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OAKLAND ATHLETICS (15-8) VS. HOUSTON ASTROS (7-17)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won the past two games to snap a three-game losing streak...the losing streak was the A's first of the season and the first time the A's had lost more than two straight games since Aug. 20-23, 2013 when they lost three straight...have not lost more than three in a row since May 6-

10, 2013 when they had a five-game losing streak...began the season by going 2-3 and then won 11 of their next 13 games before losing three in a row to Texas...are 15-8 for the season, which is the **best record in the American League** and the third best in the majors...it is the A's best record after 23 games since 1992 (also 15-8)...with a win today, the A's would have their best start after 24 games since 1990 (18-6)...are in first place in the AL West and lead Texas by one game...have 13 days in sole possession of first place, two days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth.

HOME AND AWAY: Are 2-0 on the second road trip of the season, a 10-game trip to Houston (2-0), Texas (three games) and Boston (three games)...went 7-2 on the first road trip to Minnesota (3-0), Seattle (2-1) and Los Angeles-AL (2-1)...have the **best road record in the American League** and second best in the majors (Milwaukee, 9-1)...this marks the first time the A's have won the first three road series of the season since 1990...the last time the A's won four straight to start the season was 1988 when they won their first eight...the A's 9-2 start is the A's best start on the road since 1990 (also 9-2)...this road trip concludes a 25-game stretch from April 7 to May 4 where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of their 25 games on the road...are 12-5 over the first 17 games of that stretch...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Houston (3-0) and Texas (0-3)...the sweep by the Rangers marked the first time the A's were swept at home since Sept. 3-5, 2012 against Los Angeles (AL), a streak of 32 consecutive home series without being swept...are 6-6 at home for the season.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have allowed three runs or fewer in 20 of the first 23 games and have a 2.90 ERA (45 er in 139.2 ip), which is the **lowest mark in the American League** and sixth lowest in the majors...have allowed six hits or fewer 19 times and have a .236 (126 for 535) opponents batting average, which is third lowest in the AL...have the lowest on-base percentage (.297) and second lowest slugging percentage (.357)...have the third most strikeouts (127)...have two 30-year olds (Scott Kazmir and Jesse Chavez) in the starting rotation at the same time for the first time since April of 2010 (Ben Sheets, Justin Duchscherer).

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.67 ERA, which is the **lowest mark in the American League** and third lowest in the majors...lead the American League in opponents batting average (.226), on-base percentage (.290) and slugging percentage (.333).

MONTH BY MONTH: The A's are 15-7 (.682) in the month of April and have clinched a winning record in April for the second consecutive season (went 16-12 last year)...also clinched the A's 11th consecutive winning month dating back to June of 2012...that ties the second longest such streak in Oakland history (July, 1989-May 1991)...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept., 1970-Sept. 1972.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in each of their last 12 stolen base attempts and are 16 for 17 (94.1%) for the season, which is the best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 19 of their 21 (90.5%) attempts, which is the third highest percentage in the American League.

OFFENSE: The A's scored a season-high 12 runs yesterday...have now scored 10 or more runs in each of the past two games and have four games of at least 10 runs for the season...rank second in the American League in walks (109) and fourth in runs (116)...are tied for the fourth fewest grounded into double plays (16)...17 of the A's 26 home runs have come with runners on base, nine have put the A's ahead and seven have come in the ninth inning or later.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 22 errors, which is tied for the most in the American League...A's first basemen have committed six of those errors after tallying just nine all last year...the A's are 4-4 when going errorless compared to 11-4 when making one or more errors...have turned just 17 double plays, which is fifth fewest in the AL.

CLOSE CALLS: Lost 3-0 on Wednesday, the first time this year the A's have lost a game by more than two runs...Oakland is the only team in the majors that has not lost a game by more than three runs...the A's are 6-4 in games decided in the last at bat...the 10 games and six wins are the most in the majors...have a Major League leading four wins when trailing after seven innings, which matches their season total from last year...also have a ML leading three losses when leading after eight innings...have six come from behind wins, which is tied with Texas for second most in the American League (Detroit, 8)...are 3-1 in extra inning games...are tied for the ML lead in extra inning wins and are tied for the AL lead in extra inning games...are 4-3 (.571) in one-run games and the seven one-run decisions are tied for second most in the AL

NIGHT AND DAY: The A's are 8-2 in day games, which is tied for the best record in the American League and second best in the majors (Milwaukee, 7-1)...have a 7-6 record at night...have a 1.86 ERA (19 er in 92.0 ip) during the day compared to 3.27 (45 er in 123.2 ip) at night...the day ERA is the lowest in the American League and third lowest in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 9-5 during this stretch of 19 consecutive games against American League West competition (April 11-30)...have five pinch-walks, which is the most in the AL and tied for third most in the majors...have not used a rookie, marking their longest stretch without a rookie on the roster since 2006 when they had no rookies for the first 36 days of the season (April 3-May 8)...the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 16 minutes.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Rodriguez)...O'Flaherty and Parker are both on the 60-day DL...Rodriguez is on a rehab assignment with Sacramento...have used the DL seven times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one

A's vs. ASTROS: The A's lead the season series 5-0...have won the first two games of this series after sweeping a three-game series in Oakland last weekend...won the season series last year, 15-4...the 15 wins tied for third most in Oakland history against one team and were the most since going 17-2 against

Seattle in 2006...went 8-1 in Houston and 7-3 in Oakland...have won all three season series against the Astros and lead the all-time series, 25-5...that is the best record by a Major League club against another club among teams that have played each other 20 or more times...all five of the A's losses to Houston have been by one run...are 13-3 in Oakland and 12-2 in Houston.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Josh Donaldson has hit three home runs in his past two games, including two on Thursday for his first career multi-homer game...has now hit safely in seven straight (11 for 28, .393) and 17 of his last 18 games (27 for 79, .342)...**Dan Otero** has not allowed a home run in 63.2 career innings, the most innings pitched among active players without allowing a home run.

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In **1990** Walt Weiss homers in the fourth inning of a 6-4 A's victory at Baltimore...he would not homer again as an Athletic, setting an Oakland record with an 837-at bat homerless streak.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Dan Straily (1-1, 5.40 ERA)

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed at least one home run in each of his first four starts and is tied for sixth in the American League in home runs allowed (5)...four have been hit by left-handed hitters as have 20 of the 32 he has allowed in his career...three have been solo shots as have 22 in his career...has surrendered five home runs in 21.2 innings (2.08 per nine innings) after yielding 16 home runs in 152.1 innings last year (0.95 per nine innings)...allowed 11 in 39.1 innings in 2012 (2.52 per nine innings).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-1 with a 2.77 ERA (4 er in 13.0 ip) and .191 (9 for 47) opponents batting average in two starts during the day compared to 0-0 with a 9.35 ERA (9 er in 8.2 ip) and .342 (13 for 38) opponents average in two starts at night...last year, he was 4-2 with a 2.14 ERA and .195 opponents batting average in nine starts during the day compared to 6-6 with a 4.98 ERA and .252 opponents average in 18 starts at night...his day ERA was the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings in day games...surrendered just one of his 16 home runs during the day...his career numbers are 5-4 with a 3.21 ERA (29 er in 81.1 ip) in 14 starts during the day compared to 8-6 with a 4.64 ERA (68 er in 132.0 ip) in 24 starts at night.

EIGHT HITS OR FEWER: Has not allowed more than eight hits in a start in his career and has tossed at least 3.1 innings in each of those outings...his streak of 38 consecutive starts of eight hits or fewer and three innings or more is the longest by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 (previous: 36, Curt Young, July 21, 1986-Aug. 8, 1987)...it is the longest career opening streak by a Major Leaguer since Juan Guzman had a 42-game streak from June 7, 1991-July 18, 1992.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss to Seattle April 5 in Oakland...blanked the Mariners on two hits over the first four innings before allowing three runs in the fifth inning on a two-run home run by Ackley and a solo home run by Almonte...Hernandez shut out the A's on four hits over the first eight innings before Lowrie homered in the ninth.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win at Minnesota April 10...allowed a solo home run to the second batter he faced, Dozier, but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings...did not allow a hit over his final five innings and retired 16 of the final 18 batters he faced.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 10-9, 11-inning win at Los Angeles (AL) April 15...yielded a career-high tying six runs (fifth time)...allowed a RBI double to Trout and a RBI single to Kendrick in the first inning but the A's scored three times in the third to take a 3-2 lead...he then allowed four runs in the fourth inning on a two-run double by lannetta and a two-run home run by Calhoun...left after 3.2 innings trailing 6-3.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss to Texas last Monday in Oakland...allowed a home run to Choo to lead off the game but the A's came back with three runs in the second inning off Darvish...allowed a RBI single to Kouzmanoff in the fourth and a RBI single to Fielder in the fifth and left after five innings with the scored tied 3-3.

STRAILY vs. HOUSTON: Is 2-0 with a 1.32 ERA (13.2 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 18 so, 0 hr) in two career starts, both last year...the first win came in an 8-3 A's victory at Houston on April 5...struck out a careerhigh 11 batters in 6.2 innings...became the ninth pitcher in Oakland history to strikeout 11 or more in fewer than seven innings, the first since Kirk Saarloos on September 19, 2006 (11 so in 5.0 ip)...did not issue a walk and is the 12th pitcher in Oakland to strikeout 11 or more without walking a batter...shutout the Astros on two hits over the first five innings and had an 8-0 lead when he allowed a RBI single to Altuve in the sixth...allowed a leadoff double to Maxwell in the seventh and retired the next two batters before he was relieved by Neshek, who allowed Maxwell to score...also picked up the win in a 2-1 decision in Oakland on September 7...tossed seven shutout innings and allowed just two hits...Villar singled with two outs in the third and Dominiguez doubled to lead off the fifth...retired each of the final nine batters he faced...left after seven innings with a 2-0 lead and Otero allowed a run in the eighth.

THIS SPRING: Had no decisions and a 4.37 ERA in four starts this spring...opponents hit .275...walked two or more batters in all four starts and issued 10 walks in 13.1 innings overall (6.75 walks per nine innings)...had his final start on March 29 against San Francisco rained out...pitched in a minor league game March 24 (5.2 ip, 10 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 2 hr).

2013 RECAP: Had five stints with Oakland in 2013 and was 10-8 with a 3.96 ERA in 27 starts...led American League rookies in games started, innings pitched (152.1) and strikeouts (124) and tied for the lead in wins (Perez, TEX)...is the 11th rookie in Oakland history to win 10 or more games, the fifth in the last five years (Anderson, Cahill, Milone, Parker)...had the sixth most strikeouts by an Oakland rookie...went 1-2 with a 7.27 ERA and .257 opponents batting average over his first five starts, 5-0 with a 2.83 ERA and .196 opponents average over his next nine starts from May 21 to July 9, 0-5 with a 5.20 ERA and .299 opponents over his next seven starts from July 20 to Aug. 23 and 4-1 with a 2.00 ERA and .195 opponents average over his final six starts

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .233 opponents batting average...did not have enough innings pitched to qualify for the league leaders, but his opponents average was ninth lowest among AL pitchers with 150 or more innings pitched...his .358 slugging percentage was eighth best...his opponents batting average included a .221 (60-for-272) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .244 (72-for-295) against left-handers...allowed a .201 batting average the first time through the lineup, which was third lowest among AL pitchers with 150 or more innings pitched...now has a .209 (64-for-306) opponents average the first time through the lineup in his career...allowed a .225 batting average to batters leading off an inning...however, issued 19 walks to start an inning, which tied for second most in the AL...opponents hit .300 with runners in scoring position and two outs...they were 4-for-7 (.571) with a grand slam with the bases loaded.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 6-2 with a 4.28 ERA and .217 opponents batting average in 14 starts before the All-Star Break...then went 4-6 with a 3.61 ERA and .250 opponents average in 13 starts after the break.

DAYS REST: Was 6-3 with a 3.25 ERA in 14 starts on five days rest or more compared to 4-5 with a 4.80 ERA in 13 starts on four days rest...is now 8-4 with a 3.08 ERA (41 er in 119.2 ip) in 20 career starts on five days rest or more compared to 5-6 with a 5.39 ERA (56 er in 93.2 ip) in 18 starts on four days rest.

RUN SUPPORT: Received two runs of support or fewer in 17 of his 27 starts and was 5-8 in those games...was 5-0 in 10 starts with three runs of support or more...is now 6-10 in 21 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 7-0 in 17 starts with support of three or more

THIS AND THAT: Was 3-1 with a 1.54 ERA and .167 opponents batting average in four interleague starts...tied for third in the majors in interleague wins, ranked fourth in opponents batting average and ninth in ERA...tied for the team-lead with seven hit batters...the A's were 16-11 (.593) in his starting assignments and are 23-15 (.605) in his career.

2013 WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-1 with a 1.14 ERA and .202 opponents batting average in five starts with Sacramento...allowed just one home run in 31.2 innings...struck out 33, an average of 9.38 per nine innings...his opponents batting average included a .174 (8-for-46) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .219 (16-for-73) against right-handers.

LHP Tommy Milone (0-1, 4.24 ERA): Has allowed a .344 (11 for 32) average with the bases empty compared to .237 (9 for 38) with runners on...opponents are 3 for 19 (.158) with runners in scoring position...the A's are 0-3 in his starting assignments this year but are 36-24 (.600) in his career...had a no decision in his last start, a 5-4 A's loss to Texas last Tuesday in Oakland (6.0 ip, 5 h, 3 r, 3 er, 4 bb, 1 so)...matched his career high in walks...is 1-0 with a 4.62 ERA in four career starts against Houston...went 2-1 with a 4.26 ERA in five games, four starts, this spring...logged a 1.93 ERA over his final three games...spent the first four months of the 2013 season in the starting rotation but split the final two months of the year between the bullpen, rotation and minor leagues...was 12-9 with a 4.14 ERA in 28 games, 26 starts.

ATHLETICS BULLPEN BRIEFS

7-5. 2.25 ERA (19 er in 76.0 ip) Saves/Opportunities: 5-for-11 (45.4%)

- The A's bullpen has yielded just 12 runs over the last 20 games (67.0 ip, 1.61 ERA) and now has a 2.25 ERA for the season, which is the lowest in the American League...is currently on a threegame, nine-inning scoreless streak...has not allowed a run to Houston this season (5 g, 14.0 ip).
- Bullpen has been credited with the decision in eight of the A's last 12 games (5-3)...its 12 total decisions this season are tied for the most among Major League bullpens (Texas).
- Its seven wins are tied for second most in the majors.
- Its six blown saves are tied for the most in the majors (Pittsburgh).
- Ranks first in the AL in opponents batting average (.208), and onbase percentage (.276), and slugging percentage (.289).
- Its 19 runs allowed are six fewer than the next closest teams (Kansas City, Boston).

- Has not allowed a run over his first 10 outings (10.0 ip) and has struck out 11 of the 35 batters he has faced...is one of six pitchers in the majors with at least 10 innings pitched and no runs allowed.
- Has appeared against the Astros twice in his career, both this
- season (3.0 ip, 1 h, 0 bb, 3 so). Compiled a 3.27 ERA and allowed a .205 batting average in a team-leading 11 appearances this spring...did not issue a walk in 11.0 innings while striking out 12.
- Has a 13-game losing streak dating back to April 9, 2011, which is the longest active losing streak in the majors.
- Was acquired from Washington for minor league infielder John Wooten, November 25, 2013.

Last Year: Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse and was 1-0 with a 1.06 ERA in 17 relief appearances...was promoted to Washington May 21 and went 0-3 with a 3.35 ERA in a career-high 39 relief appearances.

- Was charged with the loss Monday night...was the seventh loss of his career and first since Aug. 20, 2013 vs. Seattle. Has not issued a walk in 11.2 innings, which are the most innings
- pitched in the Major Leagues without issuing a walk.
- Has allowed four runs in his last seven games (6.2 ip, 5.40 ERA) after allowing no runs in his first four contests (5.0 ip).
- Recorded his first save of the season and the fourth of his career on April 13 at Seattle.
- Is 1-1 with a save in 11 career games against Houston (11.2 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 13 so, 1.54 ERA)...has two appearances against the Astros this season (2.1 ip, 1 h, 4 so).
