ABOUT THE A'S: Had their four-game winning streak snapped Wednesday night and are now 8-2 over the last 10 games...are the only team in the majors that has not lost back-to-back games this year...are 10-5 for the season, which is the best record in the American League and tied for second best in the majors...last year, the A's were 11-4 after 15 games (won game 16)...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the sixth consecutive day and are 1½ games ahead of second place Texas...have six days in sole possession of first place this year, one day tied for first, three days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...are 200-139 (.590) since the start of the 2012 season, which is tied with Atlanta for the best record in the majors over that span...it is eight games better than the next closest AL team (Texas, 193-148).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's went 7-2 on the first road trip of the season, a nine-game trip to Minnesota (3-0), Seattle (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...have the best road record in the American League and second best in the majors (Milwaukee, 6-1)...it marked the first time the A's have won the first three road series of the season since 1990...the A's 7-2 start matches the A's best start on the road over the last 24 years (also 2008)...begin their second homestand of the season tonight, a six-game stand against Houston (three games) and Texas (three games)...went 3-3 on the first homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Seattle (2-1).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost to the Angels 5-4 in 11 innings on Wednesday...have played back-to-back extra inning games and have four this year, which is tied with Los Angeles (AL) for the most in the majors...are 3-1 and lead the majors in extra inning wins...the loss was the A's first one-run loss of the season and all five of the A's losses have been by two runs or fewer...are the only team in the majors that has not lost a game by more than two runs...are 3-1 (.750) in one-run games, which is the second best record in the American League...seven of the A's first 15 games have been decided in the winning team's last at bat and the A's are 4-3 in those games...are tied with Texas for the most last at bat wins in the majors...only Chicago (AL), with eight, has more games decided in the last at bat...have five come from behind wins, which is tied for the most in the majors...are 3-2 when trailing after seven innings and the three wins are the most in the majors.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed three runs or fewer in 13 of the first 15 games...have a 2.48 ERA (25 er in 90.2 ip) for the season, which is the lowest mark in the American League and second lowest in the majors (Atlanta, 1.58)...have allowed six hits or fewer 13 times and have a .224 (78 for 348) opponents batting average, which is third lowest in the AL...have the lowest slugging percentage (.342) and the second lowest on-base percentage (.274)...have issued the second fewest walks (21) and rank fourth in strikeouts (85)...have two 30-year olds (Scott Kazmir and Jesse Chavez) in the starting rotation at the same time for the first time since April of 2010 (Ben Sheets, Justin Duchscherer).

PITCHING: The A's allowed 14 runs over the last two games of the road trip after allowing 17 runs over the first seven games...now have a 2.57 ERA for the season, which is the lowest mark in the American League and second lowest in the majors (Atlanta, 2.44)...have the lowest opponents batting average (.211) and on-base percentage (.269) in the majors and the second lowest slugging percentage (.316).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed an error in each of the last six games (nine errors total), which is their longest such streak over the last two years...have 14 errors for the season, which is third most in the American League...five of the errors have been committed by first basemen, which is two more than any other team...the errors have led to seven unearned runs, which is tied for third most in the AL.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 10 of their 11 (92.3%) stolen base attempts, which is tied for the third best percentage in the American League...opponents have been successful in each of their nine stolen bases attempts and the A's are one of two teams in the majors without a caught stealing (San Diego, 14 sb)

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .252 (92 for 365) with 54 runs scored over the last 10 games (5.4 runs per game) after hitting .214 with 14 runs over the first five contests (2.8 runs per game)...rank second in the American League in walks (68) and tied for third in triples (4)...have grounded into the second fewest double plays (8)...five of the A's 15 home runs have come in the ninth inning or later, which is the most in the majors...nine have come with runners on base and seven have put the A's ahead.

AGAINST LEFT-HANDERS: The A's are 2-1 in games started by a left-handed pitcher and the three games against lefties are tied for second fewest in the American League (Detroit, 1)...are batting .198 (23 for 116) against left-handed pitchers compared to .252 (105 for 417) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is the lowest in the AL and second lowest in the majors (St. Louis, .179).

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 6-1 in day games, which is tied with Milwaukee for the best record in the majors...are 4-4 in night games...are batting .265 (65 for 245) during the day compared to .219 (63 for 288) at night...have hit 10 of their 15 home runs during the day.

THIS AND THAT: The A's played 4 hours and 19 minutes on Wednesday night after playing 4:12 on Tuesday...it marked the first time the A's played back-to-back four hour games since Sept. 3-5, 1995 against New York (4:27) and Boston (4:27)...are 8-0 when outthomer the opposition...are 4-2 during this stretch of 19 consecutive games against American League West competition (April 11-30)...have not used a rookie, marking their longest stretch without a rookie on the roster since 2006 when they had no rookies for the first 36 days of the season (April 3-May 8).

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have five players under contract beyond the 2014 season...Yoenis Céspedes, Scott Kazmir and Eric O'Flaherty are signed through 2015, Coco Crisp is signed through 2016 with a vesting option for 2017 and Sean Doolittle is signed through 2018 with club options for 2019 and 2020...Nick Punto has a vesting option for 2015 and minor leaguer Hirofumi Nakajima has a club option for 2015.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's won the season series last year, 15-4...the 15 wins tied for third most in Oakland history against one team and were the most since going 17-2 against Seattle in 2006...went 8-1 in Houston and 7-3 in Oakland...have won all three season series against the Astros and lead the all-time series, 20-5...that is the **best record by a Major League club against another club** among teams that have played each other 20 or more times...**all five of the A's losses to Houston have been by one run**...are 10-3 in Oakland and 10-2 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yoenis Céspedes has a 12-game hitting streak against Houston dating back to May 24 of last year (19 for 49, .388)...**Coco Crisp** stole his 145th base as an Athletic Wednesday, which moves him past Reggie Jackson for fifth in Oakland history...Carney Lansford is fourth with 146...has a 145-game errorless streak, which is fifth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...**Josh Donaldson** has a 10-game hitting streak (16 for 48, .333), which is the second longest of his career (11, Sept. 3-15, 2013)...**Sean Doolittle** has 8.2 innings pitched, which are tied for the most among American League relievers that have not issued a walk...**Luke Gregerson** has appeared in nine games, which is the most in the AL...has pitched in 372 games since 2009, which is the most in the majors over that span...**Jed Lowrie** has back-to-back three-hit games for the third time in his career and back-to-back two-double games for the second time...leads the American League and is tied for third in the majors in on-base percentage (.477)...**Dan Otero** has not allowed a home run in 59.1 career innings.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1970** Don Mincher homers twice and drives in all five Oakland runs, but the A's lose 11-5 to Minnesota...in **1981** Brian Kingman tosses a six-hit shutout in the A's 8-0 win over Seattle as the A's improve to 10-0...in **2003** Barry Zito tosses a six-hit shutout to defeat Texas, 9-0.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (2-0, 0.95 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Has allowed one earned run or fewer in each of his first three starts for a 0.95 ERA...ranks fifth in the American League in ERA...has won two of those starts to extend his winning streak to five games dating back to September 11 of last year, an on-going career high...is 5-0 with a 2.03 ERA (9 er in 40.0 ip) over that seven-start stretch.

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed all four of his runs this year over the first three innings of a game...last year, he yielded 20 of his 22 runs over the first three innings of a game...in his career, he has a 4.38 ERA (19 er in 39.0 ip), .278 (44 for 158) opponents batting average and four home runs allowed in innings one through three compared to a 0.41 ERA (2 er in 44.0 ip), .152 (23 for 151) opponents average and no home runs from the fourth inning on...has not allowed a run after the fifth inning (21.2 ip).

THE WEST AND THE REST: Defeated Seattle in each of his last two starts after a no decision against Cleveland in his first start...is now 4-1 with a 1.29 ERA (7 er in 49.0 ip) in eight career games against American League West competition compared to 3-2 with a 3.71 ERA (14 er in 34.0 ip) in seven games against everyone else.

THIS AND THAT: Has not allowed a home run over his first three starts and has yielded just four home runs in 83.0 career innings (0.43 per nine innings)...has issued six of his seven walks this year and 21 of his 27 in his career to left-handed hitters...the A's are 2-1 (.667) in his starting assignments this year and are 8-5 (.615) when he starts in his career...has tossed at least six innings in nine of his 13 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer nine times.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss to Cleveland on Opening Night March 31...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...allowed five hits while walking a career-high tying three...retired the side in order just once, the third inning...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom).

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 win over Seattle April 6 in Oakland...did not allow a run in the first inning to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings (previous: 13.0, August 10-20, 2013)...was charged with two unearned runs in the second inning (Barton error) when he allowed RBI singles to Almonte and Miller...also allowed a RBI single to Smoak in the third to give the Mariners a 3-0 lead but the A's tied the game on a Moss three-run homer in the bottom of the third...retired 11 of the final 12 batters he faced, including each of the last seven, and the A's scored twice in the fifth to take the lead for good.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 win at Seattle last Saturday...struck out a career-high tying nine batters...allowed back-to-back singles to Almonte and Miller to start the game before retiring 11 straight...Almonte scored on a Cano ground out, but that would be the only run he would allow in seven innings...blanked the Mariners on three hits and two walks over his final six innings.

GRAY vs. HOUSTON: Is 1-1 with a 1.13 ERA (16.0 ip, 11 h, 3 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 16 so, 0 hr) in two career starts, both last year in Oakland...combined with Otero on a five-hit shutout in the A's 5-0 win on August 15 for his first Major League win...tossed 8.0 innings and allowed four hits while striking out nine...allowed only two base runners as far as second base...Corporan singled to start the seventh and went to second on a wild pitch and Villar doubled with one out in the eighth...then took the loss in a 3-2 decision on September 5...matched his career-high by tossing 8.0 innings...allowed a RBI single to Carter in the first...surrendered two more runs in the second inning on a Altuve RBI single and an error...retired 19 of the final 20 batters he faced, including each of the last 10.

THIS SPRING: Went 0-1 with a 3.48 ERA in six starts...allowed a .228 (18 for 79) opponents batting average...yielded just one home run in 20.2 innings...allowed just one earned run in 10.2 innings over his final two starts (0.84 ERA) after posting a 6.30 ERA over his first four starts...surrendered one run or fewer in four of his six starts.

2013 RECAP: Spent most of the season at Triple-A Sacramento where he was 10-7 with a 3.42 ERA in 20 starts...also had two stints with the A's...after making two relief appearances in his Major League debut in July, he returned to Oakland Aug. 10 and finished the season in the starting rotation...was 5-3 with a 2.67 ERA in 12 games, 10 starts, with the A's...also went 0-1 with a 2.08 ERA in two ALDS starts against Detroit...based upon a minimum of 60 innings pitched, he had the lowest opponents on-base percentage among American League rookies (.272), ranked second in opponents batting average (.214) and slugging percentage (.298) and third in ERA...struck out 67 batters in 64.0 innings and his average of 9.42 strikeouts per nine innings was second best (Allen, CLE 11.26)...walked 20 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.35...went 4-1 with a 2.27 ERA and .230 opponents batting average over his final six starts...won each of his final three decisions beginning Sept. 11, the first time he put together consecutive wins in his career...had surgery for a fractured left thumb following the season...the surgery, an internal fixation with a screw to repair the thumb fracture, was performed by Dr. Thomas Graham at the Cleveland Clinic Hospital Oct. 18.

HOME AND AWAY: Was 3-1 with a 1.99 ERA in six starts in Oakland compared to 2-2 with a 3.86 ERA in six games, four starts, on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .198 (20-for-101) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .226 (31-for-137) against left-handers...allowed a .194 opponents batting average to hitters leading off an inning...surrendered one double (.210 slugging percentage) and issued just four walks (.242 on-base percentage).

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Compiled a 5-3 record and a 2.85 ERA in his nine starts...did not allow a run in his two relief appearances (4.0 ip)...did not inherit a runner and retired both of his first batters faced in relief.

NIGHT AND DAY: Was 2-1 with a 1.72 ERA in seven games at night compared to 3-2 with a 3.95 ERA in five starts during the day.

DAYS REST: Was 3-1 with a 1.57 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more, 2-2 with a 4.02 ERA in five starts on four days rest.

RUN SUPPORT: Averaged 7.50 runs of support in his 10 starts.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Won a career-high 10 games with the River Cats...also finished with a career-high 118 strikeouts...the wins tied for fifth in the Pacific Coast League and the strikeouts tied for seventh...was also fourth in ERA (3.42) and tied for fifth in complete games (1)...led the league in strikeouts per nine innings (8.97)...ranked fourth in the A's farm system in ERA, tied for fifth in wins and sixth in strikeouts...was named the A's organization Minor League Pitcher of the year and was also a *Baseball America's* Triple-A All-Star...surrendered just five home runs in 118.1 innings, an average of 0.38 per nine innings...had a 4.74 ERA over the first three innings of a game, 1.54 from innings four through six and 6.23 from the seventh inning on.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Scott Kazmir (2-0, 1.40 ERA): Has started the season 2-0 for the second time in his career (also 2009) and is now 4-0 with a 1.11 ERA over his last four starts dating back to September 28, 2013...is 9-5 with a 2.80 ERA over his last 21 starts...opponents are 1 for 20 (.050) with no walks when leading off an inning and 1 for 13 (.077) with runners in scoring position...had a no decision in his last start when he combined with Abad, Otero, Gregerson and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Seattle last Sunday (6.0 ip, 2 h, 9 so)...is 1-1 with a 5.06 ERA in three career starts against Houston...went 1-0 with a 1.62 ERA in four starts during the spring...held the opposition to a .155 batting average and did not allow a home run in 16.2 innings...was signed by the A's as a free agent after going 10-9 with a 4.04 ERA in 29 starts with Cleveland in 2013.

- Its five wins overall are tied for the most in the American League (Texas).
- Was charged with its fifth blown save of the season Wednesday, which is tied for the most in the majors (Chicago-AL)...is 4 for 9 (44.4%) in saves, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL.
- Also ranks first in the AL in opponents batting average (.188) and third in innings pitched (53.0).

- Made his eighth appearance of the season Tuesday, which is tied for second-most in the AL (Gregerson, 9)...tied for 10th among AL relievers in innings pitched (8.2)...the innings pitched are second most among Major League relievers that have not issued a walk (Thornburg, MIL, 9.2 ip).

SATURDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (2-0, 1.40 ERA)

2-0: Has started the season 2-0 for the second time in his career (also 2009)...has never started the season 3-0...is **red tied for fourth** in the American League in wins and ranks **ninth** in ERA (1.40)...is now 4-0 with a 1.11 ERA (4 er in 32.1 ip) over his last five starts dating back to September 28, 2013.

LAST 21 STARTS: Has not allowed a run in two of his three starts this year and has yielded one run or fewer in 10 of his last 21 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...is 9-5 with a 2.80 ERA (38 er in 122.1 ip) over that span...has held the opposition to a .227 (105 for 463) batting average...has walked 28 (2.06 per nine innings) and struck out 126 in 122.1 innings (9.27 per nine innings) for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.50...has yielded just seven home runs (0.51 per nine innings).

2013 RECAP: Went from the independent Atlantic League in 2012 to a key member of the Cleveland Indians rotation, going 10-9 with a 4.04 ERA in 29 starts...it was his sixth 10-win season but his first since 2009...his 29 starts were his most since 2007, as were his 158.0 innings pitched...walked 47 batters for an average of 2.68 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark of his career...his previous low was 3.24 in 2006...struck out 162, and his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.45 was also a career best...was one of a club-record tying three pitchers to fan 150 or more batters (Jimenez, Masterson)...averaged 9.23 strikeouts per nine innings...did not qualify for the league leaders but had the seventh best strikeout per nine inning ratio among American League pitchers with 150 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, he had the fifth highest run support average (6.27)...was 3-4 with a 5.89 ERA and .302 opponents batting average over his first 11 starts through June 15...then went 7-5 with a 3.06 ERA and .239 opponents average over his final 18 starts

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .262 opponents batting average, including .226 (38-for-168) against left-handed hitters compared to .275 (124-for-451) against right-handers...surrendered 16 of his 19 home runs and issued 41 of his 47 walks to righties...13 of the 19 home runs were solo shots.

HOME AND AWAY: Was 7-2 with a 3.86 ERA in 14 starts at home compared to 3-7 with a 4.21 ERA in 15 starts on the road.

MORE 2013: Was a non-roster invitee with the Indians during the spring but was added to the roster and placed on the 15-day disabled list April 2 with a sprained right rib cage...made one rehab start at Triple-A Columbus April 15 and was the winning pitcher in the Clippers 4-1 win over Louisville (5.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 5 so)...was reinstated from the DL April 20 and allowed a season-high six runs in 3.1 innings in his first start that day against Houston...ended up with a no decision in the Indians 19-6 win...allowed two runs in 6.0 innings May 4 against Minnesota for his first win of the season...it was his first Major League win since Sept. 19, 2010...went 3-0 with a 1.45 ERA in five starts against the Twins in 2013...struck out 10 batters in 6.0 innings May 9 against Oakland, his first of four 10-strikeout games...tossed a season-high 111 pitches June 4 at New York (AL)...had a season-high four-game winning streak from June 21 to Aug. 4...compiled a 1.93 ERA and .173 opponents batting average over that nine-start stretch...tossed a season-high 8.0 innings July 24 at Seattle, allowing one unearned run on one hit for the win...it was his longest outing since June 6, 2008...went 2-0 with a 2.75 ERA and .198 opponents batting average in six starts in July...allowed just one home run in 36.0 innings...singled Aug. 4 at Miami, his second career hit...went 1-for-4 at the plate in 2013...went 3-2 with a 2.57 ERA in five starts in September...struck out 43 batters in 28 innings and walked just four...ranked fourth in the AL in strikeouts in September...had three 10-strikeout games in the month, including Sept. 6 against New York (NL) when he fanned a season-high 12 in 6.0 shutout innings...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the second pitcher in Cleveland history to have that many strikeouts in a game in which he pitched no more than six innings (Sam McDowell vs. Detroit, Sept. 18, 1966)...did not walk a batter and became the first Major League pitcher with a scoreless outing of 6.0 innings or fewer with at least 12 strikeouts and no walks since Texas' Matt Perisho Oct. 3, 1999 at Anaheim...finished the season with back-to-back 10-strikeout games, fanning 10 Sept. 21 against Houston and 11 Sept. 28 at Minnesota...won both starts to become the first Indian to win consecutive starts with 10 or more strikeouts since Chuck Finley in April, 2000.

SUNDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (0-0, 1.35 ERA)

FIRST THREE STARTS: Has allowed one earned run in each of his first three starts and has a 1.35 ERA, which ranks **sixth** in the American League...that marks the fifth time in Oakland history a starting pitcher on the Opening Day roster has began the season by allowing one earned run or fewer in each of his first three starts (Johnson, 1978; Keough 1980 and 81; Hudson, 2002; Gonzalez, 2011)...since 1914, no Athletics pitcher has done it in four straight starts...prior to this year, had made just two career starts, both with Toronto in 2012...had a loss and a 10.38 ERA in those two outings...is now 0-1 with a 4.08 ERA (13 er in 28.2 ip) in five career starts...had 54 career starts as a minor leaguer...made 23 starts over the previous two seasons after starting just once from 2005-11.

STRIKEOUTS AND WALKS: Has struck out nine batters and walked none in each of his last two starts...joins Dan Haren (August 21-26, 2007) as the only two Athletics pitchers since at least 1914 to strikeout nine or more in back-to-back starts without issuing a walk...has 22 strikeouts and just two walks for the season...is **tied for third** in the American League in strikeout to walk ratio (11.00), **tied for fourth** in strikeouts and ranks **sixth** in fewest walks per nine innings (0.90)

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 12-inning win over Seattle April 3 in Oakland...was charged with an unearned run in the first inning when Almonte reached on a Callaspo error, went to second on a Punto error, third on a Miller fly out and scored on a Cano ground out...also allowed a RBI single to Almonte in the fifth to make the score 2-0...the A's scored single runs in the fifth and eighth to tie the game.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-4, 11-inning win at Minnesota April 9...struck out a career-high nine in a career-high 7.0 innings...the A's scored four times in the first inning and he allowed a solo home run to Kubel to lead off the second...that was the only run he would allow in his seven innings and he was relieved by Doolittle to start the eighth with a 4-1 lead...Doolittle allowed a run in the eighth and Johnson two in the ninth.

LAST START: Had his third consecutive no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Los Angeles (AL) last Monday...matched his career high with nine strikeouts and 7.0 innings pitched for the second consecutive start...allowed an unearned run in the first inning when Calhoun singled, went to second on a passed ball and scored on a Pujols single...allowed a solo home run to Pujols in the third and left after seven innings trailing 2-1.

2013 RECAP: Spent most of the season with the A's and was 2-4 with a save and a career-low 3.92 ERA in 35 games over two stints...the save was the first of his career and he also struck out a career-high 55 batters...also had career lows in opponents batting average (.230), on-base percentage (.302) and slugging percentage (.318)...matched his career highs in wild pitches (5) and hit batters (3)...surrendered just three home runs in 57.1 innings, an average of 0.47 per nine innings...entered the season with 34 home runs in 177.1 career innings (1.73 per nine innings).

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Had a 2.97 ERA and .210 opponents batting average in 18 games before the All-Star Break...then compiled a 5.25 ERA and .258 opponents average in 17 games after the break.

2013 WITH SACRAMENTO: Was used exclusively as a starter with Sacramento and went 2-2 with a 2.70 ERA in five starts...allowed just one home run in 30.0 innings...walked five batters, an average of 1.50 per nine innings...struck out 26 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 5.20...yielded a .285 opponents batting average, including .240 (18-for-75) against right-handed hitters compared to .354 (17-for-48) against left-handers...went 1-1 with a 2.45 ERA in three starts before he was called up by Oakland the first time April 20...that included a season-high nine strikeout game for his first win, April 15 at Reno...logged a 1-1 record and a 3.09 ERA in two starts during his second stay with the River Cats from April 29 to May 9.

2013 RECAP: Had five stints with Oakland in 2013 and was 10-8 with a 3.96 ERA in 27 starts...led American League rookies in games started, innings pitched (152.1) and strikeouts (124) and tied for the lead in wins (Perez, TEX)...is the 11th rookie in Oakland history to win 10 or more games, the fifth in the last five years (Anderson, Cahill, Milone, Parker)...had the sixth most strikeouts by an Oakland rookie...went 1-2 with a 7.27 ERA and .257 opponents batting average over his first five starts, 5-0 with a 2.83 ERA and .196 opponents average over his next nine starts from May 21 to July 9, 0-5 with a 5.20 ERA and .299 opponents over his next seven starts from July 20 to Aug. 23 and 4-1 with a 2.00 ERA and .195 opponents average over his final six starts
