OAKLAND ATHLETICS (18-10) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (13-16)

ABOUT THE A'S: Swept a three-game series from Texas to start the week after losing five of the previous seven games...it was the A's third sweep of the season, which is tied for the most in the majors (LAD, WAS, MIL)...the sweep of the Rangers gave the A's a season-high three-game lead in the American League West at the end of April...it marked just the sixth time in Oakland history the A's led the West by three or more games in April (1971, 1981, 1988, 1990, 2003)...the last time the A's led the West by more than three games before the end of May was in 1990 when they led by 5½ games from May 9-11...are now 18-10 for the season, which is the second best record in the majors (Milwaukee, 20-9)...it is the A's best record after 28 games since the 1991 club was also 18-10...a win tonight would give the A's their best start since 1990 (22-7)...had a season-high three-game losing streak from April 21-23, marking the only time the A's have lost more than two straight games since Aug. 24, 2013...have 17 days in sole possession of first place, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth.

IN APRIL: The A's went 18-9 (.667) last month to tie the franchise record for wins in the month of April (1981, 1989)...it was the seventh best April winning percentage in Oakland history and the best since 1990 (14-5, .737)...it was also the A's 11th consecutive winning month dating back to June of 2012...that ties the second longest such streak in Oakland history (July, 1989-May 1991)...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept., 1970-Sept. 1972...the A's had two four-game winners in April (Gray and Kazmir) for the third time in Oakland history (Norris and Keough in 1981, Mulder and Zito in 2003)...the pitching staff finished the month with 220 strikeouts, setting the franchise record for strikeouts in April (previous, 210 in 2013)...it was the third best single-month total in Oakland history (246 in Sept. 2013; 223 in Aug. 2007)...had a .280 opponents on-base percentage, which was their lowest in April since 1981 (.261)...the offense had the second best April totals in Oakland history in runs (148), hits (254) and walks (tie, 126).

STARTING PITCHING: Sonny Gray, Scott Kazmir and Jesse Chavez have combined for a 10-1 record and a 1.92 ERA (25 er in 117.1 ip) in 18 starts...Kazmir and Chavez have made six starts each, marking the first time the A's have two 30-year-olds with more than five starts in a season since 2000 (Appier, Heredia, Olivares, Prieto)...starters have compiled a 3.69 ERA (38 er in 92.2 ip) over the last 15 games after logging a 1.89 ERA over the first 13 contests...have a 2.85 ERA (55 er in 173.2 ip) overall, which is the **lowest in the American League** and fourth lowest in the majors...also have the lowest opponents on-base percentage (.285) and slugging percentage (.340) in the AL and the second lowest batting average (.224)...rank second in innings pitched (173.2) and third in strikeouts (154)...are tied with Los Angeles (NL) for the fewest losses in the majors (4).

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.78 ERA, which is the **lowest mark in the American League** and second lowest in the majors...lead the AL in opponents batting average (.221), on-base percentage (.282) and slugging percentage (.326)...are tied for the second fewest home runs allowed (19) and have issued the third fewest walks (74).

OFFENSE: The A's tallied a season-high 17 hits Wednesday and matched their season high with 12 runs scored...are now batting .283 (155 for 547) with 94 runs scored over the last 15 games (6.27 per game) after hitting .234 with 54 runs over the first 13 contests (4.15 per game)...lead the majors in on-base percentage (.351), rank second in walks (130), tied for third in triples (7), fourth in runs (148), sixth in batting (.261), seventh in slugging (.412) and tied for seventh in extra base hits (86)...18 of the A's 28 home runs have come with runners on base, which is second most in the majors to the Angels (21).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 19 for 21 (90.5%) in stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 20 of their 22 (90.9%) attempts, which is the second highest percentage in the American League.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 6 for 26 (.231) with a home run, five RBI and seven walks...lead the American League in plate appearances (34) and walks (7), are tied for the lead in home runs (1) and extra base hits (3), rank second in RBI (5) and on-base

percentage (.412), and tied for second in doubles (2)...have more plate appearances than two National League teams (Milwaukee, 33; Atlanta, 32).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 5-2 on the second road trip of the season, a 10-game trip to Houston (2-2), Texas (3-0) and Boston (three games)...went 7-2 on the first road trip and are 12-4 on the road for the season...that is the **best road record in the American League** and third best in the majors...it is the A's best start on the road since the 1990 club also started the year 12-4 (won road game 17)...this series with Boston concludes a 25-game stretch from April 7 to May 4 where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of their 25 games on the road...are 15-7 over the first 22 games of that stretch...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Houston (3-0) and Texas (0-3) and are 6-6 at home for the season...return home following the game Sunday for a 10-game homestand against Seattle (four games), Washington (three games) and Chicago-AL (three games).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 6-5 in games decided in the last at bat...the 11 games are the most in the majors and the six wins are second most (Milwaukee, 7)...have a Major League leading four wins when trailing after seven innings, which matches their season total from last year...also have a ML leading three losses when leading after eight innings...are 3-1 in extra inning games...are tied for the American League lead in extra inning wins and games...are 5-8 in games decided by two runs or fewer, 13-2 in games decided by three runs or more.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have committed 25 errors, which is tied for second most in the American League...are 12-2 when scoring first, which is the best record in the AL...are 12-0 when hitting more home runs than the opposition...have not used a rookie, marking their longest stretch without a rookie on the roster since 2006 when they had no rookies for the first 36 days of the season (April 3-May 8)...the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 13 minutes.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have four players on the disabled list (Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker)...O'Flaherty and Parker are both on the 60-day DL...Elmore is on a rehab assignment with Sacramento...have used the DL seven times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RED SOX: The two clubs split the season series last year, 3-3...each team won two of three games in its home ballpark...the A's have won 11 of the last 14 games against the Red Sox after losing seven of the previous eight...since 2006, the A's have won three season series, lost two and split three...are 38-32 over that span, which includes 25-10 in Oakland, 12-21 at Fenway and 1-1 in Tokyo...are 230-278 since moving to Oakland in 1968...that includes 137-115 in Oakland, 92-162 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyo...all-time, the A's are 872-1059 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Fernando Abad has not allowed a run over his first 11 outings and his 11.0 innings pitched are third most in the majors among pitchers that have not allowed a run...**Josh Donaldson** has reached base safely via hit or walk in each of his last 23 games, which is the third longest streak in the majors (Bautista, 28; Napoli, 24)...is 32 for 100 (.320) with 10 doubles, seven home runs, 23 RBI and 10 walks (.382 on-base percentage) over that span...**Sean Doolittle** has more innings pitched without allowing a walk than any other pitcher in the Major Leagues (12.2 ip)...**Derek Norris** has five straight multiple hit games (11 for 18, .611)...has a seven-game hitting streak overall (13 for 22, .591), which is one short of his career high...is batting .386, which is the best mark in the majors among batters with 60 or more plate appearances.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1975** Reggie Jackson collects his 1000th hit in an Oakland uniform in the A's 4-3 win at Chicago...in **2001** Mark Mulder tosses a three-hit shutout in the A's 6-0 win over Toronto...Miguel Tejada homers twice and drives in four runs...in **2012** Brian Fuentes records the 200th save of his career in the A's 4-2 win at Boston...he becomes the sixth left-hander in Major League history to reach the 200 save plateau.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Dan Straily (1-1, 5.14 ERA)

LAST THREE, FIRST TWO: Is 0-0 with a 7.20 ERA (12 er in 15.0 ip) and .283 (17 for 60) opponents batting average over his last three starts after going 1-1 with a 2.77 ERA and .191 opponents average over his first two starts.

THE LONG BALL: Has allowed at least one home run in each of his first five starts and is tied for the Major League lead in home runs allowed (7)...five have been hit by left-handed hitters, which is tied for second in the majors...four have been solo shots...23 of his 34 career home runs have been solo shots and 21 of the 34 have been hit by left-handers...has surrendered seven home runs in 28.0 innings (2.25 per nine innings) after yielding 16 home runs in 152.1 innings last year (0.95 per nine innings)...allowed 11 in 39.1 innings in 2012 (2.52 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 9 for 26 (.346) with two walks and a hit by pitch (.414 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...also has three doubles and a home run (.577 slugging percentage)...has yielded a .316 (6 for 19) average with runners in scoring position

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-1 with a 2.77 ERA (4 er in 13.0 ip) and .191 (9 for 47) opponents batting average in two starts during the day compared to 0-0 with a 7.20 ERA (12 er in 15.0 ip) and .283 (17 for 60) opponents average in three starts at night...last year, he was 4-2 with a 2.14 ERA and .195 opponents batting average in nine starts during the day compared to 6-6 with a 4.98 ERA and .252 opponents average in 18 starts at night...his day ERA was the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings in day games...surrendered just one of his 16 home runs during the day...his career numbers are 5-4 with a 3.21 ERA (29 er in 81.1 ip) in 14 starts during the day compared to 8-6 with a 4.62 ERA (71 er in 138.1 ip) in 25 starts at night.

EIGHT HITS OR FEWER: Has not allowed more than eight hits in a start in his career and has tossed at least 3.1 innings in each of those outings...his streak of 39 consecutive starts of eight hits or fewer and three innings or more is the longest by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 (previous: 36, Curt Young, July 21, 1986-Aug. 8, 1987)...it is the longest career opening streak by a Major Leaguer since Juan Guzman had a 42-game streak from June 7, 1991-July 18, 1992.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss to Seattle April 5 in Oakland...blanked the Mariners on two hits over the first four innings before allowing three runs in the fifth inning on a two-run home run by Ackley and a solo home run by Almonte...Hernandez shut out the A's on four hits over the first eight innings before Lowrie homered in the ninth.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win at Minnesota April 10...allowed a solo home run to the second batter he faced, Dozier, but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings...did not allow a hit over his final five innings and retired 16 of the final 18 batters he faced.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 10-9, 11-inning win at Los Angeles (AL) April 15...yielded a career-high tying six runs (fifth time)...allowed a RBI double to Trout and a RBI single to Kendrick in the first inning but the A's scored three times in the third to take a 3-2 lead...he then allowed four runs in the fourth inning on a two-run double by Iannetta and a two-run home run by Calhoun...left after 3.2 innings trailing 6-3.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss to Texas in Oakland on April 21...allowed a home run to Choo to lead off the game but the A's came back with three runs in the second inning off Darvish...allowed a RBI single to Kouzmanoff in the fourth and a RBI single to Fielder in the fifth and left after five innings with the scored tied 3-3.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss at Houston last Saturday...the A's scored twice in the first but he allowed a run in the bottom of the first and two more in the second...Fowler homered in the first and Carter hit a two-run home run in the second...left after five innings trailing 3-2 but the A's scored a run in the seventh to tie the game.

THIS SPRING: Had no decisions and a 4.37 ERA (13.1 ip, 14 h, 7 r, 7 er, 10 bb, 8 so, 1 hr) in four starts this spring...opponents hit .275...walked two or more batters in all four starts and issued 10 walks in 13.1 innings overall (6.75 walks per nine innings)...had his final start on March 29 against San Francisco rained out...pitched in a minor league game March 24 (5.2 ip, 10 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 2 hr).

2013 RECAP: Had five stints with Oakland in 2013 and was 10-8 with a 3.96 ERA in 27 starts...led American League rookies in games started, innings pitched (152.1) and strikeouts (124) and tied for the lead in wins (Perez, TEX)...is the 11th rookie in Oakland history to win 10 or more games, the fifth in the last five years (Anderson, Cahill, Milone, Parker)...had the sixth most strikeouts by an Oakland rookie...went 1-2 with a 7.27 ERA and .257 opponents batting average over his first five starts, 5-0 with a 2.83 ERA and .196 opponents average over his next nine starts from May 21 to July 9, 0-5 with a 5.20 ERA and .299 opponents over his next seven starts from July 20 to Aug. 23 and 4-1 with a 2.00 ERA and .195 opponents average over his final six starts

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .233 opponents batting average...did not have enough innings pitched to qualify for the league leaders, but his opponents average was ninth lowest among AL pitchers with 150 or more innings pitched...his .358 slugging percentage was eighth best...his opponents batting average included a .221 (60-for-272) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .244 (72-for-295) against left-handers...allowed a .201 batting average the first time through the lineup, which was third lowest among AL pitchers with 150 or more innings pitched...now has a .210 (66-for-314) opponents average the first time through the lineup in his career...allowed a .225 batting average to batters leading off an inning...however, issued 19 walks to start an inning, which tied for second most in the AL...opponents hit .300 with runners in scoring position and two outs...they were 4-for-7 (.571) with a grand slam with the bases loaded.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 6-2 with a 4.28 ERA and .217 opponents batting average in 14 starts before the All-Star Break...then went 4-6 with a 3.61 ERA and .250 opponents average in 13 starts after the break.

DAYS REST: Was 6-3 with a 3.25 ERA in 14 starts on five days rest or more compared to 4-5 with a 4.80 ERA in 13 starts on four days rest...is now 8-4 with a 3.08 ERA (41 er in 119.2 ip) in 20 career starts on five days rest or more compared to 5-6 with a 5.31 ERA (59 er in 100.0 ip) in 19 starts on four days rest.

RUN SUPPORT: Received two runs of support or fewer in 17 of his 27 starts and was 5-8 in those games...was 5-0 in 10 starts with three runs of support or more...is now 6-10 in 21 career starts with two runs of support or fewer, 7-0 in 18 starts with support of three or more

THIS AND THAT: Was 3-1 with a 1.54 ERA and .167 opponents batting average in four interleague starts...tied for third in the majors in interleague wins, ranked fourth in opponents batting average and ninth in ERA...tied for the team-lead with seven hit batters...the A's were 16-11 (.593) in his starting assignments and are 23-16 (.590) in his career.

2013 WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-1 with a 1.14 ERA and .202 opponents batting average in five starts with Sacramento...allowed just one home run in 31.2 innings...struck out 33, an average of 9.38 per nine innings...his opponents batting average included a .174 (8-for-46) mark against left-handed hitters compared to .219 (16-for-73) against right-handers.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER
LHP Tommy Milone (0-2, 4.56 ERA): Has been charged with both of his losses this year on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 12-8 with a 3.08 ERA in 28 games in Oakland compared to 13-13 with a 4.74 ERA in 35 games on the road...has received no run support in two of his four starts this year, both losses...has received just 22 runs of support in his 21 losses in three seasons with the A's (1.64 RSA)...the A's are 0-4 in his starting assignments this year but are 36-25 (.590) in his career...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 5-1 A's loss at Houston last Sunday (6.2 ip, 5 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 2 so)...was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance against the Red Sox, a start in the A's 11-6 loss at Boston on April 30, 2012 (4.2 ip, 8 h, 8 r, 7 er, 1 bb, 5 so)...went 2-1 with a 4.26 ERA in five games, four starts, this spring...logged a 1.93 ERA over his final three games.

- The A's bullpen has allowed six earned runs over its last four games (9.0 ip, 6.00 ERA) after giving up just three earned runs over its previous eight outings (23.0 ip, 1.17 ERA)...its 2.65 ERA is first in the American League...no other team in the AL has an ERA below 3.24 (Cleveland).
- Bullpen has been credited with the decision in nine of the A's last 17 games (5-4)...its 13 total decisions this season are the second most among Major League bullpens (Texas, 14).
- Has gone eight straight games without a save opportunity (5-3).
- Its seven wins are the second most in the American League (Texas, 8)...six losses are tied for the third most in the AL (Seattle/Chicago, 7).
- Its six blown saves are tied for the second most in the majors (Pittsburgh, 7).
- First in the AL in opponents batting average (.214), opponents on-base percentage (.277), and slugging percentage (.298).
- Its 25 runs allowed are the fewest in the American League, nine fewer than the next closest team (Kansas City).

- Has a win and a save in six career games against Boston (6.2 ip, 3 h, 0 r, 4 bb, 9 so)...in two appearances last year, picked up a win in 2.1 ip.

HOME AND AWAY: Has been charged with both of his losses this year on the road...last year, he went 5-4 with a 3.44 ERA in 12 games at home compared to 7-5 with a 4.69 ERA in 16 games on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 12-8 with a 3.08 ERA (59 er in 172.2 ip) in 28 games in Oakland compared to 13-13 with a 4.74 ERA (104 er in 197.1 ip) in 35 games on the road.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received no run support in two of his four starts this year, both losses...last year, he received just 10 runs of support in his nine losses (1.78 RSA)...has received just 22 runs of support in his 21 losses in three seasons with the A's (120.2 ip, 1.64 RSA)...has received no support 11 times over the last three years as a starter and one run of support eight times...went 11-1 with three runs of support or more in 2013 and is 20-3 in his career.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .217 (5 for 23) batting average with runners in scoring position...last year, opponents hit .216 with RISP, which ranked eighth in the American League...has yielded just one home run in 23.2 innings...has issued all eight of his walks this year to right-handed hitters.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Opponents have reached base on an error twice with him pitching, which is **red** tied for seventh most in the American League...that has led to three unearned runs, which is **red** tied for eighth in the AL...last year, opponents reached base on an error 11 times with him pitching, which was the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors...that led to 11 unearned runs, which tied for second most in the AL...opponents have now reached base via error 24 times over the last three years, which is the **red** most in the majors (Jordan Lyles, 23)...has 25 unearned runs over that span, which is **red** tied for fourth in the majors.

RHP Sonny Gray (4-1, 1.76 ERA): Is **red** tied for the American League lead in wins (4) and ranks **red** fifth in ERA (1.76)...is the **red** fifth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April...is 8-2 with a 2.00 ERA and .225 opponents batting over his last 12 starts dating back to Aug. 31, 2013...**red** the wins are second most in the majors over that span...has allowed just one home run over his first six starts and 41.0 innings...has surrendered just five home runs in 105.0 career innings...is 3-0 with a 1.29 ERA in four starts at night compared to 1-1 with a 2.77 ERA in two starts during the day...his career numbers are 5-1 with a 1.53 ERA in 11 night games, 4-3 with a 3.57 ERA in seven day games...tossed his first career complete game in his last start, a three-hit shutout in the A's 4-0 win at Texas last Monday (1 bb, 6 so)...has never faced Boston in his career...went 0-1 with a 3.48 ERA in six starts this spring...yielded just one home run in 20.2 innings.

SUNDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (4-1, 1.76 ERA)

WINS: Became the third four-game winner in the American League with a win in his last start...is currently **red** tied for the **AL lead** in wins...is the **fifth** A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998)...is now 8-2 with a 2.00 ERA (17 er in 76.0 ip) and .225 (64 for 285) opponents batting over his last 12 starts dating back to Aug. 31, 2013...**the wins are second** most in the majors over that span (**Wainwright, STL 9**)...now has nine wins in 18 career appearances...the only pitchers in Oakland history to win their 10th game in 19 appearances or fewer are Tim Hudson (18 games) and Barry Zito (19).

SHUTOUT: Tossed his first career shutout in his last start Monday at Texas...it was the second time this year he has not allowed a run in a start and he ranks **fifth** in the American League in ERA (1.76)...has one of **three** shutouts in the AL and one of **five** complete games.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed just one home run over his first six starts and 41.0 innings...his average of 0.22 home runs per nine innings is **fifth** lowest in the American League...has surrendered just five home runs in 105.0 career innings (0.43 per nine innings)...ranks **sixth** in the AL in opponents slugging (.287)...has yielded a .163 (7 for 43) average with runners in scoring position, which ranks **eighth** in the American League...has allowed a .198 (17 for 91) average with RISP in his career...opponents are 2 for 19 (.105) with RISP and two outs...has a .174 (8 for 46) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .240 (25 for 104) after that...opponents are batting .171 (6 for 35) when leading off an inning this year and .186 (18 for 97) in his career.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-0 with a 1.29 ERA (4 er in 28.0 ip) in four starts at night compared to 1-1 with a 2.77 ERA (4 er in 13.0 ip) in two starts during the day...his career numbers are 5-1 with a 1.53 ERA (11 er in 64.2 ip) in 11 night games, 4-3 with a 3.57 ERA (16 er in 40.1 ip) in seven day games.

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed five of his eight earned runs this year over the first three innings of a game...last year, he yielded 20 of his 22 runs over the first three innings of a game...in his career, he has a 3.75 ERA (20 er in 48.0 ip), .258 (49 for 190) opponents batting average and four home runs allowed in innings one through three compared to a 1.11 ERA (7 er in 57.0 ip), .177 (35 for 198) opponents average and one home run from the fourth inning on.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Has won four of his five starts this year against American League West competition after a no decision against Cleveland in his first start...is now 6-2 with a 1.65 ERA (13 er in 71.0 ip) in 11 career games against AL West foes compared to 3-2 with a 3.71 ERA (14 er in 34.0 ip) in seven games against everyone else.

DAYS REST: Is 3-0 with a 1.80 ERA (5 er in 25.0 ip) in four starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-1 with a 1.69 ERA (3 er in 16.0 ip) in two starts on four days rest...his career numbers are 6-1 with a 1.68 ERA (10 er in 53.2 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more, 3-3 with a 3.23 ERA (17 er in 47.1 ip) in seven starts on four days rest.

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Was charged with his first loss of the season April 23, snapping his season-opening winning streak at three games...has never lost consecutive decisions in his career...the loss snapped a six-game winning streak dating back to September 11 of last year, which was a career high...went 6-0 with a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch...allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak.

THIS AND THAT: Has issued 10 of his 14 walks this year and 25 of his 34 in his career to left-handed hitters...the A's have been shut out **twice** this year, both times in his starts...however, his season run support average is 4.83 (22 rs in 41.0 ip)...his career RSA as a starter is 6.42 (72 rs in 101.0 ip)...the A's are 4-2 (.667) in his starting assignments this year and are 10-6 (.625) when he starts in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 12 of his 16 starts, allowed two runs or fewer nine times and walked two batters or fewer 11 times.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss to Cleveland on Opening Night March 31...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...allowed five hits and walked three...retired the side in order just once, the third inning...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom).

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 win over Seattle April 6 in Oakland...did not allow a run in the first inning to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings (previous: 13.0, August 10-20, 2013)...was charged with two unearned runs in the second inning (Barton error) when he allowed RBI singles to Almonte and Miller...also allowed a RBI single to Smoak in the third to give the Mariners a 3-0 lead but the A's tied the game on a Moss three-run homer in the bottom of the third...retired 11 of the final 12 batters he faced, including each of the last seven, and the A's scored twice in the fifth to take the lead for good.

THIRD START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 win at Seattle April 12...struck out a career-high tying nine batters...allowed back-to-back singles to Almonte and Miller to start the game before retiring 11 straight...Almonte scored on a Cano ground out, but that

would be the only run he would allow in seven innings...blanked the Mariners on three hits and two walks over his final six innings.

FOURTH START: He won his third consecutive start in the A's 11-3 win over Houston April 18 in Oakland...allowed a career-high nine hits...the A's scored seven times in the first inning and he blanked the Astros on three hits and a walk over the first four innings...allowed three runs in the fifth on RBI singles by Fowler and Springer and a sacrifice fly by Carter.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas last Wednesday in Oakland...walked a career-high four batters...allowed a RBI triple to Rios in the first, a RBI single to Choice in the fifth and a solo home run to Murphy in the sixth...Perez shut out the A's on three hits and two walks.

LAST START: He tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a three-hitter in the A's 4-0 win at Texas last Monday...became just the fifth visiting pitcher to allow three hits or fewer in a shutout at Globe Life Park, the first since Matt Garza (Aug. 15, 2008)...allowed a Martin single in the third, a Chirinos single in the sixth and a Rios single in the seventh.

THIS SPRING: Went 0-1 with a 3.48 (20.2 ip, 18 h, 11 r, 8 er, 6 bb, 16 so) ERA in six starts...allowed a .228 (18 for 79) opponents batting average...yielded just one home run in 20.2 innings...allowed just one earned run in 10.2 innings over his final two starts (0.84 ERA) after posting a 6.30 ERA over his first four starts...surrendered one run or fewer in four of his six starts.

RYAN COOK

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring.

COCO CRISP

- Was on his 10th Opening Day roster (2004-09, 11-14) and made his ninth career Opening Day start, his fourth straight with the A's.
- Hit his first career game-ending home run April 3 against Seattle...it was his sixth regular season "walk-off" RBI.

- Had a 10-game hitting streak from April 6-16 (16 for 48, .333), which fell one short of his career high.

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.

LUKE GREGERSON

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
