THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY: April 18

1998 - Sean Berry hits a walk-off solo homer in the bottom of the 9th for a 4-3 Astros win over the Expos... Craig Biggio breaks Cesar Cedeno's franchise record by scoring his 891st career run in the win.

1966 - Houston plays the first Major League game on artificial turf in the Astrodome...Dodgers' pitcher Don Sutton earns his first career win in the 6-3 victory over the Astros.

the first of a six-game, west coast road trip for the Astros as they take on the A's in Oakland (Fri-Sun) and the Mariners in Seattle (Mon-Wed).

ROAD WARRIORS: The Astros are in the midst of a stretch that will see them play 12 of 15 games on the road between April 8-23...the club recently had a quick, three-game home series against the Royals that came after a six-game road trip in Toronto (1-2) and Texas (1-2).

TONIGHT'S GAME: RHP Jarred Cosart (1-1) will make his fourth start of the season as he goes up against the A's and RHP Sonny Gray (2-0)...Cosart has faced the Athletics twice in his career...both outings were quality starts and resulted in Astros wins...has allowed just one earned run in 13.0 total innings against the club (0.69 ERA).

YOUNG GUNS: Tonight's starting pitching matchup includes two of the top young pitchers in baseball...since his MLB debut on 7/12/13, Cosart (23) ranks sixth in the American League in ERA, while Gray (24) ranks fourth (min. 60IP). AL ERA leaders since 7/12/13:

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP: The Astros were defeated by the Royals in the series finale last night by a score of 5-1...RHP Scott Feldman (2-1) suffered his first loss of the year after allowing four earned runs in 6.0 innings...RHP Anthony Bass (0ER/3.0IP) was perfect over the final three frames of the game...RF George Springer (1x4) recorded his second career Major League hit in his second MLB game while 3B Matt Dominguez (1x3) pushed his career and team-high hitting streak to seven games.

ULTIMATE WAR-RIOR: Despite receiving his first loss of the year last night, RHP Scott Feldman currently ranks third among all AL players in WAR according to Baseball-Reference with a 1.2 mark...ahead of Feldman are RHPYu Darvish (1.3) and **SS Alexei Ramirez** (1.2).

START ME UP: Astros starters have posted a combined 3.00 ERA (15ER/45IP) in their last seven games...for the season, Astros starters have posted a 3.87 ERA (40ER/93IP) in 16 games with a .233 opponents' batting average, which ranks sixth in the AL.

STANDING TALL: 2B Jose Altuve has not made an error in his last 51 games and 239 total chances (last error was on 8/16/13 at LAA)... since 7/9/13, he has made just one error in 79 games and 368 TC for a .997 fielding percentage, which is tops in the Majors in that span among second basemen.

STEADY UP THE MIDDLE: Among qualifying players, Altuve and SS Jonathan Villar are the only second base-shortstop combo in the Majors this season that has not committed an error (143 combined total chances).

GOING BACK TO CALI: The Astros are 5-20 all-time vs. the A's...they were 4-15 vs. Oakland in 2013 (3-7 at O.co Coliseum).

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Tonight's game marks CATCHING ON: Since 2013, Castro Valley, CAnative and Stanford grad Iason Castro leads all MLB catchers in slugging (.515) and on-base percentage (.362)...ranks third in home runs (19) among AL catchers over that span...his OPS as a catcher is .877 since 2013.

> ROSTER MOVE: The Astros selected LHP Raul Valdes from Triple A Oklahoma City yesterday and optioned LHP Kevin Chapman to OKC.

> **DYNAMIC DUO:** Since July 12,2013, RHP Jarred Cosart and LHP Brett Oberholtzer have a combined ERA of 2.47 (44ER/160.1IP), which is tops in the AL for teammates in that span (min. 75 IP)...Tigers RHP Anibal Sanchez and RHP Max Scherzer are second with a 2.52 ERA (60ER/214.2IP) in that span.

> THE MAGIC NUMBER FOUR: The Astros are 4-1 when they score four or more runs this season.

> CLOSE CALLS: Six of the Astros last seven games have been decided by two runs or less (three one-run contests)...they are 2-4 in those games.

> GOIN' DEEP: The Astros are tied for third in the AL in homers with 18...they are 5-4 in games that they homer in this season, and 0-7 when they do not homer.

THROWING SOME LEATHER: As a club, the Astros rank 4th in the Majors and 2nd in the AL in fielding pct. with a .991 mark (6 E, 639 TC).

Highest fielding percentage in the AL: 1. Baltimore - .994 2. Houston - .991

GROUND CONTROL: The Astros pitching staff ranks first in the American League and second in the Majors in ground ball to fly ball ratio with a 2.00 mark...Jarred Cosart (2.54), Dallas Keuchel (2.29) and Scott Feldman (2.14) all rank among the AL's top 12 pitchers in GB/FB ratio... since 1987 (the year the stat was first tracked), the Astros have never had more than two starters post groundball to fly ball ratios higher than 2.00 for a full season.

YOUNGBLOODS: The Astros currently have the youngest roster in the Majors, averaging 27.2 years old...they are followed by MIA (27.4) and ATL (27.4).

MINOR SUCCESS: In 2014, the Astros minor league clubs have a combined record of 35-22 (.614), which ranks third among all organizations...the Astros combined minor league record over the past two seasons (2012-13) was tops among all organizations (were last in 2010-11)

- LAST APP 4/12 at TEX: tossed 7.0 frames, allowing 3 runs on 6 hits in the Astros 6-5 win in 10 innings...was in line for the victory after the 7th inning when the Astros led 5-3...ended with a no decision after the bullpen couldn't hold.
- recorded a career-high 8 strikeouts in his 7.0 innings of work... his previous MLB high was 5, set on 9/3/13 vs. MIN (4ER/4IP)... that game also marked the only other start in his career that he's posted more strikeouts than innings pitched.
- ABOUT COSART: hard-throwing, 23-year old right-hander was named the Astros No. 2 starter this Spring, marking his first appearance on an Opening Day roster.
- has allowed just a .197 (13x66) opponent's batting average and 3 extra-base hits in his 3 starts this season...among pitchers to throw at least 15 innings this season, Cosart has allowed just 1 more extra-base hit than the league leaders (Kyle Gibson-MIN, Jake Odorizzi-TB).
- PITCHER'S DUEL: since Cosart's MLB debut on 7/12/13, his 2.42 ERA ranks 6th in the AL (min. 75IP)...his mound opponent tonight is RHP Sonny Gray (2.33 ERA), who ranks 4th in the AL since that date.
- DYNAMIC DUO: since 7/12/13, has teamed up with LHP Brett Oberholtzer to combine for a 2.48 ERA (44ER/160IP), which ranks as the lowest combined ERA among current AL teammates (min. 75IP for both pitchers)...the two immediately rank ahead of Anibal Sanchez and Max Scherzer in that time frame, who have posted a 2.52 ERA (60ER/214.2IP).
- THIS SPRING: posted a 4.50 ERA (6ER/12IP) while striking out 16 and walking 5 over 4 Spring Training starts...tossed 5.0 perfect innings in his final official appearance in Spring Training on 3/19 while facing the majority of the Nationals Opening Day lineup... fanned 9 hitters in those 5.0 innings.
- IN 2013: went 1-1 with a 1.95 ERA (13ER/60IP) in 10 starts last season en route to getting named the Astros Rookie of the Year by the Houston Chapter of the BBWAA.
- from the date of his big league debut on 7/12/13 thru the end of the 2013 season, led the American League in ERA.
- led all Major League rookies in ERA and finished 4th with a .220 $\,$ opponent's batting average (min. 10 starts).
- did not allow a homer in his first 44.0 MLB innings, which was the longest streak by a Houston pitcher to start their MLB career since RHP Brad Lidge went 54.1 innings from 2002-03 (Elias).
- BRINGING THE HEAT: according to PITCHf/x, averaged 94.5 mph on his cutter in 2013, which led all Major League starters who threw at least 60.0 innings.
- vs. OAK: has 2 quality starts in 2 tries opposite the A's in his career, which both resulted in Astros wins...tossed 6.0 scoreless innings in his last start opposite the A's on 8/14 at OAK.
- has gone 6+ innings and has not allowed more than 1 earned run in his 1st 2 starts opposite the A's...the last pitcher to do this over their 1st 3 starts against Oakland was LHP Cliff Lee from 5/28/04-5/27/05.
- I'M COMING HOME: the League City, TX native was acquired by the Astros from the Phillies on 7/29/11 along with 1B Jon Singleton (MLB.com's #1 overall first base prospect), RHP Josh Zeid (3.90 ERA in 25g w/HOU in 2013) and a PTBNL (OF Domingo Santana - HOU's No.8 prospect per MLB.com) in exchange for **OF Hunter Pence**.
- originally drafted by Philadelphia in the 38th round of the 2008 draft...is a 2008 graduate of Clear Creek HS (TX) and became the 4th Texas-born pitcher to make his MLB debut as a starting pitcher for the Astros (Elias)...also Troy Patton (8/25/07 vs. PIT), Butch Henry (4/9/92 vs. CIN) and Bill Greif (7/19/71 vs. PHI).

- 7.0 innings and allowing 1 run on 5 hits...recorded a careerhigh 7 strikeouts, while tossing only 89 pitches...received the loss in the Astros 1-0 defeat to the Rangers.
- ABOUT OBERHOLTZER: 24-year-old southpaw was named the Astros No. 3 starter this Spring...tomorrow will be his 4th start of the season and his 3rd consecutive on the road.
- since joining Houston's rotation on 7/31/13, has posted a 2.51 ERA (23ER/82.1IP) in 13 starts...he currently ranks 2nd in the AL and 7th in MLB in ERA over that time frame (min. 80 IP).
- has lasted 5.0 or more innings in each of his first 13 career ML starts...that streak ranks 2nd in franchise history to RHP Mark Lemongello's streak of lasting 5.0 or more innings in his 1st 14 ML starts...Oberholtzer's streak is the longest by a LHP in franchise history.
- THIS SPRING: went 0-2 and gave up 11 earned runs in 9.0 innings this Spring (3 apps/2 starts).
- IN 2013: was dominant as a starter in 2013...after joining Houston's rotation on 7/31, his 2.24 ERA (16ER/64.1IP) in 10 starts ranked 2nd in the American League behind U. Jimenez (1.92).
- became the 1st Astros rookie to throw 2 complete games in the same season since Roy Oswalt in 2001 (3 CG).
- IN CONTROL: showed excellent control during his rookie campaign with Houston...posted a 1.82 walks per 9.0 innings ratio (13BB/64.1IP) in his starts, which ranked 5th in the AL after his move to the rotation on 7/31.
- vs. OAK: made his 1 career start against the A's on 9/7/13 at OAK and received the loss despite allowing just 1 run in 6.0 innings...Houston lost that game, 2-1.
