .246 (29-for-118) against left-handers...yielded all three of his home runs to right-handers but issued 14 of his 20 walks to lefties...allowed a .167 batting average with runners in scoring position and two outs...had a .269 batting average over his first 15 pitches in a game, .193 after that...opponents hit .333 with a .418 on-base percentage when leading off an inning.
