ABOUT THE A'S: Snapped their season-high tying three-game losing streak with a win in the second game of doubleheader on Wednesdav the against Seattle...lost three of four to the Mariners after dropping two of three in Boston last weekend and have lost back-to-back series for the first time since Aug. 19-25 of last year...are 7-10 over the last 17 games after starting the

year 13-5...are 20-15 for the season, which is the second best record in the American League and tied for fifth best in the majors...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 11th consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 15 consecutive days and 28 of the last 30...have 24 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's begin interleague play with this three-game series against Washington...are one of four teams that have yet to play an interleague game (Atlanta, St. Louis and Arizona)...also host San Francisco (July

 7-8), New York (Aug. 19-20) and Philadelphia (Sept. 19-21) and play at New York (June 24-25), Miami (June 27-29), San Francisco (July 9-10) and Atlanta (Aug. 15-17)...went 13-7

against the National League last year, which tied for third best in the majors...it marked the second consecutive season and 10th time in 17 seasons that the A's finished with a winning record against the National League...are now 167-137 (.549) all-time in interleague play, which is fifth best.

NO ROOKIES: The A's recalled Arnold Leon Wednesday as the 26th man for the doubleheader marking the first time they had a rookie on the roster this year...he did not appear in either game before returning to Sacramento and the A's are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 35 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest by an Oakland team since they began the 1984 season with a 73-game streak from April 4 through the first game of a June 26 doubleheader...the rookie who ended that streak was Curt Young, who started the second game of the doubleheader.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's snapped their six-game home losing streak with a win in the second game of the doubleheader Wednesday...that matched the A's longest home losing streak over the last 13 years...are 1-3 on this 10-game homestand against Seattle (1-3), Washington (three games) and Chicago-AL (three games)...are 7-9 (.429) at home compared to 13-6 (.684) on the road...have the third worst home record in the American League, but the second best road record in the majors...the A's road record is their best after 19 road games since the 1990 club started the year 14-5...went 6-4 on the last road trip to Houston (2-2), Texas (3-0) and Boston (1-2)...this homestand is the first of three 10-game homestands this year...the last time the A's had at least three 10-game homestands in one season was in 2002 when they had four.

PITCHING: The A's tossed their third shutout of the season in the second game of the doubleheader Wednesday, which is tied for third in the American League...now have a 3.05 ERA, which is the **lowest** mark in the American League by nearly half a run (Detroit, 3.51)...it is fourth lowest in the majors...also lead the AL in opponents batting average (.224), on-base percentage (.290) and slugging percentage (.339)... are tied for the third fewest walks (101).

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 1-4 with a 5.11 ERA (21 er in 37.0 ip) in the month of May ... are now 7-6 with a 4.10 ERA (59 er in 129.2 ip) over the last 22 games after going 5-2 with a 1.89 ERA over the first 13 contests...have a 3.25 ERA (76 er in 210.2 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the American League (Detroit, 2.76)...Sonny Gray, Scott Kazmir and Jesse Chavez have combined for a 10-3 record and a 2.33 ERA (35 er in 135.0 ip) in 21 starts while the A's other starters are 2-5 with a 4.88 ERA (41 er in 75.2 ip) in 14 starts...Kazmir and Chavez have made seven starts each, marking the first time the A's have two 30-year-olds with more than five starts in a season since 2000 (Appier, Heredia, Olivares, Prieto)...starters rank

second in the AL in innings pitched (210.2), tied for second in fewest losses (8) and third in strikeouts (179).

OFFENSE: The A's are 47 for 231 (.203) with 18 runs scored over the last seven games after going 27 for 81 (.333) with 21 runs over their previous two contests...lead the majors in walks (156)...rank second in the American League in on-base percentage (.339) and triples (9) and are fourth in runs scored (166)...19 of the A's 30 home runs have come with runners on base, which is tied with Toronto for second in the AL (Los Angeles, 21).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters have nine walks, which is more than twice as many as any American League team and second most in the majors to Washington (12)...also lead the AL with 44 pinch plate appearances, which is more than three National League teams...are 6 for 34 (.176) with a home run and five RBI...are tied for the AL lead in home runs and extra base hits (3).

ON THE BASES: The A's are 23 for 26 (88.5%) in stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 27 of their 30 (90.0%) attempts, which is the second highest percentage in the American League...the A's are one of three AL teams without a pickoff (Baltimore, Boston).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 7-10 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 13-5 in games decided by three runs or more...are 7-6 in games decided in the last at bat...the seven last at bat wins and 13 games are the most in the American League...have four wins when trailing after seven innings, which matches their season total from last year and is tied for the most in the majors...also have three losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied for the most in the majors...are 4-2 in extra inning games...lead the AL in extra inning wins and games and are tied for the second best record.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have committed 30 errors, which is tied for second most in the American League...went 18-9 in April, which was the A's 11th consecutive winning month dating back to June of 2012...that ties the second longest such streak in Oakland history (July, 1989-May 1991)...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept., 1970-Sept. 1972... are 14-2 when scoring first, which is the best record in the AL...the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 12 minutes...averaged 3:05 last year, which was second longest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Ryan Cook on the disabled list today and now have five players on the DL (Cook, Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker)...Griffin, O'Flaherty and Parker are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL eight times this year, including twice with Cook...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. NATIONALS: The A's and Nationals square off for the first time in nine years...last met June 7-9, 2005 when Washington swept a three-game series at Nationals Park...that was the only meeting between Oakland and Washington...the A's are 3-3 all-time against the Nationals/Expos franchise...swept a three-game series from Montreal in Oakland, June 13-15, 2003.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Sean Doolittle has not walked a batter in 17.0 innings and has a streak of 29.0 without a walk dating back to last year, which is tied for the fourth longest streak in Oakland history...Derek Norris is batting .377, which is second best in the majors among players with 60 or more plate appearances (Tulowitzki, COL .407).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1972 the A's score 10 times in the fourth inning of the first game of a doubleheader against Milwaukee...the first seven batters reach base and score in the A's 10-2 win...in 1988 Bob Welch and Dennis Eckersley combine on a four-hitter as the A's defeat Detroit 3-1 for what was then a club record 14th consecutive victory...the A's would go on to win an Oakland record 104 games and their first division title since 1981...in **2010** Dallas Braden pitches the 19th perfect game in Major League history in the A's 4-0 win over Tampa Bay on Mother's Day

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Tommy Milone (0-3, 5.86 ERA)

0-3: Has started the season 0-3...is tied for eighth in the American League losses and is one of 11 AL pitchers with three or more losses and no wins...has a 5.86 ERA, which is sixth highest among AL pitchers with 25 or more innings.

HOME AND AWAY: Is 0-0 with a 4.50 ERA (3 er in 6.0 ip) in one start in Oakland compared to 0-3 with a 6.23 ERA (15 er in 21.2 ip) in four starts on the road...last year, he went 5-4 with a 3.44 ERA in 12 games at home compared to 7-5 with a 4.69 ERA in 16 games on the road...in three seasons with the A's, he is 12-8 with a 3.08 ERA (59 er in 172.2 ip) in 28 games in Oakland compared to 13-14 with a 4.92 ERA (110 er in 201.1 ip) in 36 games on the road.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .222 (6 for 27) batting average with runners in scoring position...last year, opponents hit .216 with RISP, which ranked eighth in the American League...has issued 10 of his 12 walks and allowed three of his four home runs this year to right-handed hitters...has yielded 24 of his 29 home runs over the last two years to righties...has held the opponents number three and four hitters to a .148 (4 for 27) batting average...opponents are batting .308 (8 for 26) with three walks, two hit by pitches (.419 on-base percentage), a double and two home runs (.577 slugging percentage) when leading off an inning...last year, opponents batted .299 with a .541 slugging percentage when leading off an inning...has allowed a .315 (123 for 391) batting average and .558 (32 doubles, 21 home runs) slugging percentage in that situation in his career.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Went 3-1 despite a 5.68 ERA in five interleague starts last year...is now 4-1 with a 6.02 ERA (29 er in 43.1 ip) in eight interleague starts in his career...has allowed 12 home runs in 43.2 career interleague innings (2.47 per nine innings), compared to 43 in 356.1 intraleague innings (1.09 per nine innings).

RUN SUPPORT: Has received no run support in three of his five starts this year, all losses...his season run support of 2.60 (8 rs in 27.2 ip) is third lowest in the American League among pitchers with 25 or more innings...last year, he received just 10 runs of support in his nine losses (1.78 RSA)...has received just 22 runs of support in his 22 losses in three seasons with the A's (124.2 ip, 1.59 RSA)...has received no support 12 times over the last three years as a starter and one run of support eight times...went 11-1 with three runs of support or more in 2013 and is 20-3 in his career.

DEFENSIVE DOINGS: Opponents have reached base on an error twice with him pitching, which has led to three unearned runs...last year, opponents reached base on an error 11 times with him pitching, which was the most in the AL and tied for second most in the majors...that led to 11 unearned runs, which tied for second most in the AL...opponents have now reached base via error 24 times over the last three years, which is tied for the most in the majors (Jordan Lyles)...has 25 unearned runs over that span, which is tied for fourth in the majors.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 0-5 in his starting assignments this year...went 16-10 (.615) in his 26 starting assignments and are 36-26 (.581) in his career...his teams are 41-26 (.612) in his 67 career starts.

FIRST START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 6-4 loss at Seattle April 11...allowed a RBI single to Cano in the first and two unearned runs in the second on errors by Donaldson and Lowrie...surrendered a two-run home run to Zunino in the sixth and left trailing 5-0...Hernandez shutout the A's three hits over the seven innings.

SECOND START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4, 11-inning loss at Los Angeles (AL) April 16...allowed a run in the third inning on a Trout RBI double, but the A's scored four times in the fourth to take a 4-1 lead...put the first two batters on base in the seventh inning and was relieved by Otero, who allowed both runners to score...Gregerson allowed a run in the ninth for the blown save.

THIRD START: He had a no decision in the A's 5-4 loss to Texas April 22 in Oakland...walked a career-high tying four batters...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Murphy RBI single and a Chirinos bases loaded walk...the A's came back with two in the bottom of the first but he allowed a run in the third when Rios scored on a Kouzmanoff grounded into double play...the A's then scored twice in the fourth to take the lead...left after six innings with a 4-3 lead but Gregerson allowed two runs in the ninth for the blown save.

FOURTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 5-1 loss at Houston April 27...allowed just one run over the first six innings and that was in the third inning when Villar doubled and later scored on a Fowler ground out...then allowed a two-out two-run triple to Villar in the seventh inning...was relieved by Otero, who allowed Villar to score on an Altuve home run...McHugh shutout the A's on one hit over the first eight innings before Callaspo had a RBI single in the ninth.

MILONE vs. WASHINGTON: Is making his first career appearance and start...was originally drafted by the Nationals in the 10th round of the 2008 First-Year Player Draft...made his Major League debut with Washington in 2011, going 1-0 with a 3.81 ERA in five starts during a September call-up...was traded to Oakland Dec. 23, 2011 with pitchers A.J. Cole and Brad Peacock and catcher Derek Norris for pitchers Gio Gonzalez and Rob Gilliam.

THIS SPRING: Went 2-1 with a 4.26 ERA (19.0 ip, 18 h, 12 r, 9 er, 5 bb, 8 so, 4 hr) in five games, four starts, this spring...allowed a .240 opponents batting average...logged a 1.93 ERA over his final three games after posting a 10.80 ERA in his first two starts...also pitched in a minor league game March 20 (6.0 ip, 7 h, 2 r, 2 er, 1 bb, 4 so)...was scheduled to pitch in relief in the spring finale March 29 against San Francisco but that game was rained out.

2013 RECAP: Spent the first four months of the season in the starting rotation but split the final two months of the year between the bullpen, rotation and minor leagues...was 12-9 with a 4.14 ERA in 28 games, 26 starts...had a .258 opponents batting average and .301 on-base percentage, which were the lowest marks of his career...had career highs in ERA (4.14), walks (39) and home runs (25) and matched his high in extra base hits (59).

OPPONENTS BATTING: His opponents batting average included a .247 (121-for-489) mark against right-handed hitters compared to .298 (39-for-131) against left-handers...surrendered 21 of his 25 home runs to righties, which tied for fourth most in the American League...18 of the home runs were solo shots and 14 came in the first two innings of a game.

STARTING AND RELIEVING: Was 12-9 with a 4.17 ERA and .261 opponents batting average in his 26 starts, 0-0 with a 3.00 ERA and .100 opponents average in his two relief appearances...did not inherit a runner in his two relief appearances and retired both of his first batters faced.

BEFORE AND AFTER THE BREAK: Went 8-8 with a 4.24 ERA before the All-Star Break, 4-1 with a 3.86 ERA after the break...is now 16-17 before the break compared to 10-5 after the break.

AGAINST THE CENTRAL: Compiled a 3-1 record and a 1.98 ERA in eight games against AL Central teams...is now 9-2 with a 1.97 ERA (22 er in 100.2 ip) in 17 career appearances against the Central.

MORE 2013 WITH OAKLAND: Won each of his first three starts to become the first pitcher on an A's Opening Day roster to win each of his first three starts since Dave Stewart had six wins in his first six starts in 1990... matched his career-high with 10 strikeouts and did not walk a batter May 1 against Los Angeles (AL)...has three career 10-strikeout games and has not walked a batter in any of those contests...is the third A's pitcher since 1916 with three career games of 10 or more strikeouts and no walks...was 9-9 with a 4.39 ERA in 22 starts when he was optioned to Triple-A Sacramento Aug. 3...made two starts with the River Cats before returning to Oakland Aug. 18...tossed a rain-shortened five-inning complete game in his second start Aug. 27 at Detroit...it matched the shortest complete game in Oakland history...was 1-0 with a 2.79 ERA in two starts before he was optioned to Single-A Stockton Aug. 28...returned to Oakland Sept. 3 and went 2-0 with a 2.70 ERA in four games, including two starts...began his career with 60 consecutive starts before making the first relief appearance of his career Sept. 11 at Minnesota (1.0 ip, 1 h, 1 r, 1 er, 2 so).

TOMORROW'S PROBABLE STARTING PITCHER

RHP Sonny Gray (4-1, 1.91 ERA): Ranks second in the American League in ERA and tied for third in wins...is 8-2 with a 2.07 ERA over his last 13 starts dating back to Aug. 31, 2013...the wins are tied for second most in the majors over that span and the ERA is fourth lowest (min. 60.0 ip)...has nine wins in 19 career appearances...the only pitchers in Oakland history to win their 10th game in 20 appearances or fewer are Tim Hudson (18 games) and Barry Zito (19)...was named AL Pitcher of the Month for the month of April after going 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in five starts...had a no decision in his last start, a 3-2 A's win in 10 innings at Boston last Sunday (6.0 ip, 6 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bd, 3 so)...has never faced Washington in his Major League debut on July 10, 2013 at Pittsburgh (2.0 ip, 1 h, 3 so).

Was placed on the DL for the second time this season on May 9 (retroactive to May 8) with a strained right forearm.

Was originally placed on the DL March 29 (retroactive to March 21) with right shoulder tendinitis...had a two-game rehab assignment with Single-A Stockton April 3-5 (1.2 ip, 2 h, 2 r, 2 er, 2 bb, 2 so, 1 hr, 10.80 ERA)...came off the DL on April 7 and pitched in 12 games with the A's (0-1, 2.92 ERA in 12.1 ip).

Last Year: Was 6-4 with two saves and a 2.54 ERA in a team-leading 71 relief appearances...allowed just two home runs in 67.1 innings, an average of 0.27 per nine innings, which was fourth lowest among AL relievers.

- Is the first Athletic to triple in each of his first two games with the A's since Bob Dillinger did it with the Philadelphia A's, April 18-19, 1950.
- Was designated for assignment April 12 and claimed off waivers by Minnesota April 20.

CRAIG GENTRY

- Began the season on the disabled list as he was placed on the 15-day DL March 29 retroactive to March 21 with a lower back sprain...did not play in a Major League game during the spring.
- Went 6 for 12 (.500) with two runs, a double, four RBI, a walk and two strikeouts in three games (one in each outfield position) with Triple-A Sacramento and Single-A Stockton on a rehab assignment before he was reinstated from the DL April 12.

LUKE GREGERSON

• Was on his sixth consecutive Opening Day roster, his first with the A's.

JOSH LINDBLOM

 Was recalled from Sacramento April 2 to start the night game of the day/night doubleheader against Cleveland...allowed two runs on five hits in 4.2 innings for a no decision and was optioned back to Sacramento following the game.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has been hit at least four times over a four-game span (5, Sept. 23-27, 1976).
- Played in the 500th game of his career April 25.

ERIC O'FLAHERTY
