ABOUT THE A'S: Have lost four of the last five games and are now 6-9 over the last 15 contests after starting the year 13-5...need to win both games today to avoid losing back-to-back series for the first time since Aug. 19-25 of last year...are 19-14 for the season, which is the second best record in the American League and fifth best in the majors...are in sole possession of first

place in the AL West for the ninth consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 13 consecutive days and 26 of the last 28...have a two-game lead for the fifth consecutive day...have 22 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...had a season-high three-game losing streak from April 21-23, marking the only time the A's have lost more than two straight games since Aug. 24, 2013.

LET'S PLAY TWO: The A's are scheduled to play their first "traditional" doubleheader since July 16, 2011 against Los Angeles (AL), a split in Oakland...that was the A's only other single-admission doubleheader in Oakland over the last 16 years...the A's have four losses and three splits over their last seven traditional doubleheaders and have not swept one since Aug. 22, 1998 against Detroit in Oakland...this will be the A's sixth doubleheader with the Mariners, all in Oakland...the last was on Aug. 3, 1984, an A's sweep...the A's have two sweeps and four splits in those six doubleheaders.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 0-2 on this 10-game homestand against Seattle (0-2), Washington (three games) and Chicago-AL (three games) and have a five-game home losing streak, which matches their longest over the last seven years...have not lost more than five straight home games since a six-game streak from Sept. 16-29, 2007...are 6-8 (.429) at home for the season compared to 13-6 (.684) on the road...have the third worst home record in the American League, but are tied for the second best road record in the majors...the A's road record is their best after 19 road games since the 1990 club started the year 14-5...went 6-4 on the last road trip to Houston (2-2), Texas (3-0) and Boston (1-2)...this homestand is the first of three 10-game homestands this year...the last time the A's had at least three 10-game homestands in one season was in 2002 when they had four.

THE FIRST ROOKE: The A's have recalled Arnold Leon today and he is the first rookie on the roster this year...the A's are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 33 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest by an Oakland team since a 34-game streak from May 27 to July 1, 1995.

PITCHING: The A's have a 3.06 ERA, which is the **lowest mark in the American League** and third lowest in the majors...also lead the AL in opponents batting average (.227), on-base percentage (.292) and slugging percentage (.342)...have issued the third fewest walks (94).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 0-4 with a 6.23 ERA (18 er in 26.0 ip) in the month of May...are now 6-6 with a 4.25 ERA (56 er in 118.2 ip) over the last 20 games after going 5-2 with a 1.89 ERA over the first 13 contests...have a 3.29 ERA (73 er in 199.2 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the American League (Detroit, 2.69)...Sonny Gray, Scott Kazmir and Jesse Chavez have combined for a 10-3 record and a 2.33 ERA (35 er in 135.0 ip) in 21 starts while the A's other starters are 1-5 with a 5.29 ERA (38 er in 64.2 ip) in 12 starts...Kazmir and Chavez have made seven starts each, marking the first time the A's have two 30-year-olds with more than five starts in a season since 2000 (Appier, Heredia, Olivares, Prieto)...starters are tied for the AL lead in innings pitched (199.2), have the third fewest losses (8) and rank fourth in strikeouts (171).

OFFENSE: The A's are 28 for 161 (.174) with 12 runs scored over the last five games after going 27 for 81 (.333) with 21 runs over their previous two contests...lead the majors in walks (151)...rank second in the American League in on-base percentage (.340), tied for second in triples (8) and are third in runs scored (160)...19 of the A's 30 home runs have come with runners on base, which is tied with Toronto for second in the AL (Los Angeles, 21).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters have nine walks, which is more than twice as many as any American League team and second most in the

majors to Washington (12)...also lead the AL with 43 pinch plate appearances, which is more than three National League teams...are 6 for 33 (.182) with a home run and five RBI...are tied for the AL lead in home runs and extra base hits (3).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 21 for 23 (91.3%) in stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 24 of their 27 (88.9%) attempts, which is the third highest percentage in the American League...the A's are one of three AL teams without a pickoff (Baltimore, Boston).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 6-9 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 13-4 in games decided by three runs or more...are 7-5 in games decided in the last at bat...the seven wins are tied with Milwaukee for the most in the majors and the 12 games are tied with Chicago for the most in the American League...have four wins when trailing after seven innings, which matches their season total from last year and ties Arizona for the most in the majors...also have three losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied with Pittsburgh for the most in the majors...are 4-1 in extra inning games...lead the AL in extra inning wins, are tied for the lead in extra inning games and have the second best record.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have committed 29 errors, which is second most in the American League...are 13-2 when scoring first, which is the best record in the AL...lost for the first time last night when hitting more home runs than the opposition and are 12-1 in those games for the season...the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 13 minutes...averaged 3:05 last year, which was second longest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

IN APRIL: The A's went 18-9 (.667) last month to tie the franchise record for wins in the month of April...it was the seventh best April winning percentage in Oakland history...it was also the A's 11th consecutive winning month dating back to June of 2012...that ties the second longest such streak in Oakland history (July, 1989-May 1991)...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept., 1970-Sept. 1972...the A's had two four-game winners in April for the third time in Oakland history...the pitching staff finished the month with 220 strikeouts, setting the franchise record for strikeouts in April.

A's vs. MARINERS: The A's season series is even at four games each...the A's are 2-3 in Oakland and 2-1 in Seattle...are hitting .198 (52 for 262) but have a 2.19 ERA (18 er in 74.0 ip)...over the previous eight seasons, the A's have won the season series in even numbered seasons (2006, 2008, 2010, 2012) and the Mariners have won in odd numbered years (2007, 2009, 2011, 2013)...Oakland is 83-77 (.519) against the Mariners since 2006...all-time, the A's are 316-239 (.569) against Seattle, which is the second best mark by any team against the Mariners to Boston's .581 mark (min. 20 games)...are 174-104 in Oakland, 141-134 in Seattle and 1-1 in Tokyo.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Fernando Abad has not allowed a run over his first 14 outings and his 13.1 innings pitched are second most in the majors among pitchers that have not allowed a run (Rodriguez, MIL 17.0)...Josh Donaldson has reached base safely via hit or walk in each of his last 28 games, which is the second longest active streak in the majors (Bautista, TOR 34)...Sean Doolittle has the most innings pitched in the majors among pitchers that have not walked a batter (15.2 ip)...Derek Norris is batting .364, which is second best in the American League among players with 70 or more plate appearances (Choo, TEX .370).

THIS DATE IN A'S HISTORY

In 1979 the A's turn the first triple play in Oakland history at Baltimore when Gary Roenicke hits into a Gross to Klutts to Revering triple play...it is the first of the A's major league recording tying three triple plays in 1979...in 1991 Harold Baines sets an Oakland record with 14 total bases in the A's 11-3 win against Baltimore...he homers in the first, doubles in third, homers in the fourth, homers in the sixth for his club record tying third home run and then walks in the eighth inning with a chance for his fourth home run...he has seven RBI on the evening...in 1997 the A's and Milwaukee set a major league record for the longest 1-0 nine inning game...the Brewers win the game in 3 hours and 20 minutes, breaking the previous record of 3:07.

TODAY'S GAME 1 STARTING PITCHER: Dan Straily (1-2, 5.01 ERA)

LAST FOUR, FIRST TWO: Is 0-1 with a 6.52 ERA (14 er in 19.1 ip) and .273 (21 for 77) opponents batting average over his last four starts after going 1-1 with a 2.77 ERA and .191 opponents average over his first two starts...has tossed five innings or fewer in three of his last four starts.

THE LONG BALL: Did not allow a home run in his last start after beginning the season by yielding at least one long ball in each of his first five starts...has allowed seven home runs for the season, which is tied for third most in the American League...five have been hit by left-handed hitters, which is tied for second in the majors...four have been solo shots...23 of his 34 career home runs have been solo shots and 21 of the 34 have been hit by left-handers...has surrendered seven home runs in 32.1 innings (1.95 per nine innings) after yielding 16 home runs in 152.1 innings last year (0.95 per nine innings)...allowed 11 in 39.1 innings in 2012 (2.52 per nine innings).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Opponents are 10 for 28 (.357) with five walks and a hit by pitch (.471 on-base percentage) when leading off an inning...the on-base percentage is the highest in the majors...opponents also have four doubles and a home run leading off an inning for a .607 slugging percentage, which is fifth highest in the American League...has held the opponents three and four hitters to a .167 batting average (5 for 30).

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 1-1 with a 2.77 ERA (4 er in 13.0 ip) and .191 (9 for 47) opponents batting average in two starts during the day compared to 0-1 with a 6.52 ERA (14 er in 19.1 ip) and .273 (21 for 77) opponents average in four starts at night...last year, he was 4-2 with a 2.14 ERA and .195 opponents batting average in nine starts during the day compared to 6-6 with a 4.98 ERA and .252 opponents average in 18 starts at night...his day ERA was the lowest in the AL and fourth lowest in the majors among pitchers with 50 or more innings in day games...surrendered just one of his 16 home runs during the day...his career numbers are 5-4 with a 3.21 ERA (29 er in 81.1 ip) in 14 starts during the day compared to 8-7 with a 4.61 ERA (73 er in 142.2 ip) in 26 starts at night.

EIGHT HITS OR FEWER: Has not allowed more than eight hits in a start in his career and has tossed at least 3.1 innings in each of those outings...his streak of 40 consecutive starts of eight hits or fewer and three innings or more is the longest by an A's pitcher since at least 1914 (previous: 36, Curt Young, July 21, 1986-Aug. 8, 1987)...it is the longest career opening streak by a Major Leaguer since Juan Guzman had a 42-game streak from June 7, 1991-July 18, 1992.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-1 loss to Seattle April 5 in Oakland...blanked the Mariners on two hits over the first four innings before allowing three runs in the fifth inning on a two-run home run by Ackley and a solo home run by Almonte...Hernandez shut out the A's on four hits over the first eight innings before Lowrie homered in the ninth.

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win at Minnesota April 10...allowed a solo home run to the second batter he faced, Dozier, but that was the only run he would allow in seven innings...did not allow a hit over his final five innings and retired 16 of the final 18 batters he faced.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 10-9, 11-inning win at Los Angeles (AL) April 15...yielded a career-high tying six runs (fifth time)...allowed a RBI double to Trout and a RBI single to Kendrick in the first inning but the A's scored three times in the third to take a 3-2 lead...he then allowed four runs in the fourth inning on a two-run double by lannetta and a two-run home run by Calhoun...left after 3.2 innings trailing 6-3.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 loss to Texas in Oakland on April 21...allowed a home run to Choo to lead off the game but the A's came back with three runs in the second inning off Darvish...allowed a RBI single to Kouzmanoff in the fourth and a RBI single to Fielder in the fifth and left after five innings with the scored tied 3-3.

FIFTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 7-6 loss at Houston April 26...the A's scored twice in the first but he allowed a run in the bottom of the first and two more in the second...Fowler homered in the first and Carter hit a two-run home run in the second...left after five innings trailing 3-2 but the A's scored a run in the seventh to tie the game.

LAST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 7-1 loss at Boston last Friday...allowed two runs in the bottom of the second on a Pierzynski RBI single and a Bradley RBI double...those were the only

two runs he would allow but he was relieved by Abad after throwing 82 pitches in 4.1 innings.

STRAILY vs. SEATTLE: Is 0-2 with a 6.75 ERA (18.2 ip, 21 h, 15 r, 14 er, 12 bb, 19 so, 6 hr) in four career starts...is 0-1 with a 6.75 ERA (6 er in 10.1 ip) in two starts in Oakland and 0-1 with an 8.64 ERA (8 er in 8.1 ip) in two starts in Seattle...was the losing pitcher in his only start this year, a 3-1 A's loss in Oakland on April 5 (see first start above)...was 0-1 with an 8.64 ERA (8.1 ip, 12 h, 8 r, 8 er, 7 bb, 9 so, 2 hr) in two starts last year.

THIS SPRING: Had no decisions and a 4.37 ERA (13.1 ip, 14 h, 7 r, 7 er, 10 bb, 8 so, 1 hr) in four starts this spring...opponents hit .275...walked two or more batters in all four starts and issued 10 walks in 13.1 innings overall (6.75 walks per nine innings)...had his final start on March 29 against San Francisco rained out...pitched in a minor league game March 24 (5.2 ip, 10 h, 7 r, 7 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 2 hr).

2013 RECAP: Had five stints with Oakland in 2013 and was 10-8 with a 3.96 ERA in 27 starts...led American League rookies in games started, innings pitched (152.1) and strikeouts (124) and tied for the lead in wins (Perez, TEX)...is the 11th rookie in Oakland history to win 10 or more games, the fifth in the last five years (Anderson, Cahill, Milone, Parker)...had the sixth most strikeouts by an Oakland rookie...went 1-2 with a 7.27 ERA and .257 opponents batting average over his first five starts, 5-0 with a 2.83 ERA and .196 opponents average over his next nine starts from May 21 to July 9, 0-5 with a 5.20 ERA and .299 opponents over his next seven starts from July 20 to Aug. 23 and 4-1 with a 2.00 ERA and .195 opponents average over his final six starts

OPPONENTS BATTING: Allowed a .233 opponents batting average...did not have enough innings pitched to qualify for the league leaders, but his opponents average was ninth lowest among AL pitchers with 150 or more innings pitched...his .358 slugging percentage was eighth best...his opponents batting average included a .221 (60-for-272) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .244 (72-for-295) against left-handers...allowed a .201 batting average the first time through the lineup, which was third lowest among AL pitchers with 150 or more innings pitched...allowed a .225 batting average to batters leading off an inning...however, issued 19 walks to start an inning, which tied for second most in the AL...opponents hit .300 with runners in scoring position and two outs...they were 4-for-7 (.571) with a grand slam with the bases loaded.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Was 6-2 with a 4.28 ERA and .217 opponents batting average in 14 starts before the All-Star Break...then went 4-6 with a 3.61 ERA and .250 opponents average in 13 starts after the break.

DAYS REST: Was 6-3 with a 3.25 ERA in 14 starts on five days rest or more compared to 4-5 with a 4.80 ERA in 13 starts on four days rest...is now 8-5 with a 3.12 ERA (43 er in 124.0 ip) in 21 career starts on five days rest or more compared to 5-6 with a 5.31 ERA (59 er in 100.0 ip) in 19 starts on four days rest.

2013 WITH SACRAMENTO: Was 3-1 with a 1.14 ERA and .202 opponents batting average in five starts with Sacramento...allowed just one home run in 31.2 innings...struck out 33, an average of 9.38 per nine innings...his opponents batting average included a .174 mark against left-handed hitters compared to .219 against right-handers.

YOENIS CÉSPEDES

 Made his third consecutive Opening Day start March 31 against Cleveland (center field in 2012, left field in 2013-14)...is the first Athletic to start back-to-back openers in left field since Ben Grieve in 1999-2000.

RYAN COOK

 Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with right shoulder tendinitis...did not pitch in a Major League game during the spring.

COCO CRISP

- Was on his 10th Opening Day roster (2004-09, 11-14) and made his ninth career Opening Day start, his fourth straight with the A's.

 times in a nine-inning game and steal a base...is the first Major League catcher to do it since at least
 1914.

JIM JOHNSON

Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

JOSH LINDBLOM

 Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most
 by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has
 been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
