OAKLAND ATHLETICS (13-5) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (11-8)

ABOUT THE A'S: Swept a three-game series from Houston to start the homestand, their second sweep of the season...have won seven of the last eight games and 11 of the last 13...are 13-5 for the season, which is the second best record in the majors to Milwaukee (14-5)...it matches the third best record after 18 games in Oakland history and is the best since the 1990 club also started the year 13-5...are in first place in the American League West for the ninth consecutive day and lead second place Texas by a season-high tying 2½ games...with a win tonight, the A's would have their largest lead before the end of April since 1990 when they led by 3½ games as late as April 26...have 10 days in sole possession of first place this year, one day tied for first, three days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...the A's are the only team in the majors that has not lost back-to-back games in 2014...are 203-139 (.594) since the start of the 2012 season, which is the **best record in the majors** over that span (Atlanta, 202-140)...it is nine games better than the next closest AL team (Texas, 195-149).

STARTING PITCHING: Jesse Chavez allowed one earned run yesterday, the 10th time this year A's starters have allowed one earned run or fewer...have allowed three runs or fewer in 16 of the first 18 games and have a 2.52 ERA (31 er in 110.2 ip), which is the lowest mark in the American League and fourth lowest in the majors...have allowed six hits or fewer 15 times and have a .228 (.97 for 426) opponents batting average, which is second lowest in the AL...have the lowest slugging percentage (.350) and on-base percentage (.278)...have issued the second fewest walks (26) and are tied for the third most strikeouts (100)...have two 30-year olds (Scott Kazmir and Jesse Chavez) in the starting rotation at the same time for the first time since April of 2010 (Ben Sheets, Justin Duchscherer).

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.48 ERA, which is the lowest mark in the American League and second lowest in the majors (Atlanta, 2.40)...have the lowest opponents batting average (.212) and on-base percentage (.271) in the majors and the third lowest slugging percentage (.318)...are tied for the second fewest walks in the AL (49)

MONTH BY MONTH: The A's are 13-4 (.765) in the month of April, which is the best record in the majors...need one more win to clinch a winning record in April for the second consecutive season (went 16-12 last year)...it would also clinch the A's 11th consecutive winning month dating back to June of 2012...that would tie for the second longest such streak in Oakland history (July, 1989-May 1991)...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept., 1970-Sept. 1972

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed two errors in each of the last four games, which is their longest streak since a four-game streak from Sept. 23-26, 2009...the Oakland record is five (May 10-15, 1998 and July 30-Aug. 2, 1976)...have made at least one error in each of the last nine contests (15 errors total), which is their longest streak of consecutive games with an error since June 9-18, 2011 when they also had a nine-game streak...the last streak longer than nine was a 12-game streak from April 8-19, 2008...have 20 errors for the season, which is tied with Los Angeles (NL) and Washington for the most in the majors...the errors have led to eight unearned runs, which is fourth most in the AL...have turned just nine double plays, which is tied with Kansas City for the fewest in the majors.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in 11 of their 12 (91.7%) stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 15 of their 16 (93.8%) attempts, which is the highest percentage in the American League and fourth highest in the majors.

OFFENSE: The A's are batting .299 (58 for 194) with 33 runs scored and seven home runs over the last five games...have 21 home runs for the season, which ranks third in the American League...13 have come with runners on base, eight have put the A's ahead and six have come in the ninth inning or later...also rank second in the AL in walks (86) and on-base percentage (.344), third in slugging (.412) and fourth in runs scored (87)...are tied for the second fewest grounded into double plays (10).

CLOSE CALLS: Eight of the A's first 18 games have been decided in the winning team's last at bat and Oakland is 5-3 in those games...are

tied for the most last at bat wins (Milwaukee) and games (Chicago-AL) in the majors...have a Major League leading four wins when trailing after seven innings, which matches their season total from last year...have six come from behind wins, which is tied for second most in the majors (Detroit, 7)...are 3-1 in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning wins and are tied for the lead in extra inning games...are 4-1 (.800) in one-run games, which is the second best record in the American League...all five of the A's losses have been by two runs or fewer and the A's are the only team in the majors that has not lost a game by more than two runs.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-0 on this six-game homestand against Houston (3-0) and Texas (three games)...are 6-3 at home for the season, which is tied for the third best home record in the American League...this homestand is part of a 25-game stretch from April 7 to May 4 where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of their 25 games on the road...are 10-2 over the first 12 games of that stretch...leave for a 10-game road trip to Houston (four games), Texas (three games) and Boston (three games) following the game Wednesday...went 7-2 on the first road trip to Minnesota (3-0), Seattle (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...have the best road record in the AL and second best in the majors (Milwaukee, 9-1)...this marks the first time the A's have won the first three road series of the season since 1990...the A's 7-2 start matches the A's best start on the road over the last 24 years (also 2008).

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 7-2 during this stretch of 19 consecutive games against American League West competition (April 11-30) and are 9-3 against the West for the season...are tied with Detroit (3-1) for the best intra-division record in the majors...have five pinch-walks, which is tied for second in the majors and three more than any other AL team...are 3-1 in games started by a left-handed pitcher and the four games against south paws are tied for second fewest in the AL (Detroit, 3)...are 8-1 in day games, which is the best record in the majors...have not used a rookie, marking their longest stretch without a rookie on the roster since 2006 when they had no rookies for the first 36 days of the season (April 3-May 8).

CONTRACT STATUS: The A's have five players under contract beyond the 2014 season...Yoenis Céspedes, Scott Kazmir and Eric O'Flaherty are signed through 2015, Coco Crisp is signed through 2016 with a vesting option for 2017 and Sean Doolittle is signed through 2018 with club options for 2019 and 2020...Nick Punto has a vesting option for 2015 and minor leaguer Hiroyuki Nakajima has a club option for 2015.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's won the season series last year, 10-9...went 4-5 in Oakland and 6-4 in Texas...it was the A's second consecutive season series win over the Rangers after losing five of the previous six...are 21-17 (.553) over the last two years...are 313-324 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 167-151 in Oakland and 146-173 in Texas...have an all-time record of 410-406 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Alberto Callaspo is tied for the American League lead with a .478 batting average with runners on base (.478) and is tied for second in batting with runners in scoring position (.500)...**Coco Crisp** stole his 145th base as an Athletic last Wednesday, which moves him past Reggie Jackson for fifth in Oakland history...Carney Lansford is fourth with 146...**Josh Donaldson** leads the AL and is tied for third in the majors in go-ahead RBI (6)...**Luke Gregerson** has appeared in 10 games, which is tied for the most in the AL...has pitched in 373 games since 2009, which is the most in the majors over that span...**Dan Otero** has not allowed a home run in 60.1 career innings.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1956** Art Ditmar tosses a one-hitter in the A's 15-1 win over the Chicago White Sox...in **1958** Frank House scores two runs as a pinch hitter in an eight-run 8th inning as the A's defeat Cleveland, 9-4...the two runs scored by a pinch hitter ties a major league record...in **1981** Steve McCarty goes the distance in the A's 4-3, 10 inning win over Minnesota...Tony Armas drives in the winning run with a RBI single...in **2002** Greg Myers hits a pinch hit three-run home run in the bottom of the ninth to give manager Art Howe his 900th career victory in a 6-5 win over Anaheim.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Dan Straily (1-1, 5.40 ERA)

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss to Seattle April 5 in Oakland...blanked the Mariners on two hits over the first four innings before allowing three runs in the fifth inning on a two-run home run by Ackley and a solo home run by Almonte...Hernandez shut out the A's on four hits over the first eight innings before Lowrie homered in the ninth.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win at Minnesota April 10...allowed a solo home run to the second batter he faced, Dozier, but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings...did not allow a hit over his final five innings and retired 16 of the final 18 batters he faced.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 10-9, 11-inning win at Los Angeles (AL) last Tuesday...yielded a career-high tying six runs (fifth time)...allowed a RBI double to Trout and a RBI single to Kendrick in the first inning but the A's scored three times in the third to take a 3-2 lead...he then allowed four runs in the fourth inning on a two-run double by Iannetta and a two-run home run by Calhoun...left after 3.2 innings trailing 6-3.

STRAILY vs. TEXAS: Is 3-1 with a 4.05 ERA (33.1 ip, 24 h, 17 r, 15 er, 14 bb, 24 so, 4 hr) in six career starts...is 2-0 with a 3.38 ERA (9 er in 24.0 ip) in four starts in Texas and 1-1 with a 5.79 ERA (6 er in 9.1 ip) in two starts in Oakland...went 3-1 with a 4.73 ERA (26.2 ip, 19 h, 15 r, 14 er, 12 bb, 16 so) in five starts last year...the loss came in a 6-2 decision in Oakland May 15...allowed a bases loaded two-run single to Berkman in the third inning and was charged with three of the Rangers runs in a four-run fifth inning...then combined with Doolittle and Balfour on a three-hit shutout in the A's 1-0 win at Texas May 21...tossed 7.0 innings and allowed two of the hits...did not walk a batter to become just the second visiting pitcher at Rangers Ballpark to toss seven or more innings and allow two or fewer baserunners (Erik Bedard, July 7, 2007)...then had a no decision in the A's 8-7 loss at Texas June 17...allowed a career-high tying six runs on a career-high tying eight hits in 4.2 innings...allowed a Pierzynski two-run home run in the second and a Martin RBI double in the third...the A's then scored six times in the fourth to take a 6-3 lead but he allowed a solo home run to Cruz in the bottom of the fourth...allowed a RBI double to Pierzynski in the fifth and was relieved by Chavez, who allowed a two-run home run to Cruz for the loss...also picked up the win in a 4-2 decision in Oakland September 2...the A's scored twice in the second and he blanked the Rangers on two hits and a walk over the first four innings...allowed a two-run game-tying home run to Murphy in the fifth but the A's came back with two in the bottom of the fifth for the win...his final victory came in the A's 9-8 win at Texas September 13...walked the first two batters and both scored on a Beltre RBI single and a Pierzynski sacrifice fly...those were the only runs he would allow in 5.2 innings...allowed just one hit following the Beltre single.

THIS SPRING: Had no decisions and a 4.37 ERA in four starts this spring...opponents hit .275...walked two or more batters in all four starts and issued 10 walks in 13.1 innings overall (6.75 walks per nine innings)...had his final start on March 29 against San Francisco rained out...pitched in a minor league game March 24 (5.2 ip, 10 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 2 hr).

2013 RECAP: Had five stints with Oakland in 2013 and was 10-8 with a 3.96 ERA in 27 starts...led American League rookies in games started, innings pitched (152.1) and strikeouts (124) and tied for the lead in wins (Perez, TEX)...is the 11th rookie in Oakland history to win 10 or more games, the fifth in the last five years (Anderson, Cahill, Milone, Parker)...had the sixth most strikeouts by an Oakland rookie...went 1-2 with a 7.27 ERA and .257 opponents batting average over his first five starts, 5-0 with a 2.83 ERA and .196 opponents average over his next nine starts from May 21 to July 9, 0-5 with a 5.20 ERA and .299 opponents over his next seven starts from July 20 to Aug. 23 and 4-1 with a 2.00 ERA and .195 opponents average over his final six starts

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .233 opponents batting average...did not have enough innings pitched to qualify for the league leaders, but his opponents average was ninth lowest among AL pitchers with 150 or more innings pitched...his .358 slugging percentage was eighth best...surrendered 16 home runs in 152.1 innings (0.95 per nine innings) after allowing 11 in 39.1 innings in 2012 (2.52 per nine innings)...11 of the 16 home runs he allowed were solo shots as are 21 of the 31 in his career...his opponents batting average included a .221 (60-for-272) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .244 (72-for-295) against left-handers...allowed a .201 batting average the first time through the lineup, which was third lowest among AL pitchers with 150 or more innings pitched...now has a .211 (63-for-299) opponents average the first time through the lineup in his career...allowed a .225 batting average to batters leading off an inning...however, issued 19 walks to start an inning, which tied for second most in the AL...opponents hit .300 with runners in scoring position and two outs...they were 4-for-7 (.571) with a grand slam with the bases loaded.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 6-2 with a 4.28 ERA and .217 opponents batting average in 14 starts before the All-Star Break...then went 4-6 with a 3.61 ERA and .250 opponents average in 13 starts after the break.

NIGHT AND DAY: Was 4-2 with a 2.14 ERA and .195 opponents batting average in nine starts during the day compared to 6-6 with a 4.98 ERA and .252 opponents average in 18 starts at night...his day ERA was the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings in day games...surrendered just one of his 16 home runs during the day...in 2012, allowed eight of his 11 home runs in day games.

DAYS REST: Was 6-3 with a 3.25 ERA in 14 starts on five days rest or more compared to 4-5 with a 4.80 ERA in 13 starts on four days rest...is now 8-4 with a 2.98 ERA (38 er in 114.2 ip) in 19 career starts on five days rest or more compared to 5-6 with a 5.39 ERA (56 er in 93.2 ip) in 18 starts on four days rest.

RUN SUPPORT: Received two runs of support or fewer in 17 of his 27 starts and was 5-8 in those games...was 5-0 in 10 starts with three runs of support or more...is now 6-10 in 21 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 7-0 in 16 starts with support of three or more

THIS AND THAT: Was 3-1 with a 1.54 ERA and .167 opponents batting average in four interleague starts...tied for third in the majors in interleague wins, ranked fourth in opponents batting average and ninth in ERA...tied for the team-lead with seven hit batters...the A's were 16-11 (.593) in his starting assignments and are 23-14 (.622) in his career.

2013 WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-1 with a 1.14 ERA and .202 opponents batting average in five starts with Sacramento...allowed just one home run in 31.2 innings...struck out 33, an average of 9.38 per nine innings...his opponents batting average included a .174 (8-for-46) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .219 (16-for-73) against right-handers...yielded a .161 average to batters leading off an inning and issued just one walk...the River Cats were 4-1 in his starting assignments.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

LHP Tommy Milone (0-1, 4.09 ERA): Was on the A's Opening Day roster but did not make his first appearance of the season until starting April 10 at Seattle...was scheduled to start April 5 against the Mariners...however, his turn in the rotation was skipped after the game of April 4 was postponed due to a wet field...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-4 A's loss in 11 innings at Los Angeles (AL) last Wednesday (6.0 ip, 6 h, 3 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 1 so)...opponents have reached base on an error twice with him pitching and they have now reached via error 24 times over the last three years, which is the most in the majors (Jordan Lyles, 23)...is 1-4 with a 5.06 ERA in six career starts against Texas...went 2-1 with a 4.26 ERA in five games, four starts, this spring...logged a 1.93 ERA over his final three games...spent the first four months of the 2013 season in the starting rotation but split the final two months of the year between the bullpen, rotation and minor leagues...was 12-9 with a 4.14 ERA in 28 games, 26 starts.

- The A's bullpen has yielded just nine runs over the last 15 games (51.0 ip, 1.59 ERA) and now has a 2.40 ERA for the season, which is the second lowest in the American League...did not allow a run in the most recent three-game series against Houston (7.0 ip, 3 h, 4 bb, 9 so).
- Bullpen has been credited with the decision in five of the A's last seven games (4-1).
- Its six wins are tied for the most in the majors (Milwaukee, San Francisco).
- Its five blown saves are tied for the most in the majors (Chicago-AL, Pittsburgh).
- Also ranks first in the majors in opponents batting average (.186) and on-base percentage (.263).

2013 RECAP: Spent the first four months of the season in the starting rotation but split the final two months of the year between the bullpen, rotation and minor leagues...was 12-9 with a 4.14 ERA in 28 games, 26 starts...had a .258 opponents batting average and .301 on-base percentage, which were the lowest marks of his career...had career highs in ERA (4.14), walks (39) and home runs (25) and matched his high in extra base hits (59).

THIS AND THAT: The A's were 16-10 (.615) in his 26 starting assignments and are 36-23 (.611) in his career...his teams are 41-23 (.641) in his 64 career starts.

MORE 2013 WITH OAKLAND: Won each of his first three starts to become the first pitcher on an A's Opening Day roster to win each of his first three starts since Dave Stewart had six wins in his first six starts in 1990...that extended his winning streak to five games dating back to 2012...had never won more than two consecutive games in his career...matched his career-high with 10 strikeouts and did not walk a batter May 1 against Los Angeles (AL)...has three career 10-strikeout games and has not walked a batter in any of those contests...is the third A's pitcher since 1916 with three career games of 10 or more strikeouts and no walks...tossed a career-high 118 pitches in a no decision in the A's 4-1 loss at Chicago (AL) June 8...that ran his record to 6-5 with a 3.69 ERA and .249 opponents batting average over his first 13 starts...was 9-9 with a 4.39 ERA in 22 starts when he was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento Aug. 3...made two starts with the River Cats and had no decisions, a 1.74 ERA and .348 opponents batting average before returning to Oakland Aug. 18...tossed a rain-shortened five-inning complete game in his second start Aug. 27 at Detroit...it matched the shortest complete game in Oakland history...was 1-0 with a 2.79 ERA in two starts before he was optioned to Single-A Stockton Aug. 28...returned to Oakland Sept. 3 after Stockton's season ended and went 2-0 with a 2.70 ERA in four games, including two starts...began his career with 60 consecutive starts before making the first relief appearance of his career Sept. 11 at Minnesota (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 so)...made an emergency start Sept. 15 at Texas, replacing an ill Jarrod Parker, and allowed one run in 5.0 innings for the win...tossed 2.0 perfect innings of relief against Minnesota Sept. 20 and then started and won three days later at Los Angeles (AL)...both of his September starts came on three days rest or fewer...the last A's pitcher to make two such starts in a season was John Halama in 2003.

WEDNESDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (3-0, 1.80 ERA)

WINNING STREAK: Has won each of his first three decisions and is one of **six** undefeated American League pitchers with at least three wins...is **red tied for the AL lead** in wins...now has a six-game winning streak dating back to September 11 of last year, an on-going career high...is 6-0 with a 2.35 ERA (12 er in 46.0 ip) over that eight-start stretch...has allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings...the streak is **red tied for second longest in the majors among active pitchers (Ziegler, ARI 7)**.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has not allowed a home run over his first four starts and 25.0 innings pitched...his innings pitched are **red fourth** most in the American League among pitchers with no home runs allowed...has surrendered just four home runs in 89.0 career innings (0.40 per nine innings)...has yielded a .176 (6 for 34) average with runners in scoring position...has a .188 (6 for 32) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .288 (19 for 66) after that.

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed four of his seven runs this year over the first three innings of a game...last year, he yielded 20 of his 22 runs over the first three innings of a game...in his career, he has a 4.07 ERA (19 er in 42.0 ip), .275 (47 for 171) opponents batting average and four home runs allowed in innings one through three compared to a 0.96 ERA (5 er in 47.0 ip), .176 (29 for 165) opponents average and no home runs from the fourth inning on...has not allowed a run after the fifth inning (22.2 ip).

THE WEST AND THE REST: Has won each of his three starts this year against American League West competition after a no decision against Cleveland in his first start...is now 5-1 with a 1.64 ERA (10 er in 55.0 ip) in nine career games against American League West competition compared to 3-2 with a 3.71 ERA (14 er in 34.0 ip) in seven games against everyone else.

THIS AND THAT: Has issued eight of his nine walks this year and 23 of his 29 in his career to left-handed hitters...received 10 runs of support in his last start after getting eight runs total over his first three starts...his season RSA is 6.48 (18 rs in 25.0 ip) and his career RSA as a starter is 7.20 (68 rs in 85.0 ip)...the A's are 3-1 (.750) in his starting assignments this year and are 9-5 (.643) when he starts in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 10 of his 14 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer 10 times.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss to Cleveland on Opening Night March 31...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...allowed five hits while walking a career-high tying three...retired the side in order just once, the third inning...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom).

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 win over Seattle April 6 in Oakland...did not allow a run in the first inning to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings (previous: 13.0, August 10-20, 2013)...was charged with two unearned runs in the second inning (Barton error) when he allowed RBI singles to Almonte and Miller...also allowed a RBI single to Smoak in the third to give the Mariners a 3-0 lead but the A's tied the game on a Moss three-run homer in the bottom of the third...retired 11 of the final 12 batters he faced, including each of the last seven, and the A's scored twice in the fifth to take the lead for good.

THIRD START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 win at Seattle April 12...struck out a career-high tying nine batters...allowed back-to-back singles to Almonte and Miller to start the game before retiring 11 straight...Almonte scored on a Cano ground out, but that would be the only run he would allow in seven innings...blanked the Mariners on three hits and two walks over his final six innings.

LAST START: He won his third consecutive start in the A's 11-3 win over Houston last Friday in Oakland...allowed a career-high nine hits...the A's scored seven times in the first inning and he blanked the Astros on three hits and a walk over the first four innings...allowed three runs in the fifth on RBI singles by Fowler and Springer and a sacrifice fly by Carter.

2013 RECAP: Spent most of the season at Triple-A Sacramento where he was 10-7 with a 3.42 ERA in 20 starts...also had two stints with the A's...after making two relief appearances in his Major League debut in July, he returned to Oakland Aug. 10 and finished the season in the starting rotation...was 5-3 with a 2.67 ERA in 12 games, 10 starts, with the A's...also went 0-1 with a 2.08 ERA in two ALDS starts against Detroit...based upon a minimum of 60 innings pitched, he had the lowest opponents on-base percentage among American League rookies (.272), ranked second in opponents batting average (.214) and slugging percentage (.298) and third in ERA...struck out 67 batters in 64.0 innings and his average of 9.42 strikeouts per nine innings was second best (Allen, CLE 11.26)...walked 20 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.35...went 4-1 with a 2.27 ERA and .230 opponents batting average over his final six starts...won each of his final three decisions beginning Sept. 11, the first time he put together consecutive wins in his career...had surgery for a fractured left thumb following the season...the surgery, an internal fixation with a screw to repair the thumb fracture, was performed by Dr. Thomas Graham at the Cleveland Clinic Hospital Oct. 18.

THURSDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (2-0, 1.65 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks **third** in the American League in opponents batting average (.173) and is **eighth** in ERA (1.65)...also has the **third** lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.214) and the **sixth** lowest slugging percentage (.265)...is **tied for sixth** in strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.00) and is averaging the **seventh** fewest walks per nine innings (1.32).

2-0: Has started the season 2-0 for the second time in his career (also 2009)...has never started the season 3-0...is now 4-0 with a 1.34 ERA (6 er in 40.1 ip) over his last six starts dating back to September 28, 2013.

LAST 22 STARTS: Has not allowed a run in two of his four starts this year and has yielded one run or fewer in 10 of his last 22 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...is 9-5 with a 2.76 ERA (40 er in 130.1 ip) over that span...has held the opposition to a .226 (111 for 492) batting average...has walked 28 (1.93 per nine innings) and struck out 131 in 130.1 innings (9.05 per nine innings) for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.68...has yielded just eight home runs (0.55 per nine innings).

THIST AND THAT: The A's have won each of his four starting assignments...has tossed at least six innings in all four starts, allowed three runs or fewer in each start and issued no walks in three of his starts.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win over Cleveland in the day game April 2 against Cleveland...tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut.

SECOND START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-3 win at Minnesota April 7...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Hicks in the second...the A's scored three times in the third but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the third on a Kubel RBI double and a Suzuki RBI ground out...then retired 11 of the final 13 batters he faced.

THIRD START: He combined with Abad, Otero, Gregerson and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Seattle April 13...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed two of the hits but had a no decision as the A's scored twice in the eighth and once in the ninth...retired each of the first 10 batters, allowed back to back singles to Miller and Cano with one out in the fourth, and then retired each of the final eight batters.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win over Houston last Saturday in Oakland...allowed his first home run of the season, a solo shot by Villar in the third inning...also allowed a RBI single to Dominguez in the fourth and an unearned run in the fifth when Villar scored on a Norris throwing error following a steal of third...left trailing 3-1 but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the ninth for the win.

2013 RECAP: Went from the independent Atlantic League in 2012 to a key member of the Cleveland Indians rotation, going 10-9 with a 4.04 ERA in 29 starts...it was his sixth 10-win season but his first since 2009...his 29 starts were his most since 2007, as were his 158.0 innings pitched...walked 47 batters for an average of 2.68 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark of his career...his previous low was 3.24 in 2006...struck out 162, and his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.45 was also a career best...was one of a club-record tying three pitchers to fan 150 or more batters (Jimenez, Masterson)...averaged 9.23 strikeouts per nine innings...did not qualify for the league leaders but had the seventh best strikeout per nine inning ratio among American League pitchers with 150 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, he had the fifth highest run support average (6.27)...was 3-4 with a 5.89 ERA and .302 opponents batting average over his first 11 starts through June 15...then went 7-5 with a 3.06 ERA and .239 opponents average over his final 18 starts

- Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.

DREW POMERANZ

- Is in his fourth professional season and his fourth season in the majors but is on his first Opening Day roster.

NICK PUNTO

- Was on his 12th Opening Day roster (Philadelphia, 2002-03; Minnesota, 2004-10; Boston, 2012; Los Angeles-NL, 2013).

JOSH REDDICK

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start in right field and is the first Athletic to make three consecutive Opening Day starts in right field since Ruben Sierra (1993-95).

FERNANDO RODRIGUEZ

- Began the season on the disabled list as he continued his recovery from Tommy John surgery...was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21.

EVAN SCRIBNER

- Was on the A's Opening Day roster and did not allow a run in two outings (1.1 ip) before he was optioned to Sacramento April 7 when Ryan Cook was reinstated from the DL.

PLAYER TRANSACTIONS
