ABOUT THE A'S: Aq starting pitchers have failed to go 5.0 innings in back-togame games for the first time this year, with Oakland dropping the first two games of this series...had swept a three-game series from Texas to start the week after losing five of the previous seven gamesõ it was the Aq third sweep of the season, which is tie

third sweep of the season, which is tied for the most in the majors (LAD, WAS, MIL)õ the sweep of the Rangers gave the Ac a seasonhigh three-game lead in the American League West at the end of Aprilõ it marked just the sixth time in Oakland history the Ac led the West by three or more games in April (1971, 1981, 1988, 1990, 2003)õ are now 18-12 for the season, two games ahead of secondplace Texas in the AL Westõ their record is the second best mark in the American League and fourth best in the majorsõ the Ac record after 30 games matches the best over the last 24 years (1991, 1992, 2003, 2008)õ the 1990 club started 22-8õ had a season-high three-game losing streak from April 21-23, marking the only time the Ac have lost more than two straight games since Aug. 24, 2013õ have been 19 days in sole possession of first place, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth.

IN APRIL: The Ac went 18-9 (.667) last month to tie the franchise record for wins in the month of April (1981, 1989)õ it was the seventh best April winning percentage in Oakland history and the best since 1990 (14-5, .737)õ it was also the Ac 11th consecutive winning month dating back to June of 2012õ that ties the second longest such streak in Oakland history (July, 1989-May 1991)õ the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept., 1970-Sept. 1972õ the Ac had two four-game winners in April (Gray and Kazmir) for the third time in Oakland history (Norris and Keough in 1981, Mulder and Zito in 2003)õ the pitching staff finished the month with 220 strikeouts, setting the franchise record for strikeouts in April (previous, 210 in 2013)õ it was the third best single-month total in Oakland history (246 in Sept. 2013; 223 in Aug. 2007)õ had a .280 opponents on-base percentage, which was their lowest in April since 1981 (.261)õ the offense had the second best April totals in Oakland history in runs (148), hits (254) and walks (tie, 126).

STARTING PITCHING: Sonny Gray, Scott Kazmir and Jesse Chavez have combined for a 10-1 record and a 1.92 ERA (25 er in 117.1 ip) in 18 startsõ Kazmir and Chavez have made six starts each, marking the first time the Aqs have two 30-year-olds with more than five starts in a season since 2000 (Appier, Heredia, Olivares, Prieto)õ starters have compiled a 4.14 ERA (46 er in 100 ip) over the last 17 games after logging a 1.89 ERA over the first 13 contestsõ have a 3.12 ERA (63 er in 182 ip) overall, which is the second lowest in the American League and seventh lowest in the majorsõ also have the second lowest opponents on-base percentage (.291), slugging percentage (.356) and batting average (.227) in the ALõ rank second fewest losses in the majors (6).

PITCHING: The Ac have a 3.05 ERA, which is the **lowest mark in the American League** and fourth lowest in the majorso rank first in the AL in opponents on-base percentage (.288), slugging percentage (.339) and opponents batting average (.223)o have issued the third fewest walks (85).

OFFENSE: The As tallied a season-high 17 hits Wednesday at Texas and matched their season high with 12 runs scoredõ are now batting .269 (164 for 609) with 98 runs scored over the last 17 games (5.76 per game) after hitting .234 with 54 runs over the first 13 contests (4.15 per game)õ lead the American League in on-base percentage (.345) and walks (137), tied for second in triples (8), third in runs (152), and seventh in batting (.255) and extra base hits (90)õ 18 of the As 28 home runs have come with runners on base, which is second most in the AL and third most in the majors.

ON THE BASES: The Aq are 20 for 22 (90.9%) in stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majorsõ opponents have been successful in 21 of their 23 (91.3%) attempts, which is the second highest percentage in the American League.

IN THE PINCH: As pinch hitters are 6 for 30 (.200) with a home run, five RBI and seven walksõ lead the American League in plate appearances (38) and walks (7), are tied for the lead in home runs (1) and extra base hits (3), rank second in RBI (5), tied for second in doubles (2) and tied for fourth in on-base percentage (.368).

HOME AND AWAY: The Aq are 5-4 on the second road trip of the season, a 10-game trip to Houston (2-2), Texas (3-0) and Boston (0-2, one game)õ went 7-2 on the first road trip and are 12-6 on the road for the seasonõ that is the **best road record in the American League** and third best in the majorsõ it is the Aq best start on the road since the 1990 club started 13-5õ this series with Boston concludes a 25-game stretch from April 7 to May 4 where the Aq are scheduled to play 19 of their 25 games on the roadõ are 15-9 over the first 24 games of that stretchõ went 3-3 on the last homestand against Houston (3-0) and Texas (0-3) and are 6-6 at home for the seasonõ return home following the game Sunday for a 10-game homestand against Seattle (four games), Washington (three) and Chicago-AL (three).

CLOSE CALLS: The Ac are 6-5 in games decided in the last at batō the 11 games are the most in the majors and the six wins are second most (Milwaukee, 7)ō have a Major League leading four wins when trailing after seven innings, which matches their season total from last yearō also have a ML leading three losses when leading after eight inningsō are 3-1 in extra inning gamesō are tied for the American League lead in extra inning wins and gamesō are 5-8 in games decided by two runs or fewer, 13-4 in games decided by three runs or more.

THIS AND THAT: The Ac have committed 26 errors, which is tied for third most in the American Leagueõ are 12-2 when scoring first, which is the best record in the ALõ are 12-0 when hitting more home runs than the oppositionõ have not used a rookie, marking their longest stretch without a rookie on the roster since 2006 when they had no rookies for the first 36 days of the season (April 3-May 8)õ the Ac average time of game is 3 hours and 13 minutes.

THE DISABLED LIST: The Ac have four players on the disabled list (Elmore, Griffin, Od Flaherty, Parker)õ Od Flaherty and Parker are both on the 60-day DLõ Elmore is on a rehab assignment with Sacramentoõ have used the DL seven times this yearõ used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight timesõ have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. RED SOX: Boston has outscored Oakland 13-4 with a grand slam in each game in claiming the first two meetingsõ the two clubs split the season series last year, 3-3õ each team won two of three games in its home ballparkõ the Ac have won 11 of the last 16 games against the Red Sox after losing seven of the previous eightõ since 2006, the Ac have won three season series, lost two and split threeõ are 38-34 over that span, which includes 25-10 in Oakland, 12-22 at Fenway and 1-1 in Tokyoõ are 230-280 since moving to Oakland in 1968õ that includes 137-115 in Oakland, 92-163 in Boston and 1-1 in Tokyoõ all-time, the Ac are 872-1061 against the Red Sox.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Fernando Abad has not allowed a run over his first 12 outings and his 11.2 innings pitched are second most in the majors among pitchers that have not allowed a run (Rodriguez, MIL, 17.0)õ **Josh Donaldson** has reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in each of his last 25 games, which is the third longest streak in the majors (Bautista, 30; Napoli, 26)õ is 33 for 103 (.320) with 10 doubles, seven home runs, 23 RBI and 10 walks (.381 on-base percentage) over that spanõ **Sean Doolittle** has more innings pitched without allowing a walk than any other pitcher in the Major Leagues (13.2 ip)õ **Derek Norris** is batting .367, which is the best mark in the American League (batters with 60 or more plate appearances).

SUNDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (4-1, 1.76 ERA)

WINS: Became the third four-game winner in the American League with a win in his last startõ is currently tied for second in the AL in winsõ is the sixth A\$\$ pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998)õ is now 8-2 with a 2.00 ERA (17 er in 76.0 ip) and .225 (64 for 285) opponents batting over his last 12 starts dating back to Aug. 31, 2013õ the wins are second most in the majors over that span (Wainwright, STL 9)õ now has nine wins in 18 career appearancesõ the only pitchers in Oakland history to win their 10th game in 19 appearances or fewer are Tim Hudson (18 games) and Barry Zito (19).

SHUTOUT: Tossed his first career shutout in his last start Monday at Texasõ it was the second time this year he has not allowed a run in a start and he ranks second in the American League in ERA (1.76)õ has one of three shutouts in the AL and one of six complete games.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed just one home run over his first six starts and 41.0 inningsõ his average of 0.22 home runs per nine innings is third lowest in the American Leagueõ has surrendered just five home runs in 105.0 career innings (0.43 per nine innings)õ ranks fourth in the AL in opponents slugging (.287)õ has yielded a .163 (7 for 43) average with runners in scoring position, which ranks eighth in the American Leagueõ has allowed a .198 (17 for 91) average with RISP in his careerõ opponents are 2 for 19 (.105) with RISP and two outsõ has a .174 (8 for 46) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .240 (25 for 104) after thatõ opponents are batting .171 (6 for 35) when leading off an inning this year and .186 (18 for 97) in his career.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-0 with a 1.29 ERA (4 er in 28.0 ip) in four starts at night compared to 1-1 with a 2.77 ERA (4 er in 13.0 ip) in two starts during the dayõ his career numbers are 5-1 with a 1.53 ERA (11 er in 64.2 ip) in 11 night games, 4-3 with a 3.57 ERA (16 er in 40.1 ip) in seven day games.

INNING BY INNING: Has allowed five of his eight earned runs this year over the first three innings of a gameõ last year, he yielded 20 of his 22 runs over the first three innings of a gameõ in his career, he has a 3.75 ERA (20 er in 48.0 ip), .258 (49 for 190) opponents batting average and four home runs allowed in innings one through three compared to a 1.11 ERA (7 er in 57.0 ip), .177 (35 for 198) opponents average and one home run from the fourth inning on.

THE WEST AND THE REST: Has won four of his five starts this year against American League West competition after a no decision against Cleveland in his first startõ is now 6-2 with a 1.65 ERA (13 er in 71.0 ip) in 11 career games against AL West foes compared to 3-2 with a 3.71 ERA (14 er in 34.0 ip) in seven games against everyone else.

DAYS REST: Is 3-0 with a 1.80 ERA (5 er in 25.0 ip) in four starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-1 with a 1.69 ERA (3 er in 16.0 ip) in two starts on four days restõ his career numbers are 6-1 with a 1.68 ERA (10 er in 53.2 ip) in nine starts on five days rest or more, 3-3 with a 3.23 ERA (17 er in 47.1 ip) in seven starts on four days rest.

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Was charged with his first loss of the season April 23, snapping his season-opening winning streak at three gamesõ has never lost consecutive decisions in his careerõ the loss snapped a six-game winning streak dating back to September 11 of last year, which was a career highõ went 6-0 with a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretchõ allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak.

THIS AND THAT: Has issued 10 of his 14 walks this year and 25 of his 34 in his career to left-handed hittersõ the Aqs have been shut out twice this year, both times in his startsõ however, his season run support average is 4.83 (22 rs in 41.0 ip)õ his career RSA as a starter is 6.42 (72 rs in 101.0 ip)õ the Aqs are 4-2 (.667) in his starting assignments this year and are 10-6 (.625) when he starts in his careerõ has tossed at least six innings in 12 of his 16 starts, allowed two runs or fewer nine times and walked two batters or fewer 11 times.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the Ac 2-0 loss to Cleveland on Opening Night March 31ő tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)ő allowed five hits and walked threeő retired the side in order just once, the third inningő it was the first Opening Day start of his careerő becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the Ac in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)ő became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom). **SECOND START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A\$\$ 6-3 win over Seattle April 6 in Oaklandō did not allow a run in the first inning to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings (previous: 13.0, August 10-20, 2013)ō was charged with two unearned runs in the second inning (Barton error) when he allowed RBI singles to Almonte and Millerō also allowed a RBI single to Smoak in the third to give the Mariners a 3-0 lead but the A\$\$\$\$ tied the game on a Moss three-run homer in the bottom of the thirdō retired 11 of the final 12 batters he faced, including each of the last seven, and the A\$\$\$\$\$\$\$\$\$ scored twice in the fifth to take the lead for good.

THIRD START: He was the winning pitcher in the Ac 3-1 win at Seattle April 12õ struck out a career-high tying nine battersõ allowed back-to-back singles to Almonte and Miller to start the game before retiring 11 straightõ Almonte scored on a Cano ground out, but that would be the only run he would allow in seven inningsõ blanked the Mariners on three hits and two walks over his final six innings.

FOURTH START: He won his third consecutive start in the Aqs 11-3 win over Houston April 18 in Oaklandõ allowed a career-high nine hitsõ the Aqs scored seven times in the first inning and he blanked the Astros on three hits and a walk over the first four inningsõ allowed three runs in the fifth on RBI singles by Fowler and Springer and a sacrifice fly by Carter.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the Aqs 3-0 loss to Texas last Wednesday in Oaklandõ walked a career-high four battersõ allowed a RBI triple to Rios in the first, a RBI single to Choice in the fifth and a solo home run to Murphy in the sixthõ Perez shut out the Aqs on three hits and two walks.

LAST START: He tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a three-hitter in the Ac 4-0 win at Texas last Mondayõ became just the fifth visiting pitcher to allow three hits or fewer in a shutout at Globe Life Park, the first since Matt Garza (Aug. 15, 2008)õ allowed a Martin single in the third, a Chirinos single in the sixth and a Rios single in the seventh.

THIS SPRING: Went 0-1 with a 3.48 (20.2 ip, 18 h, 11 r, 8 er, 6 bb, 16 so) ERA in six startsõ allowed a .228 (18 for 79) opponents batting averageõ yielded just one home run in 20.2 inningsõ allowed just one earned run in 10.2 innings over his final two starts (0.84 ERA) after posting a 6.30 ERA over his first four startsõ surrendered one run or fewer in four of his six starts.
