ABOUT THE A'S: Have won five of the last six games and nine of the last 11...are 11-5 for the season, which is the best record in the American League and tied for second best in the majors...last year, the A's were 12-4 after 16 games...with a win today, the A's would match their best record after 17 games

over the last 33 years (1990, 2013)...it would tie for the third best record after 17 games in Oakland history...are the only team in the majors that has not lost back-to-back games this year...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the seventh consecutive day and are 1½ games ahead of second place Texas...have eight days in sole possession of first place this year, one day tied for first, three days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...are 201-139 (.591) since the start of the 2012 season, which is tied with Atlanta for the best record in the majors over that span...it is eight games better than the next closest AL team (Texas, 194-148).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed three runs or fewer in 14 of the first 16 games...have a 2.61 ERA (28 er in 96.2 ip) for the season, which is the second lowest mark in the American League (Kansas City, 2.49)...have allowed six hits or fewer 13 times and have a .232 (87 for 375) opponents batting average, which is third lowest in the AL...have the lowest slugging percentage (.344) and the second lowest walks (23)...have two 30-year olds (Scott Kazmir and Jesse Chavez) in the starting rotation at the same time for the first time since April of 2010 (Ben Sheets, Justin Duchscherer).

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.59 ERA, which is the lowest mark in the American League and second lowest in the majors (Atlanta, 2.28)...have the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the majors (.273), the second lowest slugging percentage (.314) and the fourth lowest batting average (.215).

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 10 of their 11 (92.3%) stolen base attempts, which is tied for the third best percentage in the American League...opponents have been successful in each of their 10 stolen bases attempts and the A's are one of two teams in the majors without a caught stealing (San Diego, 17 sb).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed two errors in each of the last two games and have made at least one error in each of the last seven contests (11 errors total)...that is their longest streak of consecutive games with an error since a nine-game streak from June 9-18, 2011...have 16 errors for the season, which is tied with Cleveland for the most in the American League...five of the errors have been committed by first basemen, which is two more than any other team...the errors have led to seven unearned runs, which is tied for fourth most in the AL..have turned just six double plays, which is tied with Kansas City for the fewest in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's hit a season high four home runs last night and now have 19 for the season, which ranks third in the American League...three of the home runs last night came with runners on base as have 12 for the season, which is second most in the AL (Los Angeles, 16)...seven have put the A's ahead and five have come in the ninth inning or later...the A's are batting .256 (102 for 398) with 65 runs scored over the last 11 games (5.91 runs per game) after hitting .214 with 14 runs over the first five contests (2.80 runs per game)...rank second in the AL in walks (78) and are fourth in runs scored (79)...are tied for the second fewest grounded into double plays (9).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 1-0 on this six-game homestand against Houston (1-0) and Texas (three games)...went 3-3 on the first homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Seattle (2-1) and are 4-3 at home for the season...went 7-2 on the first road trip, a nine-game trip to Minnesota (3-0), Seattle (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...have the best road record in the American League and second best in the majors (Milwaukee, 7-1)...this marks the first time the A's have won the first three road series of the season since 1990...the A's 7-2 start matches the A's best start on the road over the last 24 years (also 2008).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 3-1 in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning wins and are tied for the lead in extra inning games...are 3-1 (.750) in one-run games, which is the second best record in the American League...all five of the A's losses have been by two runs or fewer and the A's are the only team in the majors that has not lost a game by more than two runs...seven of the A's first 16 games have been decided in the winning team's last at bat and the A's are 4-3 in those games...are tied with Texas for the most last at bat wins in the majors...only Chicago (AL), with eight, has more games decided in the majors...are 3-2 when trailing after seven innings and the three wins are the most in the majors.

AGAINST LEFT-HANDERS: The A's are 2-1 in games started by a left-handed pitcher and the three games against lefties are tied for second fewest in the American League (Detroit, 1)...are batting .202 (24 for 119) against left-handed pitchers compared to .255 (114 for 447) against right-handers...the mark against lefties is the lowest in the AL and third lowest in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 6-1 in day games, which is tied with Milwaukee for the best record in the majors...the A's played 4 hours and 19 minutes on Wednesday night after playing 4:12 on Tuesday...it marked the first time the A's played back-to-back four hour games since Sept. 3-5, 1995 against New York (4:27) and Boston (4:27)...the average time of game over the first 16 games is 3 hours and 18 minutes...are 9-0 when outhomering the opposition...are 5-2 during this stretch of 19 consecutive games against American League West competition (April 11-30) and are 7-3 against the West for the season...have not used a rookie, marking their longest stretch without a rookie on the roster since 2006 when they had no rookies for the first 36 days of the season (April 3-May 8).

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have five players under contract beyond the 2014 season...Yoenis Céspedes, Scott Kazmir and Eric O'Flaherty are signed through 2015, Coco Crisp is signed through 2016 with a vesting option for 2017 and Sean Doolittle is signed through 2018 with club options for 2019 and 2020...Nick Punto has a vesting option for 2015 and minor leaguer Hiroyuki Nakajima has a club option for 2015.

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's won the first meeting of 2014 last night after winning the season series last year, 15-4...the 15 wins tied for third most in Oakland history against one team and were the most since going 17-2 against Seattle in 2006...went 8-1 in Houston and 7-3 in Oakland...have

won all three season series against the Astros and lead the all-time series, 21-5...that is the **best record by a Major League club against another club** among teams that have played each other 20 or more times...**all five of the A's losses to Houston have been by one run**...are 11-3 in Oakland and 10-2 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Yoenis Céspedes has a 13-game hitting streak against Houston dating back to May 24 of last year (22 for 53, .415)...Coco Crisp stole his 145th base as an Athletic Wednesday, which moves him past Reggie Jackson for fifth in Oakland history...Carney Lansford is fourth with 146...Sean Doolittle has 8.2 innings pitched, which are the most among American League relievers that have not issued a walk...Luke Gregerson has appeared in nine games, which is tied for the most in the AL...has pitched in 372 games since 2009, which is the most in the majors over that span...Dan Otero has not allowed a home run in 59.1 career innings.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1981** the A's defeat the Seattle Mariners 6-1 in the first game of a double header at the Coliseum to run their record to 11-0, a Major League record at the time...the Mariners won the second game of the twinbill to end the A's streak but Oakland won the next six to improve to 17-1...in **1986** Jose Rijo strikes out an Oakland record 16 batters in the A's 7-2 win at Seattle...Bill Mooneyham adds two in an inning of relief for a club record 18 for a nine inning game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (2-0, 1.40 ERA)

2-0: Has started the season 2-0 for the second time in his career (also 2009)...has never started the season 3-0...is tied for seventh in the American League in wins and ranks eighth in ERA (1.40)...is now 4-0 with a 1.11 ERA (4 er in 32.1 ip) over his last five starts dating back to September 28, 2013.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .159 opponents batting average, which is the lowest mark in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...opponents are 1 for 20 (.050) with no walks when leading off an inning and 1 for 13 (.077) with runners in scoring position...has issued all four of his walks to right-handed hitters.

LAST 21 STARTS: Has not allowed a run in two of his three starts this year and has yielded one run or fewer in 10 of his last 21 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...is 9-5 with a 2.80 ERA (38 er in 122.1 ip) over that span...has held the opposition to a .227 (105 for 463) batting average...has walked 28 (2.06 per nine innings) and struck out 126 in 122.1 innings (9.27 per nine innings) for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.50...has yielded just seven home runs (0.51 per nine innings).

DAY GAMES: Has made each of his first three starts this year during the day...last year, he went 5-2 with a 3.27 ERA in 10 starts during the day compared to 5-7 with a 4.46 ERA in 19 starts at night...is now 7-2 with a 2.78 ERA (23 er in 74.1 ip) in 13 starts during the day over the last two years.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win over Cleveland in the day game April 2 against Cleveland...tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut.

SECOND START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-3 win at Minnesota April 7...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Hicks in the second...the A's scored three times in the third but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the third on a Kubel RBI double and a Suzuki RBI ground out...then retired 11 of the final 13 batters he faced.

LAST START: He combined with Abad, Otero, Gregerson and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Seattle last Sunday...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed two of the hits but had a no decision as the A's scored twice in the eighth and once in the ninth...retired each of the first 10 batters, allowed back to back singles to Miller and Cano with one out in the fourth, and then retired each of the final eight batters.

KAZMIR vs. HOUSTON: Is 1-1 with a 5.06 ERA (16.0 ip, 16 h, 9 r, 9 er, 6 bb, 21 so, 4 hr) in three career starts...including 1-0 with a 5.23 ERA (10.1 ip, 12 h, 6 r, 6 er, 4 bb, 14 so) in two starts with Cleveland last year...had a no decision in a 19-6 win at Houston April 20...had a 14-0 lead when he allowed three runs in the bottom of the second, highlighted by a Barnes two-run homer...had a 15-3 lead when he allowed three more runs in the bottom of the second, highlighted three more runs in the bottom of the third on a Laird home run and a Cedeno two run single...left after 3.1 innings and did not get the win...then tossed 7.0 shutout innings for the win September 21 at Cleveland, a 4-1 victory...allowed just four hits and one walk while striking out 10...his other start came in 2008 at Houston.

THIS SPRING: Went 1-0 with a 1.62 ERA in four starts during the spring...held the opposition to a .155 (9 for 58) batting average...did not allow a home run in 16.2 innings...did not allow a run in three of his four starts...was scratched from his start March 17 against Chicago (NL) with left triceps stiffness.

2013 RECAP: Went from the independent Atlantic League in 2012 to a key member of the Cleveland Indians rotation, going 10-9 with a 4.04 ERA in 29 starts...it was his sixth 10-win season but his first since 2009...his 29 starts were his most since 2007, as were his 158.0 innings pitched...walked 47 batters for an average of 2.68 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark of his career...his previous low was 3.24 in 2006...struck out 162, and his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.45 was also a career best...was one of a club-record tying three pitchers to fan 150 or more batters (Jimenez, Masterson)...averaged 9.23 strikeouts per nine innings...did not qualify for the league leaders but had the seventh best strikeout per nine inning ratio among American League pitchers with 150 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, he had the fifth highest run support average (6.27)...was 3-4 with a 5.89 ERA and .302 opponents batting average over his first 11 starts through June 15...then went 7-5 with a 3.06 ERA and .239 opponents average over his final 18 starts

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .262 opponents batting average, including .226 (38-for-168) against left-handed hitters compared to .275 (124-for-451) against right-handers...surrendered 16 of his 19 home runs and issued 41 of his 47 walks to righties...13 of the 19 home runs were solo shots.

HOME AND AWAY: Was 7-2 with a 3.86 ERA in 14 starts at home compared to 3-7 with a 4.21 ERA in 15 starts on the road.

DAYS REST: Was 6-5 with a 3.55 ERA in 15 starts on four days rest, 4-4 with a 4.60 ERA in 14 starts on five days rest or more.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Compiled a mark of 5-4 and a 4.60 ERA in 16 starts before the All-Star Break...then went 5-5 with a 3.38 ERA in 13 starts after the break...his career numbers are 43-42 with a 4.66 ERA (349 er in 674.1 ip) in 119 starts before the break compared to 35-28 with a 3.41 ERA in 93 games, 92 starts, after the break.

THIS AND THAT: Was 3-1 with a 3.38 ERA in five interleague starts and is now 11-5 in 22 career interleague starts...committed three errors, which tied for second most among AL pitchers...the Indians were 15-14 (.517) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in 15 of his starts, allowed two runs or fewer 16 times and walked two batters or fewer six times.

MORE 2013: Was a non-roster invitee with the Indians during the spring but was added to the roster and placed on the 15-day disabled list April 2 with a sprained right rib cage ... made one rehab start at Triple-A Columbus April 15 and was the winning pitcher in the Clippers 4-1 win over Louisville (5.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 5 so)...was reinstated from the DL April 20...allowed two runs in 6.0 innings May 4 against Minnesota for his first win of the season ... it was his first Major League win since Sept. 19, 2010...struck out 10 batters in 6.0 innings May 9 against Oakland, his first of four 10-strikeout games...had a season-high fourgame winning streak from June 21 to Aug. 4...compiled a 1.93 ERA and .173 opponents batting average over that nine-start stretch...tossed a season-high 8.0 innings July 24 at Seattle, allowing one unearned run on one hit for the win...it was his longest outing since June 6, 2008...went 2-0 with a 2.75 ERA and .198 opponents batting average in six starts in July...allowed just one home run in 36.0 innings...went 3-2 with a 2.57 ERA in five starts in September...struck out 43 batters in 28 innings and walked just four...ranked fourth in the AL in strikeouts in September...had three 10-strikeout games in the month, including Sept. 6 against New York (NL) when he fanned a season-high 12 in 6.0 shutout innings...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the second pitcher in Cleveland history to have that many strikeouts in a game in which he pitched no more than six innings (Sam McDowell vs. Detroit, Sept. 18, 1966)...did not walk a batter and became the first Major League pitcher with a scoreless outing of 6.0 innings or fewer with at least 12 strikeouts and no walks since Texas' Matt Perisho Oct. 3, 1999 at Anaheim...finished the season with back-to-back 10-strikeout games, fanning 10 Sept. 21 against Houston and 11 Sept. 28 at Minnesota...won both starts to become the first Indian to win consecutive starts with 10 or more strikeouts since Chuck Finley in April, 2000.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Chavez (0-0, 1.35 ERA): Has allowed one earned run in each of his first three starts and has a 1.35 ERA, which ranks seventh in the American League...that marks the fifth time in Oakland history a starting pitcher on the Opening Day roster has began the season by allowing one earned run or fewer in each of his first three starts...prior to this year, had made just two career starts, both with Toronto in 2012...Has struck out nine batters and walked none in each of his last two starts...joins Dan Haren as the only two Athletics pitchers since at least 1914 to strikeout nine or more in back-to-back starts without issuing a walk...he had his third consecutive no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Los Angeles (AL) last Monday (7.0 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 1 er, 9 so)...matches his career-highs in innings and strikeouts for the second consecutive start...is 0-0 with a 0.92 ERA in 15 career appearances against Houston, all in relief...went 5-1 with a save and a 2.22 ERA in seven games, five starts, this spring...the five wins were the most in the majors and the most by an A's pitcher since spring win totals are available beginning in 1990...ranked second in the Cactus League in innings pitched (28.1), fourth in strikeouts (25) and eighth in ERA.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

TEAM

5-3, 2.57 ERA (16 er in 56.0 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 4-for-9 (44.4%)

- The A's bullpen has yielded just nine runs over the last 13 games (47.0 ip, 1.72 ERA) and now has a 2.57 ERA for the season, which is the second lowest in the American League.
- Bullpen has been credited with the decision in four of the A's last five games (3-1).
- Its five wins overall are tied for the most in the American League (Texas).
- Was charged with its fifth blown save of the season Wednesday, which is tied for the most in the majors (Chicago-AL)...is 4 for 9 (44.4%) in saves, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL.
- Also ranks first in the AL in opponents batting average (.184) and third in innings pitched (56.0).

- Has not allowed a run over his first seven outings (7.1 ip) and has struck out nine of the 25 batters he has faced...is one of 11 pitchers in the majors with at least seven innings pitched and no runs allowed.
- Last night was his first career outing against Houston.
- Compiled a 3.27 ERA and allowed a .205 batting average in a team-leading 11 appearances this spring...did not issue a walk in 11.0 innings while striking out 12.
- Has a 13-game losing streak dating back to April 9, 2011, which is the longest active losing streak in the majors.
- Was acquired from Washington for minor league infielder John Wooten, November 25, 2013.

Last Year: Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse and was 1-0 with a 1.06 ERA in 17 relief appearances...was promoted to Washington May 21 and went 0-3 with a 3.35 ERA in a career-high 39 relief appearances

- Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list April 7 and has pitched five times since then.
- Has not allowed a hit in 4.1 innings this season but has walked six batters.
- Has faced Houston 10 times in his career...recorded a win and a save in nine games against the Astros in 2013 (9.0 ip, 8 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 12 so, 2.00 era).
- Has a 1.37 ERA (4 er in 26.1 ip) in 25 career appearances in April.
- Was placed on the DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...had a two-game rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton April 3-5 (1.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 10.80 ERA).

SUNDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (0-0, 1.35 ERA)

FIRST THREE STARTS: Has allowed one earned run in each of his first three starts and has a 1.35 ERA, which ranks sixth in the American League...that marks the fifth time in Oakland history a starting pitcher on the Opening Day roster has began the season by allowing one earned run or fewer in each of his first three starts (Johnson, 1978; Keough 1980 and 81; Hudson, 2002; Gonzalez, 2011)...since 1914, no Athletics pitcher has done it in four straight starts...prior to this year, had made just two career starts, both with Toronto in 2012...had a loss and a 10.38 ERA in those two outings...is now 0-1 with a 4.08 ERA (13 er in 28.2 ip) in five career starts...had 54 career starts as a minor leaguer...made 23 starts over the previous two seasons after starting just once from 2005-11.

STRIKEOUTS AND WALKS: Has struck out nine batters and walked none in each of his last two starts...joins Dan Haren (August 21-26, 2007) as the only two Athletics pitchers since at least 1914 to strikeout nine or more in back-to-back starts without issuing a walk...has 22 strikeouts and just two walks for the season...is tied for third in the American League in strikeout to walk ratio (11.00), tied for fourth in strikeouts and ranks sixth in fewest walks per nine innings (0.90)

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 12-inning win over Seattle April 3 in Oakland...was charged with an unearned run in the first inning when Almonte reached on a Callaspo error, went to second on a Punto error, third on a Miller fly out and scored on a Cano ground out...also allowed a RBI single to Almonte in the fifth to make the score 2-0...the A's scored single runs in the fifth and eighth to tie the game.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-4, 11-inning win at Minnesota April 9...struck out a career-high nine in a career-high 7.0 innings...the A's scored four times in the first inning and he allowed a solo home run to Kubel to lead off the second...that was the only run he would allow in his seven innings and he was relieved by Doolittle to start the eighth with a 4-1 lead...Doolittle allowed a run in the eighth and Johnson two in the ninth.

2013 RECAP: Spent most of the season with the A's and was 2-4 with a save and a career-low 3.92 ERA in 35 games over two stints...the save was the first of his career and he also struck out a career-high 55 batters...also had career lows in opponents batting average (.230), on-base percentage (.302) and slugging percentage (.318)...matched his career highs in wild pitches (5) and hit batters (3)...surrendered just three home runs in 57.1 innings, an average of 0.47 per nine innings...entered the season with 34 home runs in 177.1 career innings (1.73 per nine innings).

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Had a 2.97 ERA and .210 opponents batting average in 18 games before the All-Star Break...then compiled a 5.25 ERA and .258 opponents average in 17 games after the break.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .212 (21-for-99) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .246 (29-for-118) against left-handers...yielded all three of his home runs to right-handers but issued 14 of his 20 walks to lefties...allowed a .167 batting average with runners in scoring position and two outs...had a .269 batting average over his first 15 pitches in a game, .193 after that...opponents hit .333 with a .418 on-base percentage when leading off an inning.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Opponents have reached base on an error twice with him pitching, which is tied for second most in the American League...that has led to three unearned runs, which is tied for third in the AL...last year, opponents reached base on an error 11 times with him pitching, which was the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors...that led to 11 unearned runs, which tied for second most in the AL...opponents have now reached base via error 24 times over the last three years, which is the most in the majors (Jordan Lyles, 23).

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-4 loss at Seattle April 11...allowed a RBI single to Cano in the first and two unearned runs in the second on errors by Donaldson and Lowrie...surrendered a two-run home run to Zunino in the sixth and left trailing 5-0...Hernandez shutout the A's three hits over the seven innings.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Wednesday...allowed a run in the third inning on a Trout RBI double, but the A's scored four times in the fourth to take a 4-1 lead...put the first two batters on base in the seventh inning and was relieved by Otero, who allowed both runners to score...Gregerson allowed a run in the ninth for the blown save.

2013 RECAP: Spent the first four months of the season in the starting rotation but split the final two months of the year between the bullpen, rotation and minor leagues...was 12-9 with a 4.14 ERA in 28 games, 26 starts...had a .258 opponents batting average and .301 on-base percentage, which were the lowest marks of his career...had career highs in ERA (4.14), walks (39) and home runs (25) and matched his high in extra base hits (59).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .247 (121-for-489) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .298 (39-for-131) against left-handers...surrendered 21 of his 25 home runs to righties, which tied for fourth most in the American League...18 of the home runs were solo shots and 14 came in the first two innings of a game...allowed a .216 batting average with runners in scoring position, which ranked eighth in the AL...opponents batted .299 with a .541 slugging percentage when leading off an inning...has allowed a .318 batting average and .554 slugging percentage in that situation in his career.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Was 12-9 with a 4.17 ERA and .261 opponents batting average in his 26 starts, 0-0 with a 3.00 ERA and .100 opponents average in his two relief appearances...did not inherit a runner in his two relief appearances and retired both of his first batters faced.

DIVISIONS AND INTERLEAGUE: Compiled a 3-1 record and a 1.98 ERA in eight games against AL Central teams...is now 9-2 with a 1.97 ERA (22 er in 100.2 ip) in 17 career appearances against the Central...was 3-1 despite a 5.68 ERA in five interleague starts...is now 4-1 with a 6.02 ERA (29 er in 43.1 ip) in eight interleague starts in his career.

RUN SUPPORT: Received just 10 runs of support in his nine losses (1.78 RSA)...has received just 22 runs of support in his 20 losses in three seasons with the A's (114.0 ip, 1.74 RSA)...has received no support 10 times over the last three years as a starter and one run of support eight times...went 11-1 with three runs of support or more in 2013 and is 20-3 in his career.

THIS AND THAT: The A's were 16-10 (.615) in his 26 starting assignments and are 36-23 (.611) in his career...his teams are 41-23 (.641) in his 64 career starts.

MORE 2013 WITH OAKLAND: Won each of his first three starts to become the first pitcher on an A's Opening Day roster to win each of his first three starts since Dave Stewart had six wins in his first six starts in 1990...that extended his winning streak to five games dating back to 2012...had never won more than two consecutive games in his career...matched his career-high with 10 strikeouts and did not walk a batter May 1 against Los Angeles (AL)...has three career 10-strikeout games and has not walked a batter in any of those contests...is the third A's pitcher since 1916 with three career games of 10 or more strikeouts and no walks...tossed a career-high 118 pitches in a no decision in the A's 4-1 loss at Chicago (AL) June 8...that ran his record to 6-5 with a 3.69 ERA and .249 opponents batting average over his first 13 starts...was 9-9 with a 4.39 ERA in 22 starts when he was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento Aug. 3...made two starts with the River Cats and had no decisions, a 1.74 ERA and .348 opponents batting average before returning to Oakland Aug. 18...tossed a rainshortened five-inning complete game in his second start Aug. 27 at Detroit...it matched the shortest complete game in Oakland history...was 1-0 with a 2.79 ERA in two starts before he was optioned to Single-A Stockton Aug. 28...returned to Oakland Sept. 3 after Stockton's season ended and went 2-0 with a 2.70 ERA in four games, including two starts...began his career with 60 consecutive starts before making the first relief appearance of his career Sept. 11 at Minnesota (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 so)...made an emergency start Sept. 15 at Texas, replacing an ill Jarrod Parker, and allowed one run in 5.0 innings for the win...tossed 2.0 perfect innings of relief against Minnesota Sept. 20 and then started and won three days later at Los Angeles (AL)...both of his September starts came on three days rest or fewer...the last A's pitcher to make two such starts in a season was John Halama in 2003.

• Had a career-high 0 for 20 streak from April 2 to 6.

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.

LUKE GREGERSON

· Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

A.J. GRIFFIN
