THIS DATE IN ASTROS HISTORY: April 19

1980 - I.R. Richard throws a one-hit shutout against the Dodgers in Los Angeles...Richard strikes out 12 batters in what was an Astros 2-0 victory...Cesar Cedeno (1x4) and Jose Cruz (1x4, RBI) record the only hits of the game for Houston.

1992 - The Astros tie a franchise record by walking just one batter in an extra innings shutout...starter Butch Henry kept the Padres scoreless over 9.0 innings, but the game went to extras as the Astros were also kept off the board...in the 11th inning, pinch hitter Pete Incaviglia records an RBI-single to propel Houston to the victory.

the second of a six-game, west coast road trip for the Astros as they take on the A's in Oakland (Fri-Sun) and the Mariners in Seattle (Mon-Wed).

ROAD WARRIORS: The Astros are in the midst of a stretch that will see them play 12 of 15 games on the road between April 8-23...the club recently had a quick, three-game home series against the Royals that came after a six-game road trip in Toronto (1-2) and Texas (1-2).

TODAY'S GAME: LHP Brett Oberholtzer (0-3) will make his fourth start of the season as he goes up against the A's and LHP Scott Kazmir (2-0)... will mark Oberholtzer's second career start op posite Oakland as he faced the club on 9/7/13 at the Coliseum and took the loss despite giving up just one run in 6.0 innings.

OBIE-WON: With last Sunday's start at TEX (7IP, 1ER), today's starter LHP Brett Oberholtzer has now posted a 2.51 ERA (23ER/82.1IP) in 13 starts since joining the Astros rotation on July 31 of last year...he currently ranks first in the AL in ERA over that span among southpaws (min. 80 IP) and second among all pitchers to Yu Darvish (2.43). Lowest ERA by AL LHP's (since 7/31/13):

Player ERA Brett Oberholtzer (HOU) 2.51 Jon Lester (BOS) 2.61 Martin Perez (TEX) 2.83

I GOT FIVE ON IT: Oberholtzer has lasted 5.0 or more innings in each of his first 13 career Major League starts...that streak ranks second in franchise history to RHP Mark Lemongello, who went 5.0+ innings in each of his first 14 Major League starts from 1976-77...Oberholtzer's streak is the longest by a left-handed pitcher in franchise history.

OB AND DK: In addition to going at least 5.0 innings in his first 13 starts, Oberholtzer has allowed four or fewer earned runs in each of those outings...the last Astros pticher to begin GROUND CONTROL: The Astros pitching staff his career by doing so was RHP Darryl Kile, who had a 14-start streak in 1991.

LAST NIGHT'S RECAP: Despite tying a season high with 10 hits, the Astros were defeated by the A's last night, 11-3...RHP Jarred Cosart (1-2) lasted just 0.1 of an inning, allowing 7 runs...2B Jose Altuve (2x5), CF Dexter Fowler (2x4, RBI), RF George Springer (2x5, RBI) and SS Jonathan Villar (2x4) all had multi-hit games...Springer recorded his first career RBI, stolen base and multi-hit game.

WELCOME TO THE SHOW: After getting selected from Triple A on Wednesday, OF George Springer has hit in each of his first three Major League games...the last Astro to record hits in his first three MLB contests was Jimmy Paredes in 2011...the last Houston player to go more than three games was **Jose Altuve**, who recorded hits in his first seven Major League games after debuting in 2011.

STANDING TALL: 2B Jose Altuve has not made an error in his last 52 games and 246 total chances (last error was on 8/16/13 at LAA)... since 7/9/13, he has made just one error in 80 games and $375\,\mathrm{TC}$ for a .997 fielding percentage, which is tops in the Majors in that span among second basemen.

THE MAGIC NUMBER FOUR: The Astros are 4-1 when they score four or more runs this season.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: Today's game marks STEADY UP THE MIDDLE: Among qualifying players, 2B Jose Altuve and SS Jonathan Villar are the only second base-shortstop combo in the Majors this season that has not committed an error (156 combined total chances).

> CATCHING ON: Since 2013, Castro Valley, CAnative and Stanford grad Jason Castro leads all MLB catchers in slugging (.515) and on-base percentage (.362)...ranks third in home runs (19) among AL catchers over that span...his OPS as a catcher is .877 since 2013.

> CHARTING THE HITS: Jose Altuve currently ranks second among American League second basemen in hits.

GOING BACK TO CALI: The Astros are 5-21 all-time vs. the A's...they were 4-15 vs. Oakland in 2013 (3-7 at O.co Coliseum).

CLOSE CALLS: Six of the Astros last eight games have been decided by two runs or less (three one-run contests)...they are 2-4 in those games.

GOIN' DEEP: The Astros are tied for fourth in the AL in homers with 18...they are 5-4 in games that they homer in this season, and 0-8 when they do not homer.

THROWING SOME LEATHER: As a club, the Astros rank second in the Majors in fielding percentage with a .991 mark (6 E, 674 TC).

ranks first in the AL and second in the Majors in ground ball to fly ball ratio with a 1.95 mark.. Jarred Cosart (2.43), Dallas Keuchel (2.29) and Scott Feldman (2.14) all rank among the AL's top 12 pitchers in GB/FB ratio...since 1987 (the year the stat was first tracked), the Astros have never had more than two starters post groundball to fly ball ratios higher than 2.00 for a full season.

YOUNGBLOODS: The Astros currently have the youngest roster in the Majors, averaging 27.2 years old...they are followed by MIA (27.4) and ATL (27.4).

ULTIMATE WAR-RIOR: Despite receiving his first loss of the year Thursday night, RHP Scott Feldman currently ranks third among all AL players in WAR according to Baseball-Reference with a 1.2 mark...ahead of Feldman are RHP Yu Darvish (1.3) and SS Alexei Ramirez (1.2).

LAST NIGHT IN THE MINORS: At Triple A Oklahoma City, **1B Jon Singleton** (3x5, HR, 2RBI) and C Max Stassi (2x5, HR, 2RBI) each homered... Singleton has six homers on the season which ranks tied for first in the Pacific Coast League... he ranks second in slugging (.762) to Dodgers prospect Joc Pederson (.800)...last year's second round pick, RHP Andrew Thurman, struck out eight and walked one over 4.1 innings of one-run ball at Class A Ouad Cities.

CAREER MLB SPLITS:

LAST APP - 4/13 at TEX: had his best start of the season, tossing 7.0 innings and allowing 1 run on 5 hits...recorded a career-high 7 strikeouts, while tossing only 89 pitches...received the loss in the Astros 1-0 defeat to the Rangers.

ABOUT OBIE: 24-year-old southpaw was named the Astros No. 3 starter this Spring...today will be his 4th start of the season and his 3rd consecutive on the road...is looking to snap a 7-game losing streak, which dates back 7 starts to 9/7/13.

- since joining Houston's rotation on 7/31/13, has posted a 2.51 ERA (23ER/82.1IP) in 13 starts...he currently ranks 2nd in the AL and 7th in MLB in ERA over that time frame (min. 80 IP).
- has allowed 4 or fewer earned runs in each of his 1st 13 career MLB starts...the last Astros pitcher to begin his career by doing so was RHP Darryl Kile, who had a 14-start streak in 1991... RHP J.R. Richard also had a 14-game run to begin his career from 9/5/71-8/20/73...RHP Chris Zachary owns the franchise record with a 25-game run to begin his career (1963-67).
- has lasted 5.0 or more innings in each of his first 13 career ML starts...that streak ranks second in franchise history to RHP Mark Lemongello's streak of lasting 5.0 or more innings in his 1st 14 ML starts...Oberholtzer's streak is the longest by a LHP in franchise history.
- **THIS SPRING:** went 0-2 and gave up 11 earned runs in 9.0 innings this Spring (3 apps/2 starts).
- IN 2013: was named the Astros Pitcher of the Year by the Houston Chapter of the BBWAA...posted a 4-5 record and a 2.76 ERA (22ER/71.2IP) in 13 games (10 starts) in his rookie season of 2013.
- as a starter, posted a 4-5 record and a 2.24 ERA (16ER/64.1IP)...after joining Houston's rotation on 7/31, his 2.24 ERA (16ER/64.1IP) in 10 starts ranked 2nd in the American League behind U. Jimenez (1.92).
- **IN CONTROL:** showed excellent control during his rookie campaign with Houston...posted a 1.82 walks per 9.0 innings ratio (13BB/64.1IP) in his starts, which ranked 5th in the AL after his move to the rotation on 7/31.
- allowed 2 walks or less in each of his first 8 Major League starts (7/31-9/14), which tied a franchise record.
- **ROOKIE RANKS:** his 3.46 strikeout to walk ratio in 2013 ranked 4th all-time in franchise history by a rookie for a single season (min. 50.0 IP).
- became the first Astros rookie to throw 2 complete games in the same season since Roy Oswalt in 2001 (3 CG).
- vs. OAK: made his 1 career start against the A's on 9/7/13 at OAK and received the loss despite allowing just 1 run in 6.0 innings... the only run allowed came on a solo homer by OF Yoenis Cespedes...Houston lost that game, 2-1.
- CAREER TRANSACTIONS: was acquired by the Astros on 7/31/11 from Atlanta as part of the return in the Michael Bourn trade... was originally an eighth round selection by the Braves in the 2008 draft out of Seminole CC (FL).

- **ABOUT PEACOCK:** will be making his 1st turn in the rotation tomorrow ater beginning the year in the bullpen...is taking the rotation spot of the DFA'd RHP Lucas Harrell
- was 1 of 4 pitchers vying for the final 2 spots in the rotation this Spring, along with LHP Dallas Keuchel, RHP Jerome Williams and Harrell.
- in his 4 relief appearances this year, reached a maximum of 3.1 innings and 63 pitches both coming on 4/3 vs. NYY (1ER/3.1IP)...since then, his appearances have been 3.0 IP, 2.2 IP and 0.2 of an inning last Wednesday.
- **FOR STARTERS:** has been much more effective as a starter in his career, posting a 7-6 record and a 4.38 ERA (42ER/86.1IP) in 16 games.
- finished his 2013 campaign in the rotation by posting a 4-3 record and a 3.64 ERA (22ER/54.1IP) in his final 9 starts... those starts all came after a return from a 2-month stint in the minors
