ABOUT THE A'S: Have won each of the last two games, the first time they have put together back-to-back wins or losses this year...are 1-0 on the first road trip of the season, a nine-game trip to Minnesota (1-0), Seattle (three games) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 3-3 on the first homestand games Cleveland (1-2) and Seattle (2-

against Cleveland (1-2) and Seattle (2-1)...this is the A's 47th season in Oakland...have won 16 American League West titles, one AL Wild Card, six AL pennants and four World Championships in Oakland...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...have a 3819-3502 (.522) record over the previous 46 seasons in Oakland...only five teams have won more games over that span (New York Yankees, Boston, Los Angeles Dodgers, St. Louis, Cincinnati)...this is the Athletics franchise 114th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships...the A's are 8534-8974 (.487) in their previous 113 seasons...that includes a 3886-4248 record from 1901-54 in Philadelphia and 829-1224 from 1955-67 in Kansas City.

PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed three runs or fewer in each of the first seven games and have a 2.14 ERA (10 er in 42.0 ip) for the season...rank third in the American League in ERA...have a 2.32 ERA overall, which is the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors...have the second lowest opponents batting average in the AL (.202) and are tied for the third fewest home runs allowed (3)...have two 30-year olds (Scott Kazmir and Jesse Chavez) in the starting rotation at the same time for the first time since April of 2010 (Ben Sheets. Justin Duchscherer).

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 14 runs over the last two games after tallying 14 over the first five games...are 19 for 65 (.292) over the last two games after hitting .214 over the first five games...are batting .236 overall, which is third lowest in the American League...are tied for the Major League lead in triples (4) and rank third in the American League in walks (33)...have the second fewest doubles in the AL (9).

THIS AND THAT: The A's had their game on Friday night against Seattle postponed due to a wet field after their game of April 1 against Cleveland was rained out...also had a rainout March 29 in the final spring training game at the Coliseum...prior to that, the A's had not been rained out in Oakland since May 5, 1998...that was also the last time the A's were rained out twice in one season...had not been rained out in Oakland twice over a four-day span since September 25-26, 1972...recorded their first walk-off win of the season last Thursday night against Seattle and three of the A's first seven games have been decided in the last at bat.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's reinstated Ryan Cook from the disabled list Monday and now have six players on the DL (Elmore, Gentry, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Rodriguez)...O'Flaherty and Parker are both on the 60-day DL...Gentry and Rodriguez are on rehab assignments with Sacramento...had seven players on the DL for the first seven days of the season, which matches the most players the A's had on the DL at once last year (May 7-14 and August 26-27)...used the DL just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's opened the season with 12 pitchers and 13 position players for the sixth time in the last eight years...the exceptions were in 2008 and 2012 when they opened in Japan and carried just 10 pitchers...13 players returned from last year's Opening Day roster (Céspedes, Crisp, Donaldson, Doolittle, Jaso, Lowrie, Milone, Moss, Norris, Reddick, Scribner, Sogard, Straily)...those are the most returning players from a previous Opening Day roster since the 2007 club had 16...for the first time since 2006, the A's began the season with no rookies on the Opening Day roster...the average age on the A's Opening Day roster was 28.64 years...Sonny Gray was the youngest at 24 years, 143 days...Nick Punto was the oldest at 36

years, 142 days...of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only four played for the A's prior to 2012...Daric Barton played for the A's in 2007 and three players were with the club in 2010 (Crisp, Donaldson, Sogard)...Barton has been in the A's organization the longest as he was acquired from St. Louis in the Mark Mulder trade, December 18, 2004.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 15-13-5, which marked their third consecutive spring with a winning record (17-13-3 in 2013, 15-7-2 in 2012)...the last time A's had three straight winning springs was from 2000-04 when they had five straight...the five tie games were the most by an Oakland team since moving to Arizona for Spring Training in 1969...the previous high was three in 2010 and 2013...have 16 tie games over the last six springs...led the majors in walks (135) and ranked second in runs (193) and on-base percentage (.358)...the A's pitching staff ranked fifth in the majors with 247 strikeouts...those are the most strikeouts by an A's team during the spring since statistics are available beginning in 1991...the previous high was 228 last year.

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have four players under contract beyond the 2014 season...Yoenis Céspedes, Scott Kazmir and Eric O'Flaherty are signed through 2015 and Coco Crisp is signed through 2016 with a vesting option for 2017...Nick Punto has a vesting option for 2015 and minor leaguer Hiroyuki Nakajima has a club option for 2015

A's vs. TWINS: The A's won the first meeting of 2014 on Monday after winning the season series last year, 6-1...won two of three at Minnesota and then swept a four-game series in Oakland, all in September...now have a seven-game winning streak against the Twins, which is the A's longest against Minnesota since July 19, 1998-May 16, 1999 when they also won seven straight...have scored eight or more runs during each game of the winning streak...that is the longest streak of consecutive games with eight or more runs against one team in Athletics history...have outscored the Twins 73-22 during the winning streak and are batting .358 (92 for 257) with 23 doubles, two triples and 16 home runs...have now won 12 of their last 14 games against the Twins, including six of the last seven at Target Field...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 285-290 against Minnesota...that includes 158-126 in Oakland and 127-164 in Minnesota...are 10-9 at Target Field...are 342-359 all-time against the Twins and have a 989-995 record against the Twins/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yoenis Céspedes is a .385 (20 for 52) career hitter against the Twins, which is his best average against any American League team...is 14 for 28 (.500) with 14 RBI in seven games at Target Field...Coco Crisp has 143 career steals as an Athletic and needs one more to tie Reggie Jackson for fifth in Oakland history...has a 143-game errorless streak, which is fifth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...Josh Donaldson has an 11-game hitting streak against Minnesota (18 for 42, .429)...is a .391 (18 for 46) career hitter against the Twins, which is his best average against any AL team...Sean Doolittle has not allowed a run over his first four outings (5.0 ip) and now has a 12.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to September 13 of last year...Luke Gregerson has pitched in 367 games since 2009, which is the most in the majors over that span...John Jaso has 15 pinchwalks since 2010, which are the most by an American Leaguer over that span...Jim Johnson has converted all five of his save opportunities in 13 career games against Minnesota...Jed Lowrie has reached base safely in each of the last six games, going 6 for 17 (.353) with seven walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf. .538 on-base percentage)...is a .317 (95 for 300) career hitter in the month of April, which is his best average for any month of the season...Dan Otero has not allowed a home run in 54.0 career innings.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1974 Joe Rudi ties an Oakland record with three doubles as the A's defeat Kansas City 6-4...in 2004 the A's tie an Oakland record with eight doubles in an 8-6 win over Seattle...in 2008 Fernando Hernandez becomes the first reliever in Oakland history to record a win in his Major League debut when he pitches a scoreless eighth inning in the A's 6-3 win at Toronto.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (0-0, 1.50 ERA)

AS A STARTER: Is scheduled to make his second start of the season and the fourth of his career...is 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA (11 er in 14.2 ip) in his three career starting assignments...his other two came with Toronto in 2012...has 54 career starts as a minor leaguer...made 23 starts over the previous two seasons after starting just once from 2005-11.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 12-inning win over Seattle last Thursday in Oakland...tossed a career-high tying 6.0 innings...was charged with an unearned run in the first inning when Almonte reached on a Callaspo error, went to second on a Punto error, third on a Miller fly out and scored on a Cano ground out...also allowed a RBI single to Almonte in the fifth to make the score 2-0...the A's scored single runs in the fifth and eighth to tie the game.

CHAVEZ vs. MINNESOTA: Is 0-0 with a 6.14 ERA (7.1 ip, 10 h, 5 r, 5 er, 3 bb, 6 so, 1 hr) in six career appearances, all in relief...the last four have come in his home ballparks (3 er in 3.1 ip, 8.10 ERA)...including one last year with Oakland on September 13 (0.1 ip, 1 h, 1 so)...entered the game in the eighth inning with the A's leading 6-5 and runners on first and second...allowed a RBI single to Dozier for the blown save in a game the A's would come back to win 8-6...has pitched twice in Minnesota, including once at Target Field on September 7, 2010 (2.0 ip, 1 bb, 2 so).

THIS SPRING: Went 5-1 with a save and a 2.22 ERA in seven games, five starts...the five wins were the most in the majors this spring and the most by an A's pitcher since spring win totals are available beginning in 1990...ranked second in the Cactus League in innings pitched (28.1), fourth in strikeouts (25) and eighth in ERA...allowed a .216 opponents batting average...did not allow a run in five of his seven games, including a spring-opening 13.2-inning scoreless streak.

2013 RECAP: Spent most of the season with the A's and was 2-4 with a save and a career-low 3.92 ERA in 35 games over two stints...the save was the first of his career and he also struck out a career-high 55 batters...also had career lows in opponents batting average (.230), onbase percentage (.302) and slugging percentage (.318)...matched his career highs in wild pitches (5) and hit batters (3)...surrendered just three home runs in 57.1 innings, an average of 0.47 per nine innings...entered the season with 34 home runs in 177.1 career innings (1.73 per nine innings).

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Had a 2.97 ERA and .210 opponents batting average in 18 games before the All-Star Break...then compiled a 5.25 ERA and .258 opponents average in 17 games after the break.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .212 (21-for-99) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .246 (29-for-118) against left-handers...yielded all three of his home runs to right-handers but issued 14 of his 20 walks to lefties...allowed a .167 batting average with runners in scoring position and two outs...had a .269 batting average over his first 15 pitches in a game, .193 after that...opponents hit .333 with a .418 on-base percentage when leading off an inning

IN RELIEF: First batters faced were 8-for-32 (.250) with two walks (.286 on-base percentage)...allowed 8-of-26 (30.8%) inherited runners to score.

HOME AND AWAY: Had a 2.73 ERA and .181 opponents batting average in 20 games on the road compared to a 5.20 ERA and .277 opponents average in 15 games at home.

THIS AND THAT: Led AL relievers in sacrifice hits allowed (6) and averaged the seventh most pitches per game (27.1)...tied for fifth among all AL pitchers in sacrifice hits...tossed at least one inning in 30 of his 35 appearances, including 10 outings of two or more.

MORE 2013 WITH OAKLAND: Was recalled from Sacramento April 20 and appeared in just three games during his first stint...had a 6.23 ERA and .350 opponents batting average when he was optioned to Sacramento April 29...returned May 10 and spent the remainder of the season with Oakland...did not allow a run in six of his first seven outings following his return...had a 0.59 ERA and .132 opponents batting average over that stretch that ran from May 10 to June 13...it included a career-high 12.2-inning scoreless streak from May 15 to June 13...capped his scoreless streak by tossing 5.2 scoreless innings of relief June 13 against New York (AL) for his first win in the A's 3-2, 18-inning victory over the Yankees...allowed just one hit and walked a season-high two while striking out a career-high tying seven (also May 27, 2012 at Texas)...it was the longest relief appearance of his career and the longest outing by an A's reliever since Lenny DiNardo tossed 6.0 innings Aug. 2, 2008 against Boston...was charged with his first loss in his next outing June 17 at Texas...allowed two runs to score plus an inherited runner...allowed 3-of-7 (42.9%) inherited runners to score through that game but then allowed just 2-of-14 (14.3%) to score over his next 17 contests...was charged with his second loss of the season when he allowed a season-high four runs in 1.1 innings in a 7-1 loss to St. Louis June 29...tossed 4.0 scoreless innings for his first career save in a 10-4 win at Kansas City July 7...it was the fourth four-inning save by an A's reliever since 1991, the first since Chad Gaudin May 4, 2006 against Cleveland...matched his season high by allowing four hits July 25 against Los Angeles (AL)...yielded three runs in that game and allowed three runs in three of six games from July 25 to Aug. 17 (10 er in 10.2 ip, 8.44 ERA)...matched his season high with two walks July 28 against Los Angeles (AL)...appeared in just six of the A's 38 games from Aug. 2 to Sept. 12 and allowed a run in the four of those contests (4.05 ERA)...struck out in his only at bat of the season Aug. 7 at Cincinnati and is 0 for 5 with five strikeouts in his career...walked a season-high two batters in back-to-back outings Aug. 20 against Seattle and Aug. 23 at Baltimore...did not allow an earned run over his final six outings beginning Sept. 15 (6.1 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 bb, 8 so)...was on the A's roster for the ALDS against Detroit but did not appear in a game.

2013 WITH SACRAMENTO: Was used exclusively as a starter with Sacramento and went 2-2 with a 2.70 ERA in five starts...allowed just one home run in 30.0 innings...walked five batters, an average of 1.50 per nine innings...struck out 26 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 5.20...yielded a .285 opponents batting average, including .240 (18-for-75) against right-handed hitters compared to .354 (17-for-48) against left-handers...went 1-1 with a 2.45 ERA in three starts before he was called up by Oakland the first time April 20...that included a season-high nine strikeout game for his first win, April 15 at Reno...logged a 1-1 record and a 3.09 ERA in two starts during his second stay with the River Cats from April 29 to May 9.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Dan Straily (0-1, 4.50 ERA): Was the losing pitcher in his first start, a 3-1 loss to Seattle last Saturday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 3 er, 1 bb, 7 so)...Had a no decision in his only career appearance against Minnesota, a start in the A's 8-6 win in Oakland last year on September 19 (5.2 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 6 so)...had no decisions and a 4.37 ERA in four starts this spring...issued 10 walks in 13.1 innings...had five stints with Oakland in 2013 and was 10-8 with a 3.96 ERA in 27 starts...led American League rookies in games started, innings pitched (152.1) and strikeouts (124) and tied for the lead in wins (Perez, TEX).

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

1-2, 2.63 ERA (7 er in 24.0 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 1-for-3 (0.0%)

- The A's bullpen has not allowed a run over the last four games (15.0 ip. 4 h. 5 bb. 14 so) after allowing seven runs in 9.0 innings in the three-game set against Cleveland to start the season...has a 2.63 ERA overall, which ranks third in the American League.
- Is one of three bullpens in the American League that has not allowed a home run (Boston, Kansas City)...ranks second in opponents batting average (.157).
- Has stranded all seven of its inherited runners and is one of three AL bullpens that has not allowed an inherited runner to score (Cleveland, Toronto).
- Ranked third in the AL with a 3.22 ERA in 2013...also ranked third in opponents on-base percentage (.300), fourth in slugging percentage (.357) and fifth in opponents batting average (.237).
- Issued the fewest walks in the AL (154) and second fewest in the majors (St. Louis, 148)...averaged 2.92 walks per nine innings, which was the A's lowest mark since 1990 (2.70).

- Is on his third career Opening Day roster (2011 and 2012 with Houston).
- Compiled a 3.27 ERA and allowed a .205 batting average in a team-leading 11 appearances this spring...did not issue a walk in 11.0 innings while striking out 12...tied for fourth in the Cactus League in games pitched.
- Has a 13-game losing streak dating back to April 9, 2011, which is the longest active losing streak in the majors.
- Was acquired from Washington for minor league infielder John Wooten, November 25, 2013.

Last Year: Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse and was 1-0 with a 1.06 ERA in 17 relief appearances...was promoted to Washington May 21 and went 0-3 with a 3.35 ERA in a career-high 39 relief appearances.

- Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list Monday and pitched the ninth inning that day...was placed on the DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis.
- Had a two-game rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton last Thursday and Saturday (1.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 10.80 ERA).
- Had a loss in three outings against Minnesota last year (1.2 ip, 3 h, 3 r, 3 er, 5 bb, 3 so)...is 0-2 with a save and a 7.94 ERA (5 er in 5.2 ip) in seven career appearances against the Twins...both of the losses and the save have come at Target Field.
- Has a 1.17 ERA (3 er in 23.0 ip) in 21 career appearances in April.
- Did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring

Last Year: Was 6-4 with two saves and a 2.54 ERA in a team-leading 71 relief appearances...allowed just two home runs in 67.1 innings, an average of 0.27 per nine innings, which was fourth lowest among AL relievers.

- Has not allowed a run over his first four outings (5.0 ip) and now has a 12.0-inning scoreless streak dating back to September 13 of last year...his career-high is 13.2 from April 29 to May 29, 2013.
- Had a win in two outings against Minnesota last year (2.2 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 so)...is 1-0 with a 1.69 ERA (1 er in 5.1 ip) in four career appearances against the Twins.
- Has a 1.10 ERA (2 er in 15.1 ip) in 15 career appearances in April.
- Tossed two innings last Thursday against Seattle for the first time since June 23, 2013...broke streak of 37-straight regular season appearances throwing fewer than two innings.
- Posted a 3.24 ERA and yielded a .226 opponents batting average in nine games this spring...walked just one batter in 8.1 innings...did not allow a run in eight of his nine appearances.
- Finished the 2013 season by stranding each of his 19 inherited runners over his final 37 games.
