OAKLAND ATHLETICS (18-11) VS. BOSTON RED SOX (14-16)

SATURDAY, MAY 3, 2014 – FENWAY PARK – 1:35 P.M. EDT

ABOUT THE A'S: Dropped the series opener last night, 7-16 had swept a three-game series from Texas to start the week after losing five of the previous seven gamesō it was the A's third sweep of the season, which is tied for the most in the majors (LAD, WAS, MIL)ō the sweep of the Rangers gave the A's a season-high three-game lead in the American League West at the end of Aprilō it marked just the sixth time in Oakland history the A's led the West by three or more games in April (1971, 1981, 1988, 1990, 2003)ō are now 18-11 for the season, two games ahead of second-place Texas in the AL Westō their record is the second best mark in the American League and tied for third best in the majorsō it is the A's best record after 29 games since the 1991 club was also 18-11ō a win today would give the A's their best start since 1990 (22-8)ō had a season-high three-game losing streak from April 21-23, marking the only time the A's have lost more than two straight games since Aug. 24, 2013ō have been 18 days in sole possession of first place, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth.

IN APRIL: The A's went 18-9 (.667) last month to tie the franchise record for wins in the month of April (1981, 1989)ō it was the seventh best April winning percentage in Oakland history and the best since 1990 (14-5, .737)ō it was also the A's 11th consecutive winning month dating back to June of 2012ō that ties the second longest such streak in Oakland history (July, 1989-May 1991)ō the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept., 1970-Sept. 1972ō the A's had two four-game winners in April (Gray and Kazmir) for the third time in Oakland history (Norris and Keough in 1981, Mulder and Zito in 2003)ō the pitching staff finished the month with 220 strikeouts, setting the franchise record for strikeouts in April (previous, 210 in 2013)ō it was the third best single-month total in Oakland history (246 in Sept. 2013; 223 in Aug. 2007)ō had a .280 opponents on-base percentage, which was their lowest in April since 1981 (.261)ō the offense had the second best April totals in Oakland history in runs (148), hits (254) and walks (tie, 126).

STARTING PITCHING: Sonny Gray, Scott Kazmir and Jesse Chavez have combined for a 10-1 record and a 1.92 ERA (25 er in 117.1 ip) in 18 startsō Kazmir and Chavez have made six starts each, marking the first time the A's have two 30-year-olds with more than five starts in a season since 2000 (Appier, Heredia, Olivares, Prieto)ō starters have compiled a 3.75 ERA (40 er in 96 ip) over the last 16 games after logging a 1.89 ERA over the first 13 contestsō have a 2.88 ERA (57 er in 178 ip) overall, which is the lowest in the American League and fourth lowest in the majorsō also have the lowest opponents on-base percentage (.286) and slugging percentage (.342) in the AL and the second lowest batting average (.224)ō rank second in innings pitched (178) and third in strikeouts (157)ō are tied with Los Angeles (NL) for the fewest losses in the majors (5).

PITCHING: The A's have a 2.94 ERA, which is the lowest mark in the American League and third lowest in the majorsō rank first in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.288) and slugging percentage (.333), and second in opponents batting average (.224)ō are tied for the second fewest home runs allowed (20) and have issued the third fewest walks (81).

OFFENSE: The A's tallied a season-high 17 hits Wednesday at Texas and matched their season high with 12 runs scoredō are now batting .276 (160 for 579) with 95 runs scored over the last 16 games (5.94 per game) after hitting .234 with 54 runs over the first 13 contests (4.15 per game)ō lead the majors in on-base percentage (.348), tied for first in walks (134), rank third in triples (8), fourth in runs (149), ninth in batting (.258) and tied for ninth in extra base hits (88)ō 18 of the A's 28 home runs have come with runners on base, which is second most in the majors to the Angels (21).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 19 for 21 (90.5%) in stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majorsō opponents have been successful in 21 of their 23 (91.3%) attempts, which is the second highest percentage in the American League.

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 6 for 29 (.207) with a home run, five RBI and seven walksō lead the American League in plate appearances (37) and walks (7), are tied for the lead in home runs (1) and extra base hits (3), rank second in RBI (5), tied for second in

doubles (2) and rank fourth in on-base percentage (.378) have more plate appearances than two National League teams (Milwaukee, 33; Atlanta, 34).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 5-3 on the second road trip of the season, a 10-game trip to Houston (2-2), Texas (3-0) and Boston (0-1, two games)ō went 7-2 on the first road trip and are 12-5 on the road for the seasonō that is the best road record in the American League and third best in the majorsō it is the A's best start on the road since the 1990 club started 13-4ō this series with Boston concludes a 25-game stretch from April 7 to May 4 where the A's are scheduled to play 19 of their 25 games on the roadō are 15-8 over the first 23 games of that stretchō went 3-3 on the last homestand against Houston (3-0) and Texas (0-3) and are 6-6 at home for the seasonō return home following the game Sunday for a 10-game homestand against Seattle (four games), Washington (three games) and Chicago-AL (three games).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 6-5 in games decided in the last at batō the 11 games are the most in the majors and the six wins are second most (Milwaukee, 7)ō have a Major League leading four wins when trailing after seven innings, which matches their season total from last yearō also have a ML leading three losses when leading after eight inningsō are 3-1 in extra inning gamesō are tied for the American League lead in extra inning wins and gamesō are 5-8 in games decided by two runs or fewer, 13-3 in games decided by three runs or more.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have committed 26 errors, which is second most in the American Leagueō are 12-2 when scoring first, which is the best record in the ALō are 12-0 when hitting more home runs than the oppositionō have not used a rookie, marking their longest stretch without a rookie on the roster since 2006 when they had no rookies for the first 36 days of the season (April 3-May 8)ō the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 14 minutes.

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have four players on the disabled list (Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker)ō O'Flaherty and Parker are both on the 60-day DLō Elmore is on a rehab assignment with Sacramentoō have used the DL seven times this yearō used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight timesō have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RED SOX: Boston claimed the first 2014 meeting last nightō the two clubs split the season series last year, 3-3ō each team won two of three games in its home ballparkō the A's have won 11 of the last 15 games against the Red Sox after losing seven of the previous eightō since 2006, the A's have won three season series, lost two and split threeō are 38-33 over that span, which includes 25-10 in Oakland, 12-21 at Fenway and 1-1 in Tokyoō are 230-279 since moving to Oakland in 1968ō that includes 137-115 in Oakland, 92-162 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyoō all-time, the A's are 872-1060 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Fernando Abad has not allowed a run over his first 12 outings and his 11.2 innings pitched are third most in the majors among pitchers that have not allowed a runō **Josh Donaldson** has reached base safely via hit or walk in each of his last 24 games, which is the third longest streak in the majors (Bautista, 29; Napoli, 25)ō is 33 for 103 (.320) with 10 doubles, seven home runs, 23 RBI and 10 walks (.386 on-base percentage) over that spanō **Sean Doolittle** has more innings pitched without allowing a walk than any other pitcher in the Major Leagues (12.2 ip)ō **Derek Norris** had five straight multiple hit games (11 for 18, .611) until he flied out as a pinch hitter in the ninth inning last nightō also snapped a seven-game hitting streak overall (13 for 22, .591), which was one short of his career highō is batting .379, which is the best mark in the majors among batters with 60 or more plate appearances.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1980, Wayne Gross and Dwayne Murphy both steal home in the A's 5-3 win against Detroitō Murphy's comes as part of a triple steal with Gross and Mitchell Pageō in 2000, the A's set an Oakland record with 10 hits and 21 total bases in the seventh inning in a 14-5 win at Kansas City.

SATURDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Tommy Milone (0-2, 4.56 ERA)

HOME AND AWAY: Has been charged with both of his losses this year on the road last year, he went 5-4 with a 3.44 ERA in 12 games at home compared to 7-5 with a 4.69 ERA in 16 games on the road in three seasons with the A Φ , he is 12-8 with a 3.08 ERA (59 er in 172.2 ip) in 28 games in Oakland compared to 13-13 with a 4.74 ERA (104 er in 197.1 ip) in 35 games on the road.

RUN SUPPORT: Has received no run support in two of his four starts this year, both losses last year, he received just 10 runs of support in his nine losses (1.78 RSA) has received just 22 runs of support in his 21 losses in three seasons with the A Φ (120.2 ip, 1.64 RSA) has received no support 11 times over the last three years as a starter and one run of support eight times went 11-1 with three runs of support or more in 2013 and is 20-3 in his career.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .217 (5 for 23) batting average with runners in scoring position last year, opponents hit .216 with RISP, which ranked eighth in the American League has yielded just one home run in 23.2 innings has issued all eight of his walks this year to right-handed hitters.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Opponents have reached base on an error twice with him pitching, which is tied for 11th most in the American League that has led to three unearned runs, which is tied for ninth in the AL last year, opponents reached base on an error 11 times with him pitching, which was the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors that led to 11 unearned runs, which tied for second most in the AL opponents have now reached base via error 24 times over the last three years, which is the most in the majors (Jordan Lyles, 23) has 25 unearned runs over that span, which is tied for fourth in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A Φ are 0-4 in his starting assignments this year went 16-10 (.615) in his 26 starting assignments and are 36-25 (.590) in his career his teams are 41-25 (.622) in his 66 career starts.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A Φ 6-4 loss at Seattle April 11 allowed a RBI single to Cano in the first and two unearned runs in the second on errors by Donaldson and Lowrie surrendered a two-run home run to Zunino in the sixth and left trailing 5-0 Hernandez shutout the A Φ three hits over the seven innings.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A Φ 5-4, 11-inning loss at Los Angeles (AL) April 16 allowed a run in the third inning on a Trout RBI double, but the A Φ scored four times in the fourth to take a 4-1 lead put the first two batters on base in the seventh inning and was relieved by Otero, who allowed both runners to score Gregerson allowed a run in the ninth for the blown save.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A Φ 5-4 loss to Texas April 22 in Oakland walked a career-high tying four batters allowed two runs in the first inning on a Murphy RBI single and a Chirinos bases loaded walk the A Φ came back with two in the bottom of the first but he allowed a run in the third when Rios scored on a Kouzmanoff grounded into double play the A Φ then scored twice in the fourth to take the lead left after six innings with a 4-3 lead but Gregerson allowed two runs in the ninth for the blown save.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A Φ 5-1 loss at Houston last Sunday allowed just one run over the first six innings and that was in the third inning when Villar doubled and later scored on a Fowler ground out then allowed a two-out two-run triple to Villar in the seventh inning was relieved by Otero, who allowed Villar to score on an Altuve home run McHugh shutout the A Φ on one hit over the first eight innings before Callaspo had a RBI single in the ninth.

MILONE vs. BOSTON: Was the losing pitcher in his only career appearance, a start in the A Φ 11-6 loss at Boston on April 30, 2012 allowed a career-high eight runs and a career-high three home

runs allowed four runs in the second inning, including a lead-off home run to Ortiz and RBI singles by Byrd and Aviles McDonald hit a two-run home run in the third and Ortiz added a solo shot in the fifth.

THIS SPRING: Went 2-1 with a 4.26 ERA (19.0 ip, 18 h, 12 r, 9 er, 5 bb, 8 so, 4 hr) in five games, four starts, this spring allowed a .240 opponents batting average logged a 1.93 ERA over his final three games after posting a 10.80 ERA in his first two starts also pitched in a minor league game March 20 (6.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 4 so) was scheduled to pitch in relief in the spring finale March 29 against San Francisco but that game was rained out.

2013 RECAP: Spent the first four months of the season in the starting rotation but split the final two months of the year between the bullpen, rotation and minor leagues was 12-9 with a 4.14 ERA in 28 games, 26 starts had a .258 opponents batting average and .301 on-base percentage, which were the lowest marks of his career had career highs in ERA (4.14), walks (39) and home runs (25) and matched his high in extra base hits (59).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .247 (121-for-489) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .298 (39-for-131) against left-handers surrendered 21 of his 25 home runs to righties, which tied for fourth most in the American League 18 of the home runs were solo shots and 14 came in the first two innings of a game opponents batted .299 with a .541 slugging percentage when leading off an inning has allowed a .312 (121 for 388) batting average and .541 (32 doubles, 19 home runs) slugging percentage in that situation in his career.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Was 12-9 with a 4.17 ERA and .261 opponents batting average in his 26 starts, 0-0 with a 3.00 ERA and .100 opponents average in his two relief appearances did not inherit a runner in his two relief appearances and retired both of his first batters faced.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Went 8-8 with a 4.24 ERA before the All-Star Break, 4-1 with a 3.86 ERA after the break is now 16-16 before the break compared to 10-5 after the break.
