CHRIS YOUNG HERE

Tonight's starting pitcher **Chris Young** is 1-0 with a 1.32 ERA (2 ER, 13.2 IP) in 3 career appearances (2 GS) at Oakland Coliseum.

VS. THE ATHLETICS

Tonight is the 7th of 19 games between the Mariners and Athletics this season, the fourth in Oakland...Mariners were 1-2 here and one game rained out April 3-6...Seattle went 11-8 vs. the Athletics last season, including a 6-4 record here.

STRIKEOUT KINGS

Felix Hernandez has 53 strikeouts in his first 7 starts this season (10.23 K/9.0 IP), 3rd in the AL behind Jon Lester (58) and David Price (55)...Felix's 53 K's are 7th-most through the first 7 starts of a season.

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a rain-shortened 9-game, 3-city road trip today with the first of four games at the Oakland Athletics, including doubleheader Wednesday...are 4-1 on the trip so far; opened with a pair of wins at New York (2-0), sandwiched around a Wednesday rain out, then won 2 of 3 over the weekend in Houston...return home following this series to begin a 7-day homestand on Thursday vs. Kansas City (4 G) and Tampa Bay (3 G)...tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS** in high definition & broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle & Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...won 2 straight, 5 of 6 and 7 of last 9 games (3 in final at-bat) after a season-high 8-game losing streak (April 15-22)...snapped 6-game road losing streak with win Tuesday...are 9-9 on the road and 5-6 at Safeco Field...opened the season with 3-game sweep of the Angels, the first 3-0 start since 1995.

- **Farquhar K's** - **Danny Farquhar** is averaging 11.93 K/9.0 IP (99 K, 74.2 IP) for his career.
- **2-Out RBI** - Scored 50 of 122 runs (41.0%) with 2 outs...**Justin Smoak** is 2nd in AL w/13 2-out RBI.
- **Closing Time** - **Fernando Rodney** has recorded **93** saves since 2012, 3rd-most in baseball.
- **Ouch** - Mariners batters have 9 HBP in last 8 games...T3rd in AL with 14 HBP.
- **Pinch Hitters** - Mariners pinch-hitters are 3-for-last-3 and 4-for-12 (.333) this season.
- **Southpaws** - Mariners are 8-3 in games started by left-handed pitchers, compared to 6-12 vs. RHP.

LATELY...Seattle is 7-2 in its last 9 games (since 4/23)...team is hitting .262 (82x313) over the 9 games, and averaging 5.67 runs per game (51 runs total)...team hit just .222 in its first 20 games (7-13) and averaged 3.55 runs per game (71 runs, total).

"RBI" CANO...**Robinson Cano** has collected 10 RBI in his last 8 games...he has at least 1 RBI in 6 of last 8 games, and four multi-RBI games over the stretch...Seattle is 6-2 in the eight games.

LEFT IS RIGHT...the Mariners are 8-3 in games started by left-handed pitchers this season, including a 4-1 mark in road games started by lefty's...that compares to a 6-12 mark in games started by right-handers.

VERY PRODUCTIVE...the Mariners are 10-for-their-last-20 with runners in scoring position, collecting 16 RBI, over their last two games...have collected a season-high tying 5 hits in back-to-back games (have a total of three games with 5 MISP hits)...are 23-for-last-60 (.383) w/MISP in last 6 games (5-1).

HITTING MACHINE...**Robinson Cano** is batting .347 (17x49) with 8 runs scored, 4 doubles, a triple, and 10 RBI over his last 12 games...overall has recorded at least one hit in 24 of 29 games this season, including a team-high 10 multi-hit games...has 18 RBI (2nd on club), and leads w/5 GA RBI.

OFFICIAL HEX NOTE...if Seattle were to win by at least two runs today, the Mariners would: return to .500 for the first time since they were 7-7 on April 16 (eventually fell to 7-13); it would mark the first time Seattle had been .500 or better thru 30 games since posting a 15-15 mark to start the 2009 season...a two-run win would also get Seattle to even in run differential (enter play today having scored 122 runs and allowed 124); just four AL teams currently have positive run differentials: DET, MIN, OAK and LAA.

JUST KEEP PITCHING...**Danny Farquhar** picked up his first save of the season yesterday, working the 8th and 9th...it was the first six out save by a Mariners pitcher since Josh Kinney tossed 2.1 innings in a 5-1 win on Aug. 19, 2012.

ROAD WARRIORS...this four-game series at the Athletics will bring the Mariners season total of road games up to 22 (currently 9-9 in 18 games on the road)...the Mariners are tied for the AL lead (with OAK) for most road games played.

THE CONDOR IS SOARING...**Michael Saunders** is 8-for-18 with 2 doubles and 4 RBI in the last four games, all batting in the leadoff spot...had season-high three hits Thursday at NY...overall this season, **Saunders** has hit in the leadoff spot in 6 games, and is hitting .391 (9x23) with 4 runs, 2 2B, a HR, 5 RBI; **Seattle** is 4-2 in the six games...since beginning the year 0-for-his-first-9 (5 games + 1 AB), **Saunders** is 15-for-48/.313 w/9 runs, 3 doubles, a triple, a homer & 6 RBI in his last 20 games...he has on OBP of .377 and is slugging .479 for a .856 OPS over the 20-game span.

HEATING UP...**Kyle Seager**, the reigning AL Player of the Week, has recorded hits in 8 of his last 9 games (.351/13x37) and is batting .308 (16x52) with 11 runs, 3 doubles, 5 home runs, 14 RBI and a 1.011 OPS over his last 14 games...in his first 14 games, hit .143 (7x49) with 3 runs, 3 doubles, 2 RBI and a .492 OPS...he has hit 5 HR over his last 9 games including multi-homer games April 23 vs. Houston and April 27 vs. Texas.

IRON MAN...**Robinson Cano** has started all 29 games this season (2B - 28, DH - 1)...over the last 8 seasons (since 2007), has appeared in 1,149 out of a possible 1,163 team games...since the 2007 ranks 2nd in the Majors in games played behind Prince Fielder (1,157).

HEY, MIKEY LIKES IT!...**Mike Zunino** collected a pair of walks Saturday (DNP Sunday), including a bases loaded free pass to tie the game in the 7th; he'd entered the game with just 1 walk this season, and it was an intentional pass...yesterday's game continued a trend for Mike: in 14 road games this season he is hitting .315 (17x54) w/7 runs, 3 doubles, a triple, 3 home runs, 11 RBI and 3 walks; he has a .351 on-base percentage and .574 slugging percentage...that compares to a .172

AS YOU (MAY) KNOW...the Mariners won their past two games in Houston 9-8 & 8-7, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...the wins mark the first time in franchise history that the club has won consecutive games by a 1-run margin while allowing seven or more runs in each game?...(*Elias Sports Bureau*).

ABOUT YOUNG...

- 34-year-old right hander is making his 6th appearance, 5th start of the season tonight vs. the Athletics.
- Prior to 2013, last pitched in the Majors with the New York Mets in 2012 (20 starts).
- Was an All-Star in 2007 with the San Diego Padres.
- Has one career postseason start, picking up the win in G#3 of the 2006 NLDS for the Padres at St. Louis.
- At 6-foot-10 is tied for the tallest player in Mariners history with LHP Randy Johnson.
- Originally selected by Pittsburgh in the 3rd round of the 2000 June Draft out of Princeton University.
- Played basketball and baseball at Princeton.
- Has played in the Pirates, Expos, Rangers, Padres, Mets, Nationals and now Mariners organizations.
- #53 will be the fourth jersey number he has worn in a MLB game...#49 with Texas, #32 with San Diego, #55 with New York Mets.
- signed with the Mariners as a free agent on March 27 after being released by Washington...was a non-roster invitee in the Nationals.
- Is 13-6 with a 2.84 ERA (54 ER, 171.1 IP) in 28 career starts in May.

LAST TIME OUT...Snapped a string of 4 consecutive no decisions to start the season with a win in the Mariners 6-3 victory over the Yankees on April 29...marked his first ML win since Sept. 12, 2012 at MIA with NYM...overall allowed 2 runs (1 ER) on 3 hits, while walking 3 and striking out 3 in 5.2 innings.

594 DAYS...Chris Young recorded a win in his last start on April 29 at NYY...marked his first ML victory since Sept. 9, 2012 at MIA w/NYM, a span of 594 days between victories.

MAY FLOWERS...Chris Young is 13-6 with a 2.84 ERA (54 ER, 171.1 IP) in 28 starts in the month of May...his 2.84 ERA in May is currently the 3rd-lowest during the month in the Majors, among active pitchers (min. 25 GS).

IT HAD BEEN A WHILE...continues to work himself back from shoulder surgery (thoracic outlet syndrome) that caused him to miss a large portion of the 2013 season...his appearance on April 6 at Oakland was his first in the Majors since Sept. 29, 2012 at Atlanta (with NYM).

ALPHABET SOUP...has thrown to catcher **Mike Zunino** in all three of his starts this season...only the second instances where a starting pitcher with a last name starting with **Y** and a catcher with a last name starting with **Z** have formed a MLB battery (last: Jason Young & Gregg Zaun with COL in 2003).

IN A PINCH...was scheduled to start on April 4 at Oakland, but the game was rained out...made first career relief appearance April 6 against the A's, striking out 2 in 2.0 scoreless innings...prior to his relief appearance had made 159 careers starts over 10 seasons in the Majors...his only relief appearance was for the NL squad in the 2007 All-Star Game, allowing an inside-the-park home run to Ichiro in the 5th inning.

HE IS A TALL ONE...listed at 6-foot-10, Young is tied LHP Randy Johnson as the tallest player in club history...Young is one of 6 pitchers in MLB history listed at 6-foot-10 or taller, with RHP Jon Rauch listed at 6-foot-11...here is a listing of the tallest players in Mariners history according to the SABR and STATS Inc databases:

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTER: LHP ROENIS ELIAS (2-2, 3.09)

25-year-old left-hander will be making his 7th MLB start tomorrow vs. Oakland...W#2 on May 1 at NYY (7.0,6,2,1,2,10,HR); became the 5th different Seattle rookie to record a 10K game over the past 4 seasons, joining Michael Pineda (2011), Erasmo Ramirez (2012), Hisashi Iwakuma (2012) and James Paxton (2013)...**2014 Season:** is the third native Cuban to pitch in a Mariners uniform joining Diego Segui (40 G in 1977) and Tony Fossas (23 games in 1998)...ND in his MLB debut, 4/3 at OAK; tossed 4.2 IP of no-hit ball, and finished 5.0 IP, 2 H, 1 R, 1 ER, 3 BB, 3 K...**2013 Season:** Was a Southern League (AA) All-Star last season for Jackson, going 6-11 with a 3.18 ERA (46 ER, 130.0 IP) in 22 starts...**MLB Career:** Combined to go 22-19 with a 3.61 ERA in 59 career minor league appearances (56 starts)...was an All-Star in 2012 (California League) and 2013 (Southern League)... signed by Seattle as a minor league free agent on May 3, 2011 while playing in Monterrey, Mexico...**vs. OAK:** Facing the Athletics for the second time in his career after recording in ND in ML debut vs. the A's on April 3 (5.0,2,1,1,3,3).
