**ABOUT THE A'S:** Have won two straight, six of the last seven and 10 of the last 12...are 12-5 for the season, which is the best record in the American League and tied for second best in the majors...it matches the A's best record after 17 games over the last 33 years (1990, 2013) and is tied for the third best record after 17 games in Oakland history...a win today would give the A's their best record after 18 games since 1990 (13-5)...are the only team in the majors that has not lost back-to-back games this year...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the eighth consecutive day and are 1½ games ahead of second place Texas...have nine days in sole possession of first place this year, one day tied for first, three days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...are 202-139 (.592) since the start of the 2012 season, which is tied with Atlanta for the best record in the majors over that span...it is eight games better than the next closest AL team (Texas, 195-148).

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's had their second walk-off win of the season yesterday...eight of the A's first 17 games have been decided in the winning team's last at bat and Oakland is 5-3 in those games...have the most last at bat wins in the majors and are tied for the most games...yesterday was the A's sixth come from behind win, which is tied for the most in the majors...it was their Major League leading fourth win when trailing after seven innings, which matches their season total from last year...are now 4-1 (.800) in one-run games, which is the second best record in the American League...all five of the A's losses have been by two runs or fewer and the A's are the only team in the majors that has not lost a game by more than two runs...are 3-1 in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning wins and are tied for the lead in extra inning games.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed three runs or fewer in 15 of the first 17 games...have a 2.58 ERA (30 er in 104.2 ip) for the season, which is the lowest mark in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...have allowed six hits or fewer 14 times and have a .230 (93 for 404) opponents batting average, which is second lowest in the AL...have the lowest slugging percentage (.349) and on-base percentage (.278)...have issued the second fewest walks (23)...have two 30-year olds (Scott Kazmir and Jesse Chavez) in the starting rotation at the same time for the first time since April of 2010 (Ben Sheets, Justin Duchscherer).

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 2.56 ERA, which is the lowest mark in the American League and second lowest in the majors (Atlanta, 2.44)...have the lowest opponents batting average (.215) and on-base percentage (.272) in the majors and the third lowest slugging percentage (.321).

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's have committed two errors in each of the last three games and have made at least one error in each of the last eight contests (13 errors total)...that is their longest streak of consecutive games with an error since a nine-game streak from June 9-18, 2011...have 18 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and tied for third most in the majors...five of the errors have been committed by first basemen, which is two more than any other team...the errors have led to eight unearned runs, which is third most in the AL...turned three double plays yesterday after tallying just six over the first 16 games...have nine for the season, which is second fewest in the majors (Kansas City, 7).

**ON THE BASES:** The A's have been successful in 11 of their 12 (91.7%) stolen base attempts, which is tied for the second best percentage in the American League...opponents have been successful in each of their 13 stolen bases attempts and the A's are one of two teams in the majors without a caught stealing (San Diego, 17 sb).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .298 (48 for 161) with 29 runs scored and six home runs over the last four games...have 20 home runs for the season, which is tied for second in the American League...12 have come with runners on base, which is second most in the AL (Los Angeles, 16)...seven have put the A's ahead and a Major League leading six have come in the ninth inning or later...also rank second in the AL in walks (82) and are fourth in runs scored (83)...have the second fewest grounded into double plays (9).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 2-0 on this six-game homestand against Houston (2-0) and Texas (three games)...went 3-3 on the first homestand against Cleveland (1-2) and Seattle (2-1) and are 5-3 at home for the season...went 7-2 on the first road trip, a nine-game trip to Minnesota (3-0), Seattle (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...have the best road record in the American League and second best in the majors (Milwaukee, 8-1)...this marks the first time the A's have won the first three road series of the season since 1990...the A's 7-2 start matches the A's best start on the road over the last 24 years (also 2008).

**THIS AND THAT:** Coco Crisp drew the A's fifth pinch-walk of the season yesterday, which is tied for second most in the majors and three more than any other American League team...the A's are 7-1 in day games, which is the best record in the majors...are 9-0 when outperforming the opposition...are 6-2 during this stretch of 19 consecutive games against AL West competition (April 11-30) and are 8-3 against the West for the season...the A's played 4 hours and 19 minutes on Wednesday night after playing 4:12 on Tuesday...it marked the first time the A's played back-to-back four hour games since Sept. 3-5, 1995 against New York (4:27) and Boston (4:27)...the average time of game over the first 16 games is 3 hours and 17 minutes...have not used a rookie, marking their longest stretch without a rookie on the roster since 2006 when they had no rookies for the first 36 days of the season (April 3-May 8).

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's reinstated Craig Gentry from the disabled list last Saturday and now have five players on the DL (Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Rodriguez)...O'Flaherty and Parker are both on the 60-day DL...Rodriguez is on a rehab assignment with Sacramento...had seven players on the DL for the first seven days of the season, which matches the most players the A's had on the DL at once last year (May 7-14 and August 26-27)...used the DL just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**A's vs. ASTROS:** The A's have won the first two meetings of 2014 after winning the season series last year, 15-4...the 15 wins tied for third most in Oakland history against one team and were the most since going 17-2 against Seattle in 2006...went 8-1 in Houston and 7-3 in Oakland...have won all three season series against the Astros and lead the all-time series, 22-5...that is the **best record by a Major League club against another club** among teams that have played each other 20 or more times...**all five of the A's losses to Houston have been by one run**...are 12-3 in Oakland and 10-2 in Houston.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

The A's will play on Easter for the first time since 2011, a 5-2 win at Seattle...it is their first Easter game in Oakland since 2009, a 1-0 loss to Seattle...since moving to Oakland in 1968, the A's are 12-16 on Easter Sunday...that includes 9-11 in Oakland where they have lost each of their last five games...**Yoenis Céspedes** has a 14-game hitting streak against Houston dating back to May 24 of last year (24 for 57, .421)...**Coco Crisp** stole his 145<sup>th</sup> base as an Athletic Wednesday, which moves him past Reggie Jackson for fifth in Oakland history...Carney Lansford is fourth with 146...**Luke Gregerson** has appeared in nine games, which is tied for the most in the AL...has pitched in 372 games since 2009, which is the most in the majors over that span...**Dan Otero** has not allowed a home run in 60.1 career innings.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1969** Dick Green triples twice in the first game of a doubleheader at Kansas City...Green drives in three of the A's runs in a 5-1 victory in game one and combines for four hits in the doubleheader...in **1971** Jim Hunter tosses a three-hit shutout as the A's win at California, 4-0...Sal Bando homers twice and singles while driving in three runs...in **1982** Dan Meyer's two-out RBI single in the bottom of the 16th inning lifts the A's to a 4-3 victory over Minnesota.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (0-0, 1.35 ERA)

**FIRST THREE STARTS:** Has allowed one earned run in each of his first three starts and has a 1.35 ERA, which ranks seventh in the American League...that marks the fifth time in Oakland history a starting pitcher on the Opening Day roster has begun the season by allowing one earned run or fewer in each of his first three starts (Johnson, 1978; Keough 1980 and 81; Hudson, 2002; Gonzalez, 2011)...since 1914, no Athletics pitcher has done it in four straight starts...prior to this year, had made just two career starts, both with Toronto in 2012...had a loss and a 10.38 ERA in those two outings...is now 0-1 with a 4.08 ERA (13 er in 28.2 ip) in five career starts...had 54 career starts as a minor leaguer...made 23 starts over the previous two seasons after starting just once from 2005-11.

**STRIKEOUTS AND WALKS:** Has struck out nine batters and walked none in each of his last two starts...joins Dan Haren (August 21-26, 2007) as the only two Athletics pitchers since at least 1914 to strikeout nine or more in back-to-back starts without issuing a walk...has 22 strikeouts and just two walks for the season...ranks second in the American League in fewest walks per nine innings (0.90) and third in the in-strikeout to walk ratio (11.00).

**FIRST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 12-inning win over Seattle April 3 in Oakland...was charged with an unearned run in the first inning when Almonte reached on a Callaspo error, went to second on a Punto error, third on a Miller fly out and scored on a Cano ground out...also allowed a RBI single to Almonte in the fifth to make the score 2-0...the A's scored single runs in the fifth and eighth to tie the game.

**SECOND START:** He had a no decision in the A's 7-4, 11-inning win at Minnesota April 9...struck out a career-high nine in a career-high 7.0 innings...the A's scored four times in the first inning and he allowed a solo home run to Kubel to lead off the second...that was the only run he would allow in his seven innings and he was relieved by Doolittle to start the eighth with a 4-1 lead...Doolittle allowed a run in the eighth and Johnson two in the ninth.

**LAST START:** Had his third consecutive no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Los Angeles (AL) last Monday...matched his career high with nine strikeouts and 7.0 innings pitched for the second consecutive start...allowed an unearned run in the first inning when Calhoun singled, went to second on a passed ball and scored on a Pujols single...allowed a solo home run to Pujols in the third and left after seven innings trailing 2-1.

**CHAVEZ vs. HOUSTON:** Is 0-0 with a 0.92 ERA (19.2 ip, 18 h, 5 r, 2 er, 8 bb, 19 so, 1 hr) in 15 career appearances, all in relief...has a 0.93 ERA (1 er in 9.2 ip) in six games in his home ballparks and a 0.90 ERA (1 er in 10.0 ip) in nine games at Minute Maid Park...did not allow a run in three outings last year (6.1 ip, 5 h, 2 bb, 7 so)...his last appearance was August 13 in Oakland when he tossed 3.2 scoreless innings (3 h, 1 bb, 5 so).

**THIS SPRING:** Went 5-1 with a save and a 2.22 ERA in seven games, five starts...the five wins were the most in the majors this spring and the most by an A's pitcher since spring win totals are available beginning in 1990...ranked second in the Cactus League in innings pitched (28.1), fourth in strikeouts (25) and eighth in ERA...allowed a .216 opponents batting average...did not allow a run in five of his seven games, including a spring-opening 13.2-inning scoreless streak.

**2013 RECAP:** Spent most of the season with the A's and was 2-4 with a save and a career-low 3.92 ERA in 35 games over two stints...the save was the first of his career and he also struck out a career-high 55 batters...also had career lows in opponents batting average (.230), on-base percentage (.302) and slugging percentage (.318)...matched his career highs in wild pitches (5) and hit batters (3)...surrendered just three home runs in 57.1 innings, an average of 0.47 per nine innings...entered the season with 34 home runs in 177.1 career innings (1.73 per nine innings).

**BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK:** Had a 2.97 ERA and .210 opponents batting average in 18 games before the All-Star Break...then compiled a 5.25 ERA and .258 opponents average in 17 games after the break.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His opponents batting average included a .212 (21-for-99) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .246 (29-for-118) against left-handers...yielded all three of his home runs to right-handers but issued 14 of his 20 walks to lefties...allowed a .167 batting average with runners in scoring position and two outs...had a .269 batting average over his first 15 pitches in a game, .193 after that...opponents hit .333 with a .418 on-base percentage when leading off an inning.

**IN RELIEF:** First batters faced were 8-for-32 (.250) with two walks (.286 on-base percentage)...allowed 8-of-26 (30.8%) inherited runners to score.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Had a 2.73 ERA and .181 opponents batting average in 20 games on the road compared to a 5.20 ERA and .277 opponents average in 15 games at home.

**THIS AND THAT:** Led AL relievers in sacrifice hits allowed (6) and averaged the seventh most pitches per game (27.1)...tied for fifth among all AL pitchers in sacrifice hits...tossed at least one inning in 30 of his 35 appearances, including 10 outings of two or more.

**MORE 2013 WITH OAKLAND:** Was recalled from Sacramento April 20 and appeared in just three games during his first stint...had a 6.23 ERA and .350 opponents batting average when he was optioned to Sacramento April 29...returned May 10 and spent the remainder of the season with Oakland...did not allow a run in six of his first seven outings following his return...had a 0.59 ERA and .132 opponents batting average over that stretch that ran from May 10 to June 13...it included a career-high 12.2-inning scoreless streak from May 15 to June 13...capped his scoreless streak by tossing 5.2 scoreless innings of relief June 13 against New York (AL) for his first win in the A's 3-2, 18-inning victory over the Yankees...allowed just one hit and walked a season-high two while striking out seven...it was the longest relief appearance of his career and the longest outing by an A's reliever since Lenny DiNardo tossed 6.0 innings Aug. 2, 2008 against Boston...tossed 4.0 scoreless innings for his first career save in a 10-4 win at Kansas City July 7...it was the fourth four-inning save by an A's reliever since 1991, the first since Chad Gaudin May 4, 2006 against Cleveland...struck out in his only at bat of the season Aug. 7 at Cincinnati and is 0 for 5 with five strikeouts in his career...did not allow an earned run over his final six outings beginning Sept. 15 (6.1 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 bb, 8 so)...was on the A's roster for the ALDS against Detroit but did not appear in a game.

**2013 WITH SACRAMENTO:** Was used exclusively as a starter with Sacramento and went 2-2 with a 2.70 ERA in five starts...allowed just one home run in 30.0 innings...walked five batters, an average of 1.50 per nine innings...struck out 26 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 5.20...yielded a .285 opponents batting average, including .240 (18-for-75) against right-handed hitters compared to .354 (17-for-48) against left-handers...went 1-1 with a 2.45 ERA in three starts before he was called up by Oakland the first time April 20...that included a season-high nine strikeout game for his first win, April 15 at Reno...logged a 1-1 record and a 3.09 ERA in two starts during his second stay with the River Cats from April 29 to May 9.

**RHP Dan Straily (1-1, 5.40 ERA):** Had a no decision in his last start, a 10-9 A's win in 11 innings at Los Angeles (AL) last Tuesday (3.2 ip, 7 h, 6 r, 6 er, 1 bb, 3 so)...the hits matched his career high...is 3-1 with a 4.05 ERA in six career starts against Texas...had no decisions and a 4.37 ERA in four starts this spring...issued 10 walks in 13.1 innings...had five stints with Oakland in 2013 and was 10-8 with a 3.96 ERA in 27 starts...led American League rookies in games started, innings pitched (152.1) and strikeouts (124) and tied for the lead in wins (Perez, TEX).

- The A's bullpen has yielded just nine runs over the last 14 games (48.0 ip, 1.69 ERA) and now has a 2.53 ERA for the season, which is the second lowest in the American League.
- Bullpen has been credited with the decision in five of the A's last six games (4-1).
- Its six wins are tied for the most in the majors (San Francisco).
- Was charged with its fifth blown save of the season Wednesday, which is tied for the most in the majors (Chicago-AL)...is 4 for 9 (44.4%) in saves, which is the third lowest percentage in the AL.
- Also ranks first in the majors in opponents batting average (.186) and on-base percentage (263).

- Has not allowed a run over his first seven outings (7.1 ip) and has struck out nine of the 25 batters he has faced...is one of 13 pitchers in the majors with at least seven innings pitched and no runs allowed.

- Compiled a 3.27 ERA and allowed a .205 batting average in a team-leading 11 appearances this spring...did not issue a walk in 11.0 innings while striking out 12.
- Has a 13-game losing streak dating back to April 9, 2011, which is the longest active losing streak in the majors.
- Was acquired from Washington for minor league infielder John Wooten, November 25, 2013.

**Last Year:** Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse and was 1-0 with a 1.06 ERA in 17 relief appearances...was promoted to Washington May 21 and went 0-3 with a 3.35 ERA in a career-high 39 relief appearances.

**MORE 2013 WITH OAKLAND:** Won each of his first three starts to become the first pitcher on an A's Opening Day roster to win each of his first three starts since Dave Stewart had six wins in his first six starts in 1990...that extended his winning streak to five games dating back to 2012...had never won more than two consecutive games in his career...matched his career-high with 10 strikeouts and did not walk a batter May 1 against Los Angeles (AL)...has three career 10-strikeout games and has not walked a batter in any of those contests...is the third A's pitcher since 1916 with three career games of 10 or more strikeouts and no walks...tossed a career-high 118 pitches in a no decision in the A's 4-1 loss at Chicago (AL) June 8...that ran his record to 6-5 with a 3.69 ERA and .249 opponents batting average over his first 13 starts...was 9-9 with a 4.39 ERA in 22 starts when he was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento Aug. 3...made two starts with the River Cats and had no decisions, a 1.74 ERA and .348 opponents batting average before returning to Oakland Aug. 18...tossed a rain-shortened five-inning complete game in his second start Aug. 27 at Detroit...it matched the shortest complete game in Oakland history...was 1-0 with a 2.79 ERA in two starts before he was optioned to Single-A Stockton Aug. 28...returned to Oakland Sept. 3 after Stockton's season ended and went 2-0 with a 2.70 ERA in four games, including two starts...began his career with 60 consecutive starts before making the first relief appearance of his career Sept. 11 at Minnesota (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 so)...made an emergency start Sept. 15 at Texas, replacing an ill Jarrod Parker, and allowed one run in 5.0 innings for the win...tossed 2.0 perfect innings of relief against Minnesota Sept. 20 and then started and won three days later at Los Angeles (AL)...both of his September starts came on three days rest or fewer...the last A's pitcher to make two such starts in a season was John Halama in 2003.



## WEDNESDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (3-0, 1.80 ERA)

**WINNING STREAK:** Has won each of his first three decisions and is one of **six** undefeated American League pitchers with at least three wins...is **red tied for the AL lead** in wins...now has a six-game winning streak dating back to September 11 of last year, an on-going career high...is 6-0 with a 2.35 ERA (12 er in 46.0 ip) over that eight-start stretch...has allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings...the streak is **red tied for second longest in the majors among active pitchers (Ziegler, ARI 7)**.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has not allowed a home run over his first four starts and 25.0 innings pitched...his innings pitched are **red fourth** most in the American League among pitchers with no home runs allowed...has surrendered just four home runs in 89.0 career innings (0.40 per nine innings)...has yielded a .176 (6 for 34) average with runners in scoring position...has a .188 (6 for 32) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .288 (19 for 66) after that.

**INNING BY INNING:** Has allowed four of his seven runs this year over the first three innings of a game...last year, he yielded 20 of his 22 runs over the first three innings of a game...in his career, he has a 4.07 ERA (19 er in 42.0 ip), .275 (47 for 171) opponents batting average and four home runs allowed in innings one through three compared to a 0.96 ERA (5 er in 47.0 ip), .176 (29 for 165) opponents average and no home runs from the fourth inning on...has not allowed a run after the fifth inning (22.2 ip).

**THE WEST AND THE REST:** Has won each of his three starts this year against American League West competition after a no decision against Cleveland in his first start...is now 5-1 with a 1.64 ERA (10 er in 55.0 ip) in nine career games against American League West competition compared to 3-2 with a 3.71 ERA (14 er in 34.0 ip) in seven games against everyone else.

**THIS AND THAT:** Has issued eight of his nine walks this year and 23 of his 29 in his career to left-handed hitters...received 10 runs of support in his last start after getting eight runs total over his first three starts...his season RSA is 6.48 (18 rs in 25.0 ip) and his career RSA as a starter is 7.20 (68 rs in 85.0 ip)...the A's are 3-1 (.750) in his starting assignments this year and are 9-5 (.643) when he starts in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 10 of his 14 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer 10 times.

**FIRST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss to Cleveland on Opening Night March 31...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...allowed five hits while walking a career-high tying three...retired the side in order just once, the third inning...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom).

**SECOND START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 win over Seattle April 6 in Oakland...did not allow a run in the first inning to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings (previous: 13.0, August 10-20, 2013)...was charged with two unearned runs in the second inning (Barton error) when he allowed RBI singles to Almonte and Miller...also allowed a RBI single to Smoak in the third to give the Mariners a 3-0 lead but the A's tied the game on a Moss three-run homer in the bottom of the third...retired 11 of the final 12 batters he faced, including each of the last seven, and the A's scored twice in the fifth to take the lead for good.

**THIRD START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 win at Seattle April 12...struck out a career-high tying nine batters...allowed back-to-back singles to Almonte and Miller to start the game before retiring 11 straight...Almonte scored on a Cano ground out, but that would be the only run he would allow in seven innings...blanked the Mariners on three hits and two walks over his final six innings.

**LAST START:** He won his third consecutive start in the A's 11-3 win over Houston last Friday in Oakland...allowed a career-high nine hits...the A's scored seven times in the first inning and he blanked the Astros on three hits and a walk over the first four innings...allowed three runs in the fifth on RBI singles by Fowler and Springer and a sacrifice fly by Carter.

**2013 RECAP:** Spent most of the season at Triple-A Sacramento where he was 10-7 with a 3.42 ERA in 20 starts...also had two stints with the A's...after making two relief appearances in his Major League debut in July, he returned to Oakland Aug. 10 and finished the season in the starting rotation...was 5-3 with a 2.67 ERA in 12 games, 10 starts, with the A's...also went 0-1 with a 2.08 ERA in two ALDS starts against Detroit...based upon a minimum of 60 innings pitched, he had the lowest opponents on-base percentage among American League rookies (.272), ranked second in opponents batting average (.214) and slugging percentage (.298) and third in ERA...struck out 67 batters in 64.0 innings and his average of 9.42 strikeouts per nine innings was second best (Allen, CLE 11.26)...walked 20 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.35...went 4-1 with a 2.27 ERA and .230 opponents batting average over his final six starts...won each of his final three decisions beginning Sept. 11, the first time he put together consecutive wins in his career...had surgery for a fractured left thumb following the season...the surgery, an internal fixation with a screw to repair the thumb fracture, was performed by Dr. Thomas Graham at the Cleveland Clinic Hospital Oct. 18.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Was 3-1 with a 1.99 ERA in six starts in Oakland compared to 2-2 with a 3.86 ERA in six games, four starts, on the road.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His opponents batting average included a .198 (20-for-101) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .226 (31-for-137) against left-handers...allowed a .194 opponents batting average to hitters leading off an inning...surrendered one double (.210 slugging percentage) and issued just four walks (.242 on-base percentage).

**STARTING AND RELIEVING:** Compiled a 5-3 record and a 2.85 ERA in his nine starts...did not allow a run in his two relief appearances (4.0 ip)...did not inherit a runner and retired both of his first batters faced in relief.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Was 2-1 with a 1.72 ERA in seven games at night compared to 3-2 with a 3.95 ERA in five starts during the day.

**DAYS REST:** Was 3-1 with a 1.57 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more, 2-2 with a 4.02 ERA in five starts on four days rest.

**WITH SACRAMENTO:** Won a career-high 10 games with the River Cats...also finished with a career-high 118 strikeouts...the wins tied for fifth in the Pacific Coast League and the strikeouts tied for seventh...was also fourth in ERA (3.42) and tied for fifth in complete games (1)...led the league in strikeouts per nine innings (8.97)...ranked fourth in the A's farm system in ERA, tied for fifth in wins and sixth in strikeouts...was named the A's organization Minor League Pitcher of the year and was also a *Baseball America's* Triple-A All-Star...surrendered just five home runs in 118.1 innings, an average of 0.38 per nine innings...had a 4.74 ERA over the first three innings of a game, 1.54 from innings four through six and 6.23 from the seventh inning on.

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.

## LUKE GREGERSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

- Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

### **BRANDON MOSS**

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.

### **ERIC O'FLAHERTY**

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

### **JARROD PARKER**

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.
