ABOUT THE A'S: Have won five of the last six games after starting the year 2-3...are 7-4 for the season, which is the second best record in the American League (Detroit, 6-3)...have not lost back-to-back games this year...are in sole possession of first place in the American League West for the second time in the last three days and are ½ game ahead of Seattle...have two days in sole possession of first place this year, one day tied for first, three days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...this is the A's 47th season in Oakland...have won 16 American League West titles, one AL Wild Card, six AL pennants and four World Championships in Oakland...only the New York Yankees (18) and Atlanta Braves (17) have more division titles than the A's...since the A's moved to Oakland in 1968, only the Yankees (11) and Cardinals (8) have more league championships and only the Yankees have more world championships (7)...this is the Athletics franchise 114th season in the American League...since 1901, the A's have 16 AL West titles plus 15 AL pennants and nine World Championships...only the Yankees (27) and Cardinals (11) have won more World Championships.

STARTING PITCHING: Sonny Gray allowed just one run last night, the fifth time in the first 11 games A's starters have allowed one run or fewer...starters have allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of the first 11 contests, which is their longest such season-opening streak since 1981 when they had a 16-game streak (Norris, Langford, Keough, McCatty and Kingman)...now have a 2.12 ERA (16 er in 68.0 ip), which is the lowest mark in the American League and second lowest in the majors (Atlanta, 1.85)...starters allowed six hits or fewer in each of the first nine games, which was the second longest season-opening streak in Oakland history (15 in 2007)...have a .230 (60 for 261) opponents batting average for the season...have two 30-year olds (Scott Kazmir and Jesse Chavez) in the starting rotation at the same time for the first time since April of 2010 (Ben Sheets, Justin Duchscherer).

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has allowed three runs or fewer in eight of the first 11 games...has a 2.36 ERA, which is the lowest mark in the American League and second lowest in the majors (Milwaukee, 1.87)...has the second lowest opponents batting average in the AL (.218)...has allowed five home runs in the last four games after yielding three over the first seven contests.

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 5-1 in day games, which is the best record in the majors...are 2-3 in night games, which is tied for the second worst record in the American League...are batting .271 (57 for 210) during the day compared to .187 (31 for 166) at night...have the fourth highest day batting average in the AL and the lowest night average...have hit eight of their 10 home runs during the day.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-1 on the first road trip of the season, a nine-game trip to Minnesota (3-0), Seattle (1-1) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...have the best road record in the American League...went 3-3 on the first homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Seattle (2-1)...have scored 28 runs and hit five home runs in five games on the road compared to 20 runs and five home runs in six games at home.

OFFENSE: The A's have scored 34 runs over the last six games after tallying 14 over the first five contests...are tied for second in the American League in triples (4) and rank third in walks (51)...have grounded into the second fewest double plays (5).

THIS AND THAT: The A's have not used a rookie this year, marking their longest stretch without a rookie on the roster since 2006 when they had no rookies for the first 36 days of the season (April 3-May 8)...have committed eight errors, which has led to five unearned runs...are tied for third in the American League in unearned runs allowed...all four of the A's losses have been by two runs...are one of two AL teams that have not lost a game by more than two runs (Seattle)...have faced just one left-handed starting pitcher over the first 11 games (Elias on April 3)...that is tied with Detroit for the fewest in the AL...are scheduled to face two lefties in the three-game series at Los Angeles (AL) beginning Monday...played their second extra inning

game of the season Wednesday at Minnesota, both in games started by Jesse Chavez and both wins...are one of four AL teams with two extra inning wins.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's reinstated Craig Gentry from the disabled list yesterday and now have five players on the DL (Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Rodriguez)...O'Flaherty and Parker are both on the 60-day DL...Rodriguez is on a rehab assignment with Sacramento...had seven players on the DL for the first seven days of the season, which matches the most players the A's had on the DL at once last year (May 7-14 and August 26-27)...used the DL just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

ROSTER NOTES: The A's Opening Day roster featured 13 returning players from 2013...those are the most returning players from a previous Opening Day roster since the 2007 club had 16...for the first time since 2006, the A's began the season with no rookies on the Opening Day roster...of the 25 players on the A's Opening Day roster, only four played for the A's prior to 2012 (Barton, Crisp, Donaldson, Sogard).

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 15-13-5, which marked their third consecutive spring with a winning record...the five tie games were the most by an Oakland team since moving to Arizona for Spring Training in 1969...the previous high was three in 2010 and 2013...led the majors in walks (135) and ranked second in runs (193) and on-base percentage (.358)...the A's pitching staff ranked fifth in the majors with 247 strikeouts...those are the most strikeouts by an A's team during the spring since statistics are available beginning in 1991.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's lead the season series 3-2...have split the first two games in Seattle after taking two of three in Oakland last weekend...lost the season series last year, 11-8...went 4-6 in Oakland and 4-5 in Seattle...over the previous eight seasons, the A's have won the season series in even numbered seasons (2006, 2008, 2010, 2012) and the Mariners have won in odd numbered years (2007, 2009, 2011, 2013)...Oakland is 82-75 (.522) against the Mariners since 2006...all-time, the A's are 315-237 (.571) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by any team against the Mariners to Boston's .581 mark (min. 20 games)...are 174-102 in Oakland, 140-134 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 64-70 at Safeco Field.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Alberto Callaspo is batting .400 (10 for 25) in April and is a .295 (132 for 448) career hitter in the month, his best average for any month of the season...**Coco Crisp** has 143 career steals as an Athletic and needs one more to tie Reggie Jackson for fifth in Oakland history...has a 144-game errorless streak, which is fifth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...**Josh Donaldson** hit his sixth career home run against Seattle last night, which are his most against any team...**Luke Gregerson** made his sixth appearance of the season last night, which is tied for the American League lead...has pitched in 369 games since 2009, which is the most in the majors over that span...**Jed Lowrie** has reached base safely in each of the last 10 games, going 8 for 29 (.276) with 13 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf, .500 on-base percentage)...has a .458 on-base percentage overall, which ranks fifth in the AL...has drawn a walk in six consecutive games for the first time in his career (nine walks total)...has 13 walks for the season, which ranks third in the AL...**Brandon Moss** has hit safely in each of his last seven games (9 for 29, .310), which is one short of the longest hitting streak of his career (8, September 20-27, 2012)...**Dan Otero** has not allowed a home run in 56.2 career innings.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1968** the Oakland A's win their first game, a 9-6 victory at Washington...Chuck Dobson pitches six innings for the win and Sal Bando homers and drives in four runs...in **1994** the A's draw 12 walks for the second consecutive game, tying what was then a club record for walks in a game...Mark McGwire walks in his first four at bats of the A's 8-7, 12 inning win...Oakland also collects 18 hits and strands 20 base runners.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (2-0, 2.03 ERA)

2-0: Has won each of his first two starts of the season for the second time in his career (also 2009)...has never won his first three starts...is tied for third in the American League in wins...is now 4-0 with a 1.37 ERA (4 er in 26.1 ip) over his last four starts dating back to September 28, 2013.

LAST 20 STARTS: Has allowed one run or fewer in nine of his last 20 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...is 9-5 with a 2.94 ERA (38 er in 116.1 ip) over that span...has held the opposition to a .233 (103 for 443) batting average and has issued just 28 walks (2.17 per nine innings) while striking out 117 in 116.1 innings...has yielded just seven home runs (0.54 per nine innings).

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win over Cleveland in the day game April 2 against Cleveland...tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut.

LAST START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-3 win at Minnesota last Monday...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Hicks in the second...the A's scored three times in the third but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the third on a Kubel RBI double and a Suzuki RBI ground out...then retired 11 of the final 13 batters he faced.

KAZMIR vs. SEATTLE: Is 4-3 with a 3.41 ERA (63.1 ip, 48 h, 28 r, 24 er, 23 bb, 58 so, 4 hr) in 11 career starts...is 0-1 with a 5.75 ERA (13 er in 20.1 ip) in four starts in his home ballparks and 4-2 with a 2.30 ERA (11 er in 43.0 ip) in seven starts at Safeco Field...the ERA is his best at any ballpark with more than three games pitched...was 1-0 with a 4.09 ERA (11.0 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 9 so, 0 hr) in two starts last year...had a no decision in a 10-8 Indians win in Cleveland May 20...lasted just three innings, allowing two runs in the first on a Morales RBI double and Morse RBI single, and two more in the third on a Morales RBI single and a Morse GDP...then tossed eight innings and allowed just one hit in a 10-1 win at Seattle July 24...allowed an unearned run in the second inning on a Cabrera error.

THIS SPRING: Went 1-0 with a 1.62 ERA in four starts during the spring...held the opposition to a .155 (9 for 58) batting average...did not allow a home run in 16.2 innings...did not allow a run in three of his four starts...was scratched from his start March 17 against Chicago (NL) with left triceps stiffness.

2013 RECAP: Went from the independent Atlantic League in 2012 to a key member of the Cleveland Indians rotation, going 10-9 with a 4.04 ERA in 29 starts...it was his sixth 10-win season but his first since 2009...his 29 starts were his most since 2007, as were his 158.0 innings pitched...walked 47 batters for an average of 2.68 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark of his career...his previous low was 3.24 in 2006...struck out 162, and his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.45 was also a career best...was one of a club-record tying three pitchers to fan 150 or more batters (Jimenez, Masterson)...averaged

9.23 strikeouts per nine innings...did not qualify for the league leaders but had the seventh best strikeout per nine inning ratio among American League pitchers with 150 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, he had the fifth highest run support average (6.27)...was 3-4 with a 5.89 ERA and .302 opponents batting average over his first 11 starts through June 15...then went 7-5 with a 3.06 ERA and .239 opponents average over his final 18 starts

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .262 opponents batting average, including .226 (38-for-168) against left-handed hitters compared to .275 (124-for-451) against right-handers...surrendered 16 of his 19 home runs and issued 41 of his 47 walks to righties...13 of the 19 home runs were solo shots.

HOME AND AWAY: Was 7-2 with a 3.86 ERA in 14 starts at home compared to 3-7 with a 4.21 ERA in 15 starts on the road.

NIGHT AND DAY: Logged a 5-2 record and a 3.27 ERA in 10 starts during the day compared to 5-7 with a 4.46 ERA in 19 starts at night.

DAYS REST: Was 6-5 with a 3.55 ERA in 15 starts on four days rest, 4-4 with a 4.60 ERA in 14 starts on five days rest or more.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Compiled a mark of 5-4 and a 4.60 ERA in 16 starts before the All-Star Break...then went 5-5 with a 3.38 ERA in 13 starts after the break...his career numbers are 43-42 with a 4.70 ERA (349 er in 668.1 ip) in 118 starts before the break compared to 35-28 with a 3.41 ERA in 93 games, 92 starts, after the break.

THIS AND THAT: Was 3-1 with a 3.38 ERA in five interleague starts and is now 11-5 in 22 career interleague starts...committed three errors, which tied for second most among AL pitchers...the Indians were 15-14 (.517) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in 15 of his starts, allowed two runs or fewer 16 times and walked two batters or fewer six times.

MORE 2013: Was a non-roster invitee with the Indians during the spring but was added to the roster and placed on the 15-day disabled list April 2 with a sprained right rib cage...made one rehab start at Triple-A Columbus April 15 and was the winning pitcher in the Clippers 4-1 win over Louisville (5.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 5 so)...was reinstated from the DL April 20 and allowed a season-high six runs in 3.1 innings in his first start that day against Houston...ended up with a no decision in the Indians 19-6 win...allowed two runs in 6.0 innings May 4 against Minnesota for his first win of the season...it was his first Major League win since Sept. 19, 2010...went 3-0 with a 1.45 ERA in five starts against the Twins in 2013...struck out 10 batters in 6.0 innings May 9 against Oakland, his first of four 10-strikeout games...walked a season-high four batters May 25 at Boston...tossed a season-high 111 pitches June 4 at New York (AL)...matched his walk high June 15 against Washington while tossing a season-low 2.2 innings...had a season-high four-game winning streak from June 21 to Aug. 4...compiled a 1.93 ERA and .173 opponents batting average over that nine-start stretch...tossed a season-high 8.0 innings July 24 at Seattle, allowing one unearned run on one hit for the win...it was his longest outing since June 6, 2008...went 2-0 with a 2.75 ERA and .198 opponents batting average in six starts in July...allowed just one home run in 36.0 innings...singled Aug. 4 at Miami, his second career hit...went 1-for-4 at the plate in 2013...had a season-high three-game losing streak from Aug. 9 to 31...compiled a 7.11 ERA and .353 opponents batting average over that four-start stretch...allowed a season-high 10 hits in 5.0 innings at Oakland Aug. 18...went 3-2 with a 2.57 ERA in five starts in September...struck out 43 batters in 28 innings and walked just four...ranked fourth in the AL in strikeouts in September...had three 10-strikeout games in the month, including Sept. 6 against New York (NL) when he fanned a season-high 12 in 6.0 shutout innings...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the second pitcher in Cleveland history to have that many strikeouts in a game in which he pitched no more than six innings (Sam McDowell vs. Detroit, Sept. 18, 1966)...did not walk a batter and became the first Major League pitcher with a scoreless outing of 6.0 innings or fewer with at least 12 strikeouts and no walks since Texas' Matt Perisho Oct. 3, 1999 at Anaheim...finished the season with back-to-back 10-strikeout games, fanning 10 Sept. 21 against Houston and 11 Sept. 28 at Minnesota...won both starts to become the first Indian to win consecutive starts with 10 or more strikeouts since Chuck Finley in April, 2000.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Chavez (0-0, 1.38 ERA): Has allowed one earned run in each of his first two starts and has a 1.38 ERA, which is tied for ninth in the American League...prior to this year, had made just two career starts, both with Toronto in 2012...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-4 A's win in 11 innings at Minnesota last Wednesday (7.0 ip, 6 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 9 so)...had career-highs in innings and strikeouts...is 1-2 with a 7.56 ERA in eight career appearances against Los Angeles, all in relief...went 5-1 with a save and a 2.22 ERA in seven games, five starts, this spring...the five wins were the most in the majors and the most by an A's pitcher since spring win totals are available beginning in 1990...ranked second in the Cactus League in innings pitched (28.1), fourth in strikeouts (25) and eighth in ERA...spent most of the 2013 season with the A's and was 2-4 with a save and a career-low 3.92 ERA in 35 games over two stints.

- The A's bullpen has allowed four runs in the last eight games (26.0 ip, 1.38 ERA) after surrendering seven runs over the first three contests (9.0 ip, 7.00 ERA).
- Ranks third in the American League in opponents batting average (.192) and fourth in ERA (2.83)...is tied for the third fewest home runs (2).
- Was charged with its third blown save of the season Wednesday at Minnesota, which is tied for the most in the majors.
- Has allowed just 1 of 11 (0.9%) inherited runners to score, which is fourth lowest in the AL.
- Ranked third in the AL with a 3.22 ERA in 2013...also ranked third in opponents on-base percentage (.300), fourth in slugging percentage (.357) and fifth in opponents batting average (.237).

- Had a two-game rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton April 3-5 (1.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 10.80 ERA).
- Had a loss in seven appearances against Seattle last year (5.2 ip, 7 h, 4 r, 4 er, 7 bb, 8 so)...however, has a 2.16 ERA (4 er in 16.2 ip) and has converted each of his two save opportunities in 18 career appearances against the Mariners.

2013 RECAP: Spent the first four months of the season in the starting rotation but split the final two months of the year between the bullpen, rotation and minor leagues...was 12-9 with a 4.14 ERA in 28 games, 26 starts...had a .258 opponents batting average and .301 on-base percentage, which were the lowest marks of his career...had career highs in ERA (4.14), walks (39) and home runs (25) and matched his high in extra base hits (59).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .247 (121-for-489) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .298 (39-for-131) against left-handers...surrendered 21 of his 25 home runs to righties, which tied for fourth most in the American League...18 of the home runs were solo shots and 14 came in the first two innings of a game...allowed a .216 batting average with runners in scoring position, which ranked eighth in the AL...opponents batted .299 with a .541 slugging percentage when leading off an inning...has allowed a .318 batting average and .558 slugging percentage in that situation in his career.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Was 12-9 with a 4.17 ERA and .261 opponents batting average in his 26 starts, 0-0 with a 3.00 ERA and .100 opponents average in his two relief appearances...did not inherit a runner in his two relief appearances and retired both of his first batters faced.

HOME AND AWAY: Was 5-4 with a 3.44 ERA in 12 games at home compared to 7-5 with a 4.69 ERA in 16 games on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 12-8 with a 3.02 ERA (56 er in 166.2 ip) in 27 games in Oakland compared to 13-12 with a 4.78 ERA (98 er in 184.2 ip) in 33 games on the road.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Went 8-8 with a 4.24 ERA before the All-Star Break, 4-1 with a 3.86 ERA after the break...is now 16-15 before the break compared to 10-5 after the break.

DIVISIONS AND INTERLEAGUE: Compiled a 3-1 record and a 1.98 ERA in eight games against AL Central teams...is now 9-2 with a 1.97 ERA (22 er in 100.2 ip) in 17 career appearances against the Central...was 3-1 despite a 5.68 ERA in five interleague starts...is now 4-1 with a 6.02 ERA (29 er in 43.1 ip) in eight interleague starts in his career.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Opponents reached base on an error 11 times with him pitching, which was the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors...that led to 11 unearned runs, which tied for second most in the AL...opponents have now reached base via error 23 times over the last three years, which is tied for the most in the majors (Jordan Lyles, 23).

RUN SUPPORT: Received just 10 runs of support in his nine losses (1.78 RSA)...has received just 22 runs of support in his 20 losses in three seasons with the A's (114.0 ip, 1.74 RSA)...has received no support 10 times over the last three years as a starter and one run of support eight times...went 11-1 with three runs of support or more in 2013 and is 20-3 in his career.

THIS AND THAT: The A's were 16-10 (.615) in his 26 starting assignments and are 36-22 (.621) in his career...his teams are 41-22 (.651) in his 63 career starts.

MORE 2013 WITH OAKLAND: Won each of his first three starts to become the first pitcher on an A's Opening Day roster to win each of his first three starts since Dave Stewart had six wins in his first six starts in 1990...that extended his winning streak to five games dating back to 2012...had never won more than two consecutive games in his career...matched his career-high with 10 strikeouts and did not walk a batter May 1 against Los Angeles (AL)...has three career 10-strikeout games and has not walked a batter in any of those contests...is the third A's pitcher since 1916 with three career games of 10 or more strikeouts and no walks...went 2-for-4 with two runs and a RBI in a 10-2 win June 3 at Milwaukee...is one of two A's pitchers with two hits in a game since the start of interleague play...is also one of two A's pitchers to score two runs in an interleague game...is the first A's pitcher with at least two hits and a RBI since Blue Moon Odom went 2 for 2 with a RBI Aug. 22, 1972 at Detroit...tossed a career-high 118 pitches in a no decision in the A's 4-1 loss at Chicago (AL) June 8...that ran his record to 6-5 with a 3.69 ERA and .249 opponents batting average over his first 13 starts...was 9-9 with a 4.39 ERA in 22 starts when he was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento Aug. 3...made two starts with the River Cats and had no decisions, a 1.74 ERA and .348 opponents batting average before returning to Oakland Aug. 18...tossed a rain-shortened five-inning complete game in his second start Aug. 27 at Detroit, a 6-3 Oakland win that was called with the A's batting in the top of the sixth...it matched the shortest complete game in Oakland history...was 1-0 with a 2.79 ERA in two starts before he was optioned to Single-A Stockton Aug. 28...returned to Oakland Sept. 3 after Stockton's season ended and went 2-0 with a 2.70 ERA in four games, including two starts...finished the season with a three-game winning streak over his final six games beginning Aug. 18, logging a 2.74 ERA and .228 opponents batting average...began his career with 60 consecutive starts before making the first relief appearance of his career Sept. 11 at Minnesota (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 so)...made an emergency start Sept. 15 at Texas, replacing an ill Jarrod Parker, and allowed one run in 5.0 innings for the win...tossed 2.0 perfect innings of relief against Minnesota Sept. 20 and then started and won three days later at Los Angeles (AL)...both of his September starts came on three days rest or fewer...the last A's pitcher to make two such starts in a season was John Halama in 2003.

DARIC BARTON

- Made his fourth career Opening Day start at first base March 31 against Cleveland, which matches Jason Giambi for second most in Oakland history...only Mark McGwire, with nine, has more.

ALBERTO CALLASPO

- Was on his eighth consecutive Opening Day roster.
- Made his professional debut at first base April 3 against Seattle and went 0 for 1 with two walks and an error.

YOENIS CÉSPEDES

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start March 31 against Cleveland (center field in 2012, left field in 2013-14)...is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers in left field since Ben Grieve in 1999-2000.

RYAN COOK

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring.

COCO CRISP

- Was on his 10th Opening Day roster and made his ninth career Opening Day start, his fourth straight with the A's.
- Hit his first career game-ending home run April 3 against Seattle...it was his sixth regular season "walk-off" RBI.

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.

LUKE GREGERSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

A.J. GRIFFIN

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a flexor muscle strain.

JOHN JASO

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year...that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).

JIM JOHNSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

JOSH LINDBLOM

- Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
