### OAKLAND ATHLETICS (13-6) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (12-8)

**ABOUT THE A'S:** Had their three-game winning streak snapped last night...the A's are the only team in the majors that has not lost back-to-back games in 2014...are 7-2 over the last nine games and 11-3 over the last 14...are 13-6 for the season, which is the best record in the American League and tied for second best in the majors...it matches the fifth best record after 19 games in Oakland history and is the best since the 1990 club started the year 14-5...are in first place in the American League West for the 10<sup>th</sup> consecutive day and lead second place Texas by 1½ games...have 11 days in sole possession of first place, one day tied for first, three days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...are 203-140 (.592) since the start of the 2012 season, which is tied with Atlanta for the best record in the majors over that span...it is eight games better than the next closest AL team (Texas, 196-149).

**CLOSE CALLS:** The A's fell to 4-2 (.667) in one-run games with the loss last night...all six of the A's losses this year have been by two runs or fewer and the A's are the only team in the majors that has not lost a game by more than two runs...eight of the A's first 19 games have been decided in the winning team's last at bat and Oakland is 5-3 in those games...are tied for the most last at bat wins (Milwaukee) and games (Chicago-AL) in the majors...have a Major League leading four wins when trailing after seven innings, which matches their season total from last year...have six come from behind wins, which is second most in the American League (Detroit, 7)...are 3-1 in extra inning games...lead the majors in extra inning wins and are tied for the lead in extra inning games.

**STARTING PITCHING:** A's starting pitchers have allowed three runs or fewer in 17 of the first 19 games and have a 2.65 ERA (34 er in 115.2 ip), which is the lowest mark in the American League and third lowest in the majors...have allowed six hits or fewer 16 times and have a .231 (103 for 446) opponents batting average, which is second lowest in the AL...have the lowest slugging percentage (.357) and on-base percentage (.283)...have issued the second fewest walks (28) and have the second most strikeouts (106)...have two 30-year olds (Scott Kazmir and Jesse Chavez) in the starting rotation at the same time for the first time since April of 2010 (Ben Sheets, Justin Duchscherer).

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 2.55 ERA, which is the lowest mark in the American League and second lowest in the majors (Atlanta, 2.32)...have the lowest opponents batting average (.217) and on-base percentage (.277) in the majors and the third lowest slugging percentage (.327)...have the third fewest walks in the AL (52)

**MONTH BY MONTH:** The A's are 13-5 (.722) in the month of April and need one more win to clinch a winning record in April for the second consecutive season (went 16-12 last year)...it would also clinch the A's 11<sup>th</sup> consecutive winning month dating back to June of 2012...that would tie for the second longest such streak in Oakland history (July, 1989-May 1991)...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept., 1970-Sept. 1972

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** The A's did not commit an error last night, ending their streak of nine consecutive games with an error...are now 3-3 when going errorless compared to 10-3 when making one or more errors...have 20 errors for the season, which is the most in the American League and third most in the majors...A's first basemen have committed six of those errors after tallying just nine all last year...have turned just nine double plays, which is tied with Kansas City for the fewest in the majors.

**ON THE BASES:** The A's stole a season-high three bases last night and have been successful in each of their last 10 stolen base attempts...are 14 for 15 (93.3%) for the season, which is the best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 17 of their 19 (89.5%) attempts, which is the highest percentage in the American League and fourth highest in the majors.

**OFFENSE:** The A's are batting .291 (67 for 230) with 36 runs scored and eight home runs over the last six games...have 22 home runs for the season, which is tied for third in the American League...13 have come with runners on base, eight have put the A's ahead and six have come in the ninth inning or later...also rank second in the AL in walks (91), third in on-base percentage (.344) and fourth in slugging (.409) and runs scored (90)...have the second fewest grounded into double plays (11).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 3-1 on this six-game homestand against Houston (3-0) and Texas (0-1)...are 6-4 at home for the season...this homestand is part of a 25-game stretch from April 7 to May 4 where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of their 25 games on the road...are 10-3 over the first 13 games of that stretch...leave for a 10-game road trip to Houston (four games), Texas (three games) and Boston (three games) following the game tomorrow...went 7-2 on the first road trip to Minnesota (3-0), Seattle (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...have the best road record in the AL and second best in the majors (Milwaukee, 9-1)...this marks the first time the A's have won the first three road series of the season since 1990...the A's 7-2 start matches the A's best start on the road over the last 24 years (also 2008).

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's are 7-3 during this stretch of 19 consecutive games against American League West competition (April 11-30) and are 9-4 against the West for the season...have the second best intra-division record in the AL (Texas, 6-2)...have five pinch-walks, which is tied for second in the majors and three more than any other AL team...are 3-1 in games started by a left-handed pitcher and the four games against south paws are tied for the fewest in the AL...are 8-1 in day games, which is the best record in the majors...have not used a rookie, marking their longest stretch without a rookie on the roster since 2006 when they had no rookies for the first 36 days of the season (April 3-May 8)...the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 16 minutes.

**SCORING CHANGE:** In the A's vs. Mariners game on April 12, Sonny Gray was originally charged with an error on a pickoff attempt in the sixth inning...that has been changed to an error on Brandon Moss.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have five players on the disabled list (Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Rodriguez)...O'Flaherty and Parker are both on the 60-day DL...Rodriguez is on a rehab assignment with Sacramento...have used the DL seven times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

**A's vs. RANGERS:** The A's lost the first meeting of 2014 last night after winning the season series last year, 10-9...went 4-5 in Oakland and 6-4 in Texas...it was the A's second consecutive season series win over the Rangers after losing five of the previous six...are 21-18 (.538) over the last three years...are 313-325 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 167-152 in Oakland and 146-173 in Texas...have an all-time record of 410-407 against the Rangers/Senators.

#### TODAY'S TIDBITS

**Coco Crisp** stole his 146<sup>th</sup> and 147<sup>th</sup> bases as an Athletic last night, which moves him past Carney Lansford for fourth in Oakland history and 10<sup>th</sup> in Athletics history...**Josh Donaldson** is tied for the American League lead in go-ahead RBI (6)...**Brandon Moss** has a .673 career slugging percentage against Texas, which is third best among players with 100 or more plate appearances against the Rangers...**Dan Otero** has not allowed a home run in 61.2 career innings.

#### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1916** Jack Nabors defeats Boston 6-2 to even his season record at 1-1...he would go on to lose 19 consecutive games to set the Athletics franchise record...in **1969** Rollie Fingers tosses the first of his two career shutouts, a five-hitter in the A's 7-0 win at Minnesota...in **1984** Dave Kingman homers twice but the A's lose to Dennis Eckersley at Boston, 12-8...in **2003** Miguel Tejada hits a walk-off home run in the bottom of the 11<sup>th</sup> inning as the A's defeat Detroit, 6-5.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Tommy Milone (0-1, 4.09 ERA)

**BRIEFLY:** Was on the A's Opening Day roster but did not make his first appearance of the season until starting April 11 at Seattle in game 10...was scheduled to start April 5 against the Mariners...however, his turn in the rotation was skipped after the game of April 4 was postponed due to a wet field.

**DEFENSIVE DOINGS:** Opponents have reached base on an error twice with him pitching, which is tied for third most in the American League...that has led to three unearned runs, which is tied for fifth in the AL...last year, opponents reached base on an error 11 times with him pitching, which was the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors...that led to 11 unearned runs, which tied for second most in the AL...opponents have now reached base via error 24 times over the last three years, which is the most in the majors (Jordan Lyles, 23)...has 25 unearned runs over that span, which is tied for fourth in the majors.

**FIRST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-4 loss at Seattle April 11...allowed a RBI single to Cano in the first and two unearned runs in the second on errors by Donaldson and Lowrie...surrendered a two-run home run to Zunino in the sixth and left trailing 5-0...Hernandez shutout the A's three hits over the seven innings.

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss at Los Angeles (AL) last Wednesday...allowed a run in the third inning on a Trout RBI double, but the A's scored four times in the fourth to take a 4-1 lead...put the first two batters on base in the seventh inning and was relieved by Otero, who allowed both runners to score...Gregerson allowed a run in the ninth for the blown save.

**2013 RECAP:** Spent the first four months of the season in the starting rotation but split the final two months of the year between the bullpen, rotation and minor leagues...was 12-9 with a 4.14 ERA in 28 games, 26 starts...had a .258 opponents batting average and .301 on-base percentage, which were the lowest marks of his career...had career highs in ERA (4.14), walks (39) and home runs (25) and matched his high in extra base hits (59).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His opponents batting average included a .247 (121-for-489) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .298 (39-for-131) against left-handers...surrendered 21 of his 25 home runs to righties, which tied for fourth most in the American League...18 of the home runs were solo shots and 14 came in the first two innings of a game...allowed a .216 batting average with runners in scoring position, which ranked eighth in the AL...opponents batted .299 with a .541 slugging percentage when leading off an inning...has allowed a .318 batting average and .554 slugging percentage in that situation in his career.

**STARTING AND RELIEVING:** Was 12-9 with a 4.17 ERA and .261 opponents batting average in his 26 starts, 0-0 with a 3.00 ERA and .100 opponents average in his two relief appearances...did not inherit a runner in his two relief appearances and retired both of his first batters faced.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Was 5-4 with a 3.44 ERA in 12 games at home compared to 7-5 with a 4.69 ERA in 16 games on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 12-8 with a 3.02 ERA (56 er in 166.2 ip) in 27 games in Oakland compared to 13-12 with a 4.72 ERA (100 er in 190.2 ip) in 34 games on the road.

**BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK:** Went 8-8 with a 4.24 ERA before the All-Star Break, 4-1 with a 3.86 ERA after the break...is now 16-15 before the break compared to 10-5 after the break.

**DIVISIONS AND INTERLEAGUE:** Compiled a 3-1 record and a 1.98 ERA in eight games against AL Central teams...is now 9-2 with a 1.97 ERA (22 er in 100.2 ip) in 17 career appearances against the Central...was 3-1 despite a 5.68 ERA in five interleague starts...is now 4-1 with a 6.02 ERA (29 er in 43.1 ip) in eight interleague starts in his career.

**RUN SUPPORT:** Received just 10 runs of support in his nine losses (1.78 RSA)...has received just 22 runs of support in his 20 losses in three seasons with the A's (114.0 ip, 1.74 RSA)...has received no support 10 times over the last three years as a starter and one run of support eight times...went 11-1 with three runs of support or more in 2013 and is 20-3 in his career.

**THIS AND THAT:** The A's were 16-10 (.615) in his 26 starting assignments and are 36-23 (.611) in his career...his teams are 41-23 (.641) in his 64 career starts.

**MORE 2013 WITH OAKLAND:** Won each of his first three starts to become the first pitcher on an A's Opening Day roster to win each of his first three starts since Dave Stewart had six wins in his first six starts in 1990...that extended his winning streak to five games dating back to 2012...had never won more than two consecutive games in his career...matched his career-high with 10 strikeouts and did not walk a batter May 1 against Los Angeles (AL)...has three career 10-strikeout games and has not walked a batter in any of those contests...is the first A's pitcher since 1916 with three career games of 10 or more strikeouts and no walks...was 9-9 with a 4.39 ERA in 22 starts when he was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento Aug. 3...made two starts with the River Cats before returning to Oakland Aug. 18...tossed a rain-shortened five-inning complete game in his second start Aug. 27 at Detroit...it matched the shortest complete game in Oakland history...was 1-0 with a 2.79 ERA in two starts before he was optioned to Single-A Stockton Aug. 28...returned to Oakland Sept. 3 and went 2-0 with a 2.70 ERA in four games, including two starts...began his career with 60 consecutive starts before making the first relief appearance of his career Sept. 11 at Minnesota (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 so).

**MILONE vs. TEXAS:** Is 1-4 with a 5.06 ERA (32.0 ip, 44 h, 25 r, 18 er, 3 bb, 21 so, 6 hr) in six career starts...is 0-1 with a 14.73 ERA (6 er in 3.2 ip) in one start in Oakland and 1-3 with a 3.72 ERA (12 er in 29.0 ip) in five starts in Texas...was 1-2 with a 8.36 ERA (14.0 ip, 23 h, 13 r, 13 er, 2 bb, 8 so, 3 hr) in three starts last year...took the loss in his first start, a 9-4 decision at Texas June 19...allowed a two-run home run to Berkman in the second inning but the A's scored three times in the fifth to take a 3-2 lead...yielded two runs in the bottom of the fifth on a Kinsler sacrifice fly and a Cruz fielders choice...was relieved by Otero with runners on first and second and one out in the sixth and both runners scored...also lost by an 8-3 score in Oakland on August 2...the A's scored two runs in the first but he allowed a two-run home run to Cruz in the bottom of the first...allowed two more runs in the third on a fielder choice and Pierzynski RBI single, and two in the fourth on a two-run home run by Profar...then picked up the win in the A's 5-1 victory at Texas September 15...was a last minute replacement for Jarrod Parker, who was scratched before the game, and tossed 5.0 innings...the A's scored twice in the first and he allowed a RBI single to Pierzynski in the bottom of the first...that was the only run he would allow as he blanked the Rangers on three hits and a walk over his final four innings.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

**RHP Sonny Gray (3-0, 1.80 ERA):** Has won each of his first three decisions and now has a six-game winning streak dating back to September 11 of last year, an on-going career high...is 6-0 with a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch...has won each of his three starts this year against American League West competition and is now 5-1 with a 1.64 ERA in nine career games against AL West foes compared to 3-2 with a 3.71 ERA in seven games against everyone else...won his third consecutive start in the A's 11-3 win over Houston last Friday here in Oakland (6.0 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...has never faced the Rangers in his career...went 0-1 with a 3.48 ERA in six starts this spring...yielded just one home run in 20.2 innings...spent most of the 2013 season at Triple-A Sacramento where he was 10-7 with a 3.42 ERA in 20 starts...also had two stints with the A's...after making two relief appearances in his Major League debut in July, he returned to Oakland Aug. 10 and finished the season in the starting rotation.

- The A's bullpen has yielded just 10 runs over the last 16 games (55.0 ip, 1.64 ERA) and now has a 2.39 ERA for the season, which is the second lowest in the American League...has allowed one run over its last 11.0 innings (0.82 ERA).
- Bullpen has been credited with the decision in six of the A's last eight games (4-2)...its 10 decisions this season are tied for the most among Major League bullpens (Texas).
- Its six wins are tied for the most in the majors.
- Its five blown saves are tied for the second most in the majors.
- Ranks first in the majors in opponents batting average (.190), on-base percentage (.264), and slugging percentage (.270).

- Has a 1.32 ERA (4 er in 27.1 ip) in 26 career appearances in April.
- Was placed on the DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...had a two-game rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton April 3-5 (1.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 10.80 ERA).
- Did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring.

## WEDNESDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (3-0, 1.80 ERA)

**WINNING STREAK:** Has won each of his first three decisions and is one of **six** undefeated American League pitchers with at least three wins...is **red tied for the AL lead** in wins...now has a six-game winning streak dating back to September 11 of last year, an on-going career high...is 6-0 with a 2.35 ERA (12 er in 46.0 ip) over that eight-start stretch...has allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings...the streak is **red tied for second longest in the majors among active pitchers (Ziegler, ARI 7)**.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has not allowed a home run over his first four starts and 25.0 innings pitched...his innings pitched are **red fourth** most in the American League among pitchers with no home runs allowed...has surrendered just four home runs in 89.0 career innings (0.40 per nine innings)...has yielded a .176 (6 for 34) average with runners in scoring position...has a .188 (6 for 32) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .288 (19 for 66) after that.

**INNING BY INNING:** Has allowed four of his seven runs this year over the first three innings of a game...last year, he yielded 20 of his 22 runs over the first three innings of a game...in his career, he has a 4.07 ERA (19 er in 42.0 ip), .275 (47 for 171) opponents batting average and four home runs allowed in innings one through three compared to a 0.96 ERA (5 er in 47.0 ip), .176 (29 for 165) opponents average and no home runs from the fourth inning on...has not allowed a run after the fifth inning (22.2 ip).

**THE WEST AND THE REST:** Has won each of his three starts this year against American League West competition after a no decision against Cleveland in his first start...is now 5-1 with a 1.64 ERA (10 er in 55.0 ip) in nine career games against American League West competition compared to 3-2 with a 3.71 ERA (14 er in 34.0 ip) in seven games against everyone else.

**THIS AND THAT:** Has issued eight of his nine walks this year and 23 of his 29 in his career to left-handed hitters...received 10 runs of support in his last start after getting eight runs total over his first three starts...his season RSA is 6.48 (18 rs in 25.0 ip) and his career RSA as a starter is 7.20 (68 rs in 85.0 ip)...the A's are 3-1 (.750) in his starting assignments this year and are 9-5 (.643) when he starts in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 10 of his 14 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer 10 times.

**FIRST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss to Cleveland on Opening Night March 31...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...allowed five hits while walking a career-high tying three...retired the side in order just once, the third inning...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom).

**SECOND START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 win over Seattle April 6 in Oakland...did not allow a run in the first inning to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings (previous: 13.0, August 10-20, 2013)...was charged with two unearned runs in the second inning (Barton error) when he allowed RBI singles to Almonte and Miller...also allowed a RBI single to Smoak in the third to give the Mariners a 3-0 lead but the A's tied the game on a Moss three-run homer in the bottom of the third...retired 11 of the final 12 batters he faced, including each of the last seven, and the A's scored twice in the fifth to take the lead for good.

**THIRD START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 win at Seattle April 12...struck out a career-high tying nine batters...allowed back-to-back singles to Almonte and Miller to start the game before retiring 11 straight...Almonte scored on a Cano ground out, but that would be the only run he would allow in seven innings...blanked the Mariners on three hits and two walks over his final six innings.

**LAST START:** He won his third consecutive start in the A's 11-3 win over Houston last Friday in Oakland...allowed a career-high nine hits...the A's scored seven times in the first inning and he blanked the Astros on three hits and a walk over the first four innings...allowed three runs in the fifth on RBI singles by Fowler and Springer and a sacrifice fly by Carter.

**2013 RECAP:** Spent most of the season at Triple-A Sacramento where he was 10-7 with a 3.42 ERA in 20 starts...also had two stints with the A's...after making two relief appearances in his Major League debut in July, he returned to Oakland Aug. 10 and finished the season in the starting rotation...was 5-3 with a 2.67 ERA in 12 games, 10 starts, with the A's...also went 0-1 with a 2.08 ERA in two ALDS starts against Detroit...based upon a minimum of 60 innings pitched, he had the lowest opponents on-base percentage among American League rookies (.272), ranked second in opponents batting average (.214) and slugging percentage (.298) and third in ERA...struck out 67 batters in 64.0 innings and his average of 9.42 strikeouts per nine innings was second best (Allen, CLE 11.26)...walked 20 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.35...went 4-1 with a 2.27 ERA and .230 opponents batting average over his final six starts...won each of his final three decisions beginning Sept. 11, the first time he put together consecutive wins in his career...had surgery for a fractured left thumb following the season...the surgery, an internal fixation with a screw to repair the thumb fracture, was performed by Dr. Thomas Graham at the Cleveland Clinic Hospital Oct. 18.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Was 3-1 with a 1.99 ERA in six starts in Oakland compared to 2-2 with a 3.86 ERA in six games, four starts, on the road.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His opponents batting average included a .198 (20-for-101) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .226 (31-for-137) against left-handers...allowed a .194 opponents batting average to hitters leading off an inning...surrendered one double (.210 slugging percentage) and issued just four walks (.242 on-base percentage).

**STARTING AND RELIEVING:** Compiled a 5-3 record and a 2.85 ERA in his nine starts...did not allow a run in his two relief appearances (4.0 ip)...did not inherit a runner and retired both of his first batters faced in relief.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Was 2-1 with a 1.72 ERA in seven games at night compared to 3-2 with a 3.95 ERA in five starts during the day.

**DAYS REST:** Was 3-1 with a 1.57 ERA in five starts on five days rest or more, 2-2 with a 4.02 ERA in five starts on four days rest.

**WITH SACRAMENTO:** Won a career-high 10 games with the River Cats...also finished with a career-high 118 strikeouts...the wins tied for fifth in the Pacific Coast League and the strikeouts tied for seventh...was also fourth in ERA (3.42) and tied for fifth in complete games (1)...led the league in strikeouts per nine innings (8.97)...ranked fourth in the A's farm system in ERA, tied for fifth in wins and sixth in strikeouts...was named the A's organization Minor League Pitcher of the year and was also a *Baseball America's* Triple-A All-Star...surrendered just five home runs in 118.1 innings, an average of 0.38 per nine innings...had a 4.74 ERA over the first three innings of a game, 1.54 from innings four through six and 6.23 from the seventh inning on.

## THURSDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (2-0, 1.65 ERA)

**AMONG THE LEADERS:** Ranks **third** in the American League in opponents batting average (.173) and is **eighth** in ERA (1.65)...also has the **third** lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.214) and the **sixth** lowest slugging percentage (.265)...is **tied for sixth** in strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.00) and is averaging the **seventh** fewest walks per nine innings (1.32).

**2-0:** Has started the season 2-0 for the second time in his career (also 2009)...has never started the season 3-0...is now 4-0 with a 1.34 ERA (6 er in 40.1 ip) over his last six starts dating back to September 28, 2013.

**LAST 22 STARTS:** Has not allowed a run in two of his four starts this year and has yielded one run or fewer in 10 of his last 22 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...is 9-5 with a 2.76 ERA (40 er in 130.1 ip) over that span...has held the opposition to a .226 (111 for 492) batting average...has walked 28 (1.93 per nine innings) and struck out 131 in 130.1 innings (9.05 per nine innings) for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.68...has yielded just eight home runs (0.55 per nine innings).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His opponents batting average includes a .152 (12 for 79) mark against right-handers, which ranks **fifth** in the American League...has issued all four of his walks to righties...opponents are 1 for 27 (.037) with no walks and a hit by pitch when leading off an inning...the batting average is the **lowest in the majors as is his** .071 on-base percentage...has allowed a .105 (2 for 19) average with runners in scoring position, which is **tied for eighth** in the AL.

**NIGHT AND DAY:** Is scheduled to make his first start during a night game this year...last year, he went 5-2 with a 3.27 ERA in 10 starts during the day compared to 5-7 with a 4.46 ERA in 19 starts at night...is now 7-2 with a 2.73 ERA (25 er in 82.1 ip) in 14 starts during the day over the last two years.

**THIST AND THAT:** The A's have won each of his four starting assignments...has tossed at least six innings in all four starts, allowed three runs or fewer in each start and issued no walks in three of his starts.

**FIRST START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win over Cleveland in the day game April 2 against Cleveland...tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut.

**SECOND START:** He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-3 win at Minnesota April 7...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Hicks in the second...the A's scored three times in the third but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the third on a Kubel RBI double and a Suzuki RBI ground out...then retired 11 of the final 13 batters he faced.

**THIRD START:** He combined with Abad, Otero, Gregerson and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Seattle April 13...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed two of the hits but had a no decision as the A's scored twice in the eighth and once in the ninth...retired each of the first 10 batters, allowed back to back singles to Miller and Cano with one out in the fourth, and then retired each of the final eight batters.

**LAST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win over Houston last Saturday in Oakland...allowed his first home run of the season, a solo shot by Villar in the third inning...also allowed a RBI single to Dominguez in the fourth and an unearned run in the fifth when Villar scored on a Norris throwing error following a steal of third...left trailing 3-1 but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the ninth for the win.

**KAZMIR vs. HOUSTON:** Is 1-1 with a 4.13 ERA (24.0 ip, 22 h, 12 r, 11 er, 6 bb, 26 so, 5 hr) in four career starts...including a win in his only start this year (see last start above)...went 1-0 with a 5.23 ERA (10.1 ip, 12 h, 6 r, 6 er, 4 bb, 14 so) in two starts with Cleveland last year...had a no decision in a 19-6 win at Houston April 20...left after 3.1 innings with a 15-6 lead and did not get the win...then tossed 7.0 shutout innings for the win September 21 at Cleveland, a 4-1 victory...allowed just four hits and one walk while striking out 10...his other start came in 2008 at Houston.

**RHP Jesse Chavez (1-0, 1.38 ERA):** Has allowed one earned run in each of his first four starts and has a 1.38 ERA, which ranks **fifth** in the American League...is the only pitcher on an Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1914 to begin the season with four consecutive starts of six or more innings and one earned run or fewer...ranks **sixth** in the American League in opponents on-base percentage (.235), **eighth** in strikeout to walk ratio (5.60) and **ninth** in strikeouts per nine innings (9.69)...he picked up his first career win as a starter in his last start last Sunday in Oakland, a 4-1 win over Houston (6.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 6 so)...is now 1-0 with a 1.05 ERA in 16 career appearances against the Astros, including one start...went 5-1 with a save and a 2.22 ERA in seven games, five starts, this spring...the five wins were the most in the majors and the most by an A's pitcher since spring win totals are available beginning in 1990...ranked second in the Cactus League in innings pitched (28.1), fourth in strikeouts (25) and eighth in ERA.



## FRIDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (1-0, 1.38 ERA)

**ONE EARNED RUN OR FEWER:** Has allowed one earned run in each of his first four starts and has a 1.38 ERA, which ranks **fifth** in the American League...is the only pitcher on an Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1914 to begin the season with four consecutive starts of six or more innings and one earned run or fewer...Brett Anderson did it in 2012 after coming off the DL in August (Aug. 21-Sept. 8)...the last AL pitcher to begin the season with five consecutive starts of six innings or more and one earned run or fewer is Dennis Leonard (KC) in 1986...prior to this year, had made just two career starts, both with Toronto in 2012...had a loss and a 10.38 ERA in those two outings...is now 1-1 with a 3.63 ERA (14 er in 34.2 ip) in six career starts...had 54 career starts as a minor leaguer...made 23 starts over the previous two seasons after starting just once from 2005-11.

**STRIKEOUTS AND WALKS:** Has struck out 28 and walked just five in 26.0 innings...ranks **eighth** in the American League in strikeout to walk ratio (5.60) and is **ninth** in strikeouts per nine innings (9.69)...has issued all five of his walks to left-handed hitters...did not walk a batter and struck out nine in back-to-back starts April 9 and 14...joins Dan Haren (August 21-26, 2007) as the only two Athletics pitchers since at least 1914 to strikeout nine or more in back-to-back starts without issuing a walk.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Ranks **sixth** in the American League in opponents on-base percentage (.235)...opponents are 5 for 26 (.192) with no walks when leading off an inning...the .192 on-base percentage is **fifth** lowest among AL pitchers with enough innings to qualify for the ERA title...also ranks **sixth** among AL qualifiers with a .143 (5 for 35) opponents batting average with runners on base and **ninth** with a .118 (2 for 17) average with runners in scoring position...has allowed three home runs, all solo shots.

**FIRST START:** He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 12-inning win over Seattle April 3 in Oakland...was charged with an unearned run in the first inning when Almonte reached on a Callaspo error, went to second on a Punto error, third on a Miller fly out and scored on a Cano ground out...also allowed a RBI single to Almonte in the fifth to make the score 2-0...the A's scored single runs in the fifth and eighth to tie the game.

**SECOND START:** He had a no decision in the A's 7-4, 11-inning win at Minnesota April 9...struck out a career-high nine in a career-high 7.0 innings...the A's scored four times in the first inning and he allowed a solo home run to Kubel to lead off the second...that was the only run he would allow in his seven innings and he was relieved by Doolittle to start the eighth with a 4-1 lead...Doolittle allowed a run in the eighth and Johnson two in the ninth.

**THIRD START:** He had his third consecutive no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Los Angeles (AL) April 14...matched his career high with nine strikeouts and 7.0 innings pitched for the second consecutive start...allowed an unearned run in the first inning when Calhoun singled, went to second on a passed ball and scored on a Pujols single...allowed a solo home run to Pujols in the third and left after seven innings trailing 2-1.

**LAST START:** He picked up his first career win as a starter in the A's 4-1 win over Houston last Sunday in Oakland...blanked the Astros on three hits and two walks over the first three innings before Gonzalez homered with two outs in the fourth...then retired seven of the final eight batters he faced...tossed a career-high 103 pitches.

**2013 RECAP:** Spent most of the season with the A's and was 2-4 with a save and a career-low 3.92 ERA in 35 games over two stints...the save was the first of his career and he also struck out a career-high 55 batters...also had career lows in opponents batting average (.230), on-base percentage (.302) and slugging percentage (.318)...matched his career highs in wild pitches (5) and hit batters (3)...surrendered just three home runs in 57.1 innings, an average of 0.47 per nine innings...entered the season with 34 home runs in 177.1 career innings (1.73 per nine innings).

**BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK:** Had a 2.97 ERA and .210 opponents batting average in 18 games before the All-Star Break...then compiled a 5.25 ERA and .258 opponents average in 17 games after the break.

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His opponents batting average included a .212 (21-for-99) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .246 (29-for-118) against left-handers...yielded all three of his home runs to right-handers but issued 14 of his 20 walks to lefties...allowed a .167 batting average with runners in scoring position and two outs...had a .269 batting average over his first 15 pitches in a game, .193 after that...opponents hit .333 with a .418 on-base percentage when leading off an inning.

**MORE 2013 WITH OAKLAND:** Was recalled from Sacramento April 20 and appeared in just three games during his first stint...had a 6.23 ERA and .350 opponents batting average when he was optioned to Sacramento April 29...returned May 10 and spent the remainder of the season with Oakland...had a career-high 12.2-inning scoreless streak from May 15 to June 13...capped his scoreless streak by tossing 5.2 scoreless innings of relief June 13 against New York (AL) for his first win in the A's 3-2, 18-inning victory over the Yankees...it was the longest relief appearance of his career and the longest outing by an A's reliever since Lenny DiNardo tossed 6.0 innings Aug. 2, 2008 against Boston...tossed 4.0 scoreless innings for his first career save in a 10-4 win at Kansas City July 7...it was the fourth four-inning save by an A's reliever since 1991, the first since Chad Gaudin May 4, 2006 against Cleveland...was on the A's roster for the ALDS against Detroit but did not appear in a game.

**2013 WITH SACRAMENTO:** Was used exclusively as a starter with Sacramento and went 2-2 with a 2.70 ERA in five starts...allowed just one home run in 30.0 innings...walked five batters, an average of 1.50 per nine innings...struck out 26 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 5.20...yielded a .285 opponents batting average, including .240 (18-for-75) against right-handed hitters compared to .354 (17-for-48) against left-handers...went 1-1 with a 2.45 ERA in three starts before he was called up by Oakland the first time April 20...that included a season-high nine strikeout game for his first win, April 15 at Reno...logged a 1-1 record and a 3.09 ERA in two starts during his second stay with the River Cats from April 29 to May 9.

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.

## LUKE GREGERSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.
