#### **OAKLAND NOTES**

- The Oakland Athletics have lost six straight games at home, which is their longest streak over the last seven years since Sept. 16-29, 2007 when they also lost six straight...are now 6-9 (.400) at home compared to 13-6 (.684) on the road.
- Dan Straily tossed 6.0 innings and allowed a season-high four walks.
- Yoenis Cespedes (1 for 5, r, so) is 8 for 26 (.308) with four doubles, one home run, five RBI, four walks and seven runs scored over his last eight games.
- Coco Crisp (1 for 2, cs) left the game in the bottom of the fourth inning with a strained neck.
- Josh Donaldson (1 for 3, rbi, bb, sf) has reached base safely via hit or walk in a career-high 29 straight games (previous: 28 games, Aug. 25-Sept. 23, 2013)...it is the longest such streak for an A's player over the last six years...is 36 for 119 (.303) with 24 runs, 10 doubles, seven home runs, 24 RBI, and 16 walks during his current streak.
- Brandon Moss (2 for 4, 3b, rbi, ibb, gidp) hit his first triple since June 18, 2013 at Texas...is 6 for 15 (.400) over his last four games after going 1 for 13 over his previous six contests.
- Josh Reddick (1 for 5) snapped his 0 for 16 hitless streak with a single in the sixth inning.

- Felix Hernandez had his three-game winning streak at the Coliseum snapped...allowed a season-high four runs...it was just his third career start in which he recorded no strikeouts (last: 5.0 ip, Aug. 18, 2008 at Chicago AL), and his first in a start in which he tossed more than six innings.
- Robinson Cano (1 for 4, r, rbi, ibb, gidp) has hit safely in 27 of his 32 games this season.
- James Jones (1 for 2, r, bb, sb) recorded his first career stolen base in the sixth inning.
- Mike Zunino (1 for 4, r, hr, rbi, so) snapped his 0 for 11 hitless streak with a solo home run in the fifth inning.
