INSIDE THE NUMBERS

TODAY'S TILTS ... the Mariners conclude a rain-shortened 9-game, 3-city road trip today with a traditional doubleheader, the third & fourth (2-0) of 4 games at Oakland...are 6-1 on the trip so far; opened with a pair of wins at New York (2-0), sandwiched around a Wednesday rain out, then won 2 of 3 over the weekend in Houston...return home after today's games to begin a 7-day homestand tomorrow vs. Kansas City (4 G) and Tampa Bay (3 G)...today's games will be televised on ROOT SPORTS in high definition & broadcast live on 710 ESPN Seattle & Mariners Radio Network.

ODDS AND ENDS...won season-high 4 straight, 7 of 8 and 9 of last 11 games (3 in final at-bat) after a season-high 8-game losing streak (April 15-22)...snapped 6-game road losing streak with win Tuesday...are 11-9 on the road and 5-6 at Safeco Field...opened the season with 3-game sweep of the Angels, the first 3-0 start since 1995.

- Farquhar K's Danny Farquhar is averaging 11.93 K/9.0 IP (99 K, 74.2 IP) for his career.
- **2-Out RBI** Scored 56 of 134 runs (41.8%) with 2 outs...**Justin Smoak** is 1st in AL w/16 2-out RBI.
- Closing Time Fernando Rodney has recorded <u>94</u> saves since 2012, 3rd-most in baseball.
- Ouch Mariners batters have 11 HBP in last 10 games...2nd in AL with 16 HBP.
- Pinch Hitters Mariners pinch-hitters are 3-for-last-4 and 4-for-13 (.308) this season.
- Southpaws Mariners are 9-3 in games started by left-handed pitchers, compared to 7-12 vs. RHP.

LET'S PLAY TWO...the Mariners are playing the 71st doubleheader in club history today, and the first since Aug. 23, 2011 at Cleveland...Seattle has won both games of a doubleheader 12 times, been swept 17 times and split 41 times (split last 5 doubleheaders)...52 of the 70 doubleheaders (and 27 of last 29) have been played on the road...last played a doubleheader in Oakland on April 11, 1982...today's second game is the make-up for the rainout on April 4.

LATELY...Seattle is 9-2 in its last 11 games (since 4/23)...team is batting .264 (101x383) over the 11 games (.317 with RISP), and averaging 5.73 runs per game (63 runs total)...team hit just .222 in its first 20 games (7-13) and averaged 3.55 runs per game (71 runs, total).

TWO-OUT THUNDER...Justin Smoak collected 3, 2-out RBI last night; he has an MLB-leading 16 two-out RBI this season...Jose Abreu, CWS, is 2nd w/14...Justin is batting .583 (7x12) w/13 RBI with two-outs and runners in scoring position... AND LATE INNING LIGHTNING... Smoak is batting .351 (13-for-37) with 4 doubles, 4 home runs and 12 RBI in the 7th inning or later.

HE GETS A'S... Dustin Ackley is batting .417 (10-for-24) with a home run and 3 RBI vs. the A's this season...he has a .462 on-base percentage, and is slugging .625 (1.087 OPS).

THAT WAS UNUSUAL...Seattle won 8-3 last night; each of the teams previous 11 games were decided by 3 runs or less...22 of the Mariners 31 games have been decided by 3 runs or less; that's tie-first in the AL with BOS & CLE, and just ahead of OAK (21).

SWEEP?...Seattle has never swept the A's in a 4-game series here; did sweep 4 in SEA 8/12-15/91.

LORD FARQUHAR...Danny Farquhar has recorded a 1.59 ERA (3 ER, 17.0 IP) and is averaging 10.06 strikeouts per 9.0 innings in his 14 appearances this season...for his career, Farquhar is averaging 11.93 K/9.0 IP, with his next strikeout being the 100th of his career.

CA(NOTES)...Robinson Cano is a career .311 (50x161) hitter with 23 runs, 13 doubles, 2 triples, 5 home runs and 16 RBI in 40 career games at Oakland Coliseum.

"RBI" CANO...Robinson Cano has collected 10 RBI in his last 10 games...he has at least 1 RBI in 6 of last 10 games, and four multi-RBI games over the stretch...Seattle is 8-2 in the 10 games.

SOMETHING POSITIVE...Seattle has scored 134 runs this season, while allowing 129; seven AL teams currently have positive run differentials (SEA, OAK, LAA, DET, MIN, CWS, TOR).

ROAD WARRIORS...this four-game series at the Athletics will bring the Mariners season total of road games up to 22 (currently 11-9 in 20 games on the road)...the Mariners are 2nd in the AL for most road games played, trailing only Toronto (21)...Toronto is home today, so by day's end, Seattle will have the most road games played.

HITTING MACHINE...Robinson Cano is batting .351 (20x57) with 9 runs scored, 4 doubles, a triple, and 10 RBI over his last 14 games...overall has recorded at least one hit in 26 of 31 games this season, including a team-high 11 multi-hit games...has 18 RBI (2nd on club), and leads w/5 GA RBI.

HOMESTAND HIGHLIGHTS...Mariners begin a 7-game homestand tomorrow featuring Kansas City (4 games) and Tampa Bay (3 games)...here are some highlights of the homestand:

DID YOU KNOW?...that the Mariners have a chance to turn in the 4th-best road trip in franchise history with a sweep today?...Seattle is 6-1 (.857) so far on this trip, with a chance to finish 8-1 (.889) ...in club history, the only trips better than that (by percentage) would be a 10-0 trip 4/8-17/02; a 6-0 trip 9/15-20/2000 and an 11-1 (.917) trip 5/27-6/8/03 (min: 6 wins).

- Signed a 7-year deal through the 2019 season on Feb. 13, 2013.
- In 2010 won the AL Cy Young, garnering 21 of 28 first-place votes... Johnson (1995) as only Mariners to win the Cy Young...named Sporting News AL
- Pitcher of the Year.
 ML debut Aug. 4, 2005 at Detroit...Safeco debut vs. MIN Aug. 9, 2005...youngest MLB pitcher since Jose Rijo worked as reliever in '84 (19 years, 54 days old on 7/6/84 at MIN).
- At 19 years, 118 days old at debut, was the 3rd-youngest player to debut in Mariners history & 2nd-youngest pitcher.
 Born in Valencia, VZ...signed as 16-year-old non-drafted free agent July 4, 2002.

- Selected to AL squad in 2009, 2011, 2012 & 2013 ASG.
 Threw the first Perfect Game in Mariners history, and 23rd in ML history, Aug. 15, 2012 in a 1-0 victory over Tampa Bay at Safeco Field (9.0,0,0,0,0,12)...7th PG in MLB history to be decided in a 1-0 game, and 1st in the AL since 1984.
- Tossed at least 6.0 IP in 221 of 273 GS (80.9%)...pitched at least 6.0 innings in 24 of 31 starts last season (77.4%), including 22 quality starts (183 career quality starts).
- Owns a 13-22, 4.41 ERA record in the month of May during his career...was 3-2 with a 2.88 ERA (13 ER, 40.2 IP) in 6 starts last May.

LAST TIME OUT ... Recorded a ND in Mariners 4-5 loss at Houston on May 2, despite leaving with a 4-3 lead...allowed 3 runs (2 ER) on 5 hits), while walking 3 and striking out 7...snapped a string of 6 consecutive quality starts to open the season.

OWNING THE COLISEUM...Felix is 5-0, including winning 3 straight starts, with a 2.76 ERA (22 ER, 71.2 IP) in 10 starts at O.co Coliseum since April 11, 2009. he currently has the longest active win streak at Oakland and tied for the longest win streak amongst all active pitchers (also: Ervin Santana, 9/27/05-7/16/09 and Bartolo Colon, 8/25/99-5/30/11)...overall is 9-2 with a 2.64 ERA (33 ER, 112.2 IP) in 17 starts at Oakland...his 9 wins are currently the most for an opposing pitcher at O.co, while his 2.64 ERA ranks behind only Ervin Santana (2.12) and Justin Verlander (2.52) at Oakland (min. 50.0 IP).

IT DOESN'T HAPPEN OFTEN ... in his last start on April 26 vs. Texas, Felix walked Robinson Chirinos with the bases loaded in the 5th innings...it marked only the 3rd time in Felix's career to walk a batter with the bases load...prior to this season had not walked a batter with the bases loaded since doing it twice in 2008 (5/26 vs. BOS & 7/23 vs. BOS).

ROAD WARRIOR...Felix is 2-0 with a 2.05 ERA (6 ER, 26.1 IP) in 4 starts on the road this season...over the last 2 seasons, Felix is 9-4 with a 2.51 ERA (36 ER, 129.0 IP) in 20 starts on the road...has allowed 1 earned run or less in 12 of last 20 road starts, while tossing at least 6.0 inning 15 times...since 2007, has the lowest road ERA in the Majors with a 2.91 mark (49-34, 2.91 ERA, 117 GS).

FACING THE AL WEST...AGAIN...Felix has made 7 starts this season, all vs. an AL West opponent...dating back to last season he has made 9 consecutive start vs. the AL West and also 12 of his last 13 starts...his last non-AL West opponent was the Kansas City Royals (9/2/13 at KC)...over the last 2 seasons, Felix is 9-7 with a 3.21 ERA (49 ER, 137.1 IP) in 22 GS vs. the AL West, including going 6-1 with a 2.43 ERA (20 ER, 74.0 IP) vs. the AL West on the road during this stretch.

ULTRA QUALITY STARTS...since 2009. Felix Hernandez has recorded 67 starts where he has allowed 1 or fewer runs in 7.0 or more innings pitched...next closest is Cliff Lee with 57...on April 16 at Texas (ND, 7.0 IP, 4 H, 1 R, BB, 9 K) was the 27th time Felix has recorded a no-decision or a loss in a start where he allowed 1 or fewer runs in 7.0 or more IP...it was the 18th Mariners team loss when Felix records such a loss.

THAT'S WHY HE IS CALL THE KING... Felix Hernandez has 53 strikeouts in his first 7 starts this season (10.23 K/9.0 IP), 3rd in the AL behind Jon Lester (58) and David Price (55)...Felix's 53 K's are 7th-most through the first 7 starts of a season.

GOODBYE 27...Felix turned 28 on April 8...according to the Elias Sports Bureau, his 1,722 strikeouts are 4th-most all-time by a pitcher before their turning 28...trails only Sam McDowell (1,956), Bert Blyleven (1,910) & Walter Johnson (1,886).

OPENING DAY...earned W#1 in the season opener March 31 at LA Angels...allowed 3 runs (2 ER) in 6.0 innings, striking out 11 and walking only 1 batter... allowed a leadoff single followed by a 2-run Mike Trout home run in the first inning, and then settled in to allow 1 run (unearned) and 2 hits the rest of the way...improved to 5-0, 1.52 ERA in his 7 career Opening Day starts...Felix holds club Opening Day records for starts (7), consecutive starts (6), wins (5) and strikeouts (52).

DOUBLE-DIGITS STRIKEOUTS...has recorded two double-digit strikeout games this season...recorded 11 strikeouts in his last outing (4/11) against Oakland and recorded 11 strikeouts on Opening Day at LAA...28th career double-digit strikeout performances in his career...recorded five 10+ strikeout starts last season, including 2 of his last 5 starts...has recorded 25 double-digits strikeout games since the start of the 2009 season, the 2nd-most in baseball behind only Cliff Lee (27) and ahead of Justin Verlander (24) and Tim Lincecum (24).

ELITE COMPANY...Felix passed Randy Johnson in career innings pitched with the Mariners on April 5 at Oakland...Felix is now second on the Mariners all-time innings pitched list, behind Jamie Moyer (2093.0 IP)...Amongst Mariners starts, Felix also ranks 2nd in with 186 quality starts (Moyer, 188) and 2nd with 275 starts (Moyer, 323)...Felix is in his 10th season with Seattle; Randy also pitched 10 years, while Jamie spent 11 seasons with Seattle.

VENEZUELAN LEADER... with a 3.18 ERA Felix Hernandez is the all-time ERA leader for pitchers from Venezuela...his 3.18 ERA (659 ER, 1866.0 IP) ranks ahead of fellow countrymen Johan Santana (3.20 ERA), Carlos Zambrano (3.66), Wilson Alvarez (3.96), Kelvim Escobar (4.15) and Freddy Garcia (4.15) among pitchers with a minimum of 1500.0 innings...Felix is 2nd on the all-time Venezuelan strikeout list with 1,756 K's, behind just Johan Santana (1,988)...and already ranks 4th in wins with 113 victories, behind Freddy Garcia (156), Johan Santana (139) and Carlos Zambrano (132).

BASEBALL TONIGHT...Felix was the No. 5 player and the top right-handed pitcher on ESPN's Baseball Tonight annual player rankings...ESPN's top 5 were Mike Trout (LAA), Miguel Cabrera (DET), Clayton Kershaw (LAD), Andrew McCutchen (PIT) and Felix...teammate Robinson Cano was No. 7 on
