ABOUT THE A'S: Had their season best four-game winning streak snapped last night...have not lost back-to-back games this year...are in second place in the American League West, ½ game behind Seattle...have one day in sole possession of first place this year, one day tied for first, three days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth ..this

for third and three days ine day ited for third and three days in fourth...this is the A's 47th season in Oakland...have won 16 American League West titles, one AL Wild Card, six AL pennants and four World Championships in Oakland...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...this is the Athletics franchise 114th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers had their season-opening streak of nine consecutive games with three runs or fewer come to an end last night when Tommy Milone allowed five runs...it was the A's longest season-opening streak since 1990...Milone allowed just three earned runs and the A's have allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of the first 10 games, which is their longest season-opening streak since 1990 (Stewart, Welch, Moore, Sanderson)...the last such streak longer than 10 games was a 16-game streak in 1981 (Norris, Langford, Keough, McCatty and Kingman)...starters have a 2.21 ERA (15 er in 61.0 ip), which is the lowest mark in the American League and second lowest in the majors (Atlanta, 1.86)...Milone allowed 10 hits yesterday, ending a season-opening streak where A's starts allowed six hits or fewer in each of the first nine games...that was the second longest season-opening streak in Oakland history (15 in 2007)...have a .234 (55 for 235) opponents batting average...have two 30-year olds (Scott Kazmir and Jesse Chavez) in the starting rotation at the same time for the first time since April of 2010 (Ben Sheets, Justin Duchscherer).

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has allowed three runs or fewer in seven of the first 10 games...has a 2.49 ERA, which is the lowest mark in the American League and third lowest in the majors...has the second lowest opponents batting average in the AL (.219)...has allowed five home runs in the last three games after yielding three over the first seven contests.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 5-1 in day games, which is the best record in the American League...are 1-3 in night games, which is tied for the worst record in the AL...are batting .271 (57 for 210) during the day compared to .179 (24 for 134) at night...have hit eight of their nine home runs during the day.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-1 on the first road trip of the season, a nine-game trip to Minnesota (3-0), Seattle (0-1) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...went 3-3 on the first homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Seattle (2-1)...have scored 25 runs and hit four home runs in four games on the road compared to 20 runs and five home runs in six games at home.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 31 runs over the last five games after tallying 14 over the first five contests...are 45 for 176 (.256) with six home runs over the last five games after hitting .214 with three home runs over the first five games...are batting .235 overall, which is fourth lowest in the American League, but have a .283 (26 for 92) average with runners in scoring position, which is fourth best in the AL...are tied for the Major League lead in triples (4) and rank second in walks (46)...are tied with Seattle for the fewest grounded into double plays in the AL (4).

THIS AND THAT: The A's lost 6-4 last night and all four of the A's losses have been by two runs...are one of two American League teams that have not lost a game by more than two runs (Seattle)...committed two errors last night, leading to two unearned runs...now have seven errors for the season, which has led to five unearned runs...are tied for second in the AL in unearned runs allowed...struck out 14 times last night and the Mariners fanned 12

times...it was the sixth nine-inning game in Oakland history in which both teams fanned at least 12 times (last: September 28, 2011 at Seattle)...are scheduled to face all right-handed starting pitchers in this series...have faced just one lefty this year (Elias on April 3), which is tied with Detroit for the fewest in the American League...are scheduled to face two lefties in the three-game series at Los Angeles (AL) beginning Monday...played their second extra inning game of the season Wednesday at Minnesota, both in games started by Jesse Chavez and both wins...are one of two AL teams with two extra inning wins (Detroit).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's reinstated Ryan Cook from the disabled list last Monday and now have six players on the DL (Elmore, Gentry, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Rodriguez)...O'Flaherty and Parker are both on the 60-day DL...Gentry and Rodriguez are on rehab assignments with Sacramento...had seven players on the DL for the first seven days of the season, which matches the most players the A's had on the DL at once last year (May 7-14 and August 26-27)...used the DL just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's Opening Day roster featured 13 returning players from 2013...those are the most returning players from a previous Opening Day roster since the 2007 club had 16...for the first time since 2006, the A's began the season with no rookies on the Opening Day roster...of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only four played for the A's prior to 2012 (Barton, Crisp, Donaldson, Sogard).

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 15-13-5, which marked their third consecutive spring with a winning record...the five tie games were the most by an Oakland team since moving to Arizona for Spring Training in 1969...the previous high was three in 2010 and 2013...led the majors in walks (135) and ranked second in runs (193) and on-base percentage (.358)...the A's pitching staff ranked fifth in the majors with 247 strikeouts...those are the most strikeouts by an A's team during the spring since statistics are available beginning in 1991.

A's vs. MARINERS: The season series is even at 2-2...the A's lost the first game in Seattle last night after taking two of three in Oakland last weekend...lost the season series last year, 11-8...went 4-6 in Oakland and 4-5 in Seattle...over the previous eight seasons, the A's have won the season series in even numbered seasons (2006, 2008, 2010, 2012) and the Mariners have won in odd numbered years (2007, 2009, 2011, 2013)...Oakland is 81-75 (.519) against the Mariners since 2006...all-time, the A's are 314-237 (.570) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by any team against the Mariners to Boston's .581 mark (min. 20 games)...are 174-102 in Oakland, 139-134 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 63-70 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Alberto Callaspo is batting .409 (9 for 22) in April and is a .294 (131 for 445) career hitter in the month, his best average for any month of the season...Coco Crisp has 143 career steals as an Athletic and needs one more to tie Reggie Jackson for fifth in Oakland history...has a 143-game errorless streak, which is fifth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...Luke Gregerson has pitched in 368 games since 2009, which is the most in the majors over that span...Jed Lowrie has drawn a walk in five consecutive games for the first time in his career (7 walks total)...has 11 walks for the season, which ranks third in the American League...Dan Otero has not allowed a home run in 56.2 career innings.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1909** the A's play their first game at Shibe Park, defeating Boston, 8-1...a crowd of 31,160 watches Eddie Plank defeat the Red Sox and 18-year old John "Stuffy" McInnis make his major league debut...in **1955** the Athletics open their first season in Kansas City with a 6-2 win over the Detroit Tigers...in **1994** Oakland collects just two hits but defeats Toronto 8-4 as the Blue Jay pitchers walk 12 A's hitters...both hits come in the first inning as Oakland draws four consecutive walks in the third inning and two consecutive bases loaded walks in the fifth...Rickey Henderson walks in each of his first four at bats.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (1-0, 0.75 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Has allowed just one earned run over his first two starts for a 0.75 ERA...is tied for fourth in the American League in ERA...picked up his first win in his last start to extend his winning streak to four games dating back to September 11 of last year, an on going career high...is 4-0 with a 2.18 ERA (8 er in 33.0 ip) over that six-start stretch.

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed all three of his runs over the first three innings of a game this year...last year, he yielded 20 of his 22 runs over the first three innings of a game...had a 5.10 ERA, .290 opponents batting average and four home runs allowed in innings one through three compared to a 0.53 ERA, .132 opponents average and no home runs from the fourth inning on...did not allow a run after the fifth inning (14.2 ip).

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss to Cleveland on Opening Night March 31...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003) ... allowed five hits while walking a career-high tying three...retired the side in order just once, the third inning...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom).

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 win over Seattle last Sunday in Oakland...did not allow a run in the first inning to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings (previous: 13.0, August 10-20, 2013)...was charged with two unearned runs in the second inning (Barton error) when he allowed RBI singles to Almonte and Miller...also allowed a RBI single to Smoak in the third to give the Mariners a 3-0 lead but the A's tied the game on a Moss three-run homer in the bottom of the third...retired 11 of the final 12 batters he faced, including each of the last seven, and the A's scored twice in the fifth to take the lead for good.

GRAY vs. SEATTLE: Is 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA (18.0 ip, 11 h, 5 r, 3 er, 7 bb, 18 so, 1 hr) in three career starts...including a win in one start this year (see last start above)...his other two starts came last year...had a no decision in a 7-4 A's loss in Oakland August 20...the A's scored four times in the first inning and he allowed a two-run home run to Franklin in the third...then retired 13 of the final 14 batters he faced and was relieved by Doolittle to start the eighth...he allowed four straight hits for the blown save as the Mariners scored five times in the eighth inning...then combined with five A's relievers on a five-hit shutout in the A's 9-0 win in the final game of the regular season September 29 at Seattle...tossed five innings and allowed three of the hits...the Mariners biggest threat came in the third inning when he loaded the bases with two outs before striking out Ibanez to end the inning.

THIS SPRING: Went 0-1 with a 3.48 ERA in six starts...allowed a .228 (18 for 79) opponents batting average...yielded just one home run in 20.2 innings...allowed just one earned run in 10.2 innings over his final two starts (0.84 ERA) after posting a 6.30 ERA over his first four starts...surrendered one run or fewer in four of his six starts.

2013 RECAP: Spent most of the season at Triple-A Sacramento where he was 10-7 with a 3.42 ERA in 20 starts...also had two stints with the A's...after making two relief appearances in his Major League debut in July, he returned to Oakland Aug. 10 and finished the season in the starting rotation...was 5-3 with a 2.67 ERA in 12 games, 10 starts, with the A's...also went 0-1 with a 2.08 ERA in two ALDS starts against Detroit...based upon a minimum of 60 innings pitched, he had the lowest opponents on-base percentage among American League rookies (.272), ranked second in opponents batting average (.214) and slugging percentage (.298) and third in ERA...struck out 67 batters in 64.0 innings and his average of 9.42 strikeouts per nine innings was second best (Allen, CLE 11.26)...allowed just four home runs, an average of 0.56 per nine innings...walked 20 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.35...went 4-1 with a 2.27 ERA and .230 opponents batting average over his final six starts...won each of his final three decisions beginning Sept. 11, the first time he put together consecutive wins in his career...had surgery for a fractured left thumb following the season...the surgery, an internal fixation with a screw to repair the thumb fracture, was performed by Dr. Thomas Graham at the Cleveland Clinic Hospital Oct. 18.

HOME AND AWAY: Was 3-1 with a 1.99 ERA in six starts in Oakland compared to 2-2 with a 3.86 ERA in six games, four starts, on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a 198 (20-for-101) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .226 (31-for-137) against left-handers...issued 15 of his 20 walks to lefties...allowed a .194 opponents batting average to hitters leading off an inning...surrendered one double (.210 slugging percentage) and issued just four walks (.242 on-base percentage)

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Compiled a 5-3 record and a 2.85 ERA in his nine starts...did not allow a run in his two relief appearances (4.0 ip)...did not inherit a runner and retired both of his first batters faced in relief

NIGHT AND DAY: Was 2-1 with a 1.72 ERA in seven games at night compared to 3-2 with a 3.95 ERA in five starts during the day

THE WEST AND THE REST: Had a 2-1 record and a 1.25 ERA in six games against AL West teams compared to 3-2 with a 4.50 ERA in six games against everyone else.

DAYS REST: Was 3-1 with a 1.57 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more, 2-2 with a 4.02 ERA in five starts on four days rest.

RUN SUPPORT: Averaged 7.50 runs of support in his 10 starts.

THIS AND THAT: The A's were 6-4 (.600) in his starting assignments...tossed at least six innings in six of his 10 starts, allowed two runs or fewer six times and walked two batters or fewer seven times

WITH SACRAMENTO: Won a career-high 10 games with the River Cats...also finished with a career-high 118 strikeouts...the wins tied for fifth in the Pacific Coast League and the strikeouts tied for seventh...was also fourth in ERA (3.42) and tied for fifth in complete games (1)...led the league in strikeouts per nine innings (8.97)...ranked fourth in the A's farm system in ERA, tied for fifth in wins and sixth in strikeouts...was named the A's organization Minor League Pitcher of the year and was also a Baseball America's Triple-A All-Star...surrendered just five home runs in 118.1 innings, an average of 0.38 per nine innings...four of the home runs came on the road and three were solo shots...allowed a .259 opponents batting average, including .244 (53-for-217) against left-handed hitters compared to .274 (64-for-234) against right-handers...issued 26 of his 39 walks to lefties...yielded a .223 batting average and .281 on-base percentage to batters leading off an inning...had a 4.74 ERA over the first three innings of a game, 1.54 from innings four through six and 6.23 from the seventh inning on...the River Cats were 12-8 (.600) in his starting assignments...was rated as having the best breaking ball and best control in the Pacific Coast League by Baseball America.

2013 RECAP: Had five stints with Oakland in 2013 and was 10-8 with a 3.96 ERA in 27 starts...led American League rookies in games started, innings pitched (152.1) and strikeouts (124) and tied for the lead in wins (Perez, TEX)...is the 11th rookie in Oakland history to win 10 or more games, the fifth in the last five years (Anderson, Cahill, Milone, Parker)...had the sixth most strikeouts by an Oakland rookie...went 1-2 with a 7.27 ERA and .257 opponents batting average over his first five starts, 5-0 with a 2.83 ERA and .196 opponents average over his next nine starts from May 21 to July 9, 0-5 with a 5.20 ERA and .299 opponents over his next seven starts from July 20 to Aug. 23 and 4-1 with a 2.00 ERA and .195 opponents average over his final six starts

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .233 opponents batting average...did not have enough innings pitched to qualify for the league leaders, but his opponents average was ninth lowest among AL pitchers with 150 or more innings pitched...his .358 slugging percentage was eighth best...surrendered 16 home runs in 152.1 innings (0.95 per nine innings) after allowing 11 in 39.1 innings in 2012 (2.52 per nine innings)...11 of the 16 home runs he allowed were solo shots as are 21 of the 30 in his career...his opponents batting average included a .221 (60-for-272) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .244 (72-for-295) against left-handers...allowed a .201 batting average the first time through the lineup, which was third lowest among AL pitchers with 150 or more innings pitched...now has a .206 (60-for-291) opponents average the first time through the lineup in his career...allowed a .225 batting average to batters leading off an inning...however, issued 19 walks to start an inning, which tied for second most in the AL...opponents hit .300 with runners in scoring position and two outs...they were 4-for-7 (.571) with a grand slam with . the bases loaded.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 6-2 with a 4.28 ERA and .217 opponents batting average in 14 starts before the All-Star Break...then went 4-6 with a 3.61 ERA and .250 opponents average in 13 starts after the break.

NIGHT AND DAY: Was 4-2 with a 2.14 ERA and .195 opponents batting average in nine starts during the day compared to 6-6 with a 4.98 ERA and .252 opponents average in 18 starts at night...his day ERA was the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings in day games...surrendered just one of his 16 home runs during the day...in 2012, allowed eight of his 11 home runs in day games.

DAYS REST: Was 6-3 with a 3.25 ERA in 14 starts on five days rest or more compared to 4-5 with a 4.80 ERA in 13 starts on four days rest...is now 8-4 with a 2.98 ERA (38 er in 114.2 ip) in 19 career starts on five days rest or more compared to 5-6 with a 5.00 ERA (50 er in 90.0 ip) in 17 starts on four days rest.

RUN SUPPORT: Received two runs of support or fewer in 17 of his 27 starts and was 5-8 in those games...was 5-0 in 10 starts with three runs of support or more...is now 6-10 in 21 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 7-0 in 15 starts with support of three or more

THIS AND THAT: Was 3-1 with a 1.54 ERA and .167 opponents batting average in four interleague starts...tied for third in the majors in interleague wins, ranked fourth in opponents batting average and ninth in ERA...tied for the team-lead with seven hit batters...the A's were 16-11 (.593) in his starting assignments and are 22-14 (.611) in his career.

MORE 2013 WITH OAKLAND: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and struck out a career-high and Oakland rookie record tying 11 batters in his first start at Houston April 5...was optioned to Sacramento the next day...returned to Oakland April 29 and started that night...was optioned to Sacramento April 30 and returned May 1 when Anderson was placed on the DL...went 3-2 with a 4.72 ERA and .232 opponents batting average in 10 starts during his third stint through June 22...had a career-high five-game winning streak from May 21 to July 9 (2.83 ERA, .196 opponents batting average)...was optioned to Sacramento June 23...returned to Oakland July 4 and went 2-0 with a 0.68 ERA in two starts before he was sent back to Sacramento July 10...was recalled for the final time July 20 and went 4-6 with a 3.61 ERA over his final 13 starts.

 Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring.

COCO CRISP

- Was on his 10th Opening Day roster and made his ninth career Opening Day start, his fourth straight with the A's.
- Hit his first career game-ending home run April 3 against Seattle...it was his sixth regular season "walk-off" RBI.

SAM FULD

 Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.

CRAIG GENTRY

• Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.

LUKE GREGERSON

· Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

A.J. GRIFFIN

 Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a flexor muscle strain.

JOHN JASO

• Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
