# OAKLAND ATHLETICS (19-13) VS. SEATTLE MARINERS (15-15)

TUESDAY, MAY 6, 2014 – O.CO COLISEUM – 7:05 P.M. PDT RHP JESSE CHAVEZ (2-0, 1.89) VS. LHP ROENIS ELIAS (2-2, 3.09) CSNCA – A'S RADIO NETWORK (95.7 FM THE GAME) – EN ESPAÑOL (KIQI 1010 AM)

ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost three of the last four games and are now 6-8 over the last 14 contests after starting the year 13-5...are 19-13 for the season, which is the second best record in the American League and fourth best in the majors...it is the A's best record after 32 games since 2003 (20-12)...with a win tonight, the A's would match their best 33-game record over

the last 24 years (1991, 1992, 2003)...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the eighth consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 12 consecutive days and 25 of the last 27...lead second place Texas by two games for the fourth consecutive day...have 21 days in sole possession of first, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...had a season-high three-game losing streak from April 21-23, marking the only time the A's have lost more than two straight games since Aug. 24, 2013.

**PITCHING:** The A's have a 3.03 ERA, which is the **lowest mark in the American League** and fourth lowest in the majors...also lead the AL in opponents batting average (.225), on-base percentage (.289) and slugging percentage (.341)...have issued the third fewest walks (89).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 6-5 with a 4.14 ERA (52 er in 113.0 ip) over the last 19 games after going 5-2 with a 1.89 ERA over the first 13 contests...have a 3.20 ERA (69 er in 194.0 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the American League (Detroit, 2.73)...Sonny Gray, Scott Kazmir and Jesse Chavez have combined for a 10-2 record and a 2.16 ERA (31 er in 129.1 ip) in 20 starts while the A's other starters are 1-5 with a 5.29 ERA (38 er in 64.2 ip) in 12 starts...Kazmir has made seven starts and Chavez has six, marking the first time the A's have two 30-year-olds with more than five starts in a season since 2000 (Appier, Heredia, Olivares, Prieto)...starters rank second in the AL in innings pitched (194.0), tied for second in fewest losses (7) and tied for third in strikeouts (168).

**OFFENSE:** The A's are 21 for 127 (.165) with nine runs scored over the last four games after going 27 for 81 (.333) with 21 runs over their previous two contests...the A's lead the majors in walks (146) and top the American League in on-base percentage (.341)...are also tied for second in the AL in triples (8) and rank third in runs scored (157)...have homered just twice over the last eight games...19 of the A's 29 home runs have come with runners on base, which ranks second in the AL (Los Angeles, 21).

**IN THE PINCH:** Derek Norris drew the A's ninth pinch walk of the season last night, which is more than twice as many as any American League team and second most in the majors to Washington (10)...also lead the AL with 43 pinch plate appearances, which is more than four National League teams...are 6 for 33 (.182) with a home run and five RBI...are tied for the AL lead in home runs and extra base hits (3).

**ON THE BASES:** The A's are 21 for 23 (91.3%) in stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 23 of their 26 (88.5%) attempts, which is the third highest percentage in the American League...the A's are one of three AL teams without a pickoff (Baltimore, Boston).

**HOME AND AWAY:** The A's are 0-1 on this 10-game homestand against Seattle (0-1), Washington (three games) and Chicago-AL (three games) and have a four-game home losing streak, which is their longest over the last two years...are 6-7 (.462) at home for the season...went 6-4 on the last road trip to Houston (2-2), Texas (3-0) and Boston (1-2) and are 13-6 (.684) on the road...have the second best road record in the majors...it is the A's best start on the road since the 1990 club started the year 14-5...this homestand is the first of three 10-game homestands this year...the last time the A's had at least three 10-game homestands in one season was in 2002 when they had four.

CLOSE CALLS: The A's lost 4-2 last night to fall to 6-9 in games decided by two runs or fewer...are 13-4 in games decided by three runs or more...are 7-5 in games decided in the last at bat...the seven wins are tied with Milwaukee for the most in the majors and the 12 games are tied with Chicago for the most in the American League...have a Major League leading four wins when trailing after seven innings, which matches their season total from last year...also

have three losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied with Pittsburgh for the most in the majors...are 4-1 in extra inning games...lead the AL in extra inning wins, are tied for the lead in extra inning games and have the second best record

THIS AND THAT: The A's are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie...the streak of 32 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest by an Oakland team since a 34-game streak from May 27 to July 1, 1995...have committed 28 errors, which is second most in the American League...are 13-2 when scoring first, which is the best record in the AL...are 12-0 when hitting more home runs than the opposition and are one of three teams in the majors that have not lost in that situation (Detroit, 8-0; Texas, 7-0)...the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 13 minutes...averaged 3:05 last year, which was second longest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

**LET'S PLAY TWO:** The A's are scheduled to play their first "traditional" doubleheader tomorrow since July 16, 2011 against Los Angeles (AL), a split in Oakland...that was the A's only other single-admission doubleheader in Oakland over the last 16 years...the A's have four losses and three splits over their last seven traditional doubleheaders and have not swept once since Aug. 22, 1998 against Detroit in Oakland...it will be the A's sixth doubleheader with the Mariners, all in Oakland...the last was on Aug. 3, 1984, an A's sweep...the A's have two sweeps and four splits in those six doubleheaders.

**IN APRIL:** The A's went 18-9 (.667) last month to tie the franchise record for wins in the month of April (1981, 1989)...it was the seventh best April winning percentage in Oakland history and the best since 1990 (14-5, .737)...it was also the A's 11<sup>th</sup> consecutive winning month dating back to June of 2012...that ties the second longest such streak in Oakland history (July, 1989-May 1991)...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept., 1970-Sept. 1972...the A's had two four-game winners in April (Gray and Kazmir) for the third time in Oakland history...the pitching staff finished the month with 220 strikeouts, setting the franchise record for strikeouts in April.

**THE DISABLED LIST:** The A's have four players on the disabled list (Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker)...Griffin, O'Flaherty and Parker are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL seven times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's lead the season series 4-3...are 2-2 in Oakland and 2-1 in Seattle...are hitting .197 (45 for 228) but have a 1.94 ERA (14 er in 65.0 ip)...over the previous eight seasons, the A's have won the season series in even numbered seasons (2006, 2008, 2010, 2012) and the Mariners have won in odd numbered years (2007, 2009, 2011, 2013)...Oakland is 83-76 (.522) against the Mariners since 2006...all-time, the A's are 316-238 (.570) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by any team against the Mariners to Boston's .581 mark (min. 20 games)...are 174-103 in Oakland, 141-134 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo.

# **TODAY'S TIDBITS**

Fernando Abad has not allowed a run over his first 14 outings and his 13.1 innings pitched are second most in the majors among pitchers that have not allowed a run...Josh Donaldson has reached base safely via hit or walk in each of his last 27 games, which is the longest active streak in the majors...is 35 for 112 (.313) with 24 runs, 10 doubles, seven home runs, 23 RBI, 14 walks and a hit by pitch (.394 on-base percentage) over that span...Sean Doolittle has more innings pitched without allowing a walk than any other pitcher in the Major Leagues (14.1 ip)...Derek Norris is batting .519 (14 for 27) with eight walks (.629 on-base percentage) over his last 11 games...is batting 371 overall, which is the best mark in the American League and second best in the majors (Tulowitzki, COL .408) among players with 60 or more plate appearances.

### THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1975 Claudell Washington homers off California's Ed Figueroa for the 1000th home run in Oakland A's history...in 2003 Mark Mulder tosses his third consecutive complete game as the A's defeat the Chicago White Sox 6-0 in 1 hour and 49 minutes...that is the A's fastest game since August 12, 1979.

# TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Jesse Chavez (2-0, 1.89 ERA)

**ONE EARNED RUN OR FEWER:** Has allowed one earned run or fewer in five of his six starts and has a 1.89 ERA, which ranks second in the American League and seventh in the majors...had a season-opening streak of four consecutive starts of six or more innings and one earned run or fewer, which was the longest such streak by a pitcher on an Athletics Opening Day roster since at least 1914 (Brett Anderson did it in 2012 after coming off the DL in August).

**IN APRIL:** Went 2-0 with a 1.89 ERA and .199 opponents batting average in six starts in April...ranked third in the American League in ERA in April, tied for third in strikeouts (41) and was fifth in opponents batting average...the strikeouts were the fourth best April total in Oakland history (58, Blue in 1971; 47, Rijo in 1986; 44, Zito in 2001)...is just the second Oakland pitcher to strike out 40 or more batters in any month over the last 12 years (Rich Harden, 42 in August of 2011).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Has the lowest opponents on-base percentage in the American League and fifth lowest in the majors (.242)...also ranks third in the AL in opponents slugging (.298) and fourth in opponents batting average (.199)...has not walked a batter to lead off an inning and his .211 (8 for 38) opponents on-base percentage in that situation is sixth lowest in the AL...has allowed a .107 (9 for 84) batting average with two strikes...right-handed hitters are batting .172 (11 for 64) with one walk (.185 on-base percentage)...opponents are hitting .185 (5 for 27) with runners in scoring position...has not allowed a hit with RISP and two outs (9 AB)...opponents are 5 for 39 (.128) with RISP and two outs over the last two years...has allowed three home runs, all solo shots.

STRIKEOUTS AND WALKS: Has struck out 41 and walked just eight in 38.0 innings...ranks sixth in the American League in strikeout to walk ratio (5.13), eighth in walks per nine innings (1.89) and 10<sup>th</sup> in strikeouts per nine innings (9.71)...has issued seven of his eight walks to left-handed hitters...has allowed 21 of his 28 walks over the last two years to left-handers...did not walk a batter and struck out nine in back-to-back starts April 9 and 14...joins Dan Haren (August 21-26, 2007) as the only two Athletics pitchers since at least 1914 to strikeout nine or more in back-to-back starts without issuing a walk.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have won all six of his starting assignments this year...since 1995, the only other A's pitchers to begin the season with at least six consecutive starts in an A's victory are Scott Kazmir (6 in 2014) and Rich Harden (9 in 2006)...however, has just two wins...the four no decisions are tied for second most in the American League among starters (Masterson, CLE 5)...has tossed at least six innings in five of his six starts, allowed two runs or fewer five times and walked two batters or fewer five times.

AS A STARTER: Prior to this year, had made just two career starts, both with Toronto in 2012...had a loss and a 10.38 ERA in those two outings...is now 2-1 with a 3.47 ERA (18 er in 46.2 ip) in eight career starts...had 54 career starts as a minor leaguer...made 23 starts over the previous two seasons after starting just once from 2005-11.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 12-inning win over Seattle April 3 in Oakland...was charged with an unearned run in the first inning when Almonte reached on a Callaspo error, went to second on a Punto error, third on a Miller fly out and scored on a Cano ground out...also allowed a RBI single to Almonte in the fifth to make the score 2-0...the A's scored single runs in the fifth and eighth to tie the name

**SECOND START:** He had a no decision in the A's 7-4, 11-inning win at Minnesota April 9...struck out a career-high nine in a career-high 7.0 innings...the A's scored four times in the first inning and he allowed a solo home run to Kubel to lead off the second...that was the only run he would allow in his seven innings and he was relieved by Doolittle to start the eighth with a 4-1 lead...Doolittle allowed a run in the eighth and Johnson two in the ninth.

**THIRD START:** He had his third consecutive no decision in the A's 3-2 win at Los Angeles (AL) April 14...matched his career high with nine strikeouts and 7.0 innings pitched for the second consecutive start...allowed an unearned run in the first inning when Calhoun singled, went to second on a passed ball and scored on a Pujols single...allowed a solo home run to Pujols in the third and left after seven innings trailing 2-1.

**FOURTH START:** He picked up his first career win as a starter in the A's 4-1 win over Houston April 20 in Oakland...blanked the Astros on three hits and two walks over the first three innings before Gonzalez homered with two outs in the fourth...then retired seven of the final eight batters he faced...tossed a career-high 103 pitches.

CHAVEZ, CAREER HIGHS

FIFTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 12-5 win at Houston April 25...allowed a career-high eight hits...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed a run in the third inning on an Altuve RBI double...the A's scored a run in the fourth to take a 5-1 lead but he allowed four runs in the bottom of the fourth on a Dominguez RBI single, a two-run error by Donaldson and a Castro RBI ground out...the A's scored seven times in the ninth for the win.

**LAST START:** He extended his winning streak to two games in the A's 12-1 victory at Texas last Wednesday...has never put together three consecutive wins in his career...did not allow a run and matched his career high by tossing 7.0 innings...yielded just one hit (Fielder two-out single in first) and one walk (Fielder, one out in fourth)...did not allow a base runner past first base.

**THIS SPRING:** Went 5-1 with a save and a 2.22 ERA (28.1 ip, 22 h, 7 r, 7 er, 6 bb, 25 so, 4 hr) in seven games, five starts...the five wins were the most in the majors this spring and the most by an A's pitcher since spring win totals are available beginning in 1990...ranked second in the Cactus League in innings pitched (28.1), fourth in strikeouts (25) and eighth in ERA...allowed a .216 opponents batting average...did not allow a run in five of his seven games, including a spring-opening 13.2-inning scoreless streak.

**2013 RECAP:** Spent most of the season with the A's and was 2-4 with a save and a career-low 3.92 ERA in 35 games over two stints...the save was the first of his career and he also struck out a career-high 55 batters...also had career lows in opponents batting average (.230), onbase percentage (.302) and slugging percentage (.318)...matched his career highs in wild pitches (5) and hit batters (3)...surrendered just three home runs in 57.1 innings, an average of 0.47 per nine innings...entered the season with 34 home runs in 177.1 career innings (1.73 per nine innings).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** His opponents batting average included a .212 (21-for-99) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .246 (29-for-118) against left-handers...yielded all three of his home runs to right-handers...had a .269 batting average over his first 15 pitches in a game, .193 after that...opponents hit .333 with a .418 on-base percentage when leading off an inning.

**HOME AND AWAY:** Had a 2.73 ERA and .181 opponents batting average in 20 games on the road compared to a 5.20 ERA and .277 opponents average in 15 games at home.

2013 WITH SACRAMENTO: Was used exclusively as a starter with Sacramento and went 2-2 with a 2.70 ERA in five starts...allowed just one home run in 30.0 innings...walked five batters, an average of 1.50 per nine innings...struck out 26 for a strikeout to walk ratio of 5.20...yielded a .285 opponents batting average, including .240 (18-for-75) against right-handed hitters compared to .354 (17-for-48) against left-handers.

## TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Dan Straily (1-2, 5.01 ERA): Is 0-1 with a 6.52 ERA and .273 opponents batting average over his last four starts after going 1-1 with a 2.77 ERA and .191 opponents average over his first two starts...has allowed seven home runs, which is tied for second most in the American League...opponents have a .471 on-base percentage when leading off an inning, which is the highest in the majors...has not allowed more than eight hits in a start in his career and has tossed at least 3.1 innings in each of those outlings...his streak of 40 consecutive starts of eight hits or fewer and three innings or more is the longest by an A's pitcher since at least 1914...was the losing pitcher in his last start, a 7-1 A's loss at Boston last Friday (4.1 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 3 so)...is 0-2 with a 6.75 ERA in four career starts against Seattle...including a loss in his only start this year, a 3-1 decision in Oakland April 5 (4.1 ip, 4 h, 2 r, 2 er, 3 bb, 3 so)...had no decisions and a 4.37 ERA in four starts this spring...issued 10 walks in 13.1 inpings

- The A's bullpen has thrown 11 straight scoreless innings over three outings...allowed 11 earned runs over its previous five games (12.2 ip, 7.82 ERA)...its 2.71 ERA is first in the American League...no other team in the AL has an ERA below 3.27 (Boston).
- Bullpen has 14 decisions this season, the second most among AL bullpens (Texas, 15).
- Has gone 12 straight games without a save opportunity (6-6).
- Its eight wins are tied for the most in the American League (Texas).
- Its six blown saves are the second most in the AL (Houston, 7).
- First in the AL in opponents batting average (.214), on-base percentage (.276) and slugging percentage (.299)...has the fewest runs allowed (30) and the second fewest walks (31) in the AL.

- Has not allowed a run over his first 14 outings (13.1 ip) and has struck out 15 of the 47 batters he has faced...has thrown the second most innings without allowing a run among Major League pitchers (F. Rodriguez, 17.0).
- Leads Major League relievers in opponents batting average (.047), on-base percentage (.128) and slugging percentage (.047).
- Leads all Major League relievers in WHIP (0.38)...has allowed the fewest hits in the majors by a reliever (min. 10.0 ip).
- Has three career appearances against the Mariners, all this season (3.1 ip, 1 bb, 3 so).
- Has a 13-game losing streak dating back to April 9, 2011, which is the longest active losing streak in the majors.
- Was acquired from Washington for minor league infielder John Wooten, November 25, 2013.

Last Year: Began the season at Triple-A Syracuse and was 1-0 with a 1.06 ERA in 17 relief appearances...was promoted to Washington May 21 and went 0-3 with a 3.35 ERA in a career-high 39 relief appearances.

- His 2.0 innings pitched last night tied a season and career high (seven times).
- Opponents are hitting .122 against him this season (5 for 41) but his opponents on-base percentage is .265 (8 bb).
- Has allowed just seven home runs in 160.0 career innings...0.39 home runs per nine innings is the fifth best ratio among active relievers (min. 150 ip).
- Has a loss and two saves in 19 career appearances against Seattle (18.2 ip, 12 h, 4 r, 4 er, 11 bb, 21 so, 1.93 ERA)...last night was his first appearance against the Mariners this season.
- Has a 2.08 ERA (6 er in 26.0 ip) in 24 career appearances in May.
- Was placed on the DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...had a two-game rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton April 3-5 (1.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 10.80 ERA).

Last Year: Was 6-4 with two saves and a 2.54 ERA in a team-leading 71 relief appearances...allowed just two home runs in 67.1 innings, an average of 0.27 per nine innings, which was fourth lowest among AL relievers.

# 62 LHP SEAN DOOLITTLE

**LAST FOUR, FIRST TWO:** Is 0-1 with a 6.52 ERA (14 er in 19.1 ip) and .273 (21 for 77) opponents batting average over his last four starts after going 1-1 with a 2.77 ERA and .191 opponents average over his first two starts...has tossed five innings or fewer in three of his last four starts

**THE LONG BALL:** Did not allow a home run in his last start after beginning the season by yielding at least one long ball in each of his first five starts...has allowed seven home runs for the season, which is tied for second most in the American League...five have been hit by left-handed hitters, which is tied for second in the majors...four have been solo shots...23 of his 34 career home runs have been solo shots and 21 of the 34 have been hit by left-handers...has surrendered seven home runs in 32.1 innings (1.95 per nine innings) after yielding 16 home runs in 152.1 innings last year (0.95 per nine innings)...allowed 11 in 39.1 innings in 2012 (2.52 per nine innings).

**OPPONENTS BATTING:** Opponents are 10 for 28 (.357) with five walks and a hit by pitch (.471 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...the on-base percentage is second highest in the American League (Perez, TEX .477)...opponents also have four doubles and a home run leading off an inning for a .607 slugging percentage, which is fifth highest...has held the opponents three and four hitters to a .167 batting average (5 for 30).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-1 with a 2.77 ERA (4 er in 13.0 ip) and .191 (9 for 47) opponents batting average in two starts during the day compared to 0-1 with a 6.52 ERA (14 er in 19.1 ip) and .273 (21 for 77) opponents average in four starts at night...last year, he was 4-2 with a 2.14 ERA and .195 opponents batting average in nine starts during the day compared to 6-6 with a 4.98 ERA and .252 opponents average in 18 starts at night...his day ERA was the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings in day games...surrendered just one of his 16 home runs during the day...his career numbers are 5-4 with a 3.21 ERA (29 er in 81.1 ip) in 14 starts during the day compared to 8-7 with a 4.61 ERA (73 er in 142.2 ip) in 26 starts at night.

**EIGHT HITS OR FEWER:** Has not allowed more than eight hits in a start in his career and has tossed at least 3.1 innings in each of those outings...his streak of 40 consecutive starts of eight hits or fewer and three innings or more is the longest by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 (previous: 36, Curt Young, July 21, 1986-Aug. 8, 1987)...it is the longest career opening streak by a Major Leaguer since Juan Guzman had a 42-game streak from June 7, 1991-July 18, 1992.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss to Seattle April 5 in Oakland...blanked the Mariners on two hits over the first four innings before allowing three runs in the fifth inning on a two-run home run by Ackley and a solo home run by Almonte...Hernandez shut out the A's on four hits over the first eight innings before Lowrie homered in the pitch

**SECOND START:** He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win at Minnesota April 10...allowed a solo home run to the second batter he faced, Dozier, but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings...did not allow a hit over his final five innings and retired 16 of the final 18 batters he faced.

**THIRD START:** He had a no decision in the A's 10-9, 11-inning win at Los Angeles (AL) April 15...yielded a career-high tying six runs (fifth time)...allowed a RBI double to Trout and a RBI single to Kendrick in the first inning but the A's scored three times in the third to take a 3-2 lead...he then allowed four runs in the fourth inning on a two-run double by lannetta and a two-run home run by Calhoun...left after 3.2 innings trailing 6-3.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss to Texas in Oakland on April 21...allowed a home run to Choo to lead off the game but the A's came back with three runs in the second inning off Darvish...allowed a RBI single to Kouzmanoff in the fourth and a RBI single to Fielder in the fifth and left after five innings with the scored tied 3-3.

**FIFTH START:** He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss at Houston April 26...the A's scored twice in the first but he allowed a run in the bottom of the first and two more in the second...Fowler homered in the first and Carter hit a two-run home run in the second...left after five innings trailing 3-2 but the A's scored a run in the seventh to tie the game.

**LAST START:** He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-1 loss at Boston last Friday...allowed two runs in the bottom of the second on a Pierzynski RBI single and a Bradley RBI double...those were the only two runs he would allow but he was relieved by Abad after throwing 82 pitches in 4.1 innings.

- Had a 10-game hitting streak from April 6-16 (16 for 48, .333), which fell one short of his career high.
- Had his first career two-homer game April 24 at Houston.

### **SAM FULD**

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

### **CRAIG GENTRY**

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.

#### **LUKE GREGERSON**

  times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least
  1914.

### JIM JOHNSON

Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

### **JOSH LINDBLOM**

 Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

### **BRANDON MOSS**

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most
  by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has
  been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.

### ERIC O'FLAHERTY

 Was placed on the 60-day disabled list February 17 as he continues his recovery from Tommy John surgery.
