Tonight is the 8th of 19 games between the Mariners and Athletics this season, the fourth in Oakland...Mariners were 1-2 here and one game rained out April 3-6...Seattle went 11-8 vs. the Athletics last season, including a 6-4 record here.

STRIKEOUT KINGS

Felix Hernandez has 53 strikeouts in his first 7 starts this season (10.23 K/9.0 IP), 3rd in the AL behind Jon Lester (58) and David Price (55)...Felix's 53 K's are 7th-most through the first 7 starts of a season in Mariners history.

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a rain-shortened 9-game, 3-city road trip today with the second (1-0) of 4 games at the Oakland Athletics, including a doubleheader Wednesday...are 5-1 on the trip so far; opened with a pair of wins at New York (2-0), sandwiched around a Wednesday rain out, then won 2 of 3 over the weekend in Houston...return home following this series to begin a 7-day homestand on Thursday vs. Kansas City (4 G) and Tampa Bay (3 G)...tonight's game will be televised on **ROOT SPORTS** in high definition & broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle & Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...won season-high matching 3 straight, 6 of 7 and 8 of last 10 games (3 in final at-bat) after a season-high 8-game losing streak (April 15-22)...snapped 6-game road losing streak with win last Tuesday at NYY...are 10-9 on the road and 5-6 at Safeco Field...opened the season with 3-game sweep of the Angels, the first 3-0 start since 1995.

- **Farquhar K's** - **Danny Farquhar** is averaging 11.93 K/9.0 IP (99 K, 74.2 IP) for his career.
- **2-Out RBI** - Scored 51 of 126 runs (40.5%) with 2 outs...**Justin Smoak** is 2nd in AL w/13 2-out RBI.
- **Closing Time** - **Fernando Rodney** has recorded **94** saves since 2012, 3rd-most in baseball.
- **Ouch** - Mariners batters have 10 HBP in last 9 games...3rd in AL with 15 HBP.
- **Pinch Hitters** - Mariners pinch-hitters are 3-for-last-4 and 4-for-13 (.308) this season.
- **Southpaws** - Mariners are 9-3 in games started by left-handed pitchers, compared to 6-12 vs. RHP.

LATELY...Seattle is 8-2 in its last 10 games (since 4/23)...team is hitting .261 (91x348) over the 10 games, and averaging 5.50 runs per game (55 runs total)...team hit just .222 in its first 20 games (7-13) and averaged 3.55 runs per game (71 runs, total).

BACK-TO-BACK...**Chris Young** improved to 2-0 with his win last night, the second straight start he's recorded a win...marks the first time since May 19 & 24, 2009, that Young has won back-to-back starts.

LORD FARQUHAR...**Danny Farquhar** has recorded a 1.59 ERA (3 ER, 17.0 IP) and is averaging 10.06 strikeouts per 9.0 innings in his 14 appearances this season...for his career, Farquhar is averaging 11.93 K/9.0 IP, with his next strikeout being the 100th of his career.

CA(NOTES)...**Robinson Cano** is a career .306 (48x157) hitter with 22 runs, 13 doubles, 2 triples, 5 home runs and 16 RBI in 39 career games at Oakland Coliseum.

"RBI" CANO...**Robinson Cano** has collected 10 RBI in his last 9 games...he has at least 1 RBI in 6 of last 9 games, and four multi-RBI games over the stretch...Seattle is 7-2 in the nine games.

EVEN-STEVEN...the Mariners are 15-15 entering play tonight; it's the first time they've been at .500 since they were 7-7 on April 16 (eventually fell to 7-13); it is the first time Seattle has been .500 or better through 30 games since posting a 15-15 mark to start the 2009 season...Seattle is even in run differential, having scored 126 runs and allowed 126 runs; just 5 AL teams currently have even or positive run differentials (SEA, OAK, LAA, DET, MIN), including three in the AL West.

ROAD WARRIORS...this four-game series at the Athletics will bring the Mariners season total of road games up to 22 (currently 10-9 in 19 games on the road)...the Mariners are tied for 2nd in the AL (with OAK) for most road games played, trailing only Toronto (20).

VERY PRODUCTIVE...the Mariners are 12-for-their-last-29 (.414) with runners in scoring position, collecting 19 RBI, over their last three games...are 25-for-last-69 (.362) w/MISP in last 7 games (6-1).

HITTING MACHINE...**Robinson Cano** is batting .340 (18x53) with 8 runs scored, 4 doubles, a triple, and 10 RBI over his last 13 games...overall has recorded at least one hit in 25 of 30 games this season, including a team-high 10 multi-hit games...has 18 RBI (2nd on club), and leads w/5 GA RBI.

JUST KEEP PITCHING...**Danny Farquhar** picked up his first save of the season Sunday in Houston, working the 8th and 9th...it was the first six-out save by a Mariners pitcher since Josh Kinney tossed 2.1 innings in a 5-1 win on Aug. 19, 2012.

THE CONDOR IS SOARING...**Michael Saunders** is 10-for-23 with 2 doubles and 4 RBI in the last five games, all batting in the leadoff spot...had season-high three hits Thursday at NY...overall this season, **Saunders has hit in the leadoff spot in 7 games, and is hitting .393 (11x28) with 5 runs, 2 2B, a HR, 5 RBI; Seattle is 5-2 in the seven games...**since beginning the year 0-for-his-first-9 (5 games + 1 AB), **Saunders is 17-for-53/.321 w/10 runs, 3 doubles, a triple, a homer & 6 RBI in his last 21 games...**he has on OBP of .379 and is slugging .472 for a .851 OPS over the 21-game span.

HEATING UP...**Kyle Seager**, the reigning AL Player of the Week, has recorded hits in 8 of his last 10 games (.317/13x41) and is batting .286 (16x56) with 11 runs, 3 doubles, 5 home runs, 14 RBI and a .940 OPS over his last 15 games...in his first 14 games, hit .143 (7x49) with 3 runs, 3 doubles, 2 RBI and a .492 OPS...he has hit 5 HR over his last 9 games including multi-homer games April 23 vs. Houston and April 27 vs. Texas.

AS YOU KNOW...**Michael Saunders** started last night's game in center field, moved to left in the 8th, then to right field in the 9th, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...he's just the third Mariners player ever to play all three outfield spots in one game?...he joins Rich Amaral (Sept. 11, 1992 vs. MIN) and Stan Javier (April 21, 2001 vs. LAA).

ABOUT ELIAS...

- Pronounced: Roenis (roh-EN-ees) Elias (ehl-LEE-us)
- 25-year-old left-hander his 7th career start tonight vs. the A's.
- Has spent entire career in the Mariners organization after signing as a minor league free agent on May 3, 2011.
- Defected from Cuba to Mexico in late 2010 after playing with Guantanamo in Serie Nacional.
- Owns a career MiLB record of 22-19, 3.61 ERA (131 ER, 326.2 IP) in 59 games/56 starts over 3 seasons.
- Made his professional debut in 2011 with the Mariners in the Arizona League...also appeared in games with Pulaski and Clinton during his rookie campaign.

LAST TIME OUT...earned his second career win in his last start May 1 at New York (AL)...struck out a career-high 10 batters in 7.0 innings in Mariners 4-2 win (7.0,6,2,1,2,10,HR)...third consecutive start to equal or better his career-high in strikeouts.

YANKEE STADIUM DEBUT...Elias struck out a career-high 10 batters in his Yankee Stadium debut May 1...became the second rookie pitcher to record a double-digit strikeout performance in a Yankee Stadium debut (old or new) over the last 45 seasons...Tampa Bay's Matt Moore recorded 11 strikeouts in 5.0 innings Sept. 22, 2011 and Baltimore's Tom Phoebus recorded 10 strikeouts in a complete game July 17, 1967.

YOU DON'T SEE THAT OFTEN...in his last start vs. the Yankees he allowed a leadoff home run to Jacoby Ellsbury in the first inning, then struck out the next three batters he faced (Jeter, Beltran, Soriano)...the only other pitcher in Mariners history to strike out the 2-3-4 batters in the first inning after allowing a leadoff homer was Randy Johnson on June 10, 1991 against the Red Sox in Seattle...Ellis Burks homered, and then Carlos Quintana, Wade Boggs and Tom Brunansky struck out.

ROOKIE STRIKEOUTS...with his 10 strikeout performance vs. the Yankees, Elias became the 12th Mariners rookie pitcher (21st timer) to record a double-digit strikeout game (last: James Paxton, 9/24/13 vs. KC)...he is the fifth different Mariners rookie to strike out 10 or more batters in one game over the last four seasons (Pineda - 2011, Ramirez - 2012, Iwakuma - 2012, Paxton - 2013).

ROAD WARRIOR...is 2-1 with a 2.59 ERA (7 ER, 24.1 IP) in 4 road starts this season...compares to 0-1, 4.22 ERA (5 ER, 10.2 IP) in 2 starts at Safeco Field.

ROOKIE RANKINGS...among Major League rookie pitchers, ranks 3rd in strikeouts (31), innings pitched (35.0) and tied for 1st with 6 starts.

NICE START ROOK...Elias recorded a 3.54 ERA in his 5 April starts...was the 3rd-best rookie ERA in month of April in club history behind **Michael Pineda** (2.01 ERA/7 ER, 31.1 IP) & **Erik Hanson** (2.23 ERA/8 ER, 32.1 IP). and ahead of **Freddy Garcia** (3.73 ERA/13 ER, 31.1 IP).

THERE IS ALWAYS A FIRST...recorded 1st Major League win in 7-1 game at Texas on April 14...began with 6.0 shutout innings before allowing one run in the 7th...allowed a runner in 6 of the 7 innings he pitched in but induced 3 double plays...recorded his first quality start and struck out a career-high 5 batters.

MAJOR LEAGUE DEBUT...recorded no decision in Major League debut April 3 at OAK, despite leaving game with 2-1 lead...allowed 1 run on 2 hits, while walking 3 & striking out 3 in 5.0 innings...is 1 of only 5 Mariners starting pitchers to toss at least 5.0 innings, allowing 1 run or less in ML debut, joining Taijuan Walker (8/30/13 at HOU), Blake Beavan (7/31/11 vs. SD), Pat Rice (5/18/91 at NYY) & Rich DeLucia (9/8/90 at BOS).

WHAT A JUMP...Elias is the Mariners fourth starting pitcher to jump from Double-A to a starting spot in the Major League rotation, joining Brandon Maurer in 2013, Mike Hampton and John Cummings, who both did it out of Class A back in 1993.

FOREIGN-BORN PLAYERS...born 8/1/88 in Guantanamo, Cuba, **Elias** is one of 19 MLB players born in Cuba to make an Opening Day roster, including 1 of 6 pitchers (Francisco Bueno-KC, Aroldis Chapman-CIN, Jose Fernandez-MIA, Onelki Garcia-LAD, Miguel Gonzalez-PHI)...Elias is also the 5th Cuban-born player in Mariners franchise history, including the 3rd pitcher (also: Tony Fossas, 1998 and Diego Segui, 1977)...he is the first Cuban-born player to record a win in Mariners franchise history.

MINOR LEAGUE CAREER...is 22-19 with a 3.61 ERA (131 ER, 326.2 IP) in 59 games/56 career starts over 3 seasons in the minor leagues...went 11-6 with a 3.76 ERA (62 ER, 148.1 IP) in 26 starts with High Desert in 2012...Elias was only the 4th pitcher in franchise history to start at least 25 games and have an ERA under 4.00 in a single season...joined John Patterson (2.83) and Brad Penny (2.96) in 1998 and Luis Galindez (3.87) in 1992...recorded his first career double digit strikeout game with a career-high 11 K's in 7.2 innings on July 21 at Stockton...made professional debut with the AZL Mariners on July 17, 2011 (1.0,1,0,0,0,0)...recorded first career win on July 24 at Danville w/Pulaski (4.0,3,0,0,0,1,HB).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE GAME #1 STARTER: RHP FELIX HERNANDEZ (3-1, 2.53)

28-year-old right-hander will be making his 8th start of the 2014 season tomorrow in the first game of the doubleheader vs. the A's...recorded a no-decision in his last start 5/2 at HOU (5.0,5,3,2,3,6,HBP) - battled flu-like symptoms...has not recorded a win since improving to 3-0 on 4/11 vs. OAK...over last 4 starts is 0-1, 2.88 ERA (8 ER, 25.0 IP)...L#1 on April 21 vs. HOU (7.0,7,6,2,1,4,HR)...W#3 April 11 vs. OAK (7.0,4,2,2,0,11); tossed 7.0 Sho IP, then allowed first two BF in 8th to reach and both scored off bullpen; was his 28th career 10+ K game, his 25th since the start of the 2009 season...W#2 April 5 at OAK (8.1,6,1,1,1,8); tossed 8.0 scoreless innings before allowing a run in the 9th inning...**2013:** Named to the AL All-Star team for the 4th time in his career...went 13-9, 3.06 ERA and recorded his fourth consecutive season or 200.0+ innings and 200+ strikeouts...ranked 5th in the AL in strikeouts (216) and 6th in ERA (3.06)...**Career:** 113-87 with a 3.18 ERA and 1,756 strikeouts in 276 career starts...currently in his 10th Major League season (debuted 8/4/05)...**vs. OAK:** Making his 32nd career start vs. the A's, 3rd this season...is 17-7, 2.60 ERA all-time vs. the A's, including 10-3, 2.62 over his last 19 starts since 2009...owns a 9-2, 2.64 career record at O.co Coliseum...is undefeated in his last 10 starts at O.co Coliseum (5-0, 2.76 ERA), including 3 consecutive winning starts (3-0, 0.39 ERA).
