ABOUT THE A'S: Split a four-game series in Houston to start the road trip and are now 2-5 over the last seven games...began the season by going 2-3 and then won 11 of their next 13 games before the current seven-game stretch...have lost each of their last two games...had a season-high three-game losing streak from April 21-23, marking the only time the A's have lost more than two straight games since Aug. 24, 2013...have not lost more than three in a row since May 6-10, 2013 when they had a five-game losing streak...are 15-10 for the season, which is tied with Texas and New York for the best record in the American League...it matches the A's best record after 25 games over the last 23 years (fifth time, last: 2008)...are tied for first place in the AL West with Texas for the second consecutive day and third time in the last four days...have 13 days in sole possession of first place, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth.

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.95 ERA, which is the **lowest mark in the American League** and fourth lowest in the majors...lead the American League in opponents on-base percentage (.289) and slugging percentage (.341) and rank second in opponents batting (.227)...are tied for third in fewest walks (70) and fewest home runs (19).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers have compiled a 4.40 ERA (35 er in 71.2 ip) over the last 12 games after logging a 1.89 ERA over the first 13 contests...now have a 3.07 ERA (52 er in 152.2 ip), which ranks second in the American League...have the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.293) and the second batting average (.232) and slugging percentage (.361)...rank second in innings pitched (152.2) and tied for third in strikeouts (136)...are tied with Texas for the fewest losses (4)...have two 30-year olds (Scott Kazmir and Jesse Chavez) in the starting rotation at the same time for the first time since April of 2010 (Ben Sheets, Justin Duchscherer).

OFFENSE: The A's were held to two hits yesterday, which were their fewest in a game since June 27, 2012 against Seattle (also two)...it ended a streak of 272 games with three or more hits...the two-hit game comes after collecting 39 hits in the first three games of the series...are now batting .275 (120 for 436) with 69 runs scored over the last 12 games (5.75 per game) after hitting .234 with 54 runs over the first 13 contests (4.15 per game)...rank second in the American League in walks (115), third in on-base percentage (.345) and fourth in runs (123), slugging (.408) and extra base hits (76)...18 of the A's 27 home runs have come with runners on base, nine have put the A's ahead and eight have come in the ninth inning or later.

ON THE BASES: The A's have been successful in each of their last 14 stolen base attempts and are 18 for 19 (94.7%) for the season, which is the best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 19 of their 21 (90.5%) attempts, which is the second highest percentage in the American League.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 5 for 25 (.200) with a home run, four RBI and five walks...lead the American League in plate appearances (31) and walks (5), are tied for the lead in home runs (1) and extra base hits (3) and tied for second in RBI (4) and doubles (2)...have more plate appearances than two National League teams (Atlanta, 28, Milwaukee 27).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 23 errors, which is tied with Cleveland for the most in the American League...A's first basemen have committed six of those errors after tallying just nine all last year...the A's are 4-5 when going errorless compared to 11-5 when making one or more errors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-2 on the second road trip of the season, a 10-game trip to Houston (2-2), Texas (three games) and Boston (three games)...went 7-2 on the first road trip and are 9-4 on the road for the season...that is the **best road record in the American League** and third best in the majors...it matches the A's best start on the road since 1991 (also 2000 and 2008)...a win today would give the A's their best start on the road since 1990 (12-2)...this road trip concludes a 25-game stretch from April 7 to May 4 where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of their 25 games on the road...are 12-7 over the first 19 games of that stretch...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Houston (3-0) and Texas (0-3)...the sweep by the Rangers marked the first time the A's were swept at home since Sept. 3-5, 2012

against Los Angeles (AL), a streak of 32 consecutive home series without being swept...are 6-6 at home for the season.

MONTH BY MONTH: The A's are 15-9 (.625) in the month of April and have clinched a winning record in April for the second consecutive season (went 16-12 last year)...have also clinched their 11th consecutive winning month dating back to June of 2012...that ties the second longest such streak in Oakland history (July, 1989-May 1991)...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept., 1970-Sept. 1972...the pitching staff has 196 strikeouts in April, which is 14 short of the franchise record for April set last year (210).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost 5-1 yesterday, which marks the first time this year Oakland has lost a game by more than three runs...it was their largest defeat since a 12-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on Sept. 16, 2013, a span of 36 games...the A's are 6-5 in games decided in the last at bat...the 11 games and six wins are the most in the majors...have a Major League leading four wins when trailing after seven innings, which matches their season total from last year...also have a ML leading three losses when leading after eight innings...are 3-1 in extra inning games...are tied for the ML lead in extra inning wins and are tied for the American League lead in extra inning games...are 4-4 (.500) in one-run games and the eight one-run decisions are tied for third most in the AL...are 5-8 in games decided by two runs or fewer, 10-2 in games decided by three runs or more.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 9-7 during this stretch of 19 consecutive games against American League West competition that concludes with this three-game series against Texas...are 8-3 in day games, which is tied for the second best record in the AL...have a 7-7 record at night...are 9-2 when scoring first, which is the second best record in the AL (New York, 11-2)...have not used a rookie, marking their longest stretch without a rookie on the roster since 2006 when they had no rookies for the first 36 days of the season (April 3-May 8)...the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 14 minutes.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Rodriguez)...O'Flaherty and Parker are both on the 60-day DL...Elmore and Rodriguez are on rehab assignments with Sacramento...have used the DL seven times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's were swept in a three-game series in Oakland last week to open the season series...won the season series last year, 10-9...went 4-5 in Oakland and 6-4 in Texas...it was the A's second consecutive season series win over the Rangers after losing five of the previous six...are 21-20 (.512) over the last three years...are 313-327 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 167-154 in Oakland and 146-173 in Texas...including 79-85 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 410-409 against the Rangers/Senators

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Fernando Abad has not allowed a run over his first 10 outings and his 10.0 innings pitched are second most among American League relievers that have not allowed a run...**Yoenis Céspedes** did not play in the final three games of the Houston series (left hamstring)...the A's are 14-7 with him in the starting lineup, 1-3 when he doesn't start...in his three seasons with the club, the A's are 179-103 (.635) with him in the starting lineup and 26-41 (.388) when he doesn't start...**Brandon Moss** was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...has four career home runs off Darvish, which is twice as much as any other pitcher.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1987** Dennis Eckersley commits an error in the A's 7-1 win over Boston...he would not commit another error for eight years, setting what was then an American League record for pitchers with 470 consecutive errorless games...in **2002** Tim Hudson and Billy Koch combine on a three-hit shutout and Eric Chavez homers and drives in four runs in the A's 10-0 win over Chicago...in **2010** Cliff Pennington and Adam Rosales collect four hits each, marking the first time in Athletics history both middle infielders had at least four hits in the same game.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (3-1, 2.25 ERA)

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Was charged with his first loss of the season in his last start, snapping his season-opening winning streak at three games...has never lost consecutive decisions in his career...the loss snapped a six-game winning streak dating back to September 11 of last year, which was a career high...went 6-0 with a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch...allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed just one home run over his first five starts and 32.0 innings...has surrendered just five home runs in 96.0 career innings (0.47 per nine innings)...has yielded a .175 (7 for 40) average with runners in scoring position, including .111 (2 for 18) with RISP and two outs...has a .179 (7 for 39) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .277 (23 for 83) after that.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA (4 er in 19.0 ip) in three starts at night compared to 1-1 with a 2.77 ERA (4 er in 13.0 ip) in two starts during the day...his career numbers are 4-1 with a 1.78 ERA (11 er in 55.2 ip) in 10 night games, 4-3 with a 3.57 ERA (16 er in 40.1 ip) in seven day games.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to make his second consecutive start on four days rest...is 0-1 with a 3.86 ERA (3 er in 7.0 ip) in one start on four days rest compared to 3-0 with a 1.80 ERA (5 er in 25.0 ip) in four starts on five days rest or more...his career numbers are 2-3 with a 3.99 ERA (17 er in 38.1 ip) in six starts on four days rest, 6-1 with a 1.68 ERA (10 er in 53.2 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Has won three of his four starts this year against American League West competition after a no decision against Cleveland in his first start...is now 5-2 with a 1.89 ERA (13 er in 62.0 ip) in 10 career games against AL West foes compared to 3-2 with a 3.71 ERA (14 er in 34.0 ip) in seven games against everyone else.

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed five of his eight earned runs this year over the first three innings of a game...last year, he yielded 20 of his 22 runs over the first three innings of a game...in his career, he has a 4.00 ERA (20 er in 45.0 ip), .264 (48 for 182) opponents batting average and four home runs allowed in innings one through three compared to a 1.24 ERA (7 er in 51.0 ip), .185 (33 for 178) opponents average and one home run from the fourth inning on.

THIS AND THAT: Is tied for third in the American League in wins (3)...has issued 10 of his 13 walks this year and 25 of his 33 in his career to left-handed hitters...the A's have been shut out twice this year, both times in his starts...however, his season run support average is 5.06 (18 rs in 32.0 ip)...his career RSA as a starter is 6.65 (68 rs in 92.0 ip)...the A's are 3-2 (.600) in his starting assignments this year and are 9-6 (.600) when he starts in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 11 of his 15 starts, allowed two runs or fewer eight times and walked two batters or fewer 10 times.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss to Cleveland on Opening Night March 31...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...allowed five hits and walked three...retired the side in order just once, the third inning...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom).

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 win over Seattle April 6 in Oakland...did not allow a run in the first inning to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings (previous: 13.0, August 10-20, 2013)...was charged with two unearned runs in the second inning (Barton error) when he allowed RBI singles to Almonte and Miller...also allowed a RBI single to Smoak in the third to give the Mariners a 3-0 lead but the A's tied the game on a Moss three-run homer in the bottom of the third...retired 11 of the final 12 batters he faced, including each of the last seven, and the A's scored twice in the fifth to take the lead for good.

THIRD START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 win at Seattle April 12...struck out a career-high tying nine batters...allowed back-to-back singles to Almonte and Miller to start the game before retiring 11 straight...Almonte scored on a Cano ground out, but that would be the only run he would allow in seven innings...blanked the Mariners on three hits and two walks over his final six innings.

FOURTH START: He won his third consecutive start in the A's 11-3 win over Houston April 18 in Oakland...allowed a career-high nine hits...the A's scored seven times in the first inning and he blanked the

Astros on three hits and a walk over the first four innings...allowed three runs in the fifth on RBI singles by Fowler and Springer and a sacrifice fly by Carter.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas last Wednesday in Oakland...walked a career-high four batters...allowed a RBI triple to Rios in the first, a RBI single to Choice in the fifth and a solo home run to Murphy in the sixth...Perez shut out the A's on three hits and two walks.

THIS SPRING: Went 0-1 with a 3.48 (20.2 ip, 18 h, 11 r, 8 er, 6 bb, 16 so) ERA in six starts...allowed a .228 (18 for 79) opponents batting average...yielded just one home run in 20.2 innings...allowed just one earned run in 10.2 innings over his final two starts (0.84 ERA) after posting a 6.30 ERA over his first four starts...surrendered one run or fewer in four of his six starts.

2013 RECAP: Spent most of the season at Triple-A Sacramento where he was 10-7 with a 3.42 ERA in 20 starts...also had two stints with the A's...after making two relief appearances in his Major League debut in July, he returned to Oakland Aug. 10 and finished the season in the starting rotation...was 5-3 with a 2.67 ERA in 12 games, 10 starts, with the A's...also went 0-1 with a 2.08 ERA in two ALDS starts against Detroit...based upon a minimum of 60 innings pitched, he had the lowest opponents on-base percentage among American League rookies (.272), ranked second in opponents batting average (.214) and slugging percentage (.298) and third in ERA...struck out 67 batters in 64.0 innings and his average of 9.42 strikeouts per nine innings was second best (Allen, CLE 11.26)...walked 20 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 3.35...went 4-1 with a 2.27 ERA and .230 opponents batting average over his final six starts...had surgery for a fractured left thumb following the season...the surgery, an internal fixation with a screw to repair the thumb fracture, was performed by Dr. Thomas Graham at the Cleveland Clinic Hospital Oct. 18.

HOME AND AWAY: Was 3-1 with a 1.99 ERA in six starts in Oakland compared to 2-2 with a 3.86 ERA in six games, four starts, on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .198 (20-for-101) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .226 (31-for-137) against left-handers...allowed a .194 opponents batting average to hitters leading off an inning...surrendered one double (.210 slugging percentage) and issued just four walks (.242 on-base percentage).

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Compiled a 5-3 record and a 2.85 ERA in his nine starts...did not allow a run in his two relief appearances (4.0 ip)...did not inherit a runner and retired both of his first batters faced in relief.

WITH SACRAMENTO: Won a career-high 10 games with the River Cats...also finished with a career-high 118 strikeouts...the wins tied for fifth in the Pacific Coast League and the strikeouts tied for seventh...was also fourth in ERA (3.42) and tied for fifth in complete games (1)...led the league in strikeouts per nine innings (8.97)...ranked fourth in the A's farm system in ERA, tied for fifth in wins and sixth in strikeouts...was named the A's organization Minor League Pitcher of the year and was also a *Baseball America's* Triple-A All-Star...surrendered just five home runs in 118.1 innings, an average of 0.38 per nine innings.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Scott Kazmir (3-0, 1.62 ERA): Has started the season 3-0 for the first time in his career...is now 5-0 with a 1.36 ERA and .192 opponents batting average over his last seven starts dating back to September 21, 2013...the winning streak is one short of his career high of six (May 10-June 6, 2008)...has allowed one run or fewer in 11 of his last 23 starts dating back to last year and is 10-5 with a 2.71 ERA over that span...ranks second in the American League in opponents on-base percentage (.234), fourth in ERA (1.62) and fifth in opponents batting (.183) and slugging percentage (.267)...the A's have won each of his five starting assignments, including his last start last Thursday at Houston, a win in a 10-1 victory (6.0 ip, 5 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 7 so so)...is 6-4 with a 3.09 ERA in 14 career starts against Texas...was the losing pitcher in his only start last year, a 6-3 Cleveland loss in Texas on June 10 (6.0 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...went 1-0 with a 1.62 ERA in four starts during the spring...held the opposition to a .155 batting average and did not allow a home run in 16.2 innings.

- The A's bullpen has allowed five earned runs over its last two games (3.0 ip, 15.00 ERA) after giving up just three earned runs over its previous eight outings (23.0 ip, 1.17 ERA)...its 2.73 ERA is first in the American League...bullpen was tagged with two of the team's three losses in last week's sweep at the hands of the Rangers.
- Bullpen has been credited with the decision in nine of the A's last 14 games (5-4)...its 13 total decisions this season are the second most among Major League bullpens (Texas, 14).
- Its seven wins are the second most in the American League (Texas, 8)...six losses are also tied for the second most in the AL (Seattle, 7).
- Its six blown saves are tied for the most in the majors (Pittsburgh).
- Tied for third in the AL in opponents batting average (.217)...is first in opponents on-base percentage (.281), and second in slugging percentage (.303).
- Its 24 runs allowed are the fewest in the American League.

- Has not allowed a run over his first 10 outings (10.0 ip) and has struck out 11 of the 35 batters he has faced...is one of five pitchers in the majors with at least 10 innings pitched and no runs allowed.
- Has appeared against the Rangers seven times in his career (4.2 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 3 so)...in two games against Texas this season, has tossed 1.2 scoreless innings (1 h, 1 so).
- Compiled a 3.27 ERA and allowed a .205 batting average in a team-leading 11 appearances this spring...did not issue a walk in 11.0 innings while striking out 12.
- Has a 13-game losing streak dating back to April 9, 2011, which is the longest active losing streak in the majors.
- Was acquired from Washington for minor league infielder John Wooten, November 25, 2013.

Last Year: Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse and was 1-0 with a 1.06 ERA in 17 relief appearances...was promoted to Washington May 21 and went 0-3 with a 3.35 ERA in a career-high 39 relief appearances.

- Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list April 7 and has pitched seven times since then.
- Has allowed two hits in 7.1 innings this season, but has walked six batters.
- Has two wins and a save in 19 career games against Texas (17.1 ip, 16 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 10 so, 2.08 ERA)...appearances and innings against Texas are his most against any Major League team...has faced the Rangers twice this season (2.1 ip, 2 h, 1 so).
- Has a 1.23 ERA (4 er in 29.1 ip) in 28 career appearances in April.
- Was placed on the DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...had a two-game rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton April 3-5 (1.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 10.80 ERA).
- Did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring.

TUESDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (3-0, 1.62 ERA)

3-0 AND A FIVE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Has started the season 3-0 for the first time in his career...is **red tied for third** in the American League in wins and is one of **red eight** AL pitchers with three or more wins that has not lost...also won his final two starts of 2013 and is now 5-0 with a 1.36 ERA (7 er in 46.1 ip) and .192 (32 for 167) opponents batting average over his last seven starts dating back to September 21, 2013...has allowed just one home run in 46.1 innings over that span...the winning streak is one short of his career high of six (May 10-June 6, 2008).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks **red third** in the American League in opponents on-base percentage (.234), **red fourth** in ERA (1.62) and **red fifth** in opponents batting (.183) and slugging percentage (.267)...also ranks **red fifth** in strikeout to walk ratio (5.17), **red sixth** in fewest walks per nine innings (1.62), **red tied for sixth** in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.27) and **red tied for seventh** in highest run support (6.75).

LAST 23 STARTS: Has allowed one run or fewer in three of his five starts this year and 11 of his last 23 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...is 10-5 with a 2.71 ERA (41 er in 136.1 ip) over that span...has held the opposition to a .226 (116 for 514) batting average...has walked 30 (1.98 per nine innings) and struck out 138 in 136.1 innings (9.11 per nine innings) for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.60...has yielded just eight home runs (0.53 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average includes a .163 (16 for 98) mark against right-handers, which ranks **red fourth** in the American League, compared to .273 (6 for 22) against left-handers...has issued all six of his walks to righties...over the last two years, 47 of his 53 walks have been issued to right-handed hitters...opponents are 3 for 33 (.091) with no walks and a hit by pitch when leading off an inning (.118 on-base percentage)...the on-base percentage is the **red lowest** in the majors and the batting average ranks **red third**...has allowed a .080 (2 for 25) average with runners in scoring position, which ranks **red second** in the AL.

NIGHT AND DAY: Made each of his first four starts during the day before starting at night in his last start...last year, he went 5-2 with a 3.27 ERA in 10 starts during the day compared to 5-7 with a 4.46 ERA in 19 starts at night...is now 7-2 with a 2.73 ERA (25 er in 82.1 ip) in 14 starts during the day over the last two years and 6-7 with a 4.29 ERA (52 er in 109.0 ip) in 20 starts at night..

THIST AND THAT: The A's have won each of his five starting assignments...has tossed at least six innings in all five starts, allowed three runs or fewer in each start and issued no walks in three of his starts.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win over Cleveland in the day game April 2 against Cleveland...tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut.

SECOND START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-3 win at Minnesota April 7...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Hicks in the second...the A's scored three times in the third but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the third on a Kubel RBI double and a Suzuki RBI ground out...then retired 11 of the final 13 batters he faced.

THIRD START: He combined with Abad, Otero, Gregerson and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Seattle April 13...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed two of the hits but had a no decision as the A's scored twice in the eighth and once in the ninth...retired each of the first 10 batters, allowed back to back singles to Miller and Cano with one out in the fourth, and then retired each of the final eight batters.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win over Houston April 19 in Oakland...allowed his first home run of the season, a solo shot by Villar in the third inning...also allowed a RBI single to Dominguez in the fourth and an unearned run in the fifth when Villar scored on a Norris throwing error following a steal of third...left trailing 3-1 but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the ninth for the win.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-1 win at Houston last Thursday...the A's scored twice in the first and he allowed a run in the bottom of the first on a bases loaded walk to Chris Carter...blanked the Astros on three hits and a walk over his final five innings.

THIS SPRING: Went 1-0 with a 1.62 ERA (16.2 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 7 bb, 14 so) in four starts during the spring...held the opposition to a .155 (9 for 58) batting average...did not allow a home run in 16.2 innings...did not allow a run in three of his four starts...was scratched from his start March 17 against Chicago (NL) with left triceps stiffness.

2013 RECAP: Went from the independent Atlantic League in 2012 to a key member of the Cleveland Indians rotation, going 10-9 with a 4.04 ERA in 29 starts...it was his sixth 10-win season but his first since 2009...his 29 starts were his most since 2007, as were his 158.0 innings pitched...walked 47 batters for an average of 2.68 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark of his career...his previous low was 3.24 in 2006...struck out 162, and his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.45 was also a career best...was one of a club-record tying three pitchers to fan 150 or more batters (Jimenez, Masterson)...averaged 9.23 strikeouts per nine innings...did not qualify for the league leaders but had the seventh best strikeout per nine inning ratio among American League pitchers with 150 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, he had the fifth highest run support average (6.27)...was 3-4 with a 5.89 ERA and .302 opponents batting average over his first 11 starts through June 15...then went 7-5 with a 3.06 ERA and .239 opponents average over his final 18 starts

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Chavez (1-0, 1.38 ERA): Has allowed one earned run in each of his first four starts and has a 1.38 ERA, which ranks **red second** in the American League...is the only pitcher on an Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1914 to begin the season with four consecutive starts of six or more innings and one earned run or fewer...ranks **red fifth** in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.235) and strikeout to walk ratio (5.60) and **red seventh** in strikeouts per nine innings (9.69)...he picked up his first career win as a starter in his last start last Sunday in Oakland, a 4-1 win over Houston (6.0 ip, 4 h, 1 r, 1 er, 3 bb, 6 so)...is now 1-0 with a 1.05 ERA in 16 career appearances against the Astros, including one start...went 5-1 with a save and a 2.22 ERA in seven games, five starts, this spring...the five wins were the most in the majors and the most by an A's pitcher since spring win totals are available beginning in 1990...ranked **red second** in the Cactus League in innings pitched (28.1), **red fourth** in strikeouts (25) and **red eighth** in ERA.

2014 PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS

DARIC BARTON

- Made his fourth career Opening Day start at first base March 31 against Cleveland, which matches Jason Giambi for second most in Oakland history...only Mark McGwire, with nine, has more.

ALBERTO CALLASPO

- Was on his eighth consecutive Opening Day roster.
- Made his professional debut at first base April 3 against Seattle and went 0 for 1 with two walks and an error.

YOENIS CÉSPEDES

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start March 31 against Cleveland (center field in 2012, left field in 2013-14)...is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers in left field since Ben Grieve in 1999-2000.

RYAN COOK

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring.

COCO CRISP

- Was on his 10th Opening Day roster (2004-09, 11-14) and made his ninth career Opening Day start, his fourth straight with the A's.
- Hit his first career game-ending home run April 3 against Seattle...it was his sixth regular season "walk-off" RBI.
- Committed his first error of the season April 18, snapping a 145-game errorless streak, which was fifth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...it was his first error since Aug. 23, 2012.

JOSH DONALDSON

- Had a career-high 0 for 20 streak from April 2 to 6.
- Had a 10-game hitting streak from April 6-16 (16 for 48, .333), which fell one short of his career high.

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.

LUKE GREGERSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

A.J. GRIFFIN

- Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.

- Began the season on the disabled list as he continued his recovery from Tommy John surgery...was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21.
