



## Texas Rangers (13-8) at Oakland Athletics (13-7)

LHP Martin Perez (3-0, 1.86) vs. RHP Sonny Gray (3-0, 1.80)

**WINS AND LOSSES:** The Rangers are 2-0 on this 6-game, 7-day road trip to Oakland (2-0) and Seattle (3 G) with an off day tomorrow...went 7-3 on 10-game, 10-day homestand that preceded this trip...club has won 2 straight, 7 of 8, and 8 of 10 since a 5-6 start...team is season-high 5 games above .500 for the first time...at 13-8 (.619), club's winning pct. ranks 2nd in A.L. to the A's, and the 13 wins are tied with OAK for league lead...is 4th best record in MLB, T2nd-most wins in majors...Rangers' longest losing streak is 2 games (once-April 4-5)...club was 14-7 through 21 G in 2013, and won the next game...current 13-8 start is fewest wins thru 21 G since 2010 (10-11)...team enters the day a season best-matching half-game behind division-leading Oakland, tied for smallest deficit in 2014 (also -0.5 GB on April 3)...team is in sole possession of 2nd place in the A.L. West for a 7th straight day.

• The Rangers' **9-3 (.750) record over the last 12 games (since 4/11) is best in the majors, MLB-high 9 wins in that span as well.**

• After securing a series win this week, Rangers have won a road series for the first time in '14 and have now won 4 consecutive series overall.

**WITH A WIN TODAY:** Texas could...

- Move into sole possession of first place in the A.L. West, which would be club's first time atop the division since 9/5/13 (+0.5 GA).
- Own A.L.'s best record and be league's first team to 14 wins.
- Win all games of a series for the first time in '14, and do so against Oakland for the first time since Aug. 12-14, 2011 (3 G) here at the Coliseum.
- Improve to 5-2 in series finales in '14.

**ANOTHER (VERY) LATE WIN:** The Rangers won last night for the 2nd time this season when trailing with 2 outs in the 9th inning (also 4/16 vs. SEA)...Rangers have scored and won in 9 innings both times, this after no such wins (trailing in 9th, 2 outs, win in 9) since 7/9/11 vs. OAK when Josh Hamilton hit a walk-off 2-R HR off Andrew Bailey...before last night, Rangers had not won such a game on the road since 6/15/10 at Florida, when Matt Treanor hit a 2-run triple in the 9th to win it.

**ALL NIGHT:** In both games in this series, Texas has scored the decisive run in the 8th or 9th inning...Texas games have been decided in the winning team's final at-bat in 8 of 21 contests in 2014 (Rangers 5-3 in those games), and have been decided in 7th-or-later 10 times (7-3).

• Rangers' 3 wins when trailing after 8 innings lead the majors and are the most for Texas in a single season since 2011 (3)...team had 5 such wins in 2010...the other 29 MLB teams have a total of 13 wins when trailing thru 8.

**ANOTHER ONE-RUN WIN:** Rangers have posted one-run wins in each of the first 2 games of this series, and are now 7-2 this season in one-run games in 2014...tied with Pittsburgh (7-4) for most one-run wins in MLB, while 9 one-run games are T3rd in majors behind SF (12) and PIT (11).

**JOSH WILSON** had a game-tying RBI double in the 9th last night...he became the first Ranger to start in the 9-hole and post a game-tying or go-ahead RBI hit in the 9th inning since David Murphy on 8/14/11 here at the Coliseum...Murphy had a tie-breaking 2-out single in the 9th off Andrew Bailey to score Craig Gentry after Gentry pinch-ran and stole 2nd base...it was the decisive run in a 7-6 Texas victory.

**9TH-INNING RUNS:** The Rangers scored twice in the 9th last night to win it...while the club has just 11 runs in the 9th this season, offense has scored runs in 7 of the 16 games in which Rangers have batted in the 9th...the 7 instances are tied for the MLB lead with 4 other clubs: Chicago-AL, Cleveland, Los Angeles-AL, and Washington.

**RELIEF WINS REIGN:** Last night's win for Alexi Ogando was the Rangers' MLB-high 7th relief victory, as the bullpen now has more wins than the rotation (6)...and MLB-high 10 different pitchers have accounted for the Rangers' 13 victories.

**MARTIN PEREZ** starts today for the Rangers...in his last outing on Friday vs. Chicago-AL, he pitched his first career complete game shutout and matched his career high with 8 K's (3rd time)...it was just the 5th 3-H-rolls SHO for the club in the last 16 years...the last SHO on 3-hits-or-less by a Ranger in Arlington was Doug Davis on 4/11/02 vs. OAK (2-hitter).

• Perez is 10-3 in 15 starts since last Aug. 1, tied with 4 others for most wins in MLB in that span: Zack Greinke, Joe Kelly, James Shields and Adam Wainwright.

• Perez enters today with consecutive starts of 8.0+ scoreless innings, first Ranger to do that since C.J. Wilson (Sept. 2011) and Derek Holland (July 2011)...prior to 2011, last instance by a Ranger had been by Ed Correa in 1986.

• He owns the longest active road winning streak (6) in the A.L., 2nd-longest in the majors (Greinke, 9).

**MICHAEL CHOICE** had the go-ahead RBI hit in the 9th last night against his former team...he was in his 25th career game in the majors last night, and started in the leadoff slot for the Rangers for the first time...Choice is the 5th batter to hit leadoff in the Ron Washington era in Texas (since 2007) within his first 25 games in the majors...others to do it were Joaquin Arias (2008), Julio Borbon (2009), Craig Gentry (2010), and Jurickson Profar (2013).

**DONNIE'S TURN:** Donnie Murphy made his first start as the designated hitter for Texas last night, the 7th different Ranger to start at DH in 2014...Murphy went 2-for-3 with an RBI in the game, as Texas DH's are now batting a league-best .341 (28-82) with one HR, 10 doubles, a triple, and 15 RBI.

**ON THE ROAD:** Rangers are 4-4 on the road this season, with 5 of those 8 games decided in the 8th-or-later (3-2 in those contests)...the Rangers were leading in the 8th inning in those 2 losses, only to see the home team score multiple runs in the bottom of the 8th for the last at-bat win.

**VS. OAKLAND:** The Rangers lead the season series 2-0 after last night's victory...Texas plays Oakland in 6 of 9, as A's visit Arlington next Monday-Wednesday...Rangers have finished 2nd to A's in the A.L. West in 2 straight years, going a combined 19-21 against Oakland since the start of 2012...lost season series last year, 9-10...despite winning first 2 G in this series, have dropped 4 of 6 and 6 of last 10...Rangers have a 32-27 overall edge since 2011...going back to September 2010, Rangers have gone 6-4-1 in last 11 series at the Coliseum (including this week's series win), as club has now taken 3 of 4 series here since start of 2013...Rangers lead all-time series 326-313, and A's have 168-152 edge in Oakland.

**VS. A.L. WEST:** Texas has gone 7-2 against A.L. West clubs in 2014...team is in a span in which 19 of 22 are against West opponents through May 4, and club is 5-1 vs. West so far in that stretch...Rangers have gone 60-25 (.706) in division games since the start of last year (53-23 in 2013), easily the best record by any MLB team against division foes in that span.

**FLYING TOWARDS THE GREAT NORTHWEST:** The Rangers are scheduled to fly to Seattle after today's game and have an off day there tomorrow before a 3-game weekend series with the Mariners...Rangers took last 3 of 4 from the M's in Arlington last week to win the series...have won 3 straight, 6 of 7, 7 of 9, and 13 of last 19 vs. M's and are 40-21 since start of 2011, 74-44 since start of 2008...Rangers have taken season series with M's in 6 straight and 9 of last 10 seasons...Rangers are 24-14 (.632) at Safeco since the start of 2010, highest winning pct. of any A.L. West team and 3rd-best among clubs with 12+ games at Safeco in that span...the only team with more wins than Texas (24) at Safeco since the start of 2010 is Seattle...entering the 3-game set, Texas is 14-12-2 in last 28 series at Safeco after going 0-11-2 in first 13 series at the park.

**MISCELLANEOUS:** Rangers are 3-3 in day games with a pair of shut-outs...will have Thursday off (tomorrow) for 3rd time in 4 chances in '14...team is 2-1 heading into an off day this season.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER

#33 Martin Perez, LHP (3-0, 1.86)

TODAY: The 23-year-old left-hander will be making his 5th start of the season in tomorrow's series finale in Oakland...will start on regular 4 days' rest after throwing his 1st career complete game shutout, a 3-hitter in a 12-0 win on Fri. vs. CWS (9.0 IP, 3 H, 1 BB, 8 SO, 109 pitches/70 strikes)...matched career high in K's (3rd time)...6th-youngest Ranger to throw 3-hit shutout or better...ranks among the A.L.'s best in wins (T2nd), ERA (9th), innings pitched (T7th, 29.0), CG (T1st, 1), and SHO (1st, 1)...has current 17.0-inning scoreless streak, longest in A.L. this season...has consecutive starts of 8.0+ scoreless innings, the first Ranger to do that since C.J. Wilson (Sept. 2011) and Derek Holland (July 2011)...the only pitcher in club history who has thrown 8.0+ shutout frames in 3 straight starts was Charlie Hough, Aug. 28-Sept. 7, 1983...has won 3 straight starts, longest streak of consecutive starts with a win by a Ranger since Perez won 6 straight starts, Aug. 5-Sept. 3, 2013...has won A.L.-best 6 consecutive road decisions, 2nd-longest active road winning streak in the majors behind LAD's Zack Greinke (9, June 22, 2013-April 12, 2014)...Texas is 4-0 in his 4 starts this season and 16-8 in his starts since the beginning of the 2013 season...his 9 GIDPs lead the majors by 3 (6, Wade Miley, ARI)...since Aug. 1, 2013, Perez's A.L.-best 10 wins are tied for the ML lead...was selected as the 2013 Rangers Rookie of the Year.

LAST START: Threw his 1st career complete game shutout, a 3-hitter in a 12-0 win, on Fri. vs. CWS (9.0 IP, 3 H, 1 BB, 8 SO, 109 pitches/70 strikes)...first SHO by a Ranger since Derek Holland on 9/23/13 vs. HOU (6-hitter)...matched his career high with 8 K's (3rd time)...was the 1st CG and SHO in the A.L. this season...first 3-hitter-or-better by a Ranger since Holland on 6/27/13 at NYY (2-hitter) and just the 5th such SHO for the club in the last 16 years...1st 3-hit shutout or better in Arlington since Doug Davis on 4/11/02 vs. OAK (2-hitter)...6th-youngest Ranger to throw 3-hit shutout or better...offense staked him to a 9-0 lead after a 7-run 3rd, as his 12 runs of support for the game were tied for the 2nd-most given to a Texas pitcher since the start of 2013 (Garza, 8/19/13 vs. HOU)...

LEADERS: Ranks among the A.L.'s best in wins (T2nd), ERA (9th), innings pitched (T7th, 29.0), CG (T1st, 1), SHO (1st, 1), and WHIP (11th, 1.03)...has not allowed a HR in 29.0 innings this season, most homerless innings in the A.L. and 2nd in the majors to LAD's Hyun-Jin Ryu (34.0 IP)...has permitted just 4 XBH and has the 6th-best opponents' slugging pct. at .278...8th-best opponents' OPS at .567...has an A.L.-best 74.6 groundball percentage (2.93 GB/FB).

SCORELESS STREAK: Perez has consecutive starts of 8.0+ scoreless innings, first Ranger to do that since C.J. Wilson (Sept. 2011) and Derek Holland (July 2011)...prior to 2011, last instance by a Ranger had been by Ed Correa in 1986...has active career-high 17.0-inning scoreless streak, longest in the A.L. this season...longest scoreless streak in majors this season was 21.0 innings by CIN's Johnny Cueto, April 11-22...first time in his career with consecutive scoreless starts...last Rangers pitcher with more than 2 consecutive scoreless starts in a season was Kenny Rogers, who had 4 straight, April 27-May 14, 2005 (30.0 IP)...the only pitcher in club history who has thrown 8.0+ shutout frames in 3 straight starts was Charlie Hough, Aug. 28-Sept. 7, 1983.

WINS: Is one of 13 A.L. pitchers with at least 3 wins (T2nd behind Mark Buehrle, 4-0)...has won 3 consecutive starts, longest streak of consecutive starts with a win by a Ranger since Perez won 6 straight starts, Aug. 5-Sept. 3, 2013...has won 10 of his 15 starts since Aug. 1, 2013, tied for most in the majors.

GIDPs: Perez's 9 GIDPs induced are most in the majors, 3 more than any other pitcher (6-Wade Miley)...induced 4 double play ground balls on 4/13 vs. HOU after 5 in his previous start, 4/8 at BOS...is the first Texas pitcher in club history with as many as 4 GIDPs in consecutive games...according to baseball-reference.com, the last major league pitcher with at least 4 GIDPs in back-to-back starts was California's Tommy John in 1984 (5/12-18).

--Induced 5 double plays on 4/8 at BOS, one shy of the ML record accomplished 4 times, last by the Rangers' Matt Harrison on 4/5/11 vs. NYY...the last pitcher with as many as 5 GIDPs was current Ranger Joe Saunders, then with Arizona on 4/6/11 vs. SF...induced the 5 GIDPs in a 6.1-inning outing...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last ML pitcher with as many as 5 GIDP in as few as 6.1 innings was Cleveland's Dave Otto, who had 5 in 6.0 IP on 9/13/91 at BAL.

OTHER STARTS: Started Rangers' first win of the year on 4/1 vs. PHI (ND, 5.2 IP, 2 R-ER), when he exited trailing 2-0 in 6th...had 7 SO/0 BB in the outing, joining Yu Darvish (3x in 2013) as only Texas pitchers since the start of '13 with 7+ K's in a walkless game...became just 4th pitcher in Rangers history to start one of club's first 2 games of a season before turning 23...earned first win on 4/8 at BOS (6.1 IP, 4 R-ER), leaving game w/ 9-2 lead and inducing 5 GIDP's (see above)...earned 1-0 win in series finale on 4/13 vs. HOU (8.0 IP, 5 H, 0 R)...Donnie Murphy's sac fly in the 6th provided the only run...faced only right-handed hitters.

THE VENEZUELAN BATTERY: Robinson Chirinos has been behind the plate for all 4 of Perez' 2014 starts, the 1st time Texas has ever had a starting pitcher and catcher combination of natives of Venezuela in the same game.

vs. OAKLAND: Is 2-3, 5.79 (15 ER/23.1 IP) in 5 career starts vs. OAK, but was 1-1, 2.70 (4 ER/13.1 IP) over 2 starts last year...has made more starts vs. OAK than any other opponent, though he has a higher ERA against the A's than any other opponent (min. 2 GS)...made 1st career start (2nd appearance) and earned 1st career win vs. A's on 6/30/12 in Arlington (5.1 IP, 2 R-ER)...had shortest career start (0.2 IP, 5 R-ER) vs. A's in Arlington on 10/1/12...in his last visit to the Coliseum, tossed 7.0 strong innings (W, 8 H, 1 R-ER, 0 BB, 5 SO) in 5-1 Rangers victory on 9/3/13.

ON THE ROAD: Has won 6 consecutive road decisions, the longest active road winning streak in the A.L. and 2nd-longest in the majors behind LAD's Zack Greinke (9, June 22, 2013-April 12, 2014)...since 8/5/13, is 6-0, 2.85 (15 ER/47.1 IP) over his last 7 road starts...last road defeat was 7/14/13 at DET (5-0 loss vs. Verlander)...is making his 2nd away start in 2014...won at Fenway Park on 4/8 (6.1 IP, 4 R-ER).

2014: Team is 4-0 in his starts, all with Robinson Chirinos behind the plate...opponents are hitting .462 (12-26) with 4 walks when leading off an inning (.533 OBP) but just .167 (7-42) with runners on base...opponents are 4-for-13 with RISP...1st time thru lineup: .250 (8-32); 2nd time: .194 (7-36); 3rd time: .320 (8-25)...has permitted just one hit in 13 at bats by no. 3 hitters, though cleanup hitters are hitting .417 (5-12).

FRIDAY'S SCHEDULED STARTER — RHP COLBY LEWIS (1-1, 4.22 in 2 games/starts)

The 34-year-old right-hander is slated to start the series opener on Friday in Seattle...will be his 3rd start after missing a year-and-a-half due to a pair of surgeries...has exactly 5.1 innings in both starts...earned win on Sat. vs. CWS (5.1 IP, 6 H, 1 R-ER, 1 BB, 4 SO, 0 HR, 85 pitches/59 strikes), a 6-3 Texas victory...gave up 3 straight singles to open the 2nd inning, when his lone run allowed scored...retired 12 of 14 from the 2nd through 6th, but gave up double and walk to his final 2 batters faced before his exit...Aaron Poreda and Jason Frasor combined to strand the 2 runners...it was his first big league victory in nearly 2 years, since 6/17/12 vs. HOU...while it is a long span between wins, the span is a distant second to his longest career stretch without a victory, as he went just over 6 years between MLB wins on 4/7/04 at OAK and 4/9/10 vs. SEA...both of those wins came with the Rangers, as in the interim he pitched with Detroit, Oakland, and the Hiroshima Carp in Japan's NPB League...his first start this year was against the Mariners on 4/14 in Arlington (L, 5.1 IP, 8 H, 4 R-ER, 0 BB, 4 SO, 1 HR, 89 pitches/56 strikes), the series opener...has not pitched at Safeco since 2011, and is 2-4, 3.74 (22 ER/53.0 IP) in 8 games/starts in his career there...re-signed to a minor league contract with an invite to spring training this offseason after surgeries on his elbow and hip the past two years...the Rangers' Opening Day starter in 2012, Lewis missed the entire 2013 season on the disabled list...had several rehab outings in 2013, but had not pitched in the majors since a start on July 18, 2012 at Oakland prior to Monday's outing...underwent season-ending right hip resurfacing surgery on Aug. 22, 2013...also had surgery on July 27, 2012 to repair a torn flexor tendon in his right elbow.

**TEAM PITCHING:** Staff has a 3.13 ERA (39 ER/112.0 IP) last 12 G to drop season ERA from 5.14 to 3.95, 8th in the A.L...13 of the 39 ER in that span came on Sun. vs. CWS...has ML-best 5 shutouts, 4 in last 12 G...this year's Rangers are just 4th team in division era (since 1969) with at least 5 SHO in first 17 G of a season, joining 1969 Orioles (5), 1981 Rangers (6), and 1990 Brewers (5)...opposing batters are hitting .229 (102-445) last 13 G to drop opponents avg. from .311 to .261...club's 4.10 road ERA (31 ER/68.0 IP) ranks 9th in A.L.

**STARTERS:** Last 16 starts: 2.98 ERA (33 ER/99.2 IP) to lower season mark almost 3 full runs from 6.66 to 3.70, 6th in A.L...Perez logged A.L.'s only CG and SHO on Fri. vs. CWS, just 5th SHO of 3 hits-or-less by a Ranger in last 16 seasons (since 1999)...team's 5 starts of 7.0+ scoreless innings are most in the majors (no other team with more than 3)...opponents are batting .228 (68-298) vs. Texas starters over the last 13 G...starters have just 12 victories in last 50 starts beginning 8/30/13.

**RELIEVERS:** No ER in 8 of last 11 games w/ an appearance...have a 3.00 ERA (12 ER/36.0) last 11 games to drop season figure from 6.21 to 4.43, 10th in A.L...bullpen had its 14.2-inning scoreless streak snapped in the 8th on Sat. vs. CWS...had a 1.07 ERA (3 ER/25.1 IP) in homestand's first 9 G before allowing season-high 9 R in 3.2 IP Sun. vs. CWS...saves by 2 different pitchers (5-Soria, 1-Ogando).
