ABOUT THE A'S: Have won two straight after losing five of the previous six games...have lost back-to-back series for the first time since Aug. 19-25 of last year...are 8-10 over the last 18 games after starting the year 13-5...are 21-15 for the season, which is the second best record in the American League and fourth best in the majors...are in sole possession of first

majors...are in sole possession of first place in the AL West for the 12th consecutive day and have held at least a share of first for 16 consecutive days and 29 of the last 31...have 25 days in sole possession of first this year, four days tied for first, four days in second, three days tied for second, one day tied for third and three days in fourth...snapped their season-high tying three-game losing streak with a win in the second game of the doubleheader on Wednesday...have not lost more than three in a row since May 6-10, 2013 when they had a five-game losing streak.

PITCHING: The A's pitching staff has tossed back-to-back shutouts for the first time since Aug. 27-28, 2012...now have four shutouts for the season, which ranks third in the American League...all four shutouts have been three-hitters...have five three-hitters overall, matching St. Louis and Los Angeles (AL) for most games of three or fewer hits...have the **lowest opponents batting average in the majors** (.221) and the second lowest on-base percentage (.288) and slugging percentage (.334)...have a 2.97 ERA, which is the lowest mark in the American League by nearly half a run (Detroit, 3.46)...it is second lowest in the majors.

STARTING PITCHING: A's starting pitchers are 8-6 with a 3.86 ERA (59 er in 137.2 ip) over the last 23 games after going 5-2 with a 1.89 ERA over the first 13 contests...have a 3.13 ERA (76 er in 218.2 ip) for the season, which is second lowest in the American League (Detroit, 2.76)...lead the AL in innings pitched (218.2), are tied for the fewest losses (8) and rank third in strikeouts (186)...Sonny Gray, Scott Kazmir and Jesse Chavez have combined for a 10-3 record and a 2.33 ERA (35 er in 135.0 ip) in 21 starts while the A's other starters are 3-5 with a 4.41 ERA (41 er in 83.2 ip) in 15 starts.

OFFENSE: The A's scored eight runs last night after tallying just 18 over the previous seven games...are batting .221 (59 for 267) over the last eight games after hitting .283 over the previous 15 contests...lead the majors in walks (159), rank second in on-base percentage (.341), tied for third in triples (9) and fourth in runs scored (174)...20 of the A's 34 home runs have come with runners on base, which ranks fourth in the majors.

ON THE BASES: The A's are 23 for 26 (88.5%) in stolen base attempts, which is the best percentage in the majors...opponents have been successful in 27 of their 30 (90.0%) attempts, which is tied with Minnesota for the second highest percentage in the majors (Chicago-NL 90.6%)...the A's are one of three Major League teams without a pickoff (Boston, Miami).

IN THE PINCH: A's pinch hitters have nine walks, which is more than twice as many as any American League team and second most in the majors to Washington (12)...also lead the AL with 44 pinch plate appearances, which is more than three National League teams...are 6 for 34 (.176) with a home run and five RBI...are tied for the AL lead in home runs and extra base hits (3).

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: The A's began interleague play with an 8-0 win over Washington last night...also host San Francisco (July 7-8), New York (Aug. 19-20) and Philadelphia (Sept. 19-21) and play at New York (June 24-25), Miami (June 27-29), San Francisco (July 9-10) and Atlanta (Aug. 15-17)...went 13-7 against the National

BEST INTERLEAGUE

(July 9-10) and Atlanta (Aug. 15-17)...went 13-7 against the National League last year, which tied for third best in the majors...it marked the second consecutive season and 10th time in 17 seasons that the A's finished with a winning record against the National League...are now 168-137 (.551) all-time in interleague play, which is fifth best.

HOME AND AWAY: The A's are 2-3 on this 10-game homestand against Seattle (1-3), Washington (1-0) and Chicago-AL (three

games)...are 8-9 (.471) at home compared to 13-6 (.684) on the road...have the second best road record in the majors (Milwaukee, 12-5)...snapped their six-game home losing streak with a win in the second game of the doubleheader Wednesday...that matched the A's longest home losing streak over the last 13 years...this homestand is the first of three 10-game homestands this year...the last time the A's had at least three 10-game homestands in one season was in 2002 when they had four...went 6-4 on the last road trip to Houston (2-2), Texas (3-0) and Boston (1-2).

CLOSE CALLS: The A's are 7-10 in games decided by two runs or fewer and 14-5 in games decided by three runs or more...are 7-6 in games decided in the last at bat...the seven last at bat wins and 13 games are the most in the American League...have four wins when trailing after seven innings, which matches their season total from last year and is tied for the most in the majors...also have three losses when leading after eight innings, which is tied for the most in the majors...are 4-2 in extra inning games...lead the AL in extra inning wins and games and are tied for the second best record.

NO ROOKIES: The A's recalled Arnold Leon Wednesday as the 26th man for the doubleheader marking the first time they had a rookie on the roster this year...he did not appear in either game before returning to Sacramento and the A's are the only Major League team that has not used a rookie in 2014...the streak of 36 consecutive games without playing a rookie is the longest by an Oakland team since they began the 1984 season with a 73-game streak from April 4 through the first game of a June 26 doubleheader...the rookie who ended that streak was Curt Young, who started the second game of the doubleheader.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have committed 30 errors, which is tied for third most in the American League...went 18-9 in April, which was the A's 11th consecutive winning month dating back to June of 2012...that ties the second longest such streak in Oakland history (July, 1989-May 1991)...the record is 13 consecutive months from Sept., 1970-Sept. 1972...are 15-2 when scoring first, which is the best record in the AL...the A's average time of game is 3 hours and 11 minutes...averaged 3:05 last year, which was second longest in Oakland history (3:08 in 2000).

THE DISABLED LIST: The A's placed Ryan Cook on the disabled list yesterday and have five players on the DL (Cook, Elmore, Griffin, O'Flaherty, Parker)...Griffin, O'Flaherty and Parker are on the 60-day DL...have used the DL eight times this year...used it just 13 times all last year, which was the fewest since 2005 when they used it eight times...have not had fewer than two players on the DL since the end of the 2006 season when they had just one.

A's vs. NATIONALS: The A's trail in the all-time series, 1-3...won the first ever meeting in Oakland last night...prior to that, had not met since June 7-9, 2005 when Washington swept a three-game series at RFK Stadium...that was the only meeting between Oakland and Washington...the A's are 4-3 all-time against the Nationals/Expos franchise...swept a three-game series from Montreal in Oakland, June 13-15, 2003.

TODAY'S TIDBITS

Sean Doolittle has not walked a batter in 17.0 innings and has a streak of 29.0 without a walk dating back to last year, which is tied for the fourth longest streak in Oakland history...Brandon Moss has 18 home runs and 61 RBI in 69 games dating back to Aug. 19 of last year...both figures are the most in the AL and second most in the majors to Giancarlo Stanton (21 HR and 65 RBI in 74 games)...Derek Norris is batting .384, which is second best in the majors among players with 60 or more plate appearances (Tulowitzki, COL .402).

THIS DATE IN A's HISTORY

In 1992 Jose Canseco, Mark McGwire and Mike Bordick all homer in the sixth inning of the A's 5-2 win at New York...in 1996 Ernie Young hits three home runs in the A's 15-5 win over Minnesota to tie an Oakland record...he adds a single and drives in six runs...Young, Geronimo Berroa and Brent Gates all homer in the fifth inning to tie an Oakland record...in 2007 Dan Johnson is a perfect 4 for 4 with two home runs, four RBI, four runs scored and two walks and Jack Cust also homers twice as the A's hit six home runs to defeat Kansas City, 17-3.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Sonny Gray (4-1, 1.91 ERA)

AMONG THE LEADERS: Ranks second in the American League in ERA (1.91), tied for second in complete games (1) and shutouts (1), tied for fourth in wins (4) and grounded into double plays (6), sixth in opponents slugging percentage (.308) and 10th in opponents batting average (.227)...is tied for second in the AL in wild pitches (5).

LAST 13 STARTS: Is 8-2 with a 2.07 ERA (19 er in 82.2 ip) and .228 (70 for 307) opponents batting average over his last 13 starts dating back to Aug. 31, 2013...the wins are tied for second most in the majors over that span (Wainwright, STL 10) and the ERA is fourth lowest (min. 60.0 ip).

WINS: Has four wins this year and nine in 19 career appearances...the only pitchers in Oakland history to win their 10th game in 20 appearances or fewer are Tim Hudson (18 games) and Barry Zito (19).

PITCHER OF THE MONTH: Was named American League Pitcher of the Month for the month of April after going 4-1 with a 2.06 ERA and .219 opponents batting average in five starts...allowed just one home run in 35.0 innings...tied for the AL lead in wins in April and ranked fourth in ERA (2.06)...became the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Kazmir, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998).

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed two home runs over his first seven starts and 47.0 innings...his average of 0.38 home runs per nine innings is seventh lowest in the American League...has surrendered just six home runs in 111.0 career innings (0.49 per nine innings)...has yielded a .174 (8 for 46) average with runners in scoring position, which ranks eighth in the American League...has allowed a .191 (18 for 94) average with RISP in his career...opponents are 2 for 19 (.105) with RISP and two outs...has a .164 (9 for 55) opponents batting average the first time through the lineup, .256 (30 for 117) after that...has held the opponents two, three and four hitters to a .177 (11 for 62) batting average.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 3-0 with a 1.29 ERA (4 er in 28.0 ip) in four starts at night compared to 1-1 with a 2.84 ERA (6 er in 19.0 ip) in three starts during the day...his career numbers are 5-1 with a 1.53 ERA (11 er in 64.2 ip) in 11 night games, 4-3 with a 3.50 ERA (18 er in 46.1 ip) in eight day games.

INTERLEAGUE PLAY: Has made one career interleague appearance and it was his Major League debut on July 10, 2013 at Pittsburgh...tossed 2.0 scoreless innings and allowed one hit while striking out three.

DAYS REST: Is scheduled to start on five days rest today...is 3-0 with a 2.03 ERA (7 er in 31.0 ip) in five starts on five days rest or more compared to 1-1 with a 1.69 ERA (3 er in 16.0 ip) in two starts on four days rest...his career numbers are 6-1 with a 1.81 ERA (12 er in 59.2 ip) in 10 starts on five days rest or more, 3-3 with a 3.23 ERA (17 er in 47.1 ip) in seven starts on four days rest.

INNING BY INNING: Has allow five of his 12 runs this year in the fifth inning (7.0 ip, 6.43 ERA)...has a 0.96 ERA (3 er in 28.0 ip) over the four innings of a game and a 1.50 ERA (2 er in 12.0 ip) from the sixth inning on.

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Was charged with his first loss of the season April 23, snapping his season-opening winning streak at three games...has never lost consecutive decisions in his career...the loss snapped a six-game winning streak dating back to September 11 of last year, which was a career high...went 6-0 with a 2.35 ERA over that eight-start stretch...allowed just two home runs in 46.0 innings during the winning streak.

THIS AND THAT: The A's have been shut out twice this year, both times in his starts...however, his season run support average is 4.60 (24 rs in 47.0 ip)...his career RSA as a starter is 6.22 (74 rs in 107.0 ip)...the A's are 5-2 (.714) in his starting assignments this year and are 11-6 (.647) when he starts in his career...has tossed at least six innings in 13 of his 17 starts, allowed two runs or fewer 10 times and walked two batters or fewer 12 times.

FIRST START: He had a no decision in the A's 2-0 loss to Cleveland on Opening Night March 31...tossed 6.0 shutout innings to become just the second starting pitcher in Oakland history to not allow a run on Opening Day (Tim Hudson, 2003)...allowed five hits and walked three...retired the side in order just once, the third inning...it was the first Opening Day start of his career...becomes the ninth different Opening Day starter for the A's in the last nine years (Anderson, McCarthy, Cahill, Sheets, Braden, Blanton, Haren, Zito)...became the fifth youngest Opening Day starting pitcher in Oakland history (Blue, Hunter, Cahill, Odom).

SECOND START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-3 win over Seattle April 6 in Oakland...did not allow a run in the first inning to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high 14.0 innings (previous: 13.0, August 10-20, 2013)...was charged with two unearned runs in the second inning (Barton error) when he allowed RBI singles to Almonte and Miller...also allowed a RBI single to Smoak in the third to give the Mariners a 3-0 lead but the A's tied the game on a Moss three-run homer in the bottom of the third...retired 11 of the final 12 batters he faced, including each of the last seven, and the A's scored twice in the fifth to take the lead for good.

THIRD START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 3-1 win at Seattle April 12...struck out a career-high tying nine batters...allowed back-to-back singles to Almonte and Miller to start the game before retiring 11 straight...Almonte scored on a Cano ground out, but that would be the only run he would allow in seven innings...blanked the Mariners on three hits and two walks over his final six innings.

FOURTH START: He won his third consecutive start in the A's 11-3 win over Houston April 18 in Oakland...allowed a career-high nine hits...the A's scored seven times in the first inning and he blanked the Astros on three hits and a walk over the first four innings...allowed three runs in the fifth on RBI singles by Fowler and Springer and a sacrifice fly by Carter.

FIFTH START: He was the losing pitcher in the A's 3-0 loss to Texas last Wednesday in Oakland...walked a career-high four batters...allowed a RBI triple to Rios in the first, a RBI single to Choice in the fifth and a solo home run to Murphy in the sixth...Perez shut out the A's on three hits and two walks.

SIXTH START: He tossed his first career complete game and shutout, a three-hitter in the A's 4-0 win at Texas April 28...became just the fifth visiting pitcher to allow three hits or fewer in a shutout at Globe Life Park, the first since Matt Garza (Aug. 15, 2008)...allowed a Martin single in the third, a Chirinos single in the sixth and a Rios single in the seventh.

LAST START: He had a no decision in the A's 3-2, 10-inning win at Boston last Sunday...blanked the Red Sox on one hit over the first four innings to extend his scoreless streak to a career-high tying 14.0 innings...had a 1-0 lead when he allowed a Sizemore RBI double in the fifth...the A's scored once in the sixth but he allowed a Pierzynski home run to start the seventh...walked the next batter and was relieved by Abad with the scored tied 2-2.

THIS SPRING: Went 0-1 with a 3.48 (20.2 ip, 18 h, 11 r, 8 er, 6 bb, 16 so) ERA in six starts...allowed a .228 (18 for 79) opponents batting average...yielded just one home run in 20.2 innings...allowed just one earned run in 10.2 innings over his final two starts (0.84 ERA) after posting a 6.30 ERA over his first four starts...surrendered one run or fewer in four of his six starts.

2013 RECAP: Spent most of the season at Triple-A Sacramento where he was 10-7 with a 3.42 ERA in 20 starts...also had two stints with the A's...after making two relief appearances in his Major League debut in July, he returned to Oakland Aug. 10 and finished the season in the starting rotation...was 5-3 with a 2.67 ERA in 12 games, 10 starts, with the A's...also went 0-1 with a 2.08 ERA in two ALDS starts against Detroit...based upon a minimum of 60 innings pitched, he had the lowest opponents on-base percentage among American League rookies (.272), ranked second in opponents batting average (.214) and slugging percentage (.298) and third in ERA...struck out 67 batters in 64.0 innings and his average of 9.42 strikeouts per nine innings was second best (Allen, CLE 11.26).

LHP Scott Kazmir (4-1, 2.64 ERA): Was charged with his first loss of the season in his last start, a 4-2 loss to Seattle last Monday (6.0 ip, 8 h, 4 r, 4 er, 2 bb, 3 so)...it snapped a career-high tying six-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 21, 2013...is tied for fourth in the American League in wins (4), ranks fifth in opponents slugging percentage (.307), eighth in opponents batting average (.223) and ninth in ERA (2.64) and opponents on-base percentage (.279)...is 11-6 with a 2.93 ERA over his last 25 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...the ERA is third lowest among AL pitchers over that span (min. 125.0 ip)...is 2-0 with a 1.65 ERA and .173 opponents batting average in four starts during the day compared to 2-1 with a 4.24 ERA and .294 opponents average in three starts at night...has hit a batter in four consecutive starts, which is tied for the second longest streak in Oakland history...had a no decision in his only career start against Washington, a 7-6 Cleveland loss last year on June 15 (2.2 ip, 4 h, 5 r, 5 er, 4 bb, 2 so)...is 11-5 with a 4.54 ERA in 22 career interleague starts.

SUNDAY'S STARTING PITCHER: Scott Kazmir (4-1, 2.64 ERA)

WINNING STREAK SNAPPED: Was charged with his first loss of the season in his last start after beginning the season 4-0 for the first time in his career...the loss snapped a career-high tying six-game winning streak dating back to Sept. 21, 2013 (also May 10-June 6, 2008)...had a 1.75 ERA and .207 opponents batting average during the streak, which spanned eight starts...allowed just one home run in 51.1 innings...struck out 56 and walked just 10.

AMONG THE LEADERS: Is tied for third in the American League in wins (4), ranks fifth in opponents slugging percentage (.307) and eighth in ERA (2.64), opponents batting average (.223) and opponents on-base percentage (.279)...has the third highest run support (7.31), is tied for fourth in wild pitches (4), tied for fifth in hit batters (4), ranks sixth in fewest walks per nine innings (1.83) and eighth in fewest home runs per nine innings (0.41).

LAST 24 STARTS: Has allowed one run or fewer in three of his seven starts this year and 11 of his last 25 starts dating back to June 21, 2013...is 11-6 with a 2.93 ERA (48 er in 147.1 ip) over that stretch...the ERA is third lowest among American League pitchers over that span (min. 125.0 ip)...has held the opposition to a .234 (131 for 560) batting average...has walked 33 (2.02 per nine innings) and struck out 145 in 147.1 innings (8.86 per nine innings) for a strikeout to walk ratio of 4.39...has yielded just nine home runs (0.55 per nine innings).

INTERLEAGUE: Went 3-1 with a 3.38 ERA in five interleague starts with Cleveland last year...is now 11-5 with a 4.54 ERA (61 er in 121.0 ip) in 22 career interleague starts.

NIGHT AND DAY: Is 2-0 with a 1.65 ERA (5 er in 27.1 ip) and .173 (17 for 98) opponents batting average in four starts during the day compared to 2-1 with a 4.24 ERA (8 er in 17.0 ip) and .294 (20 for 68) opponents average in three starts at night...ranks sixth in the American League in day ERA...last year, he went 5-2 with a 3.27 ERA in 10 starts during the day compared to 5-7 with a 4.46 ERA in 19 starts at night...is now 7-2 with a 2.73 ERA (25 er in 82.1 ip) in 14 starts during the day over the last two years and 7-8 with a 4.43 ERA (59 er in 120.0 ip) in 22 starts at night.

OPPONENTS BATTING: Has allowed a .143 (6 for 42) batting average with runners in scoring position, which is tied for fifth in the American League...opponents are 1 for 17 (.059) with RISP and two outs...opponents are 8 for 43 (.186) with no walks and two hit by pitches when leading off an inning (.222 on-base percentage)...the on-base percentage is fourth lowest in the AL and the batting average is tied for seventh...has yielded a .190 (24 for 126) average against right-handers, which ranks 10th in the AL, compared to .325 (13 for 40) against left-handers...has issued seven of his nine walks to righties...over the last two years, 48 of his 56 walks have been issued to right-handed hitters...has surrendered both of his home runs this year and 18 of his 21 over the last two years to righties...both of the home runs this year have been solo shots as have 15 of his 21 over the last two years.

IN APRIL: Went 4-0 with a 2.11 ERA and .206 opponents batting average in six starts in the month of April...tied for the American League lead in wins in April, ranked sixth in ERA and eighth in opponents batting...is the sixth A's pitcher since 1993 to win four games in April (Gray, 2014; Cahill, 2011; Mulder and Zito, 2003; Rogers, 1998)...of those six, only Cahill was undefeated (Cahill started the season 6-0)...it was the fifth time he won four or more games in a month in his career, the first time in April...his last four-win month was June of 2010 with Los Angeles (AL)...had 35 strikeouts, which was the fifth highest April strikeout total in Oakland history.

THIS AND THAT: The A's are 6-1 (.857) in his starting assignments...has walked two batters or fewer in six of his seven starts...has hit a batter in four consecutive starts, which is tied for the second longest streak in Oakland history...the longest streak is five by Justin Duchscherer from May 13 to June 4, 2008.

FIRST START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 6-1 win over Cleveland in the day game April 2 against Cleveland...tossed 7.1 shutout innings and allowed just three hits...is the only Athletics pitcher since at least 1914 to toss at least seven shutout innings and not walk a batter in his A's debut.

SECOND START: He won his second consecutive start in the A's 8-3 win at Minnesota April 7...had a 2-0 lead when he allowed a RBI double to Hicks in the second...the A's scored three times in the third but he allowed two runs in the bottom of the third on a Kubel RBI double and a Suzuki RBI ground out...then retired 11 of the final 13 batters he faced.

THIRD START: He combined with Abad, Otero, Gregerson and Doolittle on a three-hit shutout in the A's 3-0 win at Seattle April 13...tossed 6.0 innings and allowed two of the hits but had a no decision as the A's scored twice in the eighth and once in the ninth...retired each of the first 10 batters, allowed back to back singles to Miller and Cano with one out in the fourth, and then retired each of the final eight batters.

FOURTH START: He had a no decision in the A's 4-3 win over Houston April 19 in Oakland...allowed his first home run of the season, a solo shot by Villar in the third inning...also allowed a RBI single to Dominguez in the fourth and an unearned run in the fifth when Villar scored on a Norris throwing error following a steal of third...left trailing 3-1 but the A's scored three times in the bottom of the ninth for the win.

FIFTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 10-1 win at Houston April 24...the A's scored twice in the first and he allowed a run in the bottom of the first on a bases loaded walk to Chris Carter...blanked the Astros on three hits and a walk over his final five innings.

SIXTH START: He was the winning pitcher in the A's 9-3 win at Texas April 29...had a 4-0 lead when he allowed his first run in the bottom of the fourth on a RBI double by Rios...the A's then scored five times in the fifth to make the score 9-1...he allowed two runs in the bottom of the fifth on an Andrus RBI groundout and a Fielder RBI single.

LAST START: He was charged with his first loss of the season in the A's 4-2 loss to Seattle last Monday...allowed two runs in the first inning on a Hart RBI single and a Seager RBI ground out...the A's came back to tie the game with two runs in the fourth inning but he allowed a solo home run to Romero in the fifth and a RBI single to Miller in the sixth.

THIS SPRING: Went 1-0 with a 1.62 ERA (16.2 ip, 9 h, 3 r, 3 er, 7 bb, 14 so) in four starts during the spring...held the opposition to a .155 (9 for 58) batting average...did not allow a home run in 16.2 innings...did not allow a run in three of his four starts...was scratched from his start March 17 against Chicago (NL) with left triceps stiffness.

BRANDON MOSS

- Became the A's ninth different Opening Day starter at designated hitter in the last 10 years March 31 against Cleveland.
- Was hit by a pitch four times in the four-game series against Houston April 24-27, which is the most
 by an Athletic in a series of any length since at least 1914...in Oakland history, only Don Baylor has
