ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three straight and seven of the last eight games...are now 9-4 for the season, which matches the A's best record after 13 games over the last 24 years (also 1992, 2010 and 2013)...with a win tonight, the A's would match their best record after 14 games over the last 24 years (1992 and 2013)...the A's 9-4 record is the best in the American League and tied for second best in the majors...the A's are the only team in the majors that has not lost back-to-back games this year...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the third consecutive day and fourth time in the last five days...are a season-high 1½ games ahead of second place Seattle for the second consecutive day...have four days in sole possession of first place this year, one day tied for first, three days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth.

STARTING PITCHING: Jesse Chavez struck out nine batters last night, which follows nine-strikeout performances by Scott Kazmir on Sunday and Sonny Gray on Saturday...that marks the **first time since at least 1914** that A's starting pitchers have fanned nine or more in three consecutive games...have 81 strikeouts for the season, which is the most in the majors...Chavez allowed just two runs yesterday and A's starters have allowed three earned runs or fewer in each of the first 13 games...that is their longest such season-opening streak since 1981 when they had a 16-game streak (Norris, Langford, Keough, McCatty and Kingman)...now have a 1.89 ERA (17 er in 81.0 ip), which is the lowest mark in the American League and second lowest in the majors (Atlanta, 1.80)...starters have allowed six hits or fewer in 12 of the 13 games and rank second in the AL in opponents batting average (.215)...have two 30-year olds (Scott Kazmir and Jesse Chavez) in the starting rotation at the same time for the first time since April of 2010 (Ben Sheets, Justin Duchscherer).

PITCHING: The A's have allowed three runs or fewer in 10 of the first 13 games and have a 2.08 ERA...that is the lowest mark in the American League and second lowest in the majors (Milwaukee, 1.97)...have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the majors (.300) and the lowest on-base percentage in the AL (.263)...rank second in the AL in batting average (.204) and third in strikeouts (115).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 6-1 on the first road trip of the season, a nine-game trip to Minnesota (3-0), Seattle (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (1-0)...have the best road record in the American League and third best in the majors...the 6-1 start matches the A's best start on the road over the last 24 years (2008, 2013)...a win tonight would give the A's their best start on the road since going 8-0 in 1990...have won their first two road series for the second consecutive season...have not won their first three road series since 1990...return home following the game tomorrow for a six-game homestand with Houston (three games) and Texas (three games)...went 3-3 on the first homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Seattle (2-1).

OFFENSE: John Jaso delivered a pinch hit two-run home run last night in the ninth inning to turn a 2-1 deficit into a 3-2 win...five of the A's 14 home runs have come in the ninth inning or later, which is the most in the majors...eight have come with runners on base and six have put the A's ahead...the A's are tied for second in the American League in walks (57) and tied for third in triples (4)...have grounded into the second fewest double plays (7)...are tied for the second fewest doubles (16).

AGAINST LEFT-HANDERS: The A's are scheduled to face two left-handed starting pitchers in this three game series against the Angels...prior to last night had faced just one left-handed starter over the first 12 games (Elias on April 3)...have won each of their first two games started by left-handers...in the American League, only Detroit has faced fewer left-handed starting pitchers (1)...are batting .165 (15 for 91) against left-handed pitchers compared to .252 (89 for 353) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is the lowest in the majors (St. Louis, .175).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 6-1 in day games, which is the best record in the majors...are 3-3 in night games...are batting .265 (65 for

245) during the day compared to .196 (39 for 199) at night...have the second lowest night batting average in the majors (Houston, .190)...have hit 10 of their 14 home runs during the day.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's had their third last at bat win of the season last night, which is tied for the most in the majors (Detroit, Milwaukee and Texas)...it was their fourth come from behind win, which is tied for the most in the American League (Detroit)...are 2-0 in one run games and are one of two AL teams without a one-run loss (Tampa Bay)...all four of the A's losses have been by two runs...are one of three teams in the majors that has not lost a game by more than three runs (Cincinnati, Seattle)...played their second extra inning game of the season last Wednesday at Minnesota, both in games started by Jesse Chavez and both wins...are one of two AL teams with two extra inning wins.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have scored three runs in each of the last three games...the last time the A's won three straight games while scoring three runs or fewer in each game was September 13-15, 1992...are 0 for 23 with runners in scoring position over the last three games but have won all three games...are 8-0 when outperforming the opposition...are 3-1 during this stretch of 19 consecutive games against American League West competition (April 11-30)...have not used a rookie, marking their longest stretch without a rookie on the roster since 2006 when they had no rookies for the first 36 days of the season (April 3-May 8).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's reinstated Craig Gentry from the disabled list Saturday and now have five players on the DL (Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Rodriguez)...O'Flaherty and Parker are both on the 60-day DL...Rodriguez is on a rehab assignment with Sacramento...had seven players on the DL for the first seven days of the season, which matches the most players the A's had on the DL at once last year (May 7-14 and August 26-27)...used the DL just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. ANGELS: The A's won the first meeting of 2014 last night after winning the season series last year 11-8...went 6-4 in Oakland and 5-4 in Los Angeles...it was the A's third consecutive season series win...are 33-25 (.569) against the Angels over the last four seasons...including 26-2 when scoring four or more runs...have been shutout in seven of their last 17 losses to the Angels and have scored just one run in six of those games...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 398-321 against the Angels...that includes 205-153 in Oakland and 193-168 in Anaheim...all-time, the A's are 447-398 against the Angels.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Alberto Callaspo has five multiple hit games in his nine games this year...is tied for fifth in the American League in multiple hit games...**Coco Crisp** stole his 144th base as an Athletic Sunday, which ties Reggie Jackson for fifth in Oakland history...has a 145-game errorless streak, which is fifth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...**Luke Gregerson** made his eighth appearance of the season last night, which is the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors...has pitched in 371 games since 2009, which is the most in the majors over that span...**John Jaso** has a .424 (28 for 66) career batting average at Angel Stadium with six home runs and 21 RBI in 20 games...the batting average is the best by any player in this ballpark with a minimum of 75 plate appearances...the home runs equal his most in any ballpark (Safeco Field)...**Dan Otero** has not allowed a home run in 57.1 career innings.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1924** Al Simmons collects his first major league hit off the Senators Walter Johnson in the A's 4-0 loss to Washington on Opening Day...in **1990** Dennis Eckersley records his 100th career save in the A's 3-0 win at Seattle...with 100 saves, he becomes just the sixth pitcher in major league history with 100 saves and 100 victories...in **2006** Eric Chavez, Frank Thomas and Milton Bradley hit back-to-back-to-back home runs on three consecutive pitches off Vicente Padilla in the sixth inning of the A's 5-4 win over Texas.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Dan Straily (1-1, 2.77 ERA)

LAST EIGHT STARTS: Has allowed three runs or fewer in each of his first two starts this year and now has a streak of eight consecutive starts with three runs or fewer dating back to August 28 of last year...is 5-2 with a 2.20 ERA (12 er in 49.0 ip) and .194 (34 for 175) opponents batting average over that span.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss to Seattle April 5 in Oakland...blanked the Mariners on two hits over the first four innings before allowing three runs in the fifth inning on a two-run home run by Ackley and a solo home run by Almonte...Hernandez shut out the A's on four hits over the first eight innings before Lowrie homered in the ninth.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win at Minnesota last Thursday...allowed a solo home run to the second batter he faced, Dozier, but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings...did not allow a hit over his final five innings and retired 16 of the final 18 batters he faced

STRAILY vs. LOS ANGELES: Is 1-3 with a 5.82 ERA (34.0 ip, 44 h, 24 r, 22 er, 7 bb, 33 so, 9 hr) in six career starts...is 0-1 with a 10.54 ERA (16 er in 13.2 ip) in three starts in Oakland and 1-2 with a 2.66 ERA (6 er in 20.1 ip) in three starts in Anaheim...went 0-3 with a 5.56 ERA (22.2 ip, 29 h, 16 r, 14 er, 5 bb, 20 so, 3 hr) in four starts last year...had a no decision in a 10-8 A's win in 19 innings on April 29 in Oakland...allowed a career-high six runs in 4.2 innings...allowed solo home runs to Pujols in the first and Trumbo in the second...was trailing 2-1 when he allowed four more runs in the fifth on a Pujols RBI single, a Hamilton sacrifice fly and a Trumbo two-run double...left trailing 6-1 but the A's eventually tied the game before winning in the 19th in a 6 hour and 32 minute game, the longest by time in Oakland history...then took the loss in a 2-0 decision at Los Angeles July 20...allowed a sacrifice fly to Hamilton in the first inning but then blanked the Angels on five hits over the next five innings...Callaspo homered to lead off the sixth...the A's were shutout on three hits by Wilson (8.1 ip) and Frieri (0.2 ip)...also lost in an 8-3 decision in Oakland July 25...allowed a RBI single to Pujols in the third inning but the A's scored twice in the fourth to take a 2-1 lead...he then allowed four runs in the fifth inning on a Trout sacrifice fly, a Hamilton RBI single and a Trumbo two-run double...left after 4.1 innings trailing 5-2...his final loss came in a 3-1 decision at Los Angeles (AL) September 25...blanked the Angels on three hits over the first three innings before Aybar singled and later scored on a fielders choice in the fourth...also allowed RBI singles to Aybar and Hamilton in the sixth...left after 6.2 innings with the A's trailing 3-1...Weaver limited the A's to a run on five hits in seven innings.

THIS SPRING: Had no decisions and a 4.37 ERA in four starts this spring...opponents hit .275...walked two or more batters in all four starts and issued 10 walks in 13.1 innings overall (6.75 walks per nine innings)...had his final start on March 29 against San Francisco rained out...pitched in a minor league game March 24 (5.2 ip, 10 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 2 hr).

2013 RECAP: Had five stints with Oakland in 2013 and was 10-8 with a 3.96 ERA in 27 starts...led American League rookies in games started, innings pitched (152.1) and strikeouts (124) and tied for the

lead in wins (Perez, TEX)...is the 11th rookie in Oakland history to win 10 or more games, the fifth in the last five years (Anderson, Cahill, Milone, Parker)...had the sixth most strikeouts by an Oakland rookie...went 1-2 with a 7.27 ERA and .257 opponents batting average over his first five starts, 5-0 with a 2.83 ERA and .196 opponents average over his next nine starts from May 21 to July 9, 0-5 with a 5.20 ERA and .299 opponents over his next seven starts from July 20 to Aug. 23 and 4-1 with a 2.00 ERA and .195 opponents average over his final six starts

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .233 opponents batting average...did not have enough innings pitched to qualify for the league leaders, but his opponents average was ninth lowest among AL pitchers with 150 or more innings pitched...his .358 slugging percentage was eighth best...surrendered 16 home runs in 152.1 innings (0.95 per nine innings) after allowing 11 in 39.1 innings in 2012 (2.52 per nine innings)...11 of the 16 home runs he allowed were solo shots as are 21 of the 30 in his career...his opponents batting average included a .221 (60-for-272) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .244 (72-for-295) against left-handers...allowed a .201 batting average the first time through the lineup, which was third lowest among AL pitchers with 150 or more innings pitched...now has a .206 (60-for-291) opponents average the first time through the lineup in his career...allowed a .225 batting average to batters leading off an inning...however, issued 19 walks to start an inning, which tied for second most in the AL...opponents hit .300 with runners in scoring position and two outs...they were 4-for-7 (.571) with a grand slam with the bases loaded.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 6-2 with a 4.28 ERA and .217 opponents batting average in 14 starts before the All-Star Break...then went 4-6 with a 3.61 ERA and .250 opponents average in 13 starts after the break.

NIGHT AND DAY: Was 4-2 with a 2.14 ERA and .195 opponents batting average in nine starts during the day compared to 6-6 with a 4.98 ERA and .252 opponents average in 18 starts at night...his day ERA was the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings in day games...surrendered just one of his 16 home runs during the day...in 2012, allowed eight of his 11 home runs in day games.

DAYS REST: Was 6-3 with a 3.25 ERA in 14 starts on five days rest or more compared to 4-5 with a 4.80 ERA in 13 starts on four days rest...is now 8-4 with a 2.98 ERA (38 er in 114.2 ip) in 19 career starts on five days rest or more compared to 5-6 with a 5.00 ERA (50 er in 90.0 ip) in 17 starts on four days rest.

RUN SUPPORT: Received two runs of support or fewer in 17 of his 27 starts and was 5-8 in those games...was 5-0 in 10 starts with three runs of support or more...is now 6-10 in 21 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 7-0 in 15 starts with support of three or more

THIS AND THAT: Was 3-1 with a 1.54 ERA and .167 opponents batting average in four interleague starts...tied for third in the majors in interleague wins, ranked fourth in opponents batting average and ninth in ERA...tied for the team-lead with seven hit batters...the A's were 16-11 (.593) in his starting assignments and are 22-14 (.611) in his career.

MORE 2013 WITH OAKLAND: Was on the A's Opening Day roster and struck out a career-high and Oakland rookie record tying 11 batters in his first start at Houston April 5...was optioned to Sacramento the next day...returned to Oakland April 29 and started that night...was optioned to Sacramento April 30 and returned May 1 when Anderson was placed on the DL...went 3-2 with a 4.72 ERA and .232 opponents batting average in 10 starts during his third stint through June 22...had a career-high five-game winning streak from May 21 to July 9 (2.83 ERA, .196 opponents batting average)...was optioned to Sacramento June 23...returned to Oakland July 4 and went 2-0 with a 0.68 ERA in two starts before he was sent back to Sacramento July 10...was recalled for the final time July 20 and went 4-6 with a 3.61 ERA over his final 13 starts.

2013 WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-1 with a 1.14 ERA and .202 opponents batting average in five starts with Sacramento...allowed just one home run in 31.2 innings...struck out 33, an average of 9.38 per nine innings...his opponents batting average included a .174 (8-for-46) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .219 (16-for-73) against right-handers...yielded a .161 average to batters leading off an inning and issued just one walk...the River Cats were 4-1 in his starting assignments.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Tommy Milone (0-1, 5.40 ERA): Was on the A's Opening Day roster but did not make his first appearance of the season until starting last Friday at Seattle, a loss in the A's 6-4 decision (5.0 ip, 10 h, 5 r, 3 er, 7 so)...was scheduled to start April 5 against the Mariners...however, his turn in the rotation was skipped after the game of April 4 was postponed due to a wet field...is 5-2 with a 4.35 ERA in seven career starts against Los Angeles (AL)...went 2-1 with a 4.26 ERA in five games, four starts, this spring...logged a 1.93 ERA over his final three games...spent the first four months of the 2013 season in the starting rotation but split the final two months of the year between the bullpen, rotation and minor leagues...was 12-9 with a 4.14 ERA in 28 games, 26 starts.

- Is tied for first in the AL in wins (4), ranks second in opponents batting average (.182) and tied for third in saves (4) and fewest home runs (2)...is also tied for second in most blown saves (3).
- Has allowed just 1 of 11 (0.9%) inherited runners to score, which is third lowest in the AL.

2013 RECAP: Spent the first four months of the season in the starting rotation but split the final two months of the year between the bullpen, rotation and minor leagues...was 12-9 with a 4.14 ERA in 28 games, 26 starts...had a .258 opponents batting average and .301 on-base percentage, which were the lowest marks of his career...had career highs in ERA (4.14), walks (39) and home runs (25) and matched his high in extra base hits (59).

MORE 2013 WITH OAKLAND: Won each of his first three starts to become the first pitcher on an A's Opening Day roster to win each of his first three starts since Dave Stewart had six wins in his first six starts in 1990...that extended his winning streak to five games dating back to 2012...had never won more than two consecutive games in his career...matched his career-high with 10 strikeouts and did not walk a batter May 1 against Los Angeles (AL)...has three career 10-strikeout games and has not walked a batter in any of those contests...is the third A's pitcher since 1916 with three career games of 10 or more strikeouts and no walks...went 2-for-4 with two runs and a RBI in a 10-2 win June 3 at Milwaukee...is one of two A's pitchers with two hits in a game since the start of interleague play...is also one of two A's pitchers to score two runs in an interleague game...is the first A's pitcher with at least two hits and a RBI since Blue Moon Odom went 2 for 2 with a RBI Aug. 22, 1972 at Detroit...tossed a career-high 118 pitches in a no decision in the A's 4-1 loss at Chicago (AL) June 8...that ran his record to 6-5 with a 3.69 ERA and .249 opponents batting average over his first 13 starts...was 9-9 with a 4.39 ERA in 22 starts when he was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento Aug. 3...made two starts with the River Cats and had no decisions, a 1.74 ERA and .348 opponents batting average before returning to Oakland Aug. 18...tossed a rain-shortened five-inning complete game in his second start Aug. 27 at Detroit, a 6-3 Oakland win that was called with the A's batting in the top of the sixth...it matched the shortest complete game in Oakland history...was 1-0 with a 2.79 ERA in two starts before he was optioned to Single-A Stockton Aug. 28...returned to Oakland Sept. 3 after Stockton's season ended and went 2-0 with a 2.70 ERA in four games, including two starts...finished the season with a three-game winning streak over his final six games beginning Aug. 18, logging a 2.74 ERA and .228 opponents batting average...began his career with 60 consecutive starts before making the first relief appearance of his career Sept. 11 at Minnesota (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 so)...made an emergency start Sept. 15 at Texas, replacing an ill Jarrod Parker, and allowed one run in 5.0 innings for the win...tossed 2.0 perfect innings of relief against Minnesota Sept. 20 and then started and won three days later at Los Angeles (AL)...both of his September starts came on three days rest or fewer...the last A's pitcher to make two such starts in a season was John Halama in 2003.

FRIDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (2-0, 0.95 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Has allowed one earned run or fewer in each of his first three starts for a 0.95 ERA...ranks **sixth** in the American League in ERA...has won two of those starts to extend his winning streak to five games dating back to September 11 of last year, an on-going career high...is 5-0 with a 2.03 ERA (9 er in 40.0 ip) over that seven-start stretch.

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed all four of his runs this year over the first three innings of a game...last year, he yielded 20 of his 22 runs over the first three innings of a game...in his career, he has a 4.38 ERA (19 er in 39.0 ip), .278 (44 for 158) opponents batting average and four home runs allowed in innings one through three compared to a 0.41 ERA (2 er in 44.0 ip), .152 (23 for 151) opponents average and no home runs from the fourth inning on...has not allowed a run after the fifth inning (21.2 ip).

THE WEST AND THE REST: Defeated Seattle in each of his last two starts after a no decision against Cleveland in his first start...is now 4-1 with a 1.29 ERA (7 er in 49.0 ip) in eight career games against American League West competition compared to 3-2 with a 7.71 ERA (14 er in 34.0 ip) in seven games against everyone else.

THIS AND THAT: Has not allowed a home run over his first three starts and has yielded just four home runs in 83.0 career innings (0.43 per nine innings)...has issued six of his seven walks this year and 21 of his 27 in his career to left-handed hitters...the A's are 2-1 (.667) in his starting assignments this year and are 8-5 (.615) when he starts in his career...has tossed at least six innings in nine of his 13 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer nine times.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss to Cleveland on Opening Night March 31...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...allowed five hits while walking a career-high tying three...retired the side in order just once, the third inning...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom).

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 win over Seattle April 6 in Oakland...did not allow a run in the first inning to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings (previous: 13.0, August 10-20, 2013)...was charged with two unearned runs in the second inning (Barton error) when he allowed RBI singles to Almonte and Miller...also allowed a RBI single to Smoak in the third to give the Mariners a 3-0 lead but the A's tied the game on a Moss three-run homer in the bottom of the third...retired 11 of the final 12 batters he faced, including each of the last seven, and the A's scored twice in the fifth to take the lead for good.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 win at Seattle last Saturday...struck out a career-high tying nine batters...allowed back-to-back singles to Almonte and Miller to start the game before retiring 11 straight...Almonte scored on a Cano ground out, but that would be the only run he would allow in seven innings...blanked the Mariners on three hits and two walks over his final six innings.

2013 RECAP: Spent most of the season at Triple-A Sacramento where he was 10-7 with a 3.42 ERA in 20 starts...also had two stints with the A's...after making two relief appearances in his Major League debut in July, he returned to Oakland Aug. 10 and finished the season in the starting rotation...was 5-3 with a 2.67 ERA in 12 games, 10 starts, with the A's...also went 0-1 with a 2.08 ERA in two ALDS starts against Detroit...based upon a minimum of 60 innings pitched, he had the lowest opponents on-base percentage among American League rookies (.272), ranked second in opponents batting average (.214) and slugging percentage (.298) and third in ERA...struck out 67 batters in 64.0 innings and his average of 9.42 strikeouts per nine innings was second best (Allen, CLE 11.26)...walked 20 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.35...went 4-1 with a 2.27 ERA and .230 opponents batting average over his final six starts...won each of his final three decisions beginning Sept. 11, the first time he put together consecutive wins in his career...had surgery for a fractured left thumb following the season...the surgery, an internal fixation with a screw to repair the thumb fracture, was performed by Dr. Thomas Graham at the Cleveland Clinic Hospital Oct. 18.

2-0: Has started the season 2-0 for the second time in his career (also 2009)...has never started the season 3-0...is **red tied for fourth** in the American League in wins and ranks **ninth** in ERA (1.40)...is now 4-0 with a 1.11 ERA (4 er in 32.1 ip) over his last five starts dating back to September 28, 2013.

LAST 21 STARTS: Has not allowed a run in two of his three starts this year and has yielded one run or fewer in 10 of his last 21 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...is 9-5 with a 2.80 ERA (38 er in 122.1 ip) over that span...has held the opposition to a .227 (105 for 463) batting average...has walked 28 (2.06 per nine innings) and struck out 126 in 122.1 innings (9.27 per nine innings) for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.50...has yielded just seven home runs (0.51 per nine innings).

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win over Cleveland in the day game April 2 against Cleveland...tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut.

SECOND START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-3 win at Minnesota April 7...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Hicks in the second...the A's scored three times in the third but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the third on a Kubel RBI double and a Suzuki RBI ground out...then retired 11 of the final 13 batters he faced.

LAST START: He combined with Abad, Otero, Gregerson and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Seattle last Sunday...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed two of the hits but had a no decision as the A's scored twice in the eighth and once in the ninth...retired each of the first 10 batters, allowed back to back singles to Miller and Cano with one out in the fourth, and then retired each of the final eight batters.

2013 RECAP: Went from the independent Atlantic League in 2012 to a key member of the Cleveland Indians rotation, going 10-9 with a 4.04 ERA in 29 starts...it was his sixth 10-win season but his first since 2009...his 29 starts were his most since 2007, as were his 158.0 innings pitched...walked 47 batters for an average of 2.68 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark of his career...his previous low was 3.24 in 2006...struck out 162, and his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.45 was also a career best...was one of a club-record tying three pitchers to fan 150 or more batters (Jimenez, Masterson)...averaged 9.23 strikeouts per nine innings...did not qualify for the league leaders but had the seventh best strikeout per nine inning ratio among American League pitchers with 150 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, he had the fifth highest run support average (6.27)...was 3-4 with a 5.89 ERA and .302 opponents batting average over his first 11 starts through June 15...then went 7-5 with a 3.06 ERA and .239 opponents average over his final 18 starts

- Made his professional debut at first base April 3 against Seattle and went 0 for 1 with two walks and an error.

YOENIS CÉSPEDES

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start March 31 against Cleveland (center field in 2012, left field in 2013-14)...is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers in left field since Ben Grieve in 1999-2000.

RYAN COOK

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring.

COCO CRISP

- Was on his 10th Opening Day roster and made his ninth career Opening Day start, his fourth straight with the A's.
- Hit his first career game-ending home run April 3 against Seattle...it was his sixth regular season "walk-off" RBI.

- Had a career-high 0 for 20 streak from April 2 to 6.

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.

LUKE GREGERSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

A.J. GRIFFIN

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a flexor muscle strain.

JOHN JASO

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year...that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).

JIM JOHNSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

JOSH LINDBLOM

- Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
