OAKLAND ATHLETICS (17-10) VS. TEXAS RANGERS (15-12)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight and four of the past six games, but are 4-5 over the last nine...began the season by going 2-3 and then won 11 of their next 13 games before the current nine-game stretch...had a season-high three-game losing streak from April 21-23, marking the only time

the A's have lost more than two straight games since Aug. 24, 2013...have not lost more than three in a row since May 6-10, 2013 when they had a five-game losing streak...are 17-10 for the season, which is the **best record in the American League** and third best in the majors...it matches the A's best record after 27 games over the last 24 years (1991, 2003, 2008)...are in first place in the AL West and lead Texas by two games...have 15 days in sole possession of first place, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth.

STARTING PITCHING: Scott Kazmir earned his fourth win of the season last night, despite allowing a season-high tying three earned runs and a season-high seven hits...the A's improved to 6-0 in games that Kazmir has started...A's starters have compiled a 3.99 ERA (38 er in 85.2 ip) over the last 14 games after logging a 1.89 ERA over the first 13 contests...have a 2.97 ERA (55 er in 166.2 ip) overall, which is the lowest in the American League...also have the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the AL (.291) and slugging percentage (.350), and the second lowest batting average (.230)...rank first in inspirited (166.2) and third in strikeouts (146)...have the fewest losses (4)...have two 30-year olds (Scott Kazmir and Jesse Chavez) in the starting rotation at the same time for the first time since April of 2010 (Ben Sheets, Justin Duchscherer).

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.85 ERA, which is the **lowest mark in the American League** and third lowest in the majors...lead the AL in opponents batting average (.224), on-base percentage (.286) and slugging percentage (.332)...are tied for third in fewest home runs (19) and rank fourth in fewest walks (70).

OFFENSE: The A's have averaged 7.0 runs per game over their last six contests after averaging 4.5 runs over their first 21 games...scored at least nine runs last night for the fifth time in their last 14 games...are now batting .275 (138 for 501) with 82 runs scored over the last 14 games (5.86 per game) after hitting .234 with 54 runs over the first 13 contests (4.15 per game)...lead the Major Leagues in walks (127), rank second in on-base percentage (.348), and are fourth in runs (136)...rank third in the AL in extra base hits (82)...18 of the A's 27 home runs have come with runners on base, nine have put the A's ahead and eight have come in the ninth inning or later.

ON THE BASES: Eric Sogard was caught stealing Monday, which snapped a streak of 14 consecutive successful stolen base attempts for A's base runners...are now 19 for 21 (90.5%) for the season, which is the best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 20 of their 22 (90.9%) attempts, which is the second highest percentage in the American League.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 5 for 25 (.200) with a home run, five RBI and seven walks...lead the American League in plate appearances (33) and walks (7), are tied for the lead in home runs (1) and extra base hits (3), are second in RBI (5), and tied for second in doubles (2)...have more plate appearances than two National League teams (Milwaukee, 31, Atlanta, 29).

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: The A's have committed 24 errors, which is second most in the American League (Cleveland, 25)...A's first basemen have committed six of those errors after tallying just nine all last year...the A's are 5-5 when going errorless compared to 12-5 when making one or more errors.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 4-2 on the second road trip of the season, a 10-game trip to Houston (2-2), Texas (2-0) and Boston (three games)...went 7-2 on the first road trip and are 11-4 on the road for the season...that is the **best road record in the American League** and second best in the majors...it is the A's best start on the road since 1990 (12-3)...this road trip concludes a 25-game stretch from April 7 to May 4 where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of their 25 games on the road...are 14-7 over the first 21 games of that stretch...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Houston (3-0) and

Texas (0-3)...the sweep by the Rangers marked the first time the A's were swept at home since Sept. 3-5, 2012 against Los Angeles (AL), a streak of 32 consecutive home series without being swept...are 6-6 at home for the season.

MONTH BY MONTH: The A's are 17-9 (.654) in the month of April and have clinched a winning record in April for the second consecutive season (went 16-12 last year)...have also clinched their 11th consecutive winning month dating back to June of 2012...that ties the second longest such streak in Oakland history (July, 1989-May 1991)...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept., 1970-Sept. 1972...the pitching staff has 211 strikeouts in April, which breaks the franchise record for strikeouts in April, set last year (210).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost 5-1 on Sunday, which marked the first time this year Oakland has lost a game by more than three runs...it was their largest defeat since a 12-1 loss to Los Angeles (AL) on Sept. 16, 2013, a span of 36 games...the A's are 6-5 in games decided in the last at bat...the 11 games are the most in the majors and the six wins are the second most (Milwaukee, 7)...have a Major League leading four wins when trailing after seven innings, which matches their season total from last year...also have a ML leading three losses when leading after eight innings...are 3-1 in extra inning games...are tied for second in the majors in extra inning wins and are tied for the American League lead in extra inning games...are 4-4 (.500) in one-run games and the eight one-run decisions are tied for third most in the AL...are 5-8 in games decided by two runs or fewer, 11-2 in games decided by three runs or more.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 11-7 during this stretch of 19 consecutive games against American League West competition that concludes with this three-game series against Texas...are 8-3 in day games, which is tied for the second best record in the AL...have an 8-7 record at night...are 11-2 when scoring first, which is the best record in the AL...have not used a rookie, marking their longest stretch without a rookie on the roster since 2006 when they had no rookies for the first 36 days of the season (April 3-May 8)...the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 14 minutes.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have four players on the disabled list (Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker)...O'Flaherty and Parker are both on the 60-day DL...Elmore is on a rehab assignment with Sacramento...have used the DL seven times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RANGERS: The A's won the first two games of this three-game series in Texas after being swept in three games in Oakland last week to open the season series...won the season series last year, 10-9...went 4-5 in Oakland and 6-4 in Texas...it was the A's second consecutive season series win over the Rangers after losing five of the previous six...are 23-20 (.535) over the last three years...are 315-327 (.491) all-time against the Texas Rangers...that breaks down to 167-154 in Oakland and 148-173 in Texas...including 81-85 at Globe Life Park...have an all-time record of 412-409 against the Rangers/Senators.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Fernando Abad has not allowed a run over his first 11 outings and his 11.0 innings pitched are third most among Major League relievers that have not allowed a run...Josh Reddick drove in three runs last night for the first time since Sept. 12, 2013...Derek Norris extended his hitting streak to six games, and is now 10 for 17 (.588) with five doubles, five RBI and three runs scored during streak...his on-base percentage during the streak is .650 and his slugging percentage is .882...Sean Doolittle has more innings pitched without allowing a walk than any other pitcher in the Major Leagues (12.2 ip).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **2000** Adam Piatt ties an Oakland record with two triples in the A's 8-2 win at Minnesota...he also connects for his first major league home run...in **2005** Mark Kotsay ties an Oakland record with five hits, including the game winning RBI single in the bottom of the 10th inning of the A's 6-5 win over Seattle.

WEDNESDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (1-0, 2.32 ERA)

FOR STARTERS: Allowed four earned runs in his last start after allowing one earned run in each of his first four starts...his season-opening streak of four consecutive starts of six or more innings and one earned run or fewer was the longest such streak by a pitcher on an Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (Brett Anderson did it in 2012 after coming off the DL in August)...is now 1-0 with a 2.32 ERA in his five starting assignments...prior to this year, had made just two career starts, both with Toronto in 2012...had a loss and a 10.38 ERA in those two outings...is now 1-1 with a 4.08 ERA (18 er in 39.2 ip) in seven career starts...had 54 career starts as a minor leaguer...made 23 starts over the previous two seasons after starting just once from 2005-11.

STRIKEOUTS AND WALKS: Has struck out 33 and walked just seven in 31.0 innings...ranks 10th in the American League in strikeout to walk ratio (4.71) and strikeouts per nine innings (9.58)...has issued six of his seven walks to left-handed hitters...has allowed 20 of his 27 walks over the last two years to left-handers...did not walk a batter and struck out nine in back-to-back starts April 9 and 14...joins Dan Haren (August 21-26, 2007) as the only two Athletics pitchers since at least 1914 to strikeout nine or more in back-to-back starts without issuing a walk

OPPONENTS BATTING: Ranks seventh in the American League in opponents on-base percentage (.270)...opponents are batting .185 (5 for 27) with runners in scoring position...has not allowed a hit with RISP and two outs (9 AB)...opponents are 5 for 39 (.128) with RISP and two outs over the last two years...has not walked a batter to lead off an inning...has allowed three home runs, all solo shots.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have won all five of his starting assignments this year...however, has just one win...the four no decisions are tied for second most in the American League among starters (Masterson, CLE 5)...has tossed at least six innings in four of his five starts, allowed two runs or fewer four times and walked two batters or fewer four times.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 12-inning win over Seattle April 3 in Oakland...was charged with an unearned run in the first inning when Almonte reached on a Callaspo error, went to second on a Punto error, third on a Miller fly out and scored on a Cano ground out...also allowed a RBI single to Almonte in the fifth to make the score 2-0...the A's scored single runs in the fifth and eighth to tie the game.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-4, 11-inning win at Minnesota April 9...struck out a career-high nine in a career-high 7.0 innings...the A's scored four times in the first inning and he allowed a solo home run to Kubel to lead off the second...that was the only run he would allow in his seven innings and he was relieved by Doolittle to start the eighth with a 4-1 lead...Doolittle allowed a run in the eighth and Johnson two in the ninth.

THIRD START: He had his third consecutive no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Los Angeles (AL) April 14...matched his career high with nine strikeouts and 7.0 innings pitched for the second consecutive start...allowed an unearned run in the first inning when Calhoun singled, went to second on a passed ball and scored on a Pujols single...allowed a solo home run to Pujols in the third and left after seven innings trailing 2-1.

FOURTH START: He picked up his first career win as a starter in the A's 4-1 win over Houston April 20 in Oakland...blanked the Astros on three hits and two walks over the first three innings before Gonzalez homered with two outs in the fourth...then retired seven of the final eight batters he faced...tossed a career-high 103 pitches.

LAST AT BAT: He had a no decision in the A's 12-5 win at Houston last Friday...allowed a career-high eight hits...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a run in the third inning on an Altuve RBI double...the A's scored a run in the fourth to take a 5-1 lead but he allowed four runs in the bottom of the fourth on a Dominguez RBI single, a two-run error by Donaldson and a Castro RBI ground out...the A's scored seven times in the ninth for the win.

CHAVEZ vs. TEXAS: Is 0-1 with a 7.16 ERA (16.1 ip, 18 h, 13 r, 13 er, 2 bb, 18 so, 5 hr) in nine career appearances, all in relief...is 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA (8 er in 10.2 ip) in six games in Texas and 0-0 with a 7.94 ERA (5 er in 5.2 ip) in three games in Oakland...had a loss in six outings last year (9.2 ip, 10 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 9 so, 6.52 ERA)...his last appearance was on September 15, 2013 at Texas when he retired the side in order in the ninth inning of the A's 5-1 win (1 so).

THIS SPRING: Went 5-1 with a save and a 2.22 ERA (28.1 ip, 22 h, 7 r, 7 er, 6 bb, 25 so, 4 hr) in seven games, five starts...the five wins were the most in the majors this spring and the most by an A's pitcher since spring win totals are available beginning in 1990...ranked second in the Cactus League in innings pitched (28.1), fourth in strikeouts (25) and eighth in ERA...allowed a .216 opponents batting average...did not allow a run in five of his seven games, including a spring-opening 13.2-inning scoreless streak.

2013 RECAP: Spent most of the season with the A's and was 2-4 with a save and a career-low 3.92 ERA in 35 games over two stints...the save was the first of his career and he also struck out a career-high 55 batters...also had career lows in opponents batting average (.230), onbase percentage (.302) and slugging percentage (.318)...matched his career highs in wild pitches (5) and hit batters (3)...surrendered just three home runs in 57.1 innings, an average of 0.47 per nine innings...entered the season with 34 home runs in 177.1 career innings (1.73 per nine innings).

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Had a 2.97 ERA and .210 opponents batting average in 18 games before the All-Star Break...then compiled a 5.25 ERA and .258 opponents average in 17 games after the break.

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .212 (21-for-99) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .246 (29-for-118) against left-handers...yielded all three of his home runs to right-handers...allowed a .167 batting average with runners in scoring position and two outs...had a .269 batting average over his first 15 pitches in a game, .193 after that...opponents hit .333 with a .418 on-base percentage when leading off an inning.

IN RELIEF: First batters faced were 8-for-32 (.250) with two walks (.286 on-base percentage)...allowed 8-of-26 (30.8%) inherited runners to score.

HOME AND AWAY: Had a 2.73 ERA and .181 opponents batting average in 20 games on the road compared to a 5.20 ERA and .277 opponents average in 15 games at home.

THIS AND THAT: Led AL relievers in sacrifice hits allowed (6) and averaged the seventh most pitches per game (27.1)...tied for fifth among all AL pitchers in sacrifice hits...tossed at least one inning in 30 of his 35 appearances, including 10 outings of two or more.

2013 WITH SACRAMENTO: Was used exclusively as a starter with Sacramento and went 2-2 with a 2.70 ERA in five starts...allowed just one home run in 30.0 innings...walked five batters, an average of 1.50 per nine innings...struck out 26 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 5.20...yielded a .285 opponents batting average, including .240 (18-for-75) against right-handed hitters compared to .354 (17-for-48) against left-handers...went 1-1 with a 2.45 ERA in three starts before he was called up by Oakland the first time April 20...that included a season-high nine strikeout game for his first win, April 15 at Reno...logged a 1-1 record and a 3.09 ERA in two starts during his second stay with the River Cats from April 29 to May 9.

RHP Dan Straily (1-1, 5.14 ERA): Is 0-0 with a 7.20 ERA and .283 opponents batting average over his last three starts after going 1-1 with a 2.77 ERA and .191 opponents average over his first two starts...has allowed at least one home run in each of his first five starts and is tied for the Major League lead in home runs allowed (7)...has not allowed more than eight hits in a start in his career and has tossed at least 3.1 innings in each of those outings...his streak of 39 consecutive starts of eight hits or fewer and three innings or more is the longest by an A's pitcher since at least 1914...had a no decision in his last start, a 7-6 A's loss at Houston last Saturday (6.1 ip, 4 h, 3 r, 3 er, 2 bb, 7 so)...has never faced Boston in his career...had no decisions and a 4.37 ERA in four starts this spring...issued 10 walks in 13.1 innings...had five stints with Oakland in 2013 and was 10-8 with a 3.96 ERA in 27 starts...led American League rookies in games started, innings pitched (152.1) and strikeouts (124) and tied for the lead in wins (Perez, TEX).

- The A's bullpen has allowed five earned runs over its last three games (7.0 ip, 6.43 ERA) after giving up just three earned runs over its previous eight outings (23.0 ip, 1.17 ERA)...its 2.60 ERA is first in the American League...this season against the Rangers, the A's bullpen is 0-2 in with a 2.08 ERA in four games (3 er in 13.0 ip).
- Bullpen has been credited with the decision in nine of the A's last 16 games (5-4)...its 13 total decisions this season are the second most among Major League bullpens (Texas, 14).
- Its seven wins are the second most in the American League (Texas, 8)...six losses are tied for the third most in the AL (Seattle/Chicago, 7).
- Its six blown saves are tied for the most in the majors.
- First in the AL in opponents batting average (.211), opponents onbase percentage (.275), and slugging percentage (.294).
- Its 24 runs allowed are the fewest in the American League.

- Has appeared against the Rangers eight times in his career (5.2 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 4 so)...in three games against Texas this season, has tossed 2.2 scoreless innings (1 h, 2 so).
- Leads all Major League relievers in WHIP (0.36)...tied for the fewest hits allowed by a reliever (min. 10.0 ip).
- Has a 13-game losing streak dating back to April 9, 2011, which is the longest active losing streak in the majors.
- Was acquired from Washington for minor league infielder John Wooten, November 25, 2013.

Last Year: Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse and was 1-0 with a 1.06 ERA in 17 relief appearances...was promoted to Washington May 21 and went 0-3 with a 3.35 ERA in a career-high 39 relief appearances.

- Was reinstated from the 15-day disabled list April 7 and has pitched eight times since then...has thrown six-straight scoreless outings since April 16 (6.1 ip).
- Has allowed two hits in 9.1 innings this season, but has walked seven batters.
- Has two wins and a save in 20 career games against Texas (19.1 ip, 16 h, 4 r, 4 er, 5 bb, 12 so, 1.86 ERA)...appearances and innings against Texas are his most against any Major League team...has faced the Rangers three times this season (4.1 ip, 2 h, 1 bb, 3 so).
- Has a 1.15 ERA (4 er in 31.1 ip) in 29 career appearances in April.
- Was placed on the DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...had a two-game rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton April 3-5 (1.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 10.80 ERA).

Last Year: Was 6-4 with two saves and a 2.54 ERA in a team-leading 71 relief appearances...allowed just two home runs in 67.1 innings, an average of 0.27 per nine innings, which was fourth lowest among AL relievers.

- Surrendered a career-high tying four runs on Saturday (three times, last Aug. 20, 2013 vs. Seattle)...also marked the third time in his career he has failed to record an out.
- Is 0-2 and has allowed seven runs in his last five games (5.0 ip, 10 h, 0 bb, 7 so, 12.60 ERA) after allowing one run in his first four contests (7.2 ip, 5 h, 0 bb, 8 so, 1.17 ERA).
- Has not issued a walk in 12.2 innings, which are the most innings pitched in the Major Leagues without issuing a walk.
- Recorded his first save of the season and the fourth of his career on April 13 at Seattle.
- Tied for fifth in the AL in games pitched.
- Is 0-2 with a save in 16 career games against Texas (17.1 ip, 15 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 20 so, 1.04 ERA)...suffered the loss in his only game against the Rangers this season, on April 21 (0.2 ip, 2 h, 1 r, 1 er, 0 bb, 0 so).
- Finished the 2013 season by stranding each of his 19 inherited runners over his final 37 games.
