ABOUT THE A'S: Have won six of the last seven games and are now 8-4 for the season...that is the best record in the American League and is tied for third best in the majors...the 8-4 start matches the A's second best record after 12 games over the last 22 years (were 9-3 last year)...with a win tonight, the A's would match their best record after 13

games over the last 24 years...the A's are the only team in the majors that has not lost back-to-back games this year...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the second consecutive day and third time in the last four days...are a season-high 1½ games ahead of second place Seattle...have three days in sole possession of first place this year, one day tied for first, three days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth.

STARTING PITCHING: Scott Kazmir tossed six shutout innings yesterday, the sixth time in the first 12 games A's starters have allowed one run or fewer...starters have allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of the first 12 contests, which is their longest such season-opening streak since 1981 when they had a 16-game streak (Norris, Langford, Keough, McCatty and Kingman)...now have a 1.95 ERA (16 er in 74.0 ip), which is the lowest mark in the American League and second lowest in the majors (Atlanta, 1.82)...also rank fourth in the AL in opponents batting (.221) and strikeouts (72)...have two 30-year olds (Scott Kazmir and Jesse Chavez) in the starting rotation at the same time for the first time since April of 2010 (Ben Sheets, Justin Duchscherer).

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff struck out at least 11 batters in all three games of the Seattle series, which marks the third time in Oakland history the A's have fanned 11 or more in three consecutive games (July 22-25, 2012 and September 22-24, 2013)...had 34 strikeouts total while waking just two...the A's had their first shutout of the season yesterday and have now allowed three runs or fewer in nine of the first 12 games...have a 2.17 ERA, which is the lowest mark in the American League and second lowest in the majors (Milwaukee, 1.80)...have the lowest opponents on-base percentage (.271) and slugging percentage (.302) in the AL, the second lowest batting average (.209) and are tied for the second fewest home runs (8).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 5-1 on the first road trip of the season, a nine-game trip to Minnesota (3-0), Seattle (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (three games)...have the best road record in the American League and third best in the majors...have won their first two road series for the second consecutive season...started the season 6-0 on the road last year before losing each of their next four games...return home following the game Wednesday for a six-game homestand with Houston (three games) and Texas (three games)...went 3-3 on the first homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Seattle (2-1).

AGAINST LEFT-HANDERS: The A's are scheduled to face two lefthanded starting pitchers in this three game series against the Angels...have faced just one left-handed starter over the first 12 games (Elias on April 3)...that is tied with Detroit for the fewest in the AL...are batting .156 (10 for 64) against left-handed pitchers compared to .249 (86 for 346) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is the lowest in the majors (St. Louis, .173).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 6-1 in day games, which is the best record in the majors...are 2-3 in night games, which is tied for the second worst record in the American League...are batting .265 (65 for 245) during the day compared to .182 (30 for 165) at night...have the lowest night batting average in the majors (Houston, .190)...have hit 10 of their 12 home runs during the day.

OFFENSE: The A's rank third in the American League in walks (56) and tied for third in triples (4)...have grounded into the second fewest double plays (5)...are tied for the second fewest doubles (16).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 2-1 during this stretch of 19 consecutive games against American League West competition (April 11-30)...have not used a rookie, marking their longest stretch without a rookie on the roster since 2006 when they had no rookies for the first 36 days of the season (April 3-May 8)...all four of the A's losses have been by two runs...are one of four teams in the majors that has not lost

a game by more than three runs (Cincinnati, Milwaukee, Seattle)...played their second extra inning game of the season last Wednesday at Minnesota, both in games started by Jesse Chavez and both wins...are one of two AL teams with two extra inning wins.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's reinstated Craig Gentry from the disabled list Saturday and now have five players on the DL (Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Rodriguez)...O'Flaherty and Parker are both on the 60-day DL...Rodriguez is on a rehab assignment with Sacramento...had seven players on the DL for the first seven days of the season, which matches the most players the A's had on the DL at once last year (May 7-14 and August 26-27)...used the DL just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

DURING THE SPRING: The A's went 15-13-5, which marked their third consecutive spring with a winning record...the five tie games were the most by an Oakland team since moving to Arizona for Spring Training in 1969...the previous high was three in 2010 and 2013...led the majors in walks (135) and ranked second in runs (193) and on-base percentage (.358)...the A's pitching staff ranked fifth in the majors with 247 strikeouts...those are the most strikeouts by an A's team during the spring since statistics are available beginning in 1991.

SCORING CHANGE: In the third inning of the A's game against Seattle on Saturday, Brandon Moss was originally credited with RBI single after passing the base runner on Ackley's dropped transfer of a fly ball...Moss is now credited with a sacrifice fly and a RBI...that erases his hitting streak, which had reached a career-high tying eight games yesterday...this change is reflected in today's notes but not the statistics.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's won the season series last year 11-8...went 6-4 in Oakland and 5-4 in Los Angeles...it was the A's third consecutive season series win...are 32-25 against the Angels over the previous three seasons...including 26-2 when scoring four or more runs...have been shutout in seven of their last 17 losses to the Angels and have scored just one run in six of those games...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 397-321 against the Angels...that includes 205-153 in Oakland and 192-168 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 446-398 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Coco Crisp stole his 144th base as an Athletic yesterday, which ties Reggie Jackson for fifth in Oakland history...has a 145-game errorless streak, which is fifth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...Luke **Gregerson** made his seventh appearance of the season yesterday, which is tied for the American League lead...has pitched in 370 games since 2009, which is the most in the majors over that span...John **Jaso** has a .415 (27 for 65) career batting average at Angel Stadium, which is the best mark among player with 75 or more plate appearances...Jed Lowrie has reached base safely in each of the last 11 games, going 8 for 29 (.276) with 14 walks and a hit by pitch (1 sf. .511 on-base percentage)...leads the AL and ranks fifth in the majors in on-base percentage (.469)...**Dan Otero** has not allowed a home run in 57.1 career innings.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1915** Herb Pennock comes within one out of pitching the first Opening Day no-hitter...a scratch single by Harry Hooper is the only hit in the A's 5-0 win over Boston...in **1925** two future Hall of Famers make their Major League debut in the same game as Lefty Grove starts against Boston and Mickey Cochrane has a pinch hit single in a game the A's would win 9-8 in 10 innings...in **1971** Reggie Jackson hits his 100th home run in an Oakland uniform to become the first Oakland Athletic to reach the century mark...he also hit his 101st in the A's 6-1 win at Minnesota...in **1974** Jim Hunter strikes out Toby Harrah in the first inning of the A's 4-2 win against Texas...it is his 100th strikeout as an Oakland Athletic, making him the first Oakland pitcher to reach that plateau...two years later, in **1976**, Vida Blue strikeouts out four Texas Rangers to give him 1000 career strikeouts...he finished his A's career with 1315 career strikeouts, an Oakland record...in **2001** Miguel Tejada hits the 10000th home run in Athletics history in a 9-8 loss to Texas.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (0-0, 1.38 ERA)

AS A STARTER: Has allowed one earned run in each of his first two starts and has a 1.38 ERA, which is tied for seventh in the American League...the A's have played extra innings in each of his two starts...prior to this year, had made just two career starts, both with Toronto in 2012...had a loss and a 10.38 ERA in those two outings...is now 0-1 with a 4.98 ERA (12 er in 21.2 ip) in four career starts...has 54 career starts as a minor leaguer...made 23 starts over the previous two seasons after starting just once from 2005-11.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 12-inning win over Seattle April 3 in Oakland...was charged with an unearned run in the first inning when Almonte reached on a Callaspo error, went to second on a Punto error, third on a Miller fly out and scored on a Cano ground out...also allowed a RBI single to Almonte in the fifth to make the score 2-0...the A's scored single runs in the fifth and eighth to tie the game.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-4, 11-inning win at Minnesota last Wednesday...struck out a career-high nine in a career-high 7.0 innings...the A's scored four times in the first inning and he allowed a solo home run to Kubel to lead off the second...that was the only run he would allow in his seven innings and he was relieved by Doolittle to start the eighth with a 4-1 lead...Doolittle allowed a run in the eighth and Johnson two in the ninth.

CHAVEZ vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 1-2 with a 7.56 ERA (8.1 ip, 11 h, 10 r, 7 er, 4 bb, 8 so, 1 hr) in eight career appearances, all in relief...is 1-1 with a 9.00 ERA (5 er in 5.0 ip) in four games in his home ballparks and 0-1 with a 5.40 ERA (2 er in 3.1 ip) in four games in Anaheim...was 1-1 with a 4.76 ERA (5.2 ip, 6 h, 4 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 6 so) in four relief appearances last year...last faced the Angels September 23 at Los Angeles...pitched 1.2 innings of relief and retired all five batters he faced, three by strikeout.

THIS SPRING: Went 5-1 with a save and a 2.22 ERA in seven games, five starts...the five wins were the most in the majors this spring and the most by an A's pitcher since spring win totals are available beginning in 1990...ranked second in the Cactus League in innings pitched (28.1), fourth in strikeouts (25) and eighth in ERA...allowed a .216 opponents batting average...did not allow a run in five of his seven games, including a spring-opening 13.2-inning scoreless streak.

2013 RECAP: Spent most of the season with the A's and was 2-4 with a save and a career-low 3.92 ERA in 35 games over two stints...the save was the first of his career and he also struck out a career-high 55 batters...also had career lows in opponents batting average (.230), on-base percentage (.302) and slugging percentage (.318)...matched his career highs in wild pitches (5) and hit batters (3)...surrendered just three home runs in 57.1 innings, an average of 0.47 per nine

innings...entered the season with 34 home runs in 177.1 career innings (1.73 per nine innings).

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Had a 2.97 ERA and .210 opponents batting average in 18 games before the All-Star Break...then compiled a 5.25 ERA and .258 opponents average in 17 games after the break.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .212 (21-for-99) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .246 (29-for-118) against left-handers...yielded all three of his home runs to right-handers but issued 14 of his 20 walks to lefties...allowed a .167 batting average with runners in scoring position and two outs...had a .269 batting average over his first 15 pitches in a game, .193 after that...opponents hit .333 with a .418 on-base percentage when leading off an inning.

IN RELIEF: First batters faced were 8-for-32 (.250) with two walks (.286 on-base percentage)...allowed 8-of-26 (30.8%) inherited runners to score.

HOME AND AWAY: Had a 2.73 ERA and .181 opponents batting average in 20 games on the road compared to a 5.20 ERA and .277 opponents average in 15 games at home.

THIS AND THAT: Led AL relievers in sacrifice hits allowed (6) and averaged the seventh most pitches per game (27.1)...tied for fifth among all AL pitchers in sacrifice hits...tossed at least one inning in 30 of his 35 appearances, including 10 outings of two or more.

MORE 2013 WITH OAKLAND: Was recalled from Sacramento April 20 and appeared in just three games during his first stint...had a 6.23 ERA and .350 opponents batting average when he was optioned to Sacramento April 29...returned May 10 and spent the remainder of the season with Oakland...did not allow a run in six of his first seven outings following his return...had a 0.59 ERA and .132 opponents batting average over that stretch that ran from May 10 to June 13...it included a career-high 12.2-inning scoreless streak from May 15 to June 13...capped his scoreless streak by tossing 5.2 scoreless innings of relief June 13 against New York (AL) for his first win in the A's 3-2, 18-inning victory over the Yankees...allowed just one hit and walked a season-high two while striking out seven...it was the longest relief appearance of his career and the longest outing by an A's reliever since Lenny DiNardo tossed 6.0 innings Aug. 2, 2008 against Boston...was charged with his first loss in his next outing June 17 at Texas...allowed two runs to score plus an inherited runner...allowed 3-of-7 (42.9%) inherited runners to score through that game but then allowed just 2-of-14 (14.3%) to score over his next 17 contests...was charged with his second loss of the season when he allowed a season-high four runs in 1.1 innings in a 7-1 loss to St. Louis June 29...tossed 4.0 scoreless innings for his first career save in a 10-4 win at Kansas City July 7 ... it was the fourth four-inning save by an A's reliever since 1991, the first since Chad Gaudin May 4, 2006 against Cleveland...matched his season high by allowing four hits July 25 against Los Angeles (AL) ... yielded three runs in that game and allowed three runs in three of six games from July 25 to Aug. 17 (10 er in 10.2 ip, 8.44 ERA)...matched his season high with two walks July 28 against Los Angeles (AL)...appeared in just six of the A's 38 games from Aug. 2 to Sept. 12 and allowed a run in the four of those contests (4.05 ERA)...struck out in his only at bat of the season Aug. 7 at Cincinnati and is 0 for 5 with five strikeouts in his career...walked a season-high two batters in back-to-back outings Aug. 20 against Seattle and Aug. 23 at Baltimore...did not allow an earned run over his final six outings beginning Sept. 15 (6.1 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 bb, 8 so)...was on the A's roster for the ALDS against Detroit but did not appear in a game.

2013 WITH SACRAMENTO: Was used exclusively as a starter with Sacramento and went 2-2 with a 2.70 ERA in five starts...allowed just one home run in 30.0 innings...walked five batters, an average of 1.50 per nine innings...struck out 26 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 5.20...yielded a .285 opponents batting average, including .240 (18-for-75) against right-handed hitters compared to .354 (17-for-48) against left-handers...went 1-1 with a 2.45 ERA in three starts before he was called up by Oakland the first time April 20...that included a season-high nine strikeout game for his first win, April 15 at Reno...logged a 1-1 record and a 3.09 ERA in two starts during his second stay with the River Cats from April 29 to May 9.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Dan Straily (1-1, 2.77 ERA): Was the winning pitcher in his last start, a 6-1 A's victory at Minnesota last Thursday (7.0 ip, 3 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...has allowed three runs or fewer in each of his last eight starts dating back to August 28 of last year and is 5-2 with a 2.20 ERA and .194 opponents batting average over that span...is 1-3 with a 5.82 ERA in six career starts against Los Angeles, including 0-3 with a 5.56 ERA in four starts this spring...issued 10 walks in 13.1 innings...had five stints with Oakland in 2013 and was 10-8 with a 3.96 ERA in 27 starts...led American League rookies in games started, innings pitched (152.1) and strikeouts (124) and tied for the lead in wins (Perez, TEX).

- The A's bullpen has allowed four runs in the last nine games (29.0 ip, 1.24 ERA) after surrendering seven runs over the first three contests (9.0 ip, 7.00 ERA).
- Ranks second in the American League in ERA (2.61) and opponents batting average (.184) and is tied for the third fewest home runs (2).
- Has allowed just 1 of 11 (0.9%) inherited runners to score, which is third lowest in the AL.
- First batters faced are hitting .161 (5 for 31), which is third lowest in the AL...have just one double for a .194 slugging percentage, which is the lowest mark in the majors.
- Was charged with its third blown save of the season last Wednesday at Minnesota, which is tied for second most in the AL.
- Ranked third in the AL with a 3.22 ERA in 2013...also ranked third in opponents on-base percentage (.300), fourth in slugging percentage (.357) and fifth in opponents batting average (.237).

- Has never faced the Angels in his career.
- Is on his third career Opening Day roster (2011 and 2012 with Houston).
- Compiled a 3.27 ERA and allowed a .205 batting average in a team-leading 11 appearances this spring...did not issue a walk in 11.0 innings while striking out 12.
- Has a 13-game losing streak dating back to April 9, 2011, which is the longest active losing streak in the majors.
- Was acquired from Washington for minor league infielder John Wooten, November 25, 2013.

Last Year: Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse and was 1-0 with a 1.06 ERA in 17 relief appearances...was promoted to Washington May 21 and went 0-3 with a 3.35 ERA in a career-high 39 relief appearances.

- Had a two-game rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton April 3-5 (1.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 10.80 ERA).
- Did not allow a run in seven appearances against the Angels last year (7.0 ip, 4 h, 10 so) and now has an 8.1-inning scoreless streak against Los Angeles...is 1-0 with two saves and a 2.35 ERA (4 er in 15.1 ip) in 16 career outings against the Angels...has not allowed a run in seven career appearances at Angel Stadium (6.2 ip, 4 h, 1 bb, 6 so).
- Has a 1.13 ERA (3 er in 24.0 ip) in 22 career appearances in April.
 Did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring.
- Last Year: Was 6-4 with two saves and a 2.54 ERA in a team-leading 71 relief appearances...allowed just two home runs in 67.1 innings, an average of 0.27 per nine innings, which was fourth lowest among AL relievers.

- Recorded his first save of the season and the fourth of his career yesterday at Seattle.
- Has not allowed a run in six of his seven outings...is tied for the American League lead in games pitched (7)...ranks seventh among AL relievers in innings pitched (7.2)...the innings pitched are tied for the most among Major League relievers that have not issued a walk (Thornburg, MIL).
- Did not allow a run in eight games against Los Angeles last year (7.2 ip, 3 h, 5 so)...has a 2.38 ERA (3 er in 11.1 ip) in 12 career appearances against the Angels.

2013 RECAP: Had five stints with Oakland in 2013 and was 10-8 with a 3.96 ERA in 27 starts...led American League rookies in games started, innings pitched (152.1) and strikeouts (124) and tied for the lead in wins (Perez, TEX)...is the 11th rookie in Oakland history to win 10 or more games, the fifth in the last five years (Anderson, Cahill, Milone, Parker)...had the sixth most strikeouts by an Oakland rookie...went 1-2 with a 7.27 ERA and .257 opponents batting average over his first five starts, 5-0 with a 2.83 ERA and .196 opponents average over his next nine starts from May 21 to July 9, 0-5 with a 5.20 ERA and .299 opponents over his next seven starts from July 20 to Aug. 23 and 4-1 with a 2.00 ERA and .195 opponents average over his final six starts

- Was on his eighth consecutive Opening Day roster.
- Made his professional debut at first base April 3 against Seattle and went 0 for 1 with two walks and an error.

YOENIS CÉSPEDES

• Made his third consecutive Opening Day start March 31 against Cleveland (center field in 2012, left field in 2013-14)...is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers in left field since Ben Grieve in 1999-2000.

RYAN COOK

 Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring.

COCO CRISP

- Was on his 10th Opening Day roster and made his ninth career Opening Day start, his fourth straight with the A's.
- Hit his first career game-ending home run April 3 against Seattle...it was his sixth regular season "walk-off" RBI.

SAM FULD

 Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.

CRAIG GENTRY

• Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.

LUKE GREGERSON

· Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

A.J. GRIFFIN

 Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a flexor muscle strain.

JOHN JASO

• Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
