CAREER: The 31-year-old veteran was received by Texas on waiver claim from the Chicago Cubs on March 26 and made the Opening Day roster...spent all of spring with Chicago-NL after joining that organization in early April 2013, and playing 46 games for Cubs after starting last year at Triple-A...owns a career .215 batting average (156-726) with 91 runs, 43 doubles, 4 triples, 29 home runs and 105 RBI in all or part of 8 major league seasons with Kansas City (2004-05), Oakland (2007-08), Miami (2010-12) and Chicago-NL (2013)...hit a career-best 11 home runs in 46 games with the Cubs in 2013, equaling the 11 homers he hit between the 2008, 2010-12 seasons (163 games, 355 at-bats)...has made 185 career major league starts at 3 different positions, including 80 starts at third base, 57 at shortstop and 48 at second base...owns a .972 career fielding percentage (19 E/679 TC)...has appeared in 748 career minor league games over 12 seasons, batting .278 (778-2803) with 419 runs, 184 doubles, 27 triples, 92 home runs and 441 RBI...has had a double-digit home run total in 7 of 12 minor league campaigns.

2013: Signed a minor league deal with Chicago on April 3 and was promoted on Aug. 3...went on to hit a career-best 11 home runs in 46 games with the Cubs, equaling the total he hit between the 2008, 2010-12 seasons (163 games, 355 at-bats)...batted .255 (38-149) with 8 doubles, 11 home runs and 23 RBI, producing an .849 OPS...played 40 games (34 starts) at third base...played 3 games (2 starts) at shortstop...was 9-for-27 (.333) with 4 home runs in "close and late" situations...posted a .314 average (16-51) with 6 HR in the 7th-inning-or-later...hit 4 HR in his first 27 at-bats as a Cub...had 2 multi-homer efforts: Aug. 7 in Philadelphia and Aug. 19 vs. Washington...his 2nd home run in Philly came with 2 out and 2 on in the 9th inning and broke a 2-2 tie...on Aug. 22 vs. Washington, belted a game-tying 2-run HR off Stephen Strasburg with 2 outs in the 9th inning...was his 8th HR in 16 games with Chicago...became first Cub since at least 1921 to hit 8 home runs in his first 16 games with the club...spent a majority of the season with Triple-A Iowa...was released by Milwaukee, March 27...hit .265 (80-302) with 18 doubles, 2 triples, 12 home runs and 41 RBI in 89 games with Iowa...saw action at shortstop (73 games), second base (7 games) and third base (5 games) while with Iowa...was on the seven-day DL, April 24-May 7, with a left knee strain...posted a 13-game hitting streak at Iowa, July 10-26 (.304, 17-56).

2012: Opened the season on Miami's big league club before a stop at Triple-A...batted .216 (25-116) with 6 doubles, 2 triples, 3 home runs and 12 RBI in 52 games with the Marlins covering 3 stints...hit .275 (19-69) against right-handed pitchers...placed on Miami's 15-day disabled list, Aug. 4-19, with a left hamstring strain...was designated for assignment, June 10...reported to Triple-A New Orleans, June 13...batted .302 (32-106) with 6 doubles, 13 home runs and 25 RBI in 33 games with New Orleans...recorded multi-homer games July 16 at Iowa and

July 24 vs. Omaha...**2011:** Missed majority of the season with a right wrist injury...hit .185 (17-92) with 4 doubles, a triple, 2 home runs and 9 RBI in 36 games with the Marlins before landing on the disabled list in late April...got the start Opening Day vs. the New York Mets, going 1-for-4...suffered a right wrist injury, April 29 at Cincinnati...landed on the 15-day disabled list the next day...transferred to the 60-day D.L., May 21...was reinstated, Sept. 5...**2010:** Led the Marlins in pinch hits (7), pinch-hit RBI (8) and pinch-hit batting average (.368)...played in just 29 games at the major league level in his first season with the Marlins...batted a career-high .318 (14-for-44) with six doubles, a triple, three home runs and 16 RBI at the big league level after his promotion...began season with New Orleans...homered in back-to-back games twice, May 8-9 at Omaha and May 28-29 vs. Oklahoma City...on New Orleans' seven-day D.L., April 21-May 2 with a left knee injury...had his contract purchased from New Orleans, July 3...hit a 2-run, walk-off homer July 19 off Colorado closer Huston Street...missed the rest of the season after being placed on the 60-day disabled list, Sept. 2, due to a dislocation of his right wrist the previous day vs. Washington...**2009:** In his lone season in the Baltimore organization, appeared in just 3 games with Triple-A Norfolk due to a left knee injury...went 2-for-9 (.222) with a home run before being sidelined in mid-April...placed on Norfolk's seven-day disabled list, April 13, with a left knee injury...activated Sept. 21 following the Triple-A season...was declared a minor league free agent at the end of the season...signed a one-year deal with Miami in December 2009...**2008:** Hit .184 (19-103) with 3 doubles, 3 home runs and 13 RBI in 46 big league games with the Athletics in 3 stints...recorded his first-career multi-homer game, April 24 vs. Minnesota...was on Oakland's 15-day disabled list, May 18-June 20, with right elbow inflammation...designated back to Sacramento, July 21...had his contract purchased by the big league club in September...went 0-for-2 in 4 games before being outrighted to Sacramento on October 3...**2007:** Split the season between Oakland's big league club and Sacramento (AAA)...saw action in 42 major league games over 4 stints...placed on Oakland's 15-day disabled list, Aug. 19-Sept. 3 with a strained rib cage...**2006:** In his final season with Kansas City organization, spent the entire campaign at Wichita (AA)...hit a 9th-inning grand slam for his first homer of the season, April 8 at Tulsa...placed on Wichita's seven-day D.L. twice: May 1-14 with a left thumb sprain and Aug. 8-25 with tendinitis in his right wrist...Traded to Oakland in late November for a cash considerations...**2005:** Began the season at Wichita before earning a promotion to the big league club on July 20...got the start that night and recorded his first career major league home run, a 2-run shot off Cleveland's C.C. Sabathia...placed on Kansas City's 15-day disabled list, Aug. 25 after fracturing a finger in his right hand...activated, Sept. 9...was on Wichita's seven-day disabled list, May 8-June 22 with a left ankle sprain...**2004:** Spent majority of the season at

Single-A Wilmington before making his major league debut as a September call-up...batted .185 (5-27) with 3 doubles and 3 RBI in 7 big league games...made his major league debut, Sept. 18 at Cleveland...recorded an infield single off Jeremy Guthrie for his first career big league hit...was a Carolina League All-Star at Wilmington...played for the Phoenix Desert Dogs in the Arizona Fall League following the season...**2003:** Appeared in a career-high 132 games with Burlington (A)...was named the 2003 Burlington Bees Player of the Year after setting a franchise record with 98 RBI...drew 65 walks with just 78 K's in 588 total plate appearances...**2002:** In his first professional season, Donnie batted .262 (60-229) with 32 runs, 16 doubles and 30 RBI in 61 games between Spokane (Short-A) and Burlington.

AMATEUR: Originally selected by the Kansas City Royals in the 5th round of the 2002 draft...attended Orange Coast Community College...graduated from Riverside Poly (Calif.) High School...named the 25th-best prospect in California by Baseball America in 2001...was a 2001 All-Star selection in the High School National Classic Tour...signed by Royals scout Gary Johnson.

CAREER: Pronounced HEHK-ter noh-eh-SEE...acquired by Texas in an April 12 trade with Seattle for a player to be named later or cash considerations, Noesi was initially added to the active roster on April 13...is in his 4th major league season...spent 2012 season primarily as a starter and set career highs in most categories...played for the World Team in the 2010 All-Star Futures Game...originally signed by New York-AL as a non-drafted free agent on Dec. 3, 2004.

2014: Made Mariners Opening Day roster and made 2 relief appearances before he was designated for assignment on April 4...acquired by Rangers in an April 12 trade and added to active roster on April 13.

2013: Was 0-1, 6.59 (20 ER/27.1 IP) in 12 appearances / one start over 4 stints with the Mariners...made a spot-start May 16 at NYY (ND, 4.1 IP, 3 H, 1 R-0 ER, 1 BB, 4 SO)...posted a 1.23 ERA (1 ER/7.1 IP) and a .167 opponents batting average (4-24) in his first 3 relief appearances, before closing the year with a 10.91 mark (19 ER/15.2 IP) and a .443 (35-79) opponents average (35x79) in his last 8 bullpen outings...finished year having lost 10 consecutive decisions dating back to May 12, 2012...was 4-3, 5.00 (43 ER/77.1 IP) in 17 games/13 starts with Tacoma (AAA) and Jackson (AA)...started the year with Jackson, going 1-0 with a 0.00 ERA (0 ER/11.0 IP)...named Southern League Pitcher of the Week (April 4-14)...pitched for Lacey in the Dominican Winter League (3-1, 2.30 ERA).

2012: Went 2-12 with a 5.82 ERA (69 ER, 106.2 IP) in 22 G/18 GS in his first season with the Mariners...ended the season in the bullpen after starting the year in the rotation...finished the season with a personal 9-game losing streak...in 18 starts went 2-12 with a 6.24 ERA (68 ER/98.0 IP)...in 4 relief appearances posted a 1.04 ERA (1 ER/8.2 IP) and limited opponents to a .179 batting average (5-28, 0 HR)...recorded the 2nd-lowest run support average in the A.L. at 3.40 (min. 15 GS)...Mariners scored one-or-fewer runs when he was in the game in 10 of 18 starts (0 runs 6 times)...pitched at least 2.0 innings in 3 of 4 relief appearances...went 2-for-2 for first ML hit June 24 at SD...became 2nd Mariners pitcher (3rd time) to record a multi-hit game; first since Freddy Garcia June 19, 2002 at CIN...made his first Safeco Field start April 14 vs. OAK, tossing 8.0 shutout innings...became the second Mariners pitcher to toss at least 8.0 innings and not allow a run in his first Safeco start (joining Felix Hernandez)...optioned to Tacoma (AAA) after his start July 4 vs. BAL...went 2-6, 5.74 ERA (41 ER, 64.1 IP) in 11 starts for the Rainiers...**2011:** Was 2-2 with a 4.47 ERA (28 ER/56.1 IP) in 30 appearances (2 GS) over 4 stints with the Yankees (4/13-21, 5/13-6/8, 6/12-8/28, 9/6-30)...among AL rookie relievers (relief appearances only), ranked 8th in innings (51.2) and ERA (4.01), and 11th in strikeouts (42)...made 28 relief

appearances, going 2-1 with a 4.01 ERA (23 ER/51.2 IP)...17 of his 28 relief appearances were scoreless...recalled from Scranton/W-B for the first time April 13-21, but did not appear in a game...earned the win in his ML debut May 18 in 15-inning win at BAL...tossed 4.0 scoreless innings of relief (4 H, 4 BB, 4 K)...became the first Yankees pitcher to win his MLB debut in relief while tossing at least 4.0 scoreless innings, and the first in MLB since Jim Brower for Cleveland (9/5/99)...made first MLB start Sept. 21 vs. TB (G1)...began the season with AAA Scranton/Wilkes-Barre...**2010:** Combined to go 14-7 with a 3.20 ERA in 28 G/27 GS with Tampa (High-A), Trenton (AA) and Scranton/Wilkes-Barre (AAA)...led all Yankees minor leaguers in wins and strikeouts (153), and ranked 7th in ERA...named a Florida State League All-Star and FSL Pitcher of the Week honors for April 8-19...promoted to Trenton on May 16...held opponents to 2 runs or less in 12 of 16 starts with the Thunder...collected first career complete game June 13 vs. Binghamton and first shutout June 29 at New Britain...earned Eastern League Pitcher of the Week honors for week ending June 7...selected to the World Team roster for the 2010 All-Star Futures Game, tossing 1.0 scoreless inning of relief...following the season, named the 7th-best prospect in the Yankees organization and pitcher with the "Best Control" by Baseball America...**2009:** Appeared in 26 total games (20 GS) with Charleston (A) and Tampa...began the season with 27.1 consecutive scoreless innings over his first 9 appearances (3 starts), with 35 K's and 3 BB...named a South Atlantic League midseason All-Star...on the disabled list from July 19-Aug. 2 with right shoulder tendinitis...made pair of postseason relief appearances for the FSL Champion Tampa squad, including earning the win in Game 1 of the Championship Series at Port Charlotte...**2008:** Combined to go 3-2 with a 3.33 ERA in 14 appearances (7 GS) with the GCL Yankees (rookie) and Staten Island (Short-A)...**2007:** Suffered season-ending right elbow strain June 23...limited to only 5 starts with Charleston (A)...began the season serving a 50-day suspension for violating the Minor League Drug Prevention and Treatment Program...**2006:** Limited to just 5 relief appearances with the GCL Yankees...on the DL with a strained right shoulder, June 18-July 31...**2005:** Made his professional debut with the DSL Yankees, going 5-3 with a 1.60 ERA in 13 games/10 starts.
