OAKLAND ATHLETICS (16-10) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (15-11)

TUESDAY, APRIL 29, 2014 – GLOBE LIFE PARK – 7:05 P.M. CDT LHP SCOTT KAZMIR (3-0, 1.62) VS. LHP MARTIN PEREZ (4-0, 1.42) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won three of the past five games but are 3-5 over the last eight...began the season by going 2-3 and then won 11 of their next 13 games before the current eight-game stretch...had a season-high three-game losing streak from April 21-23, marking the only time the A's have lost more

than two straight games since Aug. 24, 2013...have not lost more than three in a row since May 6-10, 2013 when they had a five-game losing streak...are 16-10 for the season, which is the **best record in the American League** and third best in the majors...it matches the A's best record after 26 games over the last 23 years (2003, 2008)...a win tonight would match the A's best start after 27 games over the last 24 years (1991, 2003, 2008)...are in first place in the AL West and lead Texas by one game...have 14 days in sole possession of first place, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth.

STARTING PITCHING: Sonny Gray tossed a three-hit shutout last night, the first of his career and the first complete game by an A's starting pitcher this year...however, A's starters have compiled a 3.90 ERA (35 er in 80.2 ip) over the last 13 games after logging a 1.89 ERA over the first 13 contests...have a 2.89 ERA (52 er in 161.2 ip) overall, which is the lowest in the American League...also have the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.288) and the second batting average (.226) and slugging percentage (.349)...rank first in innings pitched (161.2) and third in strikeouts (142)...have the fewest losses (4)...have two 30-year olds (Scott Kazmir and Jesse Chavez) in the starting rotation at the same time for the first time since April of 2010 (Ben Sheets, Justin Duchscherer).

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.84 ERA, which is the **lowest mark in the American League** and fourth lowest in the majors...lead the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.285) and slugging percentage (.334) and rank second in opponents batting (.223)...are tied for third in fewest home runs (19) and rank fourth in fewest walks (70).

OFFENSE: The A's were held to two hits on Sunday, which were their fewest in a game since June 27, 2012 against Seattle (also two)...it ended a streak of 272 games with three or more hits...the two-hit game comes after collecting 39 hits in the first three games of the Houston series...are now batting .275 (128 for 466) with 73 runs scored over the last 13 games (5.62 per game) after hitting .234 with 54 runs over the first 13 contests (4.15 per game)...are tied for first in the American League in walks (121), rank second in on-base percentage (.347) and tied for third in runs (127) and extra base hits (77)...18 of the A's 27 home runs have come with runners on base, nine have put the A's ahead and eight have come in the ninth inning or

ON THE BASES: Eric Sogard was caught stealing last night, which snapped a streak of 14 consecutive successful stolen base attempts for A's base runners...are now 18 for 20 (90.0%) for the season, which is the best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 19 of their 21 (90.5%) attempts, which is the second highest percentage in the American League.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 5 for 25 (.200) with a home run, four RBI and five walks...lead the American League in plate appearances (31) and walks (5), are tied for the lead in home runs (1) and extra base hits (3) and tied for second in RBI (4) and doubles (2)...have more plate appearances than two National League teams (Milwaukee, 29, Atlanta, 28).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 23 errors, which is second most in the American League (Cleveland, 24)...A's first basemen have committed six of those errors after tallying just nine all last year...the A's are 5-5 when going errorless compared to 11-5 when making one or more errors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 3-2 on the second road trip of the season, a 10-game trip to Houston (2-2), Texas (1-0) and Boston (three games)...went 7-2 on the first road trip and are 10-4 on the road for the season...that is the **best road record in the American League** and third best in the majors...it is the A's best start on the road since 1990 (12-2)...a win tonight would give the A's their best start on the road after 15 games since 1990 (12-3)...this road trip concludes a 25-game stretch from April 7 to May 4 where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of their 25 games on the road...are 13-7 over the first 20 games of

that stretch...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Houston (3-0) and Texas (0-3)...the sweep by the Rangers marked the first time the A's were swept at home since Sept. 3-5, 2012 against Los Angeles (AL), a streak of 32 consecutive home series without being swept...are 6-6 at home for the season.

MONTH BY MONTH: The A's are 16-9 (.640) in the month of April and have clinched a winning record in April for the second consecutive season (went 16-12 last year)...have also clinched their 11th consecutive winning month dating back to June of 2012...that ties the second longest such streak in Oakland history (July, 1989-May 1991)...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept., 1970-Sept. 1972...the pitching staff has 202 strikeouts in April, which is eight short of the franchise record for April set last year (210).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost 5-1 on Sunday, which marked the first time this year Oakland has lost a game by more than three runs...it was their largest defeat since a 12-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on Sept. 16, 2013, a span of 36 games...the A's are 6-5 in games decided in the last at bat...the 11 games are the most in the majors and the six wins are tied for the most (Milwaukee)...have a Major League leading four wins when trailing after seven innings, which matches their season total from last year...also have a ML leading three losses when leading after eight innings...are 3-1 in extra inning games...are tied for the ML lead in extra inning wins and are tied for the American League lead in extra inning games...are 4-4 (.500) in one-run games and the eight one-run decisions are tied for third most in the AL...are 5-8 in games decided by two runs or fewer, 11-2 in games decided by three runs or more.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 10-7 during this stretch of 19 consecutive games against American League West competition that concludes with this three-game series against Texas...are 8-3 in day games, which is tied for the second best record in the AL...have a 7-7 record at night...are 10-2 when scoring first, which is the second best record in the AL (New York, 11-2)...have not used a rookie, marking their longest stretch without a rookie on the roster since 2006 when they had no rookies for the first 36 days of the season (April 3-May 8)...the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 14 minutes.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have five players on the disabled list (Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker, Rodriguez)...O'Flaherty and Parker are both on the 60-day DL...Elmore and Rodriguez are on rehab assignments with Sacramento...have used the DL seven times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's won the first game of this three-game series in Texas last night after being swept in three games in Oakland last week to open the season series...won the season series last year, 10-9...went 4-5 in Oakland and 6-4 in Texas...it was the A's second consecutive season series win over the Rangers after losing five of the previous six...are 22-20 (.524) over the last three years...are 314-327 all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 167-154 in Oakland and 147-173 in Texas...including 80-85 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 411-409 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Fernando Abad has not allowed a run over his first 10 outings and his 10.0 innings pitched are second most among American League relievers that have not allowed a run...**Yoenis Céspedes** has not played in the last four games (left hamstring)...the A's are 14-7 with him in the starting lineup, 2-3 when he doesn't start...in his three seasons with the club, the A's are 179-103 (.635) with him in the starting lineup and 27-41 (.497) when he doesn't start...**Josh Reddick** recorded a season-high tying three hits last night for the third time in his past 11 games...is 15 for 35 (.429) over that span.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1998** Ben Grieve ties an Oakland record by going a perfect 5 for 5 with four runs scored in the A's 11-4 win at Cleveland...in **2013** the A's defeat the Angels 10-8 in a 19-inning game that lasts an Oakland record 6 hours and 32 minutes...the A's overcome a five-run deficit in the game and Brandon Moss ends it with a two-run home run in the bottom of the 19th inning.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (3-0, 1.62 ERA)

3-0 AND A FIVE-GAME WINNING STREAK: Has started the season 3-0 for the first time in his career...is tied for fourth in the American League in wins and is one of eight AL pitchers with three or more wins that has not lost...also won his final two starts of 2013 and is now 5-0 with a 1.36 ERA (7 er in 46.1 ip) and .192 (32 for 167) opponents batting average over his last seven starts dating back to September 21, 2013...has allowed just one home run in 46.1 innings over that span...the winning streak is one short of his career high of six (May . 10-June 6, 2008).

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks second in the American League in opponents on-base percentage (.234), third in ERA (1.62) and fifth in opponents batting average (.183) and slugging (.267) also ranks sixth in strikeout to walk ratio (5.17), fewest walks per nine innings (1.62), tied for sixth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.27) and tied for seventh in highest run support (6.75).

LAST 23 STARTS: Has allowed one run or fewer in three of his five starts this year and 11 of his last 23 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...is 10-5 with a 2.71 ERA (41 er in 136.1 ip) over that span...has held the opposition to a .226 (116 for 514) batting average...has walked 30 (1.98 per nine innings) and struck out 138 in 136.1 innings (9.11 per nine innings) for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.60...has yielded just eight home runs (0.53 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average includes a .163 (16 for 98) mark against right-handers, which ranks fourth in the American League, compared to .273 (6 for 22) against lefthanders...has issued all six of his walks to righties...over the last two vears, 47 of his 53 walks have been issued to right-handed hitters...opponents are 3 for 33 (.091) with no walks and a hit by pitch when leading off an inning (.118 on-base percentage)...the on-base percentage is the lowest in the majors and the batting average ranks second...has allowed a .080 (2 for 25) average with runners in scoring position, which ranks third in the AL.

NIGHT AND DAY: Made each of his first four starts during the day before starting at night in his last start...last year, he went 5-2 with a 3.27 ERA in 10 starts during the day compared to 5-7 with a 4.46 ERA in 19 starts at night...is now 7-2 with a 2.73 ERA (25 er in 82.1 ip) in 14 starts during the day over the last two years and 6-7 with a 4.29 ERA (52 er in 109.0 ip) in 20 starts at night..

THIST AND THAT: The A's have won each of his five starting assignments...has tossed at least six innings in all five starts, allowed three runs or fewer in each start and issued no walks in three of his

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win over Cleveland in the day game April 2 against Cleveland...tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut.

SECOND START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-3 win at Minnesota April 7...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Hicks in the second...the A's scored three times in the third but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the third on a Kubel RBI double and a Suzuki RBI ground out...then retired 11 of the final 13 batters he faced.

THIRD START: He combined with Abad, Otero, Gregerson and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Seattle April 13...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed two of the hits but had a no decision as the A's scored twice in the eighth and once in the ninth...retired each of the first 10 batters, allowed back to back singles to Miller and Cano with one out in the fourth, and then retired each of the final eight batters.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win over Houston April 19 in Oakland...allowed his first home run of the season, a solo shot by Villar in the third inning...also allowed a RBI single to Dominguez in the fourth and an unearned run in the fifth when Villar scored on a Norris throwing error following a steal of third...left trailing 3-1 but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the ninth for the win.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-1 win at Houston last Thursday...the A's scored twice in the first and he allowed a run in the bottom of the first on a bases loaded walk to Chris Carter...blanked the Astros on three hits and a walk over his final five innings.

KAZMIR vs. TEXAS: Is 6-4 with a 3.09 ERA (84.1 ip, 76 h, 36 r, 29 er, 24 bb, 86 so, 7 hr) in 14 career starts...is 3-3 with a 3.10 ERA (17 er in 49.1 ip) in eight starts in Texas and 3-1 with a 3.09 ERA (12 er in 35.0 ip) in six starts in Oakland...was the losing pitcher in his only start last year, a 6-3 Cleveland loss in Texas on June 10...allowed a RBI single to Gentry in the second but Cleveland scored three times in the third to take a 3-1 lead...he then allowed a two-run home run to Baker in the fourth and left with runners on first and third and no outs in the seventh...was relieved by Hagadone, who allowed one of the runners to score.

THIS SPRING: Went 1-0 with a 1.62 ERA (16.2 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 7 bb, 14 so) in four starts during the spring...held the opposition to a .155 (9 for 58) batting average...did not allow a home run in 16.2 innings...did not allow a run in three of his four starts...was scratched from his start March 17 against Chicago (NL) with left triceps stiffness.

2013 RECAP: Went from the independent Atlantic League in 2012 to a key member of the Cleveland Indians rotation, going 10-9 with a 4.04 ERA in 29 starts...it was his sixth 10-win season but his first since 2009...his 29 starts were his most since 2007, as were his 158.0 innings pitched...walked 47 batters for an average of 2.68 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark of his career...his previous low was 3.24 in 2006...struck out 162, and his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.45 was also a career best...was one of a club-record tving three pitchers to fan 150 or more batters (Jimenez, Masterson)...averaged 9.23 strikeouts per nine innings...did not qualify for the league leaders but had the seventh best strikeout per nine inning ratio among American League pitchers with 150 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, he had the fifth highest run support average (6.27)...was 3-4 with a 5.89 ERA and .302 opponents batting average over his first 11 starts through June 15...then went 7-5 with a 3.06 ERA and .239 opponents average over his final 18 starts

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .262 opponents batting average, including .226 (38-for-168) against left-handed hitters compared to .275 (124-for-451) against right-handers...surrendered 16 of his 19 home runs to righties...13 of the 19 home runs were solo shots.

HOME AND AWAY: Was 7-2 with a 3.86 ERA in 14 starts at home compared to 3-7 with a 4.21 ERA in 15 starts on the road

DAYS REST: Was 6-5 with a 3.55 ERA in 15 starts on four days rest, 4-4 with a 4.60 ERA in 14 starts on five days rest or more.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Compiled a mark of 5-4 and a 4.60 ERA in 16 starts before the All-Star Break...then went 5-5 with a 3.38 ERA in 13 starts after the break...his career numbers are 44-42 with a 4.60 ERA (352 er in 688.1 ip) in 121 starts before the break compared to 35-28 with a 3.41 ERA in 93 games, 92 starts, after the

THIS AND THAT: Was 3-1 with a 3.38 ERA in five interleague starts and is now 11-5 in 22 career interleague starts...committed three errors, which tied for second most among AL pitchers...the Indians were 15-14 (.517) in his starting assignments...tossed six or more innings in 15 of his starts, allowed two runs or fewer 16 times and valked two batters or fewer six times

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Chavez (1-0, 2.32 ERA): Allowed four earned runs in his last start after allowing one earned run in each of his first four starts...ranks start after allowing one earned run in each of his first four starts...ranks eighth in the American League in strikeouts per nine innings (9.58) and 10th in opponents on-base percentage (.270) and strikeout to walk ratio (4.71)...opponents are batting .185 (5 for 27) with runners in scoring position...the A's have won all five of his starting assignments this year, including a no decision in his last start, a 12-5 A's win at Houston last Friday (5.0 ip, 8 h, 5 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 5 so)...is 0-1 with a 7.16 ERA in nine career appearances against Texas, all in relief...went 5-1 with a save and a 2.22 ERA in seven games, five starts, this spring...the five wins were the most in the majors and the most by an A's pitcher since spring win totals most in the majors and the most by an A's pitcher since spring win totals are available beginning in 1990...ranked second in the Cactus League in innings pitched (28.1), fourth in strikeouts (25) and eighth in ERA.

- Bullpen has been credited with the decision in nine of the A's last 15 games (5-4)...its 13 total decisions this season are the second most among Major League bullpens (Texas, 14).
- Its seven wins are the second most in the American League (Texas, 8)...six losses are also tied for the second most in the AL (Seattle, 7).

- Fourth in the AL in opponents batting average (.217)...is first in opponents on-base percentage (.281), and second in slugging percentage (.303).

- Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list April 7 and has pitched seven times since then.
- Has allowed two hits in 7.1 innings this season, but has walked six batters.
- Has two wins and a save in 19 career games against Texas (17.1 ip, 16 h, 4 r, 4 er, 4 bb, 10 so, 2.08 ERA)...appearances and innings against Texas are his most against any Major League team...has faced the Rangers twice this season (2.1 ip, 2 h, 1 so).
- Has a 1.23 ERA (4 er in 29.1 ip) in 28 career appearances in April.
- Was placed on the DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...had a two-game rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton April 3-5 (1.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 10.80 ERA).
