OAKLAND ATHLETICS (19-12) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (14-15)

ABOUT THE A'S: Lost two of three in Boston over the weekend but have won four of the last six games...are 19-12 for the season, which is the second best record in the American League...that matches the A's best record after 31 games over the last 24 years...the 1992 and 2003 clubs also started the year 19-12 (both won game 32)...hold at least a share of first place in the AL West for the 11th consecutive day and 24th time in the last 26 days...lead second place Texas by two games for the third consecutive day...have 20 days in sole possession of first place, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...swept a three-game series from Texas last week and now have three sweeps for the season, which is tied for the most in the majors...had a season-high three-game losing streak from April 21-23, marking the only time the A's have lost more than two straight games since Aug. 24, 2013.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's improved to 4-1 in extra inning games with a 3-2, 10-inning win at Boston yesterday...lead the American League in extra inning wins and extra inning games and have the second best record...are now 7-5 in games decided in the last at bat...the seven wins are tied with Milwaukee for the most in the majors and the 12 games are tied with Miami for the most...have a Major League leading four wins when trailing after seven innings, which matches their season total from last year...also have a ML leading three losses when leading after eight innings...are 6-8 in games decided by two runs or fewer, 13-4 in games decided by three runs or more.

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.00 ERA, which is the **lowest mark in the American League** and third lowest in the majors...also lead the AL in opponents batting average (.224), on-base percentage (.288) and slugging percentage (.340)...have issued the third fewest walks (87).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-4 with a 4.04 ERA (48 er in 107.0 ip) over the last 18 games after going 5-2 with a 1.89 ERA over the first 13 contests...have a 3.11 ERA (65 er in 188.0 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the American League...Sonny Gray, Scott Kazmir and Jesse Chavez have combined for a 10-1 record and a 1.97 ERA (27 er in 123.1 ip) in 19 starts while the A's other starters are 1-5 with a 5.29 ERA (38 er in 64.2 ip) in 12 starts...Kazmir and Chavez have made six starts each, marking the first time the A's have two 30-year-olds with more than five starts in a season since 2000 (Appier, Heredia, Olivares, Prieto)...starters have the lowest opponents slugging percentage in the AL (.359), are tied for the fewest losses (6), rank second in opponents batting average (.228), on-base percentage (.293) and innings pitched (188.0) and third in strikeouts (165).

OFFENSE: The A's scored seven runs on 17 hits in the three-game series at Boston after tallying a season-high 17 hits and scoring a season-high tying 12 runs last Wednesday at Texas...have homered just once over the last seven games...the A's lead the majors in walks (143) and top the American League in on-base percentage (.344)...are also tied for second in the AL in triples (8) and rank third in runs scored (155)...18 of the A's 28 home runs have come with runners on base, which is tied for second in the AL.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 21 for 23 (91.3%) in stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 21 of their 24 (87.5%) attempts, which is the third highest percentage in the American League...the A's are one of four AL teams without a pickoff (Baltimore, Boston, Minnesota).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters are 6 for 31 (.194) with a home run, five RBI and eight walks...lead the American League in plate appearances (40) and walks (8), are tied for the lead in home runs (1) and extra base hits (3), rank second in RBI (5) and tied for second in doubles (2)...have more plate appearances than three National League teams (Philadelphia, Atlanta, Milwaukee).

HOME AND AWAY: The A's begin a 10-game homestand tonight against Seattle (four games), Washington (three games) and Chicago-AL (three games)...it is the first of three 10-game homestands this year...the last time the A's had at least three 10-game homestands in one season was in 2002 when they had four...went 3-3 on the last homestand against Houston (3-0) and Texas (0-3) and are 6-6 (.500) at home for the season...went 6-4 on the last road trip to Houston (2-

2), Texas (3-0) and Boston (1-2) and are 13-6 (.684) on the road overall...have the **best road record in the American League** and third best in the majors...it is the A's best start on the road since the 1990 club started the year 14-5.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have committed 28 errors, which is second most in the American League...are 13-2 when scoring first, which is the best record in the AL...are 12-0 when hitting more home runs than the opposition and are one of three teams in the majors that have not lost in that situation (Texas and Detroit, 7-0)...have not used a rookie, marking their longest stretch without a rookie on the roster since 2006 when they had no rookies for the first 36 days of the season (April 3-May 8)...the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 14 minutes...averaged 3:05 last year, which was second longest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

IN APRIL: The A's went 18-9 (.667) last month to tie the franchise record for wins in the month of April (1981, 1989)...it was the seventh best April winning percentage in Oakland history and the best since 1990 (14-5, .737)...it was also the A's 11th consecutive winning month dating back to June of 2012...that ties the second longest such streak in Oakland history (July, 1989-May 1991)...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept., 1970-Sept. 1972...the A's had two four-game winners in April (Gray and Kazmir) for the third time in Oakland history (Norris and Keough in 1981, Mulder and Zito in 2003)...the pitching staff finished the month with 220 strikeouts, setting the franchise record for strikeouts in April (previous, 210 in 2013)...it was the third best single-month total in Oakland history (246 in Sept. 2013; 223 in Aug. 2007)...had a .280 opponents on-base percentage, which was their lowest in April since 1981 (.261)...the offense had the second best April totals in Oakland history in runs (148), hits (254) and walks (tie, 126).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's have four players on the disabled list (Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker)...Griffin, O'Flaherty and Parker are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL seven times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's lead the season series 4-2...have won two of three in both Oakland and Seattle...are hitting .206 (41 for 199) but have a 1.61 ERA (10 er in 56.0 ip)...over the previous eight seasons, the A's have won the season series in even numbered seasons (2006, 2008, 2010, 2012) and the Mariners have won in odd numbered years (2007, 2009, 2011, 2013)...Oakland is 83-75 (.525) against the Mariners since 2006...all-time, the A's are 316-237 (.571) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by any team against the Mariners to Boston's .581 mark (min. 20 games)...are 174-102 in Oakland, 141-134 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Fernando Abad has not allowed a run over his first 13 outings and his 12.1 innings pitched are second most in the majors among pitchers that have not allowed a run...**Josh Donaldson** has reached base safely via hit or walk in each of his last 26 games, which is tied with Napoli (BOS) for the longest active streak in the majors...is 34 for 108 (.315) with 24 runs, 10 doubles, seven home runs, 23 RBI, 14 walks and a hit by pitch (.398 on-base percentage) over that span...**Sean Doolittle** has more innings pitched without allowing a walk than any other pitcher in the Major Leagues (14.1 ip)...**Derek Norris** is batting .519 (14 for 27) with seven walks (.618 on-base percentage) over his last 10 games...is batting 371 overall, which is the best mark in the American League and second best in the majors (Tulowitzki, COL .400) among players with 70 or more plate appearances.

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In **1939** Sam Chapman hits for the cycle and then homers in his first two at bats the following day...in **1949** Bobby Shantz tosses nine hitless innings of relief in the A's 5-4 win over Detroit...Wally Moses hits a two-run home run in the 13th inning after Shantz allows a run in the top of the inning...in **1971** Vida Blue tosses a four hit shutout and strikes out 11 in the A's 5-0 win at Detroit...in **2000** the A's score 16 runs at Texas but lose 17-16, setting an AL record for runs scored in a loss...all 18 starters in the game score at least one run, an AL first.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (4-0, 2.11 ERA)

4-0: Has started the season 4-0 for the first time in his career...is the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Gray, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998)...of those six, only Cahill was undefeated (Cahill started the season 6-0)...it was the fifth time he won four or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...his last four-win month was June of 2010 with Los Angeles (AL)...is tied for second in the American League in wins and is one of five Major League pitchers with four or more wins and no losses.

SIX-GAME WINNING STREAK: Also won his final two starts of 2013 and is now 6-0 with a 1.75 ERA (10 er in 51.1 ip) and .207 (39 for 188) opponents batting average over his last eight starts dating back to September 21, 2013...the winning streak **matches his career high** (May 10-June 6, 2008)...has allowed just one home run in 51.1 innings during his current winning streak.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks third in the American League in opponents slugging percentage (.284), fourth in opponents on-base percentage (.258) and fifth in ERA (2.11) and opponents batting average (.206)...has the second highest run support (7.30), ranks fifth in fewest walks per nine innings (1.64) and fewest home runs per nine innings (0.23), and seventh in strikeout to walk ratio (5.10).

LAST 24 STARTS: Has allowed one run or fewer in three of his six starts this year and 11 of his last 24 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...is 11-5 with a 2.80 ERA (44 er in 144.1 ip) over that span...the ERA is third lowest among American League pitchers over that span (min. 120.0 ip)...has held the opposition to a .230 (123 for 535) batting average...has walked 31 (1.97 per nine innings) and struck out 142 in 141.1 innings (9.04 per nine innings) for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.58...has yielded just eight home runs (0.51 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .118 (4 for 34) batting average with runners in scoring position, which ranks fourth in the American League...has yielded a .177 (20 for 113) mark against right-handers, which ranks seventh in the AL, compared to .321 (9 for 28) against left-handers...has issued six of his seven walks to righties...over the last two years, 47 of his 54 walks have been issued to right-handed hitters...opponents are 6 for 37 (.162) with no walks and two hit by pitches when leading off an inning (.205 on-base percentage)...the batting average and on-base percentage are fifth lowest in the AL.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-0 with a 1.65 ERA (5 er in 27.1 ip) and .173 (17 for 98) opponents batting average in four starts during the day compared to 2-0 with a 3.27 ERA (4 er in 11.0 ip) and .279 (12 for 43) average in two starts at night...last year, he went 5-2 with a 3.27 ERA in 10 starts during the day compared to 5-7 with a 4.46 ERA in 19 starts at night...is now 7-2 with a 2.73 ERA (25 er in 82.1 ip) in 14 starts during the day over the last two years and 7-7 with a 4.34 ERA (55 er in 114.0 ip) in 21 starts at night.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have won each of his six starting assignments...since 1995, the only other A's starting pitchers to begin the season with at least six consecutive starts in an A's victory are Jesse Chavez (6 in 2014) and Rich Harden (9 in 2006)...has allowed three runs or fewer in each start and walked two batters or fewer five times.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win over Cleveland in the day game April 2 against Cleveland...tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut.

SECOND START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-3 win at Minnesota April 7...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Hicks in the second...the A's scored three times in the third but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the third on a Kubel RBI double and a Suzuki RBI ground out...then retired 11 of the final 13 batters he faced.

THIRD START: He combined with Abad, Otero, Gregerson and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Seattle April 13...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed two of the hits but had a no decision as the A's scored twice in the eighth and once in the ninth...retired each of the first 10 batters, allowed back to back singles to Miller and Cano with one out in the fourth, and then retired each of the final eight batters.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win over Houston April 19 in Oakland...allowed his first home run of the season, a solo shot by Villar in the third inning...also allowed a RBI single to

Dominguez in the fourth and an unearned run in the fifth when Villar scored on a Norris throwing error following a steal of third...left trailing 3-1 but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the ninth for the win.

FIFTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-1 win at Houston April 24...the A's scored twice in the first and he allowed a run in the bottom of the first on a bases loaded walk to Chris Carter...blanked the Astros on three hits and a walk over his final five innings.

LAST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-3 win at Texas last Tuesday...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed his first run in the bottom of the fourth on a RBI double by Rios...the A's then scored five times in the fifth to make the score 9-1...he allowed two runs in the bottom of the fifth on an Andrus RBI groundout and a Fielder RBI single.

KAZMIR vs. SEATTLE: Is 4-3 with a 3.12 ERA (69.1 ip, 50 h, 28 r, 24 er, 23 bb, 67 so, 4 hr) in 12 career starts...is 0-1 with a 5.75 ERA (13 er in 20.1 ip) in four starts in his home ballparks and 4-2 with a 2.02 ERA (11 er in 49.0 ip) in eight starts at Safeco Field...had a no decision in his only start this year (see first start above)...went 1-0 with a 4.09 ERA (11.0 ip, 8 h, 6 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 9 so, 0 hr) in two starts last year.

THIS SPRING: Went 1-0 with a 1.62 ERA (16.2 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 7 bb, 14 so) in four starts during the spring...held the opposition to a .155 (9 for 58) batting average...did not allow a home run in 16.2 innings...did not allow a run in three of his four starts...was scratched from his start March 17 against Chicago (NL) with left triceps stiffness.

2013 RECAP: Went from the independent Atlantic League in 2012 to a key member of the Cleveland Indians rotation, going 10-9 with a 4.04 ERA in 29 starts...it was his sixth 10-win season but his first since 2009...his 29 starts were his most since 2007, as were his 158.0 innings pitched...walked 47 batters for an average of 2.68 walks per nine innings, which was the lowest mark of his career...his previous low was 3.24 in 2006...struck out 162, and his strikeout-to-walk ratio of 3.45 was also a career best...was one of a club-record tying three pitchers to fan 150 or more batters (Jimenez, Masterson)...averaged 9.23 strikeouts per nine innings...did not qualify for the league leaders but had the seventh best strikeout per nine inning ratio among American League pitchers with 150 or more innings pitched...using the same minimum, he had the fifth highest run support average (6.27)...was 3-4 with a 5.89 ERA and .302 opponents batting average over his first 11 starts through June 15...then went 7-5 with a 3.06 ERA and .239 opponents average over his final 18 starts

MORE FROM 2013: Allowed a .262 opponents batting average, including .226 (38-for-168) against left-handed hitters compared to .275 (124-for-451) against right-handers...surrendered 16 of his 19 home runs to righties...13 of the 19 home runs were solo shots...was 6-5 with a 3.55 ERA in 15 starts on four days rest, 4-4 with a 4.60 ERA in 14 starts on five days rest or more...was 3-1 with a 3.38 ERA in five interleague starts and is now 11-5 in 22 career interleague starts...committed three errors, which tied for second most among AL pitchers.

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Jesse Chavez (2-0, 1.89 ERA): Has allowed one earned run or fewer in five of his six starts and ranks second in the American League in ERA (1.89)...also has the third lowest opponents batting average (.199)...finished April with 41 strikeouts, which tied for third in the AL...it was the fourth highest April strikeout total in Oakland history and was the most since Barry Zito had 44 in 2001...the A's have won all six of his starting assignments this year, including a win in his last start, a 12-1 A's win at Texas last Wednesday (7.0 ip, 1 h, 1 bb, 8 so)...is 0-0 with a 0.53 ERA in nine career appearances, one start, against Seattle...including a no decision in his only outing this year, a start in the A's 3-2, 12-inning win on April 3 in Oakland (6.0 ip, 5 h, 2 r, 1 er, 2 bb, 4 so)...went 5-1 with a save and a 2.22 ERA in seven games, five starts, this spring...the five wins were the most in the majors and the most by an A's pitcher since spring win totals are available beginning in 1990.

- The A's bullpen has thrown eight straight scoreless innings over two outings...allowed 11 earned runs over its previous five games (12.2 ip, 7.82 ERA)...its 2.79 ERA is first in the American League...no other team in the AL has an ERA below 3.27 (Boston).
- Bullpen has 14 decisions this season, the second most among Major League bullpens (Texas, 15).
- Has gone 11 straight games without a save opportunity (6-5).
- Its eight wins are tied for the most in the American League (Texas).
- Its six blown saves are the second most in the AL (Houston, 7).

2014 PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS

DARIC BARTON

- Made his fourth career Opening Day start at first base March 31 against Cleveland, which matches Jason Giambi for second most in Oakland history...only Mark McGwire, with nine, has more.

ALBERTO CALLASPO

- Was on his eighth consecutive Opening Day roster.
- Made his professional debut at first base April 3 against Seattle and went 0 for 1 with two walks and an error.

YOENIS CÉSPEDES

- Made his third consecutive Opening Day start March 31 against Cleveland (center field in 2012, left field in 2013-14)...is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers in left field since Ben Grieve in 1999-2000.

RYAN COOK

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring.

COCO CRISP

- Was on his 10th Opening Day roster (2004-09, 11-14) and made his ninth career Opening Day start, his fourth straight with the A's.
- Hit his first career game-ending home run April 3 against Seattle...it was his sixth regular season "walk-off" RBI.
- Committed his first error of the season April 18, snapping a 145-game errorless streak, which was fifth longest in Oakland history by an outfielder...it was his first error since Aug. 23, 2012.

JOSH DONALDSON

- Had a career-high 0 for 20 streak from April 2 to 6.
- Had a 10-game hitting streak from April 6-16 (16 for 48, .333), which fell one short of his career high.
- Had his first career two-homer game April 24 at Houston.

SAM FULD

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.

LUKE GREGERSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

A.J. GRIFFIN

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a flexor muscle strain.

JOHN JASO

- Went 0 for 2 in his second game of the season to snap a streak where he reached base safely via hit, walk or hit by pitch in 28 consecutive starts behind the plate dating back to May 4 of last year... that matched the longest such streak by a catcher in Oakland history (Gene Tenace, June 12-Sept. 25, 1973).
- Hit his second career pinch hit home run April 14 at Los Angeles (AL)...the other was also at Los Angeles on April 9, 2013.
- Struck out four times April 21 against Texas for the second time in his career (also Sept. 16, 2011 at Boston)...also stole a base to become the first Athletic since at least 1914 to strikeout at least four times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least 1914.

JIM JOHNSON

- Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

JOSH LINDBLOM

- Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.

ERIC O'FLAHERTY

- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.

JARROD PARKER

- Had no decisions and a 10.61 ERA in three spring training starts before it was announced he would undergo Tommy John surgery for the second time in his career.
- Was placed on the 60-day disabled list March 20 and had the surgery March 24...the surgery was performed by Dr. James Andrews in the Andrews Institute in Pensacola, Florida...also had Tommy John surgery October 28, 2009 while a member of the Arizona Diamondbacks organization.
